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

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Phase One of Construction **Nearing Completion**

Adolfson & Peterson is nearing construction completion of phase one of the Ranch House, the Community Center and Dakota Lodge. What is included in phase one?

At the Ranch House, phase one includes the north end of the building where the topo table (map room) and former A/V room were located. These spaces have been combined to provide one new multi-purpose room just off the lobby of the main entrance. This new multipurpose room will temporarily be arranged for the staff office functions. Once staff office construction is complete, the new multi-purpose room will be available for booking by the community. Phase one also included updates to the Adult Lounge. The Adult Lounge will re-open for public functions in late March.

The Community Center phase one includes the lower level fitness area. There will be an expanded group exercise room, a dedicated cardio area, new showers and a weight training area where the racquetball courts used to be. Behind-the-walls work also includes new plumbing, electrical panels, lighting and improved HVAC distribution. In early March the residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch can look forward to getting back into their fitness routine with state-of-the-art fitness equipment (see article on page 7).

Site improvements have also started at the Community Center. Work has begun on the elevator that will be located on the east side of the building. This will provide accessibility to the fitness level and the Dakota Room. There has also been some initial demolition around the tennis courts. The new post-tension tennis courts will be built directly on top of the previous asphalt



courts providing a suitable surface to build from and resulting in a construction cost savings. Grading efforts have also started on the east side of the Community Center for a new playground structure.

Phase one of Dakota Lodge includes the addition of the new, column-free multi-purpose room and the relocation of public restrooms closer to the main entrance of the building. The plan for operations is to locate the youth program in the new multi-purpose room while the Environmental Education classroom is under construction. Once the dedicated classroom is completed, the youth program will return to the west side of the building. The classroom construction is scheduled to be completed at the end of March. The second phase of Dakota Lodge will include the east side of the original building. This phase will provide a community conference room, and a map/work room, shower area and Open Space Manager office. The Dakota Lodge and maintenance building will be converted from propane to natural gas, saving on the overall utility costs for both buildings.



Dakota Lodge: The addition is almost complete and will add approximately 1,650 square feet of multipurpose event space to the facility.

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Joint Study Session

On March 1, the KCR Master Association and Metro District Boards held a Joint Study Session and discussed these items:

- Lisa Lorman of Vanir Construction, our Owner's Representative, presented an update on the status of the Bond Projects.
- Atkinson Design Group presented 2016 turf reduction projects and discussed the resident education campaign.
- The Boards approved names as recommended by staff for several new rooms that were created as part of the bond projects.
- The MD Recreation Director presented a status of the KCR pools. No major maintenance will be needed in advance of opening for 2016.
- The MD Recreation Director discussed a possible liquor license and music for the Barn BrewHa event planned for Sept. 24 at Dakota Lodge.
- The Boards discussed the volleyball court at Dakota Lodge and approved replacement with play equipment pending the award of a Great Outdoors Colorado grant request.
- The Boards discussed Park Ranger patrols for the greenbelts.

Metro District Board

On Feb. 23, the KCR Metropolitan District held a Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

- The Board took action to approve the purchase of new playground equipment for Dakota Lodge and a new playground at the Community Center. The equipment for both of these playgrounds is included in the bond projects.
- The Board received updates from staff on planning for the 2016 youth summer camps and a new proposed Metro District logo.
- Staff reported to the Board that the 2016 District Dimensions summer recreation catalog will be a digital, online edition. This is the first time the catalog has not been printed, saving the District approximately \$3,000 in printing and mailing costs.
- The Board took action to appoint members to the Parks Advisory Committee, a joint committee with the Master Association.
- The Board took action to amend the Open Space and Parks Rules to permit model aircraft, including drones, at the Community Park. A permit will be required from the District in order to fly any model aircraft in Community Park.
- The Board passed a resolution in support of the Denver metropolitan area Scientific and Cultural Facilities District, which is scheduled to conduct a reauthorization election in November of 2016.
- The Board reviewed a staff report of bond project expenditures since the inception of the projects.







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

Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space & Parks Rules Updates

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Board of Directors recently adopted language changes to the Open Space and Parks Rules and Enforcement Policy as asked by the Open Space Department.

The first change was to reflect the current state of open space property adjacent to homeowners. The new rule No. 5 states:

"You are allowed to mow/trim up to a 10-foot swath in the open space parallel to your property boundary line to a height of no less than 6 inches. Mowing beyond that point is prohibited. Removal of woody vegetation greater than 1 inch in diameter at the base is prohibited unless you get advance approval (contact Open Space Department). Dumping or storage of material, anywhere in open space, is prohibited, which includes grass clippings,

dirt and other landscaping debris. No unauthorized alterations to the open space are allowed, which include landscaping, play equipment, decks, walls, fence, buried invisible pet fences, bird feeders/houses or the removal of plant material."

The rule update is more descriptive and allows homeowners more freedom to mow/trim the open space grasses up to a 10-foot swath along the property boundary line versus a 4-foot swath in past years. This will help homeowners when there is a steep grade slope or when using larger-sized mow decks.

