Having lived my entire life in the state of Colorado, I was surprised during the second weekend in January when I learned of the weather phrase "mega-ridge". Apparently, it is a massive ridge of high pressure that forms to create unseasonable warm, dry weather. This particular megaridge is set to stick around for six or more days and impact much of the western half of the United States. I can't help but "think spring" before we have even crossed the halfway mark of January!

These warm days make it a fitting time to highlight an amazing community asset and how you can get involved. The Ken-Caryl Community Garden (KCCG) is in your Ken-Caryl community, adjacent to the Community Center, and hosts 38 plots. The garden is enclosed by an eight-foothigh decorative fence and complementary two-foot-high rabbit fence, helping to discourage unwanted guests. 

By "party", I mean celebrating December

By "over", I mean it's time to take down your holiday decorations and lights.

By "piper", I mean the HOA and/or myself. By "friend", I mean all the wonderful residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch!

It is true that our wonderful December holidays are over and it is time to take down your decorations and lights.

I know just how much you all love reading and learning about the covenants, so I thought I would tickle your fancy and provide some quality reading material as it pertains to holiday decorations and lights.

As a reminder, Architectural Committee approval is required for Permanent Holiday Lighting Installations, such as Jellyfish lighting and similar installations. As you know, Permanent Holiday Lighting installations may be illuminated no earlier than one month in advance of the holiday and must be turned off within one week following the holiday...unless it's for traditional December holidays. In that case, permanent lighting shall not

be illuminated before Nov. 1 and shall be turned off by Feb. 1.

You don't need Architectural Committee approval for Temporary Holiday Lighting and Decorations. With the exception of traditional December holidays, temporary decorations and lighting may be put up no earlier than one month in advance of the holiday and must be unplugged, removed, taken down, shoved in boxes, wadded in balls and stored in the garage, basement, attic or your favorite hiding place out of sight of the general public within one week following the holiday. Traditional December holiday decorations and lighting shall not be put up before Nov. 1 and shall be unplugged, taken down, etc., by Feb. 1...which gives you a little more time to show off your creativity and spirit.

Holiday decorations are not permitted to be displayed year-round...which why would you want to? They would not be special if they were up all year!

If you are still hungry for more reading... check out Jefferson County's Zoning Resolution Section 12. Cliffs Notes version: "Holiday lights shall be illuminated for a period of not more than 60 consecutive days nor more than 60 days in any one year." In this case, the "piper" would be Jefferson County Planning and Zoning.

Bonus if you know whose version of "The Party's Over" stayed on the Billboard chart for 11 weeks in 1956...




Michael Ryan Promoted to Full-Time Ranger in Open **Space Program**

Hi, my name is Michael Ryan. I'm a Colorado native, born and raised right here in Littleton. I currently reside in Lakewood with my wife and my mother and brother still live close by in Governor's Ranch. I went to Columbine High School and had many friends who lived in Ken-Caryl, and the Valley was always our favorite area to hike and enjoy the outdoors. Growing up in this area, it's impossible not to fall in love with the fresh air and diverse wildlife that surround us.

While I was attending Metropolitan State University of Denver, where I studied behavioral science with a minor in criminal justice, I began working at Kipling Ace Hardware, where I rented out equipment and checked in machines for service. This was where I discovered a love of figuring out how things work and started to learn about maintaining and fixing equipment.

I began working at Ken-Caryl Ranch as a seasonal ranger in the summer of 2013, right after graduating from college. I was excited about the opportunity to be out in this beautiful area every day. My duties at first were assisting with noxious weed management and trail building. I kept coming back each season because I enjoyed the work, the community and there was always more to learn. Working closely with the park rangers year after year, I realized that what started as a summer job was quickly becoming a passion that I wanted to make into a career.





I became a full-time park ranger in November 2020, and my current responsibilities include general maintenance, mowing, patrol, snow removal, installing fences and other structures, equipment maintenance and wildlife management. Over the past eight years, I've made great friends in Ken-Caryl—humans and animals alike—and learned about everything that goes into preserving this area, from the smallest task to the largest administrative plan.

I've always been drawn to the beauty of Ken-Caryl Valley, and my favorite part of working here is driving into the most scenic workplace imaginable every morning. Some of my favorite spots on the Ranch are the vast meadows on top of Manor House Trail and High Meadow Trail. KCR Volunteer Patroller Program -**Open Registration**

Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers started the Volunteer Patroller Program in 2012 with three volunteers. It has since grown to 30 volunteers in 2020 with over 380 hours volunteered on the trails! Registration for the 2021 Volunteer Patroller Program is currently open and runs through the end of February.

The Volunteer Patrollers serve as an extension of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association's Park Ranger Staff. Volunteer Patrollers provide rules education, trail use guidelines and open space information. Volunteer Patrollers strive to achieve and maintain a positive relationship with different user groups and present a professional image. To be accepted into the program, you must be a Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association member in good standing and submit a signed application and letter of commitment. A short phone interview and a two to three-hour training in the month of March will complete the process. A date and time of the training will be determined by number of applications received.

