

## Open House Planned for Bond Projects

With the community's approval of \$7.9 million in taxexempt bonds last May, planning has begun for facility and infrastructure improvements for Ken-Caryl Ranch. The Metropolitan District Board has entered into agreements with an Owner's Representative, a building architect and a landscape design architect, and a Construction Manager/General Contractor will be hired in February.

There will be an open house for all residents to review preliminary concept plans in early February. Plans will also be posted online for comment. The dates and times of the open house have not been finalized but will be announced in the e-News, the next issue of the paper and on the website. ## Manager's Column

As we start a new year, 2015 on Ken-Caryl Ranch promises to be a landmark year. This coming year, the community will be investing more than \$7.9 million in facility and infrastructure improvements. The year will no doubt be remembered as the year the voters chose to invest the largest single amount of money in updating the look and utility of Ken-Caryl Ranch since formation of the planned development back in the mid-1970s.

As a review, voters in the Metropolitan District on May 6, 2014, approved \$7.9 million in tax-exempt municipal bonds to fund improvements to the infrastructure of the community. In September, the Metropolitan District closed on the sale of the bonds at an interest rate of 2.37 percent, taking advantage of historic lows in interest rates to finance the improvements over a period of 10 years. Of the \$7.9 million of bonds sold, \$765,000 of the bonds were purchased by Ranch residents investing in their own community.

Since this past fall when the bonds were sold, the Metropolitan District Board of Directors has entered into agreements

with an Owner's Representative, a building architect and a landscape design architect to begin the planning and design for the projects. Plans call for the Metropolitan District Board of Directors to hire a Construction Manager/General Contractor in February who will be tasked with overseeing the construction projects at all three

The current timetable calls for extensive facility planning, redesign and public input over the next 60 days to be moving forward in the spring and summer with development and finalization of detailed plans for renovation of facilities and landscaping. By this coming September, it is planned for construction to be taking place at the Ranch House, the Community Center and Dakota Lodge to begin implementing the extensive remodeling of all three facilities. All building renovation and landscape renovation is planned to be completed by May 2016, bringing to completion the reinvestment of the bond proceeds back into the community.

Of course, ongoing operations of the Metropolitan District and Master Association must continue throughout the construction period. One of the major components of the construction schedule will be coordination of activities and programs throughout the process to minimize as much as possible disruption of programming to residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch. The latest updates on construction and changes to program scheduling will be communicated through Life at Ken-Caryl and on the Ken-Caryl Ranch website at www.ken-carylranch.org.

## Coats Of Many Colors

By Community Standards Administrator Rita Saunders Home maintenance projects require planning, and winter is a great time to address them. Letters received about the need for house painting should not be a total surprise. If your paint is faded, splotchy, peeling or has exposed bare wood - you are a candidate for receiving a letter.

Whether or not you do get a letter this year, if your paint is lackluster or in poor condition, it's time to plan for a new paint job. Getting bids and interviewing contractors along with choosing (and submitting!) your paint colors during the cold weather will prepare you to proceed with the project next spring. Please remember that a submittal is required even if the current paint scheme is to be used.

A list of houses that need to be painted is compiled after a winter review of the paint condition of each home within the Master Association's area of responsibility for architectural standards. The nature of the evaluation certainly has some subjective components, but there are no quotas and we don't base the list on the number of years since a house has been painted. Using the same team for the review over a number of years provides consistency and balance to the process.

Once the list has been assembled, letters and a submittal form are sent to each of the homes identified as needing new paint. It's evident that house painting is on the radar of many owners already, as we receive many submittals in the winter so that they are "good to go" when the weather warms. In the past 12 months

there were more than 400 paint submittals processed by our office, while only 77 paint letters were sent out.

Before submitting your colors, please take the time to paint samples on your house, large enough for you to evaluate and adjacent to permanent features such as brick or stone accents. Look at these samples at different times of day and weather conditions to make sure you are really happy with your choice.

Homeowners need to provide paint samples with the submittal, using the paint chips available at retail stores or even painting samples on a piece of paper. We cannot file or store samples submitted on paint sticks or 2x4s. Emailing images for paint colors cannot suffice as a sample, as monitors and printers cause a wide range of variation from the actual color.

Make sure that proper preparation is done prior to any paint application. Most paint manufacturers make a range of paint qualities, and while the "top of the line" isn't necessary to provide a quality job, I wouldn't advocate using their cheapest product either. After all, a good deal of the cost is for labor, which is the same no matter what brand of paint is being used.

Finally, once the painting is finished, please replace your address numbers. We have a puzzling number of houses without addresses displayed, prompting a tip of the hat to delivery people, visiting friends and emergency responders.