The second change is to rule No. 24: "Operation of remote controlled or motorized aircraft (includes drones), or boats from, in, on or over any Association or District owned property is prohibited. However, operation of remote controlled aircraft (including drones) is allowed by permit only in Community Park's air/land space."

This change reflects the recent activity of Unmanned Aircraft Systems, known basically as "drones." Recent inquiries by residents prompted the change as drones can be more of a visual/noise nuisance and could be used to harass wildlife as they are operated around Ken-Caryl Ranch.

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Wildland Fire Evacuation Exercise in Ken-Caryl Valley May 21

Citizens are moving farther into natural areas such as Ken-Caryl to take advantage of the privacy, natural beauty and recreational opportunities. As a result, fire departments are fighting fires in the Wildland Urban Interface (WUI), defined as areas where homes are built near or among lands prone to wildland fire. The increase in the WUI threat has been steep because of continued development and exposure.

The WUI is not a place but a set of conditions that can exist in nearly every community. The Wildland Urban Interface can be a major subdivision such as Ken-Caryl Valley, or it can be four homes on an open range. According to the National Fire Protection Association, WUI conditions include: the amount, type and distribution of vegetation; the flammability of the structures (homes, decks, fences) in the area; proximity of structures to fire-prone vegetation and to other combustible structures; weather conditions; topography; average lot size; and road construction.

On May 21, emergency vehicles will swarm into Ken-Caryl Valley as citizens are evacuating from a simulated wildfire.

The response by fire departments and law enforcement may look real, but it will only be a drill. The simulated wildfire response and evacuation exercise is sponsored by Jefferson County Sheriff's Office of **Emergency Management and West Metro** Fire Rescue.

Those living in Ken-Caryl Valley and the North Ranch will be invited to take part in a voluntary community evacuation drill. The exercise will begin at 8 a.m., and the evacuation will start at 9 a.m. Residents of the area will receive an evacuation notice via telephone. Residents who have signed up with CodeRed will also receive notification via smartphone. Participating residents should evacuate safely with their family members in their car and can meet at the evacuation point (Chatfield High School) if they choose. The drill is meant to simulate a real-life emergency and test evacuation procedures.

Prepare your home, family, friends and neighbors to safely evacuate from Ken-Caryl. After you have protected your home, it's time to prepare your family. The Ready, Set, Go! Program prepares you and your family for a wildfire within Ken-Caryl. Fire season is an increasing threat and a year-





round reality in Ken-Caryl. Do your part to be prepared with Ready, Set, Go:

- Ready Be Ready, Be Firewise. Take personal responsibility and prepare long before the threat of a wildland fire so your home is ready in case of a fire. Create defensible space by clearing brush away from your home. Use fire-resistant landscaping and harden your home with fire-safe construction measures. Assemble emergency supplies and belongings in a safe place. Plan escape routes and make sure all those residing in the home know the plan of action.
- Set Situational Awareness. Pack your emergency items and prepare for evacuation of your pets. Know how to receive and stay aware of the latest news and information on the fire from local media, social media and the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office via CodeRed. Sign up at www.your911.net.
- Go Act Early! Follow your Personal Wildland Fire Action Plan. Doing so will not only support your safety but will allow firefighters to best maneuver resources to combat the fire.

The May 21 wildfire response and evacuation exercise will prepare the Ken-Caryl community for a major wildland fire, such as those that have struck the Waldo Canyon or Black Forest areas with similar WUI issues. Safety of the citizens, firefighters and law enforcement during the exercise is the primary goal. Residents of Ken-Caryl have an opportunity to be proactive rather than reactive in preparing for a WUI fire. Preparation, mitigation and safe evacuation is beneficial for us as residents and for our neighbors. Additional information will be provided by West Metro and the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office prior to the evacuation exercise on May 21.

New Fitness Center and New Fitness Coordinator at Community Center




No Election for Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District Board







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Dear Editor:

Bikers and Hikers Come to Arms

I'd like to call attention to the issue of horse manure on the open space trails. The open space committee has no concerns whatsoever about the piles of horse manure left on the trails. The committee fines dog owners for not cleaning up after their pets, but will not even consider fining the equestrians for the same offense, which is totally unjust.

If there are ordinances for picking up dog waste, then the same rules need to apply to horses. Horse owners need to be held every bit as accountable. Anyone who bikes or hikes encounters enormous mounds of horse manure that need to be sidestepped by going off trail, which treads on the terrain, and poses the possibility of meeting up with a rattlesnake. Aside from the unpleasantness and noxious odors, horse manure contains parasites and viruses that can be potentially harmful. Horse manure is a breeding ground for various pathogens and can be environmentally hazardous. It can also be a breeding ground for flies, a nesting ground for rodents, and contaminate the water table, all of which can spread disease.

I understand that horse manure decomposes quickly and that there is some practicality in shoveling it aside. That does not negate the fact that the laws should apply equally to everyone concerned. What's excused for some but not others is in no way democratic and needs to be fully addressed. I encourage all those who are perturbed by horse manure on the trails to let their annoyance be known to the open space committee so that a dialogue can begin and a compromise reached. Apparently, this is hardly a new concern. It's far time that something actually be done about it.



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
