### New Open Space ID Bracelets for 2016; Blue Bracelets No Longer Valid

Most trails on Ken-Caryl Ranch are private and on open space land owned and managed by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association. Park Rangers are directed to contact trail users on the private trails to determine residency. If you wear an Open Space ID Bracelet, the Park Rangers will not need to stop you as long as you are obeying all of the posted rules. The blue ID Bracelets are no longer valid. To obtain a new green ID Bracelet, go to the Recreation Office at the Ranch House at 7676 South Continental Divide Road or the Community Center at 1 Club Drive. Bracelets are issued two per household and now can be temporarily transferred to house guests! You will need to sign a simple registration form and provide proof of residency. See the Open Space ID article on page 5 for details.

### **Dakota Lodge Phasing**

The Dakota Lodge drawing to the right reflects a revised approach to the phasing of the Dakota Lodge construction efforts. Adolfson & Peterson Construction proposed this revised phasing in order to minimize the operational impact of the renovation and expansion work.

The outlined area is phase 1 and includes the multipurpose room addition and the construction of the new core functions of the original building - the restrooms and mechanical spaces. Including the restrooms in phase 1 of the schedule will provide new, functioning restrooms to the staff and youth programs that operate in Dakota Lodge. When phase 1 is complete (anticipated in early April), the multipurpose room will provide ample space for the youth programs and staff while

phase 2 work is underway. Had this phasing not been re-evaluated, port-opotties would have been

brought to the site for staff and children's use during the winter months. This would have had a negative impact on everyone, and could pose a challenge for the youth program staff. ### Please Keep Your Dog on a Leash – Here's Why

Human and Dog-to-Dog Interaction

A great deal of dog owners seem to be under the false assumption that there is nothing wrong with allowing their dogs to run off leash in on-leash areas because their dogs are "well trained" and won't harm anyone. These dog owners always say, "It's ok. He's friendly," as if this makes their uncontrolled dog approaching someone acceptable.

Having an unleashed dog rush unwanted and uninvited into someone's personal space or into another dog's space is a stressful event. Dog owners who walk their dogs where off-leash dogs are prohibited do so for a reason. The owner knows that their dogs aren't good at playing off leash with other dogs. No dog owner can accurately predict 100 percent of the time how his/her dog will react when greeting another dog.

Off-leash dogs in leashed areas are a danger to other dogs, people and wildlife as well. Most on-leash areas are multi-use, frequented by cyclists, hikers, joggers, equestrians and small children, all of whom are in danger when dogs run uncontrolled. Off-leash dogs are also a danger to themselves. Off-leash dog owners are putting them at risk for running into nearby streets, being hit by cars, being bitten by wildlife or getting lost.

Dogs allowed to roam the streets are not only a nuisance and dangerous to the public, but are in constant danger from cars, irate people and even other dogs. For these reasons, all dogs must be on a leash or confined on the owner's premises at all times. Dogs in violation of the leash law may be detained by a citizen, turned over to Animal Control, and impounded at the Foothills Animal Shelter. Impoundment and board fees must be paid by the owner before the dog can be released. Failure to claim an impounded dog does not relieve the owner of liability for payment of all fees.

**Penalties** (Courtesy of Jefferson County Animal Control)

In addition to impoundment fees, owners can be issued a summons for a violation of county regulation. Each violation of a regulation constitutes a separate offense. The maximum penalty for a Class II petty offense is \$1,000. Fine schedules provide for increased fines for subsequent violations during any three-year period. These laws and penalties are enforced throughout Ken-Caryl.

### Dogs That Roam Free, Defecate Wherever They May Be

Dog owners that allow their dogs to run off leash are not always monitoring or watching where their dog(s) go potty. This allows dogs to defecate out in the open space, alongside trails or even right smack dab in the middle of the trail. Dog feces that is not picked up, bagged and

disposed of has detrimental consequences to public health and the environment. This does not mean you pick the feces up, bag it and leave it alongside the trail. Too many times I have been working/hiking on our trails and notice people who will do all of the hard work of picking up the feces only to leave the bag at a trailhead or alongside the trail. It needs to be carried out and placed into a trash receptacle that the Rangers have provided in high-use areas. Below are facts about dog feces:

