At the end of this year our current fiveyear contract for trash and recycling services with Waste Connections will be completed. Recently we sent out Requests for Proposals to five qualified haulers seeking bids for a new contract. We received three proposals, and the one from Waste Connections was deemed the most advantageous by the Board. Therefore, we will be entering into a

new five-year contract with this company.

Waste Connections provided three options for service: to continue the status quo, to provide totes for both trash and recycling on a weekly schedule, and a third option where they would provide totes and collect trash each week but go to an every other week recycling service. There will also be an option for composting. We plan to ask for your input on these options using an online survey tool. Please watch the Monday e-News or check our website, www. ken-carylranch.org, for a link to the survey because your opinion matters.

The Board is also interested in your thoughts about the future of our neighborhood signs. Please see article on page 17 for more information and let me know what you think.



Board Meeting Summaries

Metro District Board

On Sept. 29, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a Regular Meeting of the Board and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

- The Board approved a motion for a services agreement with Comprehensive Risk Services for hazardous materials abatement services for the Ranch House and Dakota Lodge bond projects.
- The Board received an update on new fitness equipment at the Community Center following the renovation of the facility for the bond projects.
- The Board received an update on the construction of the Veterans Monument at Community Park. Tiles and honor bricks were installed, and the dedication ceremony is set for Nov. 7 at noon.
- The Board received an update from staff on the 2015 aquatics program.
- The Board discussed the status of the draft 2016 budget. A proposed 2016 budget will be available by Oct. 15.
- The Board reviewed a regular monthly report of expenditures for the bond
- The Board received an update on the status of the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) contract with Adolfson & Peterson for the bond projects. The GMP will be considered by the Board at the Oct. 6 Joint Study Session.

Joint Study Session

On Sept. 29, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards held a Joint Study Session at the Ranch House and discussed the following items:

- Three residents in attendance informed the Boards they felt maintained turf areas near their homes were very important and requested that the Boards consider this when planning for implementation of the Landscape Master Plan.
- Vanir Construction Management presented an update on the status of the bond projects. The Guaranteed Maximum Price from Adolfson & Peterson will be presented to both Boards at the Oct. 6 Joint Study Session.

Architectural Accents

Sheds and Winter Storage

As we enter the beautiful autumn season on Ken-Caryl Ranch many folks are finishing outdoor projects. In particular, I see numerous painting and landscape contractors at work in our neighborhoods.

As we head into the winter months, there is also preparation in cleaning up the yard, storing landscape equipment and finding space for play items during the winter. Storage sheds and cabinets are surely an option for creating additional space to protect items and screen them from neighbors' view.

Section 3.01 of our Home Improvement Rules, Guidelines and Information provides just what you need to know regarding the look and site location for these items - check this information prior to installing any accessory buildings. In general, the intent is to keep our yards neat, organized and aesthetically pleasing. The above-mentioned document can be found on our website at www.kencarylranch.org, and of course I am happy to provide copies here at the Ranch House as well. Rules Concerning Homes Bordering Open Space

Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers routinely monitor open space lands adjacent to 850 homes looking for encroachments and landscape violations. This interface area is 17.5 miles in length. The open space is owned by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association (KCRMA). In an effort to minimize impact to open space, the KCRMA Board of Directors incorporated the Open Space & Parks Rules and Enforcement Policy regarding open space violations next to homes. The following are examples of open space violations and how they impact the resources contained in our open space.

Dumping

Includes grass clippings, branches, other yard waste, dog feces and construction debris. Harm to the open space includes yard waste containing seeds of non-native plants that can germinate and crowd out native and other desirable plants in the open space. Dump piles can provide habitat for rodents and snakes that you may not want living close to your house. The open space is not a public dumping area, but is shared by everyone to enjoy.

Driving in Open Space

Includes contractors using open space to access owner's property, transportation of materials, ATVs or any other unauthorized vehicles in open space. Harm to the open space includes destruction of property, weed invasions, unsightly scars, erosion of bare soil and potential ignition source for wildfires.



Excessive Mowing

Includes mowing beyond the allowed four-foot wide swath where private property meets open space. Excessive mowing prevents seed development of native plants, not allowing them to reseed. Some native plants can be killed by excessive mowing, and variations in excessive mowing create an unsightly mosaic of the private property/open space boundaries.