Basic requirements are to perform at least two trail patrols per month either hiking or biking mainly from May through September, but one can also patrol outside of these months, too. Applicants must be 25 years of age or older, attend trainings and be willing to make routine contacts checking residency and providing basic rules

Patrollers will receive all related training and will be supplied with an open space

patrol vest, volunteer ID, first aid kit and a packet with brochures, patrol log and quick reference sheet. The deadline for all signed applications is Feb. 28 by 5 p.m. Completed forms may be dropped off at the Ranch House or Ranger Office or emailed to matto@kcranch.org.

Columbine Library Offers Curbside and Walk-in Services

Winter is upon us and with more snow and cold temperatures expected, now's the best time to curl up with a good book! Looking for a home library refresh? Columbine Library, part of Jefferson County Public Library, is currently offering both curbside and walk-in services to help you reach your 2021 reading goals for a fireside adventure close to home.

Walk-in Services

Under the guidance from Jeffco Public Health, the library has implemented new capacity limits and service adjustments that allow for walk-in services. At this time, visits to the Columbine Library are limited to one hour or less and staff will provide stickers upon arrival to keep track of visit length. Time limits also include computer use. The library also offers reserved hours for those at high-risk or with health conditions to ensure their safety during the pandemic. Current hours of operation include:

Regular Hours

Monday - Saturday: 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. Sunday: Closed for walk-in service. Please use the library's curbside service

Reserved Hours

For persons with underlying health conditions and those at higher risk of severe illness.

Monday, Wednesday and Saturday: 9 -

Available Services

- One-hour visit times
- · Reference and staff assistance
- Printing / copying / faxing / scanning Computer access
- o Available for one hour. Reserve online or ask for availability when vou visit.
- · Collection access (checkouts /returns/ in-location browsing)

As part of the library's updated COVID-19 Code of Conduct, they have implemented physical distancing and cleaning protocols to create a safer environment for staff and the public. Face coverings will be required for all patrons, except children 10 years old and younger, no medical exceptions. Following ADA requirements, the library will continue to offer modified services to patrons who are medically unable to wear a face covering, such as curbside, home, or online services.

Because library materials are shared resources, the library also encourages patrons to practice good hygiene, including frequent hand washing and other practices recommended by the

Please note that visiting times are currently limited to one-hour or less, and you may experience wait times when

entering buildings due to the library's physical distancing requirements and occupancy limits. The library requests that any patrons experiencing any COVID-19 related symptoms to refrain from visiting any library location.

Curbside Services

Columbine Library is currently offering curbside services for the safe pick up off of all reading and library materials. Simply create an account online and check out your selected materials and follow the below steps:

Step 1: Arrive at Location and Notify Staff

When you arrive, look for a designated curbside pickup space. Call the number on the sign. Let the staff know you're outside and what materials you are here to pick up (holds, printing, tax forms, registration prizes, etc.).

If you don't have a mobile phone, call 303-235-5275 before you leave home to let us know you're coming.

Step 2: Prep for Delivery

If you arrive by car, please open your trunk, car door or window. Either stand a safe distance away from others, or remain in your vehicle.

Step 3: Receive Your Items

A staff member wearing gloves and a face mask will then place your items into your open vehicle as part of their contactless service. Confirm you have all the materials you need and enjoy your items from home!

Please note that during the colder winter months, please consider the weather when planning your visit. The safety of library patrons and staff is of the highest priority. *In certain situations, curbside services may* be temporarily suspended for inclement weather or dangerous conditions. Please confirm your location is open and what services are available before visiting.

Land Development Update

North American Development Group (NADG) purchased land for new home development in the Ken-Caryl Ranch Plains. The potential sale of this land was announced one year ago, and the sale of the land was completed at the end of 2020. This land is privately owned and was not owned by the Master Association. A total of approximately 700 units (singlefamily, townhomes, and multi-family) are proposed over the three parcels of land. The land is currently zoned for residential use and includes the following locations:

- * East of C-470 and north of Ken Caryl Ave. (Parcel A and C)
- Southwest corner of Ken Caryl Ave. and Chatfield Ave. (Parcel B)

NADG updated the draft conceptual site plan for one of the land parcels, called Parcel A, that is located east of C-470 and north of Ken Caryl Ave. in an area known as the North Bowl. The original conceptual plan for this parcel proposed 293 units, but the new draft plan is for 248 units. NADG will send updated conceptual plans for the other two parcels at a later date.

Waste Connections Trash Pick-up Safety Reminder

To protect the safety of our Waste Connections drivers, the following changes to our trash service are currently in place:

- · All large cardboard must be cut and placed inside a recycling container, trash container or garbage bag. No boxes can be set on the curb.
- Household trash will be limited to one filled can (either your personal trash can, or the 96-gallon tote provided by Waste Connections) plus up to three additional bags of trash. (You can leave out one filled can and three bags on the side.) If you have yard waste, it must be either in your trash can or in the three extra bags.
- Recycling service will be normal, and they will pick up any recycling inside your regular containers. No extra boxes will be picked up from the curb.
- No bulk items may be placed out, such as mattresses, furniture, etc. This will ensure efficient operations and will protect the safety of the drivers.
- Communities with dumpsters will continue to receive the same service. Please be sure all items are placed inside the dumpster, not beside it.
- Small recycling bins may still be used for broken down cardboard and other recyclables.