*The Facts About Dog Poop* (Courtesy of Jefferson County Animal Control)

- Dog Poop Doesn't Biodegrade Like Wild Animal Poop. Because we feed our dogs food that's different from the food wild animals eat, dog waste does not biodegrade quickly like wild animal waste. And due to the large number of pets in suburban neighborhoods and local parks, this hardy dog waste accumulates.
- Dog Poop Contains Harmful Bacteria, Parasites. Dog waste can contain harmful organisms like E. coli, Giardia, Salmonella, roundworms, hookworms and Cryptosporidium. These can be passed on to you or your pet and may cause health problems.
- Dog Waste Pollutes Groundwater, Water Bodies. Bacteria in dog waste can harm water quality in creeks and rivers and alter the ecosystems of these stream corridors. Humans who come in contact with creek water can also face health hazards.
- County Ordinances Require Cleanup.
   Jefferson County ordinances make
   "failure to clean up dog feces in public
   places" a petty offense with a fine of at
   least \$30.
- Dogs Chasing Deer in the Wintertime
   You may think it is okay for your pet to
   chase deer in the wintertime because it
   is harder for them to get to the animal,
   which in fact is completely the opposite.
   "Keep in mind during winter, deer

expend large amounts of energy to stay alive - they can lose 30 percent or more of their body weight during the cold months.



When big game animals are forced to run they become exhausted and use up valuable calories they need to stay alive. In addition, many female deer are pregnant and need to conserve energy. Pet owners can be fined up to \$275 for allowing their animals to chase wildlife. Dogs observed chasing wildlife can be shot by law enforcement officers." ("Dogs Chasing Wildlife" article, Colorado Parks & Wildlife)

Please keep your dog(s) on a leash! If you witness a loose dog chasing wildlife you should call the local Parks & Wildlife Officer, local Animal Control or Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers. So, the take-home message is, if you are tempted to take your dog off leash in an on-leash area, don't. Stop and consider the effect of your behavior on others who are using the area as well as wildlife.



# New Mandatory Registration Process with FAA for Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems


The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) announced a streamlined and user-friendly web-based aircraft registration process for owners of small unmanned aircraft weighing more than 0.55 pounds and less than 55 pounds. This includes most drones and remote-controlled aircraft. Owners must register these aircraft if they are to be flown outdoors for hobby or recreation. Unmanned Aircraft Registration System Takes Flight

The Federal Aviation Administration's new web-based registration system for small Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) is now active. Hobbyists and recreational users who fly UAS, which include remotecontrolled aircraft, may register at www.faa.gov/uas/registration.

Owners must register small UAS weighing more than 0.55 pounds and less than 55 pounds if they are to be flown outdoors for hobby or recreation. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx and FAA Deputy Administrator Mike Whitaker announced the rule requiring registration earlier this month.

Aircraft operated by the current owner before Dec. 21, 2015, must be registered no later than Feb. 19, 2016. For all others, registration is required prior to the first outdoor flight. Owners must provide their complete name, physical address, mailing address (if different), and a valid email address to register.

Federal law requires a \$5 registration fee that will be collected at the time of registration via credit card. To encourage speedy compliance, the FAA is making the process free for the first 30 days. (The registration website will initially charge the owner's credit card \$5, but a refund credit will appear shortly afterward.)

After completing registration, owners will receive a personal registration number. If a person owns more than one small UAS, each aircraft must be marked with that number. Any method may be used to mark the UAS, as long as the number is legible. Registrants may put the number in the battery compartment if it is easily accessible.

The FAA will immediately email a certificate containing the holder's name, registration number, and the dates of issuance and expiration. The operator must keep either a printed or electronic version of this certificate on hand for inspection as proof of registration. Registration must be renewed every three years. If assistance is needed with registration, email UAShelp@faa.gov.

### KCR Open Space ID Bracelets for 2016-2018

It's a well-known fact among readers of this paper that the best trails on Ken-Caryl Ranch are private and on land owned and managed by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association. Park Rangers are directed to contact trail users on the private trails to determine residency in order to protect this valuable asset. The fact is that the Park Rangers have no way of knowing whether the people they see on the trails are indeed authorized to be there unless they stop every individual and determine their residency status or the user displays a proper ID Bracelet.