Please keep in mind that rules are regularly reviewed and periodically updated. Ken-Caryl Ranch documents are available at the Ranch House and on our website at www.ken-carylranch.org. ## Trash & Recycling Info from Waste Connections

Auto-Dial Service: Waste Connections, the trash and recycling services provider for WASTE CONNECTIONS INC.

Ken-Caryl Ranch offers an auto dial service to notify customers of any changes in trash pickup days. You can sign up online by visiting www.wcdenver.com. Once you are at www.wcdenver.com/ contact/. Complete the required information, click on Residential Trash Service, then in the comment section at the bottom of the page explain that you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up

for the Call Fire service.

**Delayed Trash Days:** Waste Connections observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, unless they fall on a weekend day. If your normal pickup day falls on a holiday or after a holiday, your collection schedule will run one day late that week.

**Recycling Notes:** Please remember to have your trash and recycling curbside by 7 a.m. on your collection day. Trash and recycling should be placed four feet apart from each other at the curb. Recycling containers need to be clearly marked as recycling. If you need a Waste Connections recycling sticker, please visit the Ranch House or Community Center.

## Water District Rate for 2015

As part of the 2015 Budget, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Water and Sanitation Board of Directors approved increases for water and sewer services. The new rates took effect Jan. 1.

## Water Rate Increase for 2015:

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Water and Sanitation District ("District") purchases its water from Denver Water. In 2014, Denver Water increased the District's water cost by 3.6 percent, and the District's water rates remained unchanged in 2014. Denver Water has increased the District's water costs by 2.4 percent in 2015. The District will increase water rates 1.5 percent in 2015. The rate change will result in an additional \$0.77 (\$4.62 per year) to the average single family bi-monthly statement. The effects of the water rate increase will vary depending upon the amount of water used. Please visit the District's website (ken-carylwater.org) to see the complete water rate table.

## **Sanitary Sewer Rate Increase for 2015:**

The District has a contract with the City of Littleton to treat the sanitary sewer from the District. In 2014, the City of Littleton increased the sewer treatment cost to the District by 2 percent, and the District sewer service fees remained unchanged in 2014. In 2015, the City of Littleton will increase sewer treatment costs by 2 percent, and the District will increase sewer rates by 1.5 percent. The rate change will result in an additional \$0.81 (\$4.86 per year) to the average single family bi-monthly statement.

Water and Sewer fees collected by the District cover the cost of purchasing water and paying for sewer treatment. The fees collected also cover the operation and maintenance expenses associated with the District's own water distribution system and sanitary sewer collection system including repairs, capital improvements and administration. The District does not receive any tax revenue from its customers and solely operates from water and sewer fees.

## **Architect Hired for Bond Projects**

The Metropolitan District Board contracted with the Denver architectural design firm of Sink Combs & Dethlefs (SCD) to provide architectural services for the facility bond projects at the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge.

For more than 50 years, SCD has been recognized nationally as a leader in recreation, athletic complex and multipurpose event center planning and facility design. The 47-person firm maintains offices in Denver, Chicago and Ann Arbor. Over the years SCD has worked closely with hundreds of municipalities, colleges and

SCD has provided planning and design services at nearby facilities including: Central Park Recreation Center in Stapleton, the Reunion Community Center in Commerce City and the Highlands Ranch Recreation Center at Southridge.

SCD and landscape architect partner John Norris of Norris Design have both worked with Ken-Caryl Ranch in the past helping define long-range concept plans for the Ranch House pool area. Gudmundur Jonsson will be the lead architect and project manager.

Planning, design, permitting and bidding are expected to be completed next August with construction starting in September and continuing through May 2016. ## Wildlife Calls to Rangers in 2014

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Ranger Staff received a total of 195 wildlife calls in 2014, slightly higher than the 182 received in 2013. All calls are different in nature, and a call can last anywhere from several minutes to 45 minutes depending on the situation.

The calls can consist of general wildlife questions, a sick or injured animal, concerns about persons feeding wildlife, or directing a resident to contact a pest control company, wildlife rehabilitator, animal control, or Colorado Parks and Wildlife. Many of the calls fall under the category of nuisance wildlife, or animals either living

in or around homes, which usually involves coyotes, fox, deer, rabbits, raccoons or snakes.

The highest number of calls was 131 for deer. Calls mostly involved general questions (23), entanglement (4), injured (82) and dead deer (22). Park Rangers' job duties include monitoring the sick and injured deer through calls from concerned residents or observing while on duty and making site visits in the field to determine the health of the animal. Rangers may have to euthanize a deer if the situation warrants with a .22 rifle and are certified through Colorado Parks and Wildlife's Hunter Education Program.