Dear Editor:

Please watch out for any reintroduction of mountain bike racing into our open space. This activity is dangerous, it damages the trails and we do not need the headaches.

Resident Colin Voorhees mentioned my name in a letter to the editor. He indicated that he grew up here and never witnessed mountain bike racing. Well, the Aug. 19, 2009 Life at Ken-Caryl front page describes KCR mountain bike races and the last race finished at the Manor House trailhead. Some people make misleading statements, but I feel that the implications in his entire first paragraph cannot be substantiated. I do not recall a mountain biker being rude to me personally, even though there were near accidents in 2020. One mountain biker almost ran into a female colleague and I while we were hiking. The mountain biker said nothing. He also sped passed a family of six.

Another incident occurred on the Bradford Trail at a blind turn in the tall rock area. He was very courteous. False accusations are regrettable, but can be personally damaging.

Mr. Voorhees used the words: "spreading misinformation" among other words. Big mistake. He associated my name with "permanent closure of certain trails". Constructive criticism is productive; misleading statements are counterproductive. I feel some trails should never have been built, such as the Docmann Trail, especially in its present form.

As predicted, the golden eagles have disappeared, but what affect did it have on the population of other raptors and the ovenbirds? I feel KCR has fallen behind other communities by not having a Conservation Protected Area. Trails do not have to be closed, but merely restrict mountain biking from some areas for safety or other concerns. In my opinion, it is the excessive risk-takers and some mountain bike racing advocates that are the root of the problems: the environmental concerns, the accidents, the excessive trail expansion and the controversial trail plan frustrations. Furthermore, the MA Board could

develop a more comprehensive written safety standard than the one that merely references bicycle speeding. I feel what presently exists is inadequate and needs clarification.

Dear Editor:

With the upcoming MA election, residents should consider how much transparency they would like to see from their governing bodies. Most people are probably disgusted at the national level by the intolerance and enmity between two parties of approximately equal support and ask why they can't all try to find some common ground. Yet such intolerance is replicated here in Ken-Caryl, where the "build more trails" faction disregards the views of residents who do not want any further desecration of undisturbed open space.

While the MA Board ostensibly provides a forum for resident comments, it is the Open Space Committee which has recommended building every single trail proposed in the 2009 Trails Master Plan, notwithstanding the environmental concerns raised by the studies commissioned in advance of making such recommendations. The Board has rubber stamped all these recommendations, telling those residents who opposed that they should have spoken at OSC meetings.

Why is the Open Space Committee, charged with finding a balance between conservation and recreation, so onesided? Might it be because there is never an email link in the Ken-Caryl "E-news" to their agendas? Or that the only way to find out their agenda beforehand is to make a specific request, or to go to the OSC website just 24 hours before the

meeting? Would more people attend OSC meetings if they knew that the subjects of discussion were yet more trails? Or have preservation-minded residents given up because their comments are simply ianored?

To all residents: are you aware that in addition to the proposed construction of the new three-mile "Docmann South/ Wildcat Ridge" trail, the Board has approved the concrete paving of a dirt trail near Deerwood Vista, turning a "rural walk" into a "paved road"? And that the OSC has proposed a new Stove Prairie trail which was not in the TMP?

Please ask kristenp@kcranch.org to be added to the OSC agenda circulation list and attend the OSC meetings so that the Committee can see the level of frustration with their complete disregard of the need to preserve the beauty that we used to have here.

As we begin 2021, the KCR community should look forward and contemplate what kind of a legacy is being left for our children, grandchildren and future residents. In the beginning years of KCR, there was a license plate frame that could be purchased that said "Ken-Caryl Ranch True Colorado Living". That

was before 20 + miles of dirt trails were added to our foothills, when we had an elk herd that roamed KCR property and a larger abundance of deer, coyotes, foxes, bobcats and bear, as well as mountain lions were seen occasionally. More raptors, owls, wild turkey, turkey vultures and many ground nesting birds and butterflies were seen as they had more unfragmented hunting habitats and food sources for them to thrive. Now, we have visible scars of trails on our foothills, fencing around many neighborhoods that are in disrepair, as well as common areas where trees have been removed (without replacement) and generally look uncared

Now that voting for two MA Board members will begin in a few weeks, I ask that you look for candidates that will vote to bring KCR's beauty back to life, and by respecting resident wishes, that the past resident surveys have shown. The Plains and the Valley are one large community. For way too long, the Valley has been the recipient of a large portion (for dirt trails recommended by the Open Space Committee) of our HOA dues, leaving the Plains with exterior fencing (one subject brought up numerous times) in very poor shape, as well as requested bathroom facilities in Community Park being unfulfilled and other aesthetic improvements.

Let's get KCR back to the natural beauty it used to be. The only way this is possible is by your voicing objections to altering KCR properties at Open Space Committee meetings, your voice at MA Board meetings and voting in Board members that are truly serving the whole KCR community and not a self-serving interest group.