Structures

The following structures are prohibited: retaining walls, pathways or trails, extension of private landscaping, birdfeeders, play equipment (swing sets, trampolines, etc.), invisible dog fences, other fences or any other structures. The use of open space for personal benefit is unfair to other property

Planting in Open Space

Includes trees, shrubs, non-native vegetation, or any other non-approved plantings. Planting non-native species can compete with native species. If a resident is interested in planting in open space, they may submit a planting plan to the KCRMA Open Space Committee for approval.

Enforcement Procedure

If a KCR Rules Violation is found adjacent to your property, you will be issued a KCR Contact Notice requiring you to stop and/ or clean up the area by a deadline. Failure to meet the mitigation deadline may result in a second Contact Notice.

Any two or more violations or Contact Notices for the same violation within a 36-month period may result in a Notice of Hearing to appear before the KCRMA Board of Directors and penalties can be imposed.

Note: Residents are responsible for the actions of their contractors. When a contractor is driving on open space, dumping material, installing a fence in open space, etc., the resident will be cited and expected to mitigate the violation.

The main point regarding these violations is that any damage to open space grasses allows noxious weeds to grow. If a new weed area is established, then resources have to be redistributed from other areas to stop this new growth, straining the ranger staff. In addition, noxious weeds can spread onto a homeowner's property. • Flu Vaccines

Four-Strain (Quadrivalent) Flu Vaccination Clinics at the Community Center

The Colorado Flu Shot Company will be providing the four-strain (Quadrivalent) flu vaccine at fall family flu vaccination clinics at the Community Center. The new Quadrivalent flu vaccine protects against two strains of Influenza A and two strains of Influenza B. It provides broader coverage against the flu than the Trivalent vaccine. The flu vaccination is recommended by the CDC for anyone 6 months and older. Vaccinations will be provided by a Pediatric RN.

Higher-risk people include those with heart, lung or kidney disease; with nervous system disorders; with a compromised immune system; who are pregnant; and young children/infants. Younger children are most at risk for secondary infections such as pneumonia, bronchitis and ear infections. Complications from the virus result in more childhood hospitalizations than any other vaccine-preventable disease. School-age children/students are also the most common source of spreading the virus.

Intranasal Flu Mist Quadrivalent Preservative Free: \$40 (2 to 49 years old without chronic diseases)

Flu Shot Quadrivalent: \$40 (for ages 6 months and older)

Dates: Sundays, Oct. 4, 11, 18, 25 and Nov. 1

Time: 1-4 p.m. No appointment necessary.

Location: Community Center

Payment: Cash/Check/Visa/MasterCard accepted.

Parental consent is required for children under 18 years of age. The Colorado Flu Shot Company also provides all vaccinations including those for international travel (yellow fever, typhoid, meningococcal, polio). A travel appointment is necessary. New Dues Payment Options in 2016; Coupon Books No Longer Automatically Provided

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association is looking forward to a change in our dues collection process beginning in 2016.

Many of you (almost 80 percent) pay your dues electronically without using a paper coupon. So in an effort to keep up with our paperless society, effective Jan. 1, 2016, we will no longer be automatically providing paper coupons. However, if you would like to receive a monthly invoice, we can email one to you each month. Your email address will be kept confidential and used only for KCRMA business.

If you would still like to receive a paper coupon book for 2016 we can order one for you upon request; there will be a fee of \$5. 

• Fire Restrictions

Temporary Stage 1 Fire Restrictions Issued for All Areas of Unincorporated Jefferson County

Effective at 5 p.m. on Sept. 24, Sheriff Jeff Shrader issued Stage 1 Fire Restrictions for all areas of unincorporated Jefferson County, which includes all of Ken-Caryl Ranch.

Activities Prohibited Under Stage 1 Fire Restrictions:

- Building, maintaining, attending or using any fire or recreational campfire, except a recreational fire within a permanently constructed fire grate in a developed park, campground, private residence, or picnic area. NOTE: Residents with private residential recreational campfires exempted as described above are encouraged to contact their local fire agency and advise start and finish times to alleviate smoke check responses.
- Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area of at least six feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all combustible material.

- Open burning including "bonfires" that require a permit from the fire authority having jurisdiction, will not be allowed during these restrictions.
- The use of illegal fireworks is prohibited within Jefferson County. (Illegal fireworks are generally defined as anything that leaves the ground or explodes).