If you are wearing the bracelet while using the trails and a Park Ranger approaches, he/she will recognize the highly visible ID Bracelet and, as long as you are obeying all of the posted rules, you will pass unencumbered by the inquiries of a Park Ranger.

The proper areas to display the bracelets are listed below:

- HIKER/RUNNER On wrist, waist, backpack strap or on a dog leash handle.
- BIKER The handlebars near the stem is best.
- EQUESTRIAN Saddle strap in front of the leg.

Remember, Park Rangers normally only see a "frontal" view of an oncoming trail user, and the more one can see the bracelet the better.

New for 2016-18 Years is a Day-Glow Green Bracelet!

To obtain your own green ID Bracelet (if you have a BLUE bracelet it is no longer valid past Dec. 31, 2015) go to the Recreation Office at the Ranch House at 7676 South Continental Divide Road or the Community Center at 1 Club Drive beginning Jan. 2, 2016. You will need to sign a simple registration form and provide one item below to show proof of residency:

- 1. A valid Colorado Driver License with current KCR address.
- 2. A valid Colorado I.D. with current KCR address.
- 3. A valid property tax statement with the applicant's name for the current KCR address
- A valid warranty deed with the applicant's name for the current KCR address.
- A valid lease/rental agreement with the applicant's name for the current KCR address.

There is no cost. Bracelets are issued only two per household and now can be temporarily transferred to house guests! It is not mandatory to have an ID Bracelet when using Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space, but if you don't have an ID Bracelet, be prepared to stop and answer questions from a Park Ranger. Have you ever wondered what proper trail etiquette is when passing someone on the trails or whether it is appropriate to use a trail when it's muddy? The Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space and Parks Use Rules do not address these issues so the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee has drafted Trail Use Guidelines to help establish proper behavior when using trails. Residents are encouraged to take a look at the proposed guidelines, which are shown on this page, and provide feedback before a final draft of the guidelines is presented to the Master Association Board. It's important to point out that these guidelines are not enforceable rules but rather an educational tool to help protect open space visitors and resources. ### **Proposed Trail Use Guidelines**

KCR trails are a unique resource in our community allowing all members to enjoy a recreational lifestyle in a natural and scenic environment. Please respect your neighbors and open space by following these guidelines. These guidelines are intended to support current Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Rules and Regulations, not replace them.

### LooK out for other trail users

- Be aware of your surroundings and other trail users.
- Look up the trail, call-out, and gain the attention of others in advance with a vocal warning or bell.
- Free one ear from headphones and ear buds so you can hear others.
- Most trail conflicts occur on blind turns, switch-backs, and other poor visibility areas. Be extra aware in these areas and anticipate other users around corners.

### **Be Courteous**

- All users yield to and pass equestrians with care. Slow to walking speed (be prepared to stop if needed) and wait for clear instructions from the rider.
- Cyclists yield to hikers and runners. Establish verbal communication or eye contact, slow down (be prepared to stop if needed), and pass only after the other user has had a chance to safely move aside.
- Be particularly courteous when overtaking from behind, as people may not hear your approach and be startled. Establish communication. Do not simply shout "on your left" and expect others to immediately move to the right.
- All users, do not block the trail when others are attempting to pass. Move aside when it is safe to do so.
- Dogs are required to be on leashes and under control at all times.

### Respect your open space

- Obey all signs and trail closures.
- Cyclists, do not skid or slide around turns. This damages the trail.
- Non-members cannot be given "permission" to use our trails. KCR trails are private property for the use of members and ID-bracelet-carrying houseguests only.
- Avoid muddy trails. Ruts and hoof-prints damage the trail and must be repaired.
- If you leave tracks, turn back: If you're leaving tracks, then the trail is too wet. Please turn around and come back when conditions are drier. Horses are particularly damaging to wet trails.
- Wait 48: It's a good rule of thumb to wait 48 hours after any significant rainfall or after snow has melted.
- In winter, trails are generally more solid in the morning and get sloppier in the afternoon.
- If you find yourself in mud unexpectedly, just go through it. Do not go
  off-trail to avoid the mud. This widens the trail, kills plants and increases







### Bradford Becoming K-8 School in 2016-17

In early December, the Jefferson County Board of Education approved a proposal to transition Bradford Elementary to a kindergarten through eighth-grade school. Currently, Bradford Elementary is separated into two campuses. Bradford Primary, located at 1 White Oak, houses kindergarten through third grade, and Bradford Intermediate, located at 2 Woodruff, has fourth through sixth grade.

