(either trash cans or bags) or of using 96-gallon totes provided at no charge by Waste Connections. The totes have wheels and are 42 inches tall, the top measures 30x34 inches, and the bottom is 24x24 inches. Trash and recycling service will be weekly as it is now.

If you prefer to use the totes, send an email to kencarylco@wasteconnections.com or call the Ranch House at 303-979-1876. In the email or phone message, say that you want to sign up for totes and provide your name, address, email address and phone number. You can request both trash and recycling totes, just a trash tote, or just a recycling tote. Waste Connections will deliver totes to your home for a January start date. If you want to continue using your own containers, you do not need to do anything. Your service will continue as is. If you decide that you would like to use the tote system at a later date, you can sign up at that time.

Reminder - If you are interested in using the trash and recycling totes in 2016, be sure to sign up by sending an email to kencarylco@wasteconnections.com or calling the Ranch House at 303-979-1876. When you email or call, say that you want to sign up for totes and provide your name, address, phone number and email address. Just to be clear, if you choose this system, you may also place out up to six bags or bundles of yard waste each week in addition to the trash tote.

At their November business meeting, the Master Association Board took action to adopt the 2016 Budget (see article on page 3). Included in the adopted budget is an expenditure of \$43,000 to extend the addition to the Dakota Lodge by 288 square feet. This addresses a concern that was expressed by residents during the planning process that the new room would be too small. However, this cost was not able to be included in the bond budget so the Board responded to the concern and covered the cost.

On Nov. 17, our trash and recycling collector needed to make a schedule change due to road conditions around the transfer station. Residents were alerted to this change via the Waste Connections Call Fire telephone service and through a message that was sent out to our e-News list. If you did not receive an email message, please sign up to receive the e-News by going to our website at www. ken-carylranch.org and filling out the e-News sign-up form on the home page. Or if you would rather receive a phone call you can sign up for the Call Fire service. To do this, please go to www.wcdenver. com/contact/. Complete the required information, click on Residential Trash Service, then in the comment section at the bottom of the page explain that you are a Ken-Caryl resident and want so sign up for the Call Fire service.

Filling the Void – Community **Center Racquetball Courts**

One of the many noticeable improvements within the Community Center will be "raising the floor" of the racquetball courts to have one contiguous level of fitness facilities. Many residents have wondered how Adolfson

& Peterson intends to fill the void below the racquetball courts. The difference between the existing racquetball floor level and the new proposed floor level is more than 5 feet. Several options were considered and priced to find the most cost-effective solution.

The design team landed on a material called Geofoam. Geofoam is a lightweight fill material that looks like oversized Styrofoam blocks. Geofoam has been used in various applications worldwide for several decades. It is used in foundation fill, retaining walls, bridge abutments and plaza decks. This material is lightweight, cost effective, longlasting, strong and durable. The structural engineer on the design team has evaluated the Geofoam and specified it is the right product to withstand the weights and activity of the fitness facility. This material will also be much cleaner and faster to install than other considered options.

Snow Removal on Streets is Provided by **Jefferson County**

It's that time of year again...snow, snow and more snow! Residents often have questions regarding snow removal on Ken-Caryl Ranch. Snow removal for most roadways within Ken-Caryl Ranch is provided by the Jefferson County Road and Bridge Department. You may reach Jefferson County Road and Bridge at 303-271-5200.

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District Parks Department is only responsible for snow removal on Ranch-owned property. The first priority for snow removal by the Parks Department is clearing snow from Ranch buildings for access and safety. Crews will be dispatched to shovel, apply sand and ice melt, and to plow snow to maintain safe access to all Ranch-owned/operated facilities while the facilities are open. Snow removal activities may cease after all facilities are closed for the day and resume prior to the next business day's scheduled opening. Second priority will be given to designated sidewalks and paved trails for snowfalls greater than three inches.

MA Board Adopts 2016 Budget; Dues Will Increase \$2 Per Month in 2016

At their November Business Meeting, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board of Directors adopted the 2016 Budget. The new budget includes an increase in the monthly dues of \$2 per month. If you pay your dues through your bank's online bill pay, you will need to adjust the payment amount to \$48 starting in January. If your dues are paid by automatic withdrawal through the Master Association's Automated Clearing House (ACH) process, then you don't need to do anything. The amount will be adjusted automatically starting with the January payment.

The funding generated through the \$2 increase will be used primarily to supplement projects being completed using bond proceeds such as: an extra 288 square feet to enlarge the Dakota Lodge addition in response to input received from the community that the planned addition was too small, and constructing a new marquee sign at the entrance to the Valley that is in keeping with the new sign family. The following is a summary of items from the Nov. 17 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board:

- The Board listened to a presentation from Allen Gallamore, Colorado State Forest Service, District Forester, asking the Board to approve the Firewise Communities Board membership and empowering/directing them to implement the proposed course of action for Ken-Caryl Ranch to apply for Firewise Community status and prepare a 2016 Action Plan. Following the presentation and some discussion the Board took the requested action.
- The 2016 committee evaluation and appointment process was discussed. The Board plans to make appointments as scheduled in December.
- A motion was approved authorizing the Board President to sign a Promissory Note with the Metropolitan District providing short-term cash flow assistance.
- A motion was approved authorizing staff to purchase an electric assist bike at a cost of \$5,450. Funding source -2015 Open Space Equipment.
- A motion was approved authorizing an expenditure of \$43,000 in 2016 to accept the alternate to the Bond Projects to extend the addition to the Dakota Lodge by 288 square feet.
- A resolution adopting the 2016 assessments and the 2016 budget was approved.