Exemptions Approved Under Stage 1 Fire Restrictions:

- Use of liquid or gas fueled appliances.
- · Approved wood pellet grills.
- Charcoal barbeque grills not closer than 30 feet from an undeveloped area.
- Portable outdoor fireplaces not closer than 30 feet from an undeveloped area.
- Fire department / district training fires.
- Recreational fires, Tiki torches, chimineas and fire pits. Items must be 30 feet from an undeveloped area.
- Welding and cutting torch appliances may only be operated in an area no closer than 30 feet from an undeveloped area.

- Permitted fires by persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act such as professional fireworks displays. Contact must be made with the permitting authority to verify the status of permits issued prior to the establishment of burn restrictions.
- Burning of explosive wastes by manufacturer of explosives in areas zoned for industrial use, when the burning is supervised by the fire protection district.
- Open fires or open burning by any federal, state or local officer in the performance of official fire suppression functions.

Individuals operating under any of the above exemptions shall take adequate measures to prevent uncontrolled fires. Possible measures include, but are not limited to:

- Containers of adequate water or dry soil nearby.
- Shovels, fire extinguishers or other extinguishing agents nearby.
- Coordination with the local fire department or district to be on scene or standby during an activity.

Ken-Caryl Ranch Hazard Tree Reduction Project

In spring 2015 the Colorado State Forest Service – Golden District (CSFS) entered into a service agreement with the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association to oversee the implementation and completion of a hazard tree reduction project in Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space (KCROS).

In accordance with the KCROS forest stewardship plan, Colorado State Forest Service (CSFS) staff has identified approximately 420 trees in KCROS that pose a potential threat to the safety of trail users. Work sites were identified along Massey Draw, Shaffer, Lost Canyon and High Meadow Trails.

Trees were deemed hazardous if they were dead or severely damaged and located within 2.5 times their own height of any trail. CSFS has clearly marked all hazardous trees for removal with a vertical stripe of blue paint. For safety, trees will be cut as near to the ground as possible, and tree boles are required to be in contact with the ground. Trees that fall across a trail will have the section of the stem covering the trail removed along with any limbs within 10 feet of the trail. To retain a natural-looking forest, limbing will not be required otherwise.

In July 2015, bids were solicited for the treatment of all identified hazardous trees in KCROS. All bids were reviewed by CSFS, and recommendations were presented to the KCRMA Board of Directors at their August meeting. The KCRMA Board selected P&A Forestry as the contractor for the project. The project is set to start in late October dependent on weather and work site conditions. Because trails will not be closed while work is performed, a KCROS Ranger will be at the work site to control trail traffic and ensure public safety. During the project, CSFS will make semi-weekly visits to the project site to check on work progress and ensure compliance with prescribed standards.

Making a Difference

Lisa and Neil DeJong spent years cultivating their water-wise garden at their home at 7573 Cottonwood Mountain in Aspen Meadows. They wanted a yard that provided maximum enjoyment for both the gardener and for the other "residents" such as birds, plants, pets, butterflies and other beneficial insects while also minimizing the cost of water, chemical fertilizers and soil amendments.

The DeJongs haven't turned on their sprinkler system in more than 10 years. They hand-water only and have really seen the benefit on their water bill.

"Our evolved garden has a lot to do with being on a budget," said Neil. "You have to be patient." He said they learned from their planting mistakes and realized certain plants just didn't work well in their yard.

The DeJongs wanted to emphasize that almost anyone can turn their yard into a water-wise garden, no matter the budget or skill level. They slowly implemented their changes over several years in order to spread out the cost. They also took advantage of free or low-cost landscaping materials on CraigsList and clearance plants at nurseries at the end of the season.

They recommend designing the space using plants, rocks, mulch, pea gravel





or stone. There are landscape design books at the library to help you plan. The DeJongs suggest buying perennials that are drought-resistant (water-wise) and that bloom at different times throughout the spring, summer and fall for maximum impact.

A few examples of water-wise plants that the DeJongs recommend are: coneflower, daisy, dianthus, pin cushion, candy tuft, Russian sage, salvias, hot poker, culinary sage, coreopsis, succulents, sedums, tea roses, summer snow, bulbs and lamb's ear.







