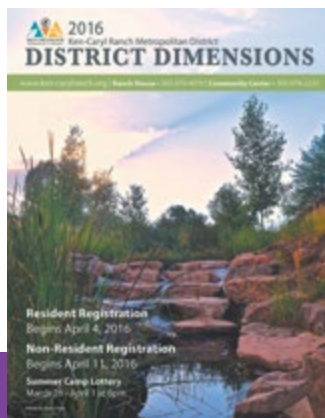

Water Conservation & Turf Reduction Plans and Open House

As part of the Landscape Master Plan, there are proposed areas throughout the Valley and North Ranch where Ken-Caryl Ranch can reduce water usage through turf reduction. You can review the plans for each specific area online at www.ken-carylranh.org under the Administration tab, then Bond & Improvement Projects. On each map, there's a highlighted yellow area that shows where sprinklers will be turned off. Dryland grasses rather than irrigated turf will then be allowed to flourish in those areas, and the Parks Department will control weeds as needed. You can find out more about Ken-Caryl Ranch's landscape water conservation efforts on page 10.

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● **Manager's Column**

The 2016 Board of Director election for the Metropolitan District has been completed. Special districts in Colorado are required to conduct Board of Director elections in May of even numbered years. With 2016 being one of these years, the District had three Director positions up for election. The three positions which were up for election were the Board seats currently held by Lauri Lehan-Milano, Jeff Esbenshade and Jami Jensen.

Pursuant to State of Colorado election statute, if the number of candidates running for the positions does not exceed the Board openings by the established deadline (which this year was Friday, Feb. 26), the election is cancelled and the

candidates are deemed elected. That is what happened this year: Lauri Lehan-Milano, Jeff Esbenshade and Jami Jensen were the only registered candidates for the three openings. The 2016 election, which was set for May 3, has thus been cancelled with Lauri, Jeff and Jami elected for four-year terms to serve until May of 2020.

The bond improvement projects have moved into high gear with Phase 1 of the construction completed for the Ranch House, the Community Center and Dakota Lodge. Phase 2 construction has now begun with an emphasis on getting the sites and facilities ready for the upcoming summer season. The new post-tension tennis courts at the Community Center have been poured and are ready for final surfacing when the weather warms up sufficiently by May. Residents will see heightened activity levels on all three sites over the next three months as the projects race toward completion.

Residents will also see improvement projects starting soon at Heirloom, Saddlewood and Territory Parks. These projects include new landscaping, irrigation system replacement at all three parks and new playgrounds to be installed at Heirloom and Saddlewood Parks. These projects are scheduled for completion by July 1 and were also funded by the 2014 bond funds authorized by voters.

Finally, the 2016 edition of the District's summer recreation catalog, District Dimensions, is now completed and available on the Ken-Caryl Ranch website. This year will mark the first time the publication has gone completely electronic in an effort to be more cost efficient and environmentally conscious. 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Post-Tension Tennis Courts for the Community Center

Site improvements at the Community Center include the replacement of the north (or lower) outdoor tennis courts. The existing asphalt courts will be left in place acting as a suitable sub-grade for the new post-tension slab tennis courts.

Post-tension construction involves the installation of tension cables arranged in a grid according to engineering specifications. These high-strength steel wires are wound together (to form the cable) and placed inside a plastic duct. The cables are designed to run through the center of the concrete slab. After the concrete has been poured and set up, the cables are pulled tight with hydraulic jacks against the outer edges of the concrete. This method is commonly used to create monolithic slabs. Post-tensioning can be found in parking structure and bridge construction. This technology was developed in France during the 1930s and introduced to the United States in the 1950s.

Post-tension tennis courts are the preferred playing surface for many reasons. They provide the best long-term value with greatly reduced annual and long-term maintenance costs. Post-tension courts also have an increased resistance to settling, heaving and have the ability to span unstable soil conditions. The finished product will also provide better uniformity of play and improved slope for drainage. These courts will now be similar to the



Ranch House and Bradford tennis courts which are also post-tension construction. The end result will be a noticeable improvement to the tennis community.

Courts No. 1 and No. 2 closest to Club Drive are not included in the current tennis court replacement. These courts were not included in the base scope of work in order to reduce overall costs for the Community Center project. Early in design it was noted that utilities exist below court No. 1 at a diagonal deep below the court. These utilities include a high pressure water main and a sewer line that may require relocation. Due to the size and depth of these lines, the possible cost to relocate them could be significant, and was not included in the original budget.

The Metro District and Master Association Boards are working with the Ken-Caryl Ranch Water and Sanitation District to come to a resolution on this matter. Due to the proximity of courts No. 1 and No. 2 being adjacent to Club Drive, the future conversion of these two courts to post tension could occur with minimal impact to the site when the water and sewer line issues are resolved and additional funding is secured.