If a call is received about an injured deer, Rangers will investigate depending on the severity of the injury. If the animal is suffering too badly, cannot stand and walk/fend for itself or feed, euthanizing the animal is the most humane way to treat the situation. Several factors are taken into account, including location of the deer, proximity to houses, Ranger and resident safety, angle of shot, etc. The Rangers may even call in a wildlife officer to assist or lead euthanizing the deer. Deer cannot be rehabilitated due to the possibility of transmitting diseases.

The Park Rangers work seven days a

week, 364 days a year in 10-hour shifts. When calls are received, the Rangers will try to determine the best course of action. However, if the Rangers are not available for a deer call, it is best to call Colorado Parks and Wildlife at 303-291-7227. Due to infectious diseases or other injured wildlife (excluding deer), it is better to call Jefferson County Animal Control, and they will assist with any concerns and may direct you to call Jefferson County Health Department or Colorado Parks and Wildlife, too. ## 10,000 Steps to Fitness and Weight Loss In 2015

I was recently given a Garmin Vivofit for a birthday present, and I was surprised to see that one of its main functions was a pedometer. With all of the advancements in technology in these devices, why would they bother to add something as trivial as a pedometer?

The 10,000 Steps a Day campaign was launched back in 2001 to encourage Americans to be more active. As a fitness professional, I never gave much credit to the campaign. I don't know why. I guess I never really considered walking a relevant form of exercise and also never considered what the equivalent 10,000 steps were in mileage.

Well, imagine my surprise when downloading the results the first day to see a measly 6,861 steps. I had even run a couple miles that day! Reaching that 10,000 steps milestone was going to be harder than I expected.

After doing some math, 10,000 steps is about 4.75 miles, give or take a few steps. This was much more than I originally thought; perhaps I had made too rash a judgment about this program. If everyone in this country tried to get 10,000+ steps a day, maybe we wouldn't have the problems with obesity and chronic disease that we do today.

So I decided to take a closer look and came up with some recommendations that anyone can incorporate into their lifestyle in the New Year. My first question to address is 10,000 steps really enough for health benefits and weight loss?

The Surgeon General's recommendation for improving health parameters (like lowering blood pressure, increasing bone density, improving cholesterol, preventing diabetes and more) is the accumulation

of 150 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity a week. Well, first of all, let's define what moderate to vigorous activity would mean to the average person.

I like to think of it on a scale from 1-10. No. 1 being sitting on the couch doing nothing and No. 10 being the hardest activity you've ever done. Imagine sprinting across a field, your lungs are burning, your legs are burning and after about 10 seconds you need to stop. Moderate to vigorous activity would fall between a No. 6 and No. 9 on that scale. Meaning you should be out of breath, and it should be hard to carry on a conversation. When you approach the 8-9 on the scale, then that is when you start to feel burning or fatigue in your muscles.

When you do your cardio workouts, are you working this hard the entire time? For most of us, unless you are walking outside up and down hills or on a treadmill with an incline really fast, just walking alone won't cut it when it comes to improving health. Sure you will burn calories and may very slowly lose weight but higher intensity exercise is what's prescribed for faster results, benefits and improvements in health, fitness and appearance.

So here is what I propose:

- Get a pedometer! Ask your insurance company or doctor for one; most will have extras they will give you for free. You can also invest in one with more bells and whistles like a Fitbit or the Garmin Vivofit. These both have the ability to also measure mileage, calories and have online platforms where you can track your data over time, set goals and join groups for support and camaraderie.

- Set the goal of a minimum of 5,000 steps a day and slowly work your way up to 10,000 steps over time. That way no day is

truly sedentary. Another way to think of it is a minimum of 30 minutes of cardiovascular activity a day, where your heart rate is elevated.

- Try to get extra steps in whenever possible. You can even make this competitive with yourself or friends, family or co-workers. Take the stairs, park as far away from work, the store, etc., as possible.
- At work, get up every hour or two and take a couple laps around the office and walk during your lunch break.
- On days you plan on working out, get more bang for your buck! If you can run, run! You will rack up steps faster. If you can't run, then walk up and down hills or on a steep incline on the treadmill.

- Weight training is an important part of the equation. Aim to incorporate a weight training routine into your schedule at least twice a week

If you haven't already, pay to join the Ken-Caryl fifth annual community-wide fitness and weight loss challenge. This program includes an eight-week pass to the Community Center (including all classes!), nutrition classes, weight training program, weekly weigh-ins, online support and more!