Jeffco League of Women Voters to Discuss Ballot Issues, Income Inequality

November ballot issue pros and cons as well as a follow-up on an income inequality study are on the agenda for the Tuesday, Oct. 13 Jeffco League of Women Voters unit meeting in the Chatfield area at 9:15 a.m. The meeting is at St. Philip Lutheran Church, 7531 S. November ballot issues include Proposition BB, the Library Mill Levy and local ballot issues. Proposition BB, if passed, allows the state to keep the tax revenue from the sale of marijuana that otherwise would be refunded for exceeding limitations under TABOR. It would allow Colorado to spend the tax revenue to provide \$40 million for public school construction and other needs, rather than refunding it to marijuana businesses and other marijuana-related education and public programs.

The Library Mill Levy is a ballot initiative that would increase the maximum mill levy for the Jefferson County Library from 3.5 to 4.5 mills in order to restore the level of library services, such as hours, materials and updated technology.

A sample ballot will be distributed to explain how to cast a vote in regard to the school board recall and candidates. The second part of the meeting will be a follow-up on the Income Inequality meetings held last February. Members will review and vote on a proposed concurrence statement.



Open House and Other Historical Society Activities

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society has had a busy and productive year. The unusually late spring freeze, followed by record-breaking rains posed several challenges to the Bradford Park area.

The Bradford Orchard apple trees were professionally pruned in March for general upkeep and to reduce fireblight. Unfortunately we lost the small apple trees planted in 2014 to the freezing May weather, and the apple harvest was non-existent. During the spring and early summer, Dutch Creek flooded through the meadow, and the grass was extraordinarily lush and tall. Open Space

staff mowed the grass several times and Historical Society members weeded the area around the little trees twice over the summer.

The wet weather postponed continuing restoration work on the Massey Draw Pump House, which had fallen into disrepair. Steve and Lori Kraft volunteered to work on this project and have done an outstanding job of cleaning up, replacing and matching the weathered wood, firming up the foundation, and reroofing the building. The pump house is on the north side of the draw, just west of the Equestrian Center.

Building Restoration Specialties conducted some scheduled maintenance on the Bradford-Perley House in September. The work included replacing a cracked stone window lintel and about a dozen stones on the southern facade, reconstructing the supports to a door lintel, and inspecting and repointing the mortar joints. The work was completed just in time for the Open House on Sept. 18 to celebrate the listing of the House and surrounding property on the National Register of Historic Places. About 50 people took advantage of the opportunity to tour the House with docents available to tell the history of the orchard, well, and various archaeological sites. Jim Antes, who prepared the nomination for the National Register, presented a short program of the history of the House.

Historical Society members have also enjoyed field trips to Little John's Chimney with Rangers Sean Warren and Peter Marozas, and to Colorow's Cave in Willowbrook. In April we also participated in a field trip on local history for the Bradford Primary second-graders.

In other news, the artifacts that were displayed in the Ranch House have been temporarily removed while the Bond Project construction is underway. The History of Ken-Caryl Ranch, available online through the KCR website, has been updated, but the oral histories are currently unavailable through the Jefferson County Public Library while a new vendor is being procured.

The top focus is for the 1,000+ single soldiers who will immediately move into an empty/barren barracks room after their arrival home. Top needs for their barracks are:

- Twin-sized bed sheets, comforters, pillows and pillow cases.
- Small edible items for gift bags that can be placed in the rooms so soldiers don't have to go looking for food if they arrive in the middle of the night. (e.g. Bottled Water, Gatorade, nuts, chips, trail mix, granola bars, candy bars)
- Individual laundry soap packets/pods
- "Good"Toilet Paper. (The Army will provide

Government Supply System Toilet Paper, which is universally scorned.)

The Columbine Chapter's goal, through the 44 Colorado Chapters of DAR and public donations, is to provide as many of the Barrack Boxes to those 1,000+ soldiers to welcome them home and support them in their redeployment. This is being accomplished through donations, the work of our members, and volunteers from DAR and the public. We welcome all material or cash donations for this project.

DAR is a not-for-profit organization, and we will be gathering items on Saturday, Oct. 10, between 11:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. at the South Metro Chamber of Commerce in the Streets of Southglenn, 2154 E Commons Ave #342, in Centennial. Proposed Policy Will Do Away with **Individual Neighborhood Signs**

The recently completed Community Master Plan supports resident desires for "more consistency between neighborhoods." The Master Association Board of Directors supports this approach. With the new community entry signs, the Board is seeking to present a unified community image and believes that the individual neighborhood signs are no longer necessary nor appropriate.