Bradford will offer seventh grade starting with the 2016-17 school year, and eighth grade will be added in the 2017-18 school year. Bradford Primary will continue to have K-3, and seventh and eighth grade will be at the Intermediate School, at least for the foreseeable future. The grade levels may switch campuses depending on enrollment numbers for future years. Currently, there are a few empty classrooms at the Intermediate School, so no additional space will be needed for the seventh and eighth graders.

Bradford K-8 will be the home school for all students residing in the Bradford boundary area. The option to open enroll at any school will be exactly the same as in the past, and students in the Chatfield area may attend schools with the same priority as previous years.

Starting with the 2017-18 school year, Bradford students who prefer to attend Deer Creek Middle School will need to apply through the choice enrollment process. Busing to Deer Creek will still be offered through the 2018-19 school year.

According to program information submitted to the Jeffco School Board, there are no additional facilities costs for implementation of the K-8 program. Minimal start-up costs have been identified through a budget modeling process organized with the budget department and school administration. These startup costs will be covered by funds from additional enrollment, carry-forward funds from Bradford Primary, PTA and community partnerships. It is projected that no additional funds will be needed for the first year.

Bradford K-8 will offer an expeditionary/ experiential learning model that is based on the belief that students learn more by experiencing the world. Part of the expeditionary/experiential learning model focuses on making kids more responsible

in the community by teaming up students to work on projects with various local agencies such as Waterton Canyon and the Water District. This learning model will enhance and be incorporated into the current Jeffco curriculum.

**According to Bradford Primary** Principal Gene Lewis and Bradford Intermediate Principal Sam Palamara, Bradford began exploring the K-8 option in 2003, but the change didn't begin to materialize until earlier in 2015. Both principals constructed a K-8 framework for the community to review and provide input. Strong community support was evident at community meetings and in survey results. The Bradford K-8 proposal was also discussed with and supported by area principals, achievement directors and district leadership.

The Bradford K-8 configuration is the first step in developing a more consistent, systemic plan for all the schools in the Chatfield articulation area. Currently, some area elementary schools are K-5 and some are K-6. Falcon Bluffs Middle School is 6-8, and Deer Creek Middle School is 7-8 for their core program and 6-8 for their




STEM (Science Technology Engineering Math) program. Area principals and Jeffco administrators are discussing the idea of making the Chatfield articulation area elementary schools K-5 and both middle schools 6-8. Bradford will encompass both elementary and middle school. These plans are still in discussion, and community input will be sought in the future.

### **Christmas Morning at the Manor House**

Ken-Caryl Ranch resident Tom Ryan captured this beautiful photo of the Manor House early on Christmas morning. The Manor House is privately owned and is used as an event center.

Regarding the history of the Manor House, on Oct. 17, 1914, John Charles Shaffer purchased the first 2,660 acres of what would become Ken-Caryl Ranch for \$100,000. He and his wife, Virginia Conser Shaffer, named it Ken-Caryl after their sons, Kent and Carroll.

The Denver Times reported that "Mr. Shaffer gave instructions for the drawing of plans for a summer home modeled on the colonial style, to cost approximately \$100,000. This building will be situated on the highest portion of the estate and is prophesied to become the nucleus of a colony of summer retreats for millionaires."

When it was built, the Manor House included 8,000 square feet of living area, with 20 rooms and six baths. The living room was 80 feet long, with fireplaces at the western and eastern ends. Sunrooms at either end of the house completed the floor plan. The veranda was deep and cool, with columns two stories high.



# Ken-Caryl Ranch Becomes a Firewise Community

Ken-Caryl Ranch is taking action to reduce our wildfire risk and improve safety. We are happy to announce that we've received recognition status as a Firewise Community. There are more than 1,200 recognized Firewise communities across the nation taking action and ownership in preparing and protecting their homes against the threat of wildfire.