Christmas Tree Sale Dec. 5

The annual Christmas Tree Sale will be held at the Dakota Lodge on Saturday, Dec. 5 from 8-10 a.m. A limited number of trees cut from forest management areas will be available to the public on a first come, first served basis. Rangers are requesting donations in exchange for the trees, and the donations will be used to offset expenses in the open space program.

Mainly Douglas Firs and some Ponderosa Pines were cut two weeks before the sale, so they will be very fresh and fragrant for the sale. These trees are not bushy and manicured like those found on Christmas tree lots around town, but the fresh pine scent still invokes the holiday spirit. The Rangers harvested small diameter trees in the open space to improve wildlife habitat and overall forest health. The removal of the small trees reduces overcrowding and eliminates ladder fuels that can carry fire into a forest canopy. Trees that don't find a home are chipped and made into mulch. The Ranger staff hopes to see you on sale day!

With the holiday season quickly approaching, The Action Center is gearing up for its two holiday programs: the Thanksgiving Distribution and Santa Shop. Both programs assist families with expensive seasonal items so their limited funds can be allocated for crucial expenditures such as utilities, rent or groceries. The Action Center is seeking help from the community in collecting new, unwrapped toys and holiday food to distribute at each program.

The Thanksgiving Distribution takes place the Sunday before Thanksgiving. Volunteers hand out pre-packed boxes filled with the ingredients needed to make a traditional Thanksgiving meal. In 2014, the Action Center provided approximately 2,400 meals at the Thanksgiving Distribution. In order to finish packing the Thanksgiving meal boxes, The Action Center is in need of canned yams, corn bread, canned fruit, canned vegetables, stuffing mix and instant potatoes. Donating these food items to The Action Center guarantees that families in need will receive a holiday meal box at the Thanksgiving Distribution.

The Santa Shop is a week-long program that takes place in mid-December. Parents

and guardians pick out toys for their children free of charge. Last year, the Santa Shop provided new toys to 3,669 children in need! The Action Center is in need of new, unwrapped toys for children ages 0-12 years old. Toys in high demand this year are: remote-controlled cars, dolls, action figures, sports balls, scooters, skateboards, bikes, helmets, "Frozen" toys, "Star Wars" toys, "Minion" toys, makeup/nail polish kits, arts and crafts kits, and stuffed animals. This year, we especially need toys for older children, ages 10-12. The deadline to donate toys for the Santa Shop is Dec. 18.

Foothills Agreement

KC Renews Agreement with Foothills for Use of Ridge Rec Center; Temporary Agreement for Peak Community & Wellness Center in Place

The Boards of Directors of both the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District (KCRMD) and the Foothills Park & Recreation District (Foothills) have renewed for 2016 an Intergovernmental Agreement that allows residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch to use the Foothills Ridge Recreation Center at Foothills resident rates.

The Ridge Recreation Center, which is located at 6613 South Ward St. just north of the boundary of KCR, is owned and operated by Foothills, a local park and recreation provider. Residents of KCR have always been able to use Foothills facilities as they are all open to the public. However, prior to 2014, residents of KCR were assessed non-resident fees for Foothills facilities as it is a separate park and recreation district. Residents of KCR do not pay property taxes to help support the facilities owned and managed by Foothills. The KCRMD and KCRMA subsidize the nonresident fee differential.

The Ridge offers users an indoor lap and separate leisure activity pool, a therapy pool, a gymnasium and track, a cardio weight room, racquetball courts and a rock climbing wall. Also, for a limited time while the KCR Community Center is being renovated, KCR residents may use the Cardio Circuit/ Weight Room ONLY at the Foothills Peak Community & Wellness Center at Foothills resident rates. The Peak is located at 6612 S. Ward St., across the street from the Ridge. This temporary agreement is in addition to the arrangement that is already in place for KCR residents to use the Ridge Recreation Center at Foothills resident rates.

As part of these agreements, KCR residents must get a special ID card issued by Foothills that will identify the user as a resident of KCR. ID cards that were issued to KCR residents in 2014 and 2015 are still valid for 2016. While ID cards issued by Foothills normally cost \$5 per card charged to the user, there is no charge during the month of December. ID cards can only be obtained at the Ridge.

Special rates are valid ONLY for select activities at the Ridge Recreation Center and Peak Community & Wellness Center. The special rates do not apply to classes or youth programs.

Feeding Deer a Big Problem

It is not uncommon to see deer in proximity to houses on Ken-Caryl Ranch. Deer will concentrate in certain areas for many reasons. Past experience has indicated that this phenomenon occurs, in many cases, when individuals begin feeding them. By feeding the deer, people are breaking the law, and it can actually harm deer and cause other problems. For example:

- Ken-Caryl Ranch is in prime deer habitat. Feeding will not prevent deer from damaging your ornamental plants. It usually results in greater damage to plants as well as those of your neighbors.
- Deer have a complex digestive system that is not adapted to large amounts of grain, birdseed, bread or hay. Feeding is often unhealthy for deer. Addiction to artificial feeds often results in deer that are in poor condition, causing them to be euthanized. Concentrating deer by feeding can also increase stress and hasten the spread of diseases.
- Deer are the primary prey of mountain lions. Concentrating deer by feeding can attract mountain lions well within private property.

If you know of any person feeding deer, please call the Ranger staff at 303-979-1876, ext. 170. We would like to have the opportunity to discuss this problem with these individuals and stop this behavior for the benefit of our deer population and the community at large.