Many neighborhoods have multiple entrances that do not all benefit from having a sign. Therefore there is limited help in finding your way to a specific neighborhood. The Board also feels that the signs are visual clutter, and their removal will improve the overall image of our community. With many people using phones or car navigation systems, the need for signs to help direct folks is reduced. The cost to replace all of the neighborhood signs (assuming a cost of \$15,000 each) would likely be in excess of \$450,000. Therefore, the Board is planning to adopt the following policy:

The Master Association will no longer be maintaining any neighborhood signs. However, if individual neighborhoods would like to keep their existing sign they will be able to as long as they are able to continue to maintain the sign in good condition at their own expense. Any signs that are not "claimed" by the neighborhood will be removed and the landscape modified. If a neighborhood wishes to replace their sign now or at some later time, the new sign will need to be designed so as to be consistent with the newly adopted "family" of signs that are represented around the community. The individual neighborhood will be responsible for the cost to replace the sign.

How do I obtain an absentee ballot when I am away at college next year?

Take heart, Olivia. Abundant resources are available to future voters. The League of Women Voters is dedicated to helping voters and is a nonpartisan political organization encouraging informed and active participation in government. The League never supports nor opposes any political party or candidate.

A primary League activity is Voter Service and Education, which we accomplish by presenting unbiased information about elections, the voting process and issues. We fund these activities from the LWV's Education Fund, a 501(c)(3) corporation, a nonprofit educational organization.

We provide informative brochures such as our annual Citizens Guide and Your Voice Your Vote, which include voting qualifications, registration and general voting information. This Election Day presents a great opportunity for the people of Jeffco to have their voices heard. On the ballot are many issues but none more important than the make-up of the Jeffco Board of Education. My concern is that the lack of transparency and accountability among the current Board majority (Ken Witt, John Newkirk and Julie Williams) takes away that very fundamental responsibility of an elected board: the representation of all the people of Jeffco.

- A few examples:
- The board majority interviewed and selected its own lawyer at a cost of around \$90,000/year without consulting with the other two board members.

- The board majority has been inconsistent in applying rules for groups that want to address issues at board meetings. This is neither fair, nor part of a transparent, collaborative process.

- Only one superintendent finalist was introduced to the community, and community input was limited to 45 minutes. This despite the fact that it came after a three-month search that cost the district \$40,000 paid to a private search firm.
- The board majority has no respect for past collaboration. During the 2010 recession, Jeffco teachers voluntarily agreed to pay cuts and freezes, and our district committed to making up for that when more money came in from the state. Instead, this board majority spends money on its own agenda and teachers are receiving a 1% raise.

I believe the board owes it to Jeffco citizens to be more accountable for how it spends money and more transparent in how it makes decisions. That is why I'm supporting the Recall of Ken Witt, John Newkirk and Julie Williams. I will also be supporting the candidacies of Ali Lasell, Amanda Stevens, Susan Harmon, Brad Rupert and Ron Mitchell this fall. Please consider voting for these experienced community members who've worked collaboratively on school decisions through their volunteer efforts.

Library News

Library Board Seeks to Secure Library Services with Mill Levy Initiative

The Jefferson County Public Library (JCPL) Board of Trustees has resolved to restore Library services and secure the future of the Library by placing a mill levy initiative on the November 2015 ballot.

"The Library has not had a mill levy increase since 1986," said Ray Elliott, chair of the Library Board of Trustees. "Since then, the demand for library services has exploded. Population has grown by 30 percent, and we're serving 240,000 more cardholders, hosting 1.6 million more visits and circulating 6.1 million more items than we did 30 years ago. With ongoing advances in information and communication technology, it has become clear to us that we can no longer deliver 21st century library services on a 20th century budget."

The Library's financial challenges intensified with the recent recession. Since 2008, the Library has had to reduce service hours, reduce its investment in books and materials, lay off employees, reduce investments in technology, and delay capital maintenance projects unless they were critical to library operations or patron safety. These reductions have had a devastating effect on library service levels. In fact, Jefferson County Public Library now ranks in the bottom quartile in key service measures when compared to other public libraries of similar size and service areas.









The trustees are seeking to increase the library's mill levy from a maximum of 3.5 mills to a maximum of 4.5 mills. The one-mill increase will cost owners of a typical Jeffco home about \$1.95 more per month in property taxes. The additional revenues will enable the library to restore library services to pre-recession levels, including:

- Expanding open hours at all JCPL libraries
- Restoring the Library's investment in books and materials
- Updating computers, Internet access and other technology
- Repairing and refurbishing library buildings
- Stabilizing the Library's finances.