## Changes Affecting West Metro Fire Station on Chatfield Ave.

Due to the failed mill levy election in May, West Metro Fire **Protection District is** experiencing some changes to firefighter staffing that started Jan. 3. West Metro

was forced to make tough decisions invoking demotions, civilian layoffs and fewer firefighters on the street. These changes will bring a savings of \$2.2 million a year.

With declining revenues for several years,

West Metro Fire Rescue has struggled with funding the fire district's general operating expenses. Reduced revenues will necessitate service level adjustments, including fewer personnel at emergency incidents and possibly longer response times.

Many options were considered and analyzed as the plan developed. The new operations plan includes staffing level changes, impacts to those that are in promoted positions, staffing level reductions, and apparatus response reductions. The plan includes:

• Reducing response districts from three


to two. There were three districts with a shift commander and two assistant chiefs. Now there will be two assistant chiefs supervising the district. Two shift commanders will be eliminated and one shift commander will be reassigned to a day position (division chief of field operations) reporting to the deputy chief of operations.

 At Station 14, located at 10305 W. Chatfield Ave. on Ken-Carvl Ranch, Engine 14 will be closed but four firefighters will continue to respond on Tower 14. Tower 14 has the same firefighting

capabilities as Engine 14. Tower 14 will also have a dual role as a frontline fire apparatus similar to Engine 14.

 To meet West Metro's optimum staffing level and minimize overtime dollars, a reduction of uniformed staffing must occur from the authorized 341 uniformed firefighters, to 315. The staffing level will be achieved through attrition.





## Fun And Sport On Murphy Gulch

by Rosemary Lewis, Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society Would it surprise you to know that there was a small ski area just west of Ken-Caryl? In 1938, Horace Watson, a former prizefighter, expanded a toboggan run into a ski run on his property off of Murphy Gulch.

If Mother Nature did not provide the snow, Watson would bring the snow to his hill. He filled his wagon, hauled it to his property and dumped it, packed it down, and groomed it by riding his shovel down the hill. The ski run was originally outfitted with a single tow line, 900 feet long and rising 375 feet up the hill. Tickets were 10 cents per day.

During the following decades a chairlift and a second tow line were added to the amenities. At the bottom was a warming hut that also served as a local dance hall. An irrigation line fed a low spot at the bottom of the hill to make a skating pond. Watson's Ski Hill later was known as Fun Valley Ski Area and operated sporadically until the 1970s. The chairlift and one tow line were removed by 1995, but one tow line remains.

Also up Murphy Gulch is the Mountain Air Ranch, a nudist club that was founded in 1934 by John and Alice Garrison. It was originally organized as the Colorado Sunshine Club, and continues in operation today as a non-profit resort.

Murphy Gulch itself is named for Eugene Van Buren Murphy, known as Van, who homesteaded the land in 1909. Van built a sawmill at the bottom end of the gulch and a cluster of log homes at the top of the gulch. The sawmill is long gone, but some of the log homes still exist, although his home, Murphy's Roost, burned down in the 1978 fire. Van's younger half-brother, Fred Clark, homesteaded along Deer Creek and operated the Phillipsburg dance hall beginning in 1940.








## Dear Editor:

I am writing this letter as a resident, not as a Metro District Board member.

The Tax Man Cometh! In the Dec. 11, 2014, Denver Post Your Hub, page 4k, there was a story about West Metro Fire Department. In the article, West Metro Board President Pam Feely and West Metro Professional Firefighters Union President Mike Frainier said another mill levy could happen soon if property values don't come back.

Colorado has 64 counties, and every two years the county assessor reappraises the value of all types of real estate in their county. The time period for reappraising real estate is from the previous two years.

The reappraisals in Jefferson County have missed all of the increases in property values, and June 2016 Jefferson County will recover lost values from the previous six years. I will predict all real estate going up a minimum of 20 percent in value. There will be some sticker shock on your property tax bill.

I encourage everyone to contact your lender and volunteer to have your monthly payment increased by \$10, \$15 or \$20 per

month, depending on your home's value. I would encourage you to do this January 2015, 2016 and 2017. You won't be short in your mortgage tax escrow account, and you won't have sticker shock.

Jeffco Public Schools, Jeffco Road & Bridge, Jeffco Library, and West Metro Fire, you have all done a great job of adjusting your operating budgets. If you can maintain your budgets until 2016 when you will know how much increase in tax revenue you can expect, you will not double dip the taxpayer by asking for a mill increase. The taxpayers have had unemployment, foreclosures, less income, and we have all experienced the Great Recession.

I predict the real estate values will be on a moderately upward projection, long term. Colorado's population is growing, but the number of residential dwellings is not growing as fast. The result will be higher real estate values. The higher tax revenue your entity will receive will be maintained for a long period.