Using a five-step process, communities develop an action plan that guides their residential risk reduction activities, while engaging and encouraging their neighbors to become active participants in building a safer place to live.

Ken-Caryl Ranch has adopted a Forest Stewardship Plan to manage the wildfire hazards and forest health needs of the open space areas. There is also a Community Wildfire Mitigation Plan that helps identify measures that recognize wildfire threats, enhance safety for residents and improve community awareness.

Attendees at the Ken-Caryl Ranch Spring Fling in May were able to interact with Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Rangers, West Metro Fire Rescue firefighters, and Colorado State Forest Service staff and ask questions specific to their homes and neighborhoods. Residents learned about wildfires in Colorado and around Ken-Caryl Ranch, and how to reduce this threat to their homes through vegetation and architectural management.

To reduce natural fuels, Ken-Caryl Ranch homeowners who border open space areas can mow up to four feet in width along their property lines. On Jan. 19, the Master Association Board will be discussing a recommendation to increase the mowing area to 10 feet. Contact the KCR Park Rangers for more information. These adjacent homeowners who want to determine what they can do to address wildfire hazards on their own properties can contact the Colorado State Forest Service for an assessment and report. The Colorado State Forest Service District Office in Golden can also provide additional free information concerning wildfire mitigation issues and actions. The office can be reached at 303-279-9757. 



# Don't Forget to Sign Up if You Want Optional Trash and Recycling Totes

Residents now have the option of continuing to use their own trash and recycling containers (either trash cans or bags) or of using 96-gallon totes provided at no charge by Waste Connections. The totes have wheels and are 42 inches tall, the top measures 30x34 inches, and the bottom is 24x24 inches. Trash and recycling service will be weekly as it is now.

If you prefer to use the totes, send an email to kencarylco@wasteconnections. com or call the Ranch House at 303-979-1876. In the email or phone message, say

that you want to sign up for totes and provide your name, address, email address and phone number. You can request both trash and recycling totes, just a trash tote, or just a recycling tote. Waste Connections will deliver totes to your home sometime in January. If you want to continue using your own containers, you do not need to do anything. Your service will continue as is. If you decide that you would like to use the tote system at a later date, you can sign up at that time.

### KCR Water and Sanitation District Board Approves Water & Sewer Rate Increases for 2016

Because of increases in costs of providing water and sanitary sewer service, including increases by Denver Water for wholesale water service and the City of Littleton for sewage treatment service, your rates for water and sanitary sewer service will increase effective Jan. 1, 2016.

Water Rate Increase for 2016

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Water and Sanitation District purchases its water from Denver Water, In 2016, Denver Water is expected to increase the Water District's water cost by 3.3 percent, plus additional fees being instituted by Denver Water will result in an increase in charges to the Water District by Denver Water of approximately 4 percent. As a result, the Water District increased its water rate effective Jan. 1, 2016, by 2 percent to help offset Denver Water's expected rate increase in 2016. The 2016 minimum residential bi-monthly water charge will be \$52.86 for the first 10,000 gallons; that's an increase of \$1.04 on your minimum bi-monthly water bill.

The Water District has a four-tiered rate structure, so any water usage above 10,000 gallons is priced to recover additional costs of providing service and to encourage customers to use water more efficiently.

Please visit the Water District's website (kencarylwater.org) to see the tiered water rate structure for usage above the 10,000 gallons allowed in the minimum bi-monthly charge.

Sanitary Sewer Increase in 2016

The Water District has a contract with the City of Littleton to treat the sanitary sewage from the District. The City of Littleton will increase sanitary sewer treatment costs by 2 percent in 2016. The Water District will pass-through the 2 percent increase to its customers. Residential customers will see their bi-monthly sewer bill increase by \$1.10 effective Jan. 1, 2016. The present bi-monthly sanitary sewer charge is \$54.81, which will increase to \$55.91.

Water and Sewer fees collected by the Water District cover the cost of purchasing water and paying for sewer treatment. The fees collected are also used to pay for the operation and maintenance expenses associated with the Water District's own water distribution system and sanitary sewer collection system including repairs, capital improvements and administration. The Water District does not receive any tax revenue from its customers and solely operates from water and sewer fees.

Bills received on and after Jan. 1, 2016, will reflect the new rates.