Master Association

The following is a summary of items from the March 15 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board:

- A representative from the Manor Ridge neighborhood requested that the board install some signs that inform open space users when they are entering private property.
- A member of the Firewise Board updated the MA Board on their activities to date and presented plans for the May 21 Wildfire Evacuation Exercise in Ken-Caryl Valley.
- Staff reviewed the delinquency report with the Board.
- Staff presented plans for 2016 trail work for Stallion Pointe Trail.
- A motion was approved adopting the open space resident use policy as recommended by the Open Space Committee.
- A motion was approved adopting the Trail Use Guidelines as recommended by the Open Space Committee.
- A motion was approved establishing the Comprehensive Open Space Management Plan Task Force and approving the job description.
- A motion was approved for Dakota Lodge playground funding from Reserves in the amount of \$51,000.
- A motion was approved for an expenditure of an additional \$2,000 for the new slide in Heirloom. Funding source is 2016 bond contingency.
- A motion was approved for additional funding to install the Mastodon Trail guardrail. Funding source is 2016 contingency.
- A motion was passed approving ERO as our 2016 biological/historical/archeological services provider at a cost of \$9,500.
- A motion was approved adopting the neighborhood signs procedure as presented by the Parks Advisory Committee.
- A motion was approved authorizing staff to enter into a contract with Tony Boone Trails to construct 2016 trails. Total maximum cost is \$70,000 (\$62,000 from MA operations and \$8,000 from Trail Club funds).
- A motion was approved authorizing staff to proceed with engineering for improvements to the Brannon Gearhart Trail. Funding source is operations - drainage and reserves – path conversion.
- A motion was approved authorizing the Executive Director to sign a letter supporting the MD application for a liquor license for the Barn Brew-Ha event at the Equestrian Center/ Dakota Lodge on Sept. 24.

My Place or Yours?

Frequently a phone call or email begins with a statement about a problem property being “a rental.” Since many of us have lived in rental properties for at least a portion of our adult lives, I feel it’s important to explore the topic to see what the real challenges are with being a renter or with being an absentee owner of a rental property.

People renting homes on Ken-Caryl Ranch have privileges identical to homeowners when it comes to amenities. Trash collection, open space or recreation access, and bi-weekly issues of Life at Ken-Caryl are some examples. Driver’s licenses or Colorado IDs with the property address or rental/lease agreements serve as documents accepted to participate in recreation. With these privileges also comes the responsibility to abide by our covenants, so it is important that owners provide information about the governing documents before the lease is negotiated. Giving a link to the website will provide new residents with information they will need, such as copies of the rules,

descriptions of classes and registration processes, as well as dates of community events.

If a covenant violation occurs on a rental property, it is ultimately the responsibility of the homeowner to see that it is remedied. We do not maintain a mandatory registration of the names and contact information for renters. Violation letters are always sent to the owner of record. If you are renting out your home, it is important that you keep us updated with your mailing address and contact information. Sometimes a violation pertains solely to the home itself and is therefore the responsibility of the owner. The need to paint the house, replace a roof or driveway, or repair a fence are some examples. Some violations are more behavioral and pertain to the renter, such as unsightly articles on the property or violations of the parking rules.

If our records reflect an owner’s mailing address that differs from the property address, the violation letters are typically sent there as well as to the resident. If a

behavioral issue is not rectified by the renter, the homeowner is ultimately responsible and would be subject to the assessment of fines and a possible lien on the property. Owners and renters need to be aware that if a covenant issue is not resolved and eventually leads to a fine, the renter loses privileges related to recreational facilities and open space access.

It is important for the owner to monitor the condition of the property. This would include regular inspections of the property by the owner or a contracted agent. If you hire a property manager, please write or email this office so that we have a means to contact them if an issue arises. I would strongly urge owners to supply contact information to the immediate neighbors so any emergencies or complaints can be addressed quickly. Being a good neighbor and a responsible resident is important not only for those occupying homes on Ken-Caryl Ranch, but also for those owners currently living elsewhere.



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that provides a natural, soft surface that drains well but does not hold up well on slopes. Staff will hire a contractor to install approximately 180 feet of colored concrete from where the trail ties into Willowleaf Drive, north to the top of the slope. In addition, the contractor will install a 3-foot wide, natural surface shoulder along the uphill edge of the trail to accommodate equestrians that sometimes use the trail to access Brannon Gearhart Park.

This problem has occurred on other soft surface trails in our open space trail system, and staff has used the same solution with great success. This design can be seen at the northwest end of Plum Thicket Open Space where the trail climbs a steep slope just before it connects to Deerwood Drive.

AGE, Inc. will be doing this project for a cost of about \$11,000. The project is supported by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee and will be paid for by a budget approved by the Board in the 2016 Annual Plan. It is anticipated that the project will be completed this spring.

New Open Space ID Bracelets for 2016; Blue Bracelets No Longer Valid

Most trails on Ken-Caryl Ranch are private and on open space land owned and managed by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association. Park Rangers are directed to contact trail users on the private trails to determine residency. If you wear an Open Space ID Bracelet, the Park Rangers will not need to stop you as long as you are obeying all of the posted rules. The blue ID Bracelets are no longer valid. To obtain a new green ID Bracelet, go to the Recreation Office at the Ranch House at 7676 South Continental Divide Road or the Community Center at 1 Club Drive. Bracelets are issued two per household and now can be temporarily transferred to house guests! You will need to sign a simple registration form and provide proof of residency.

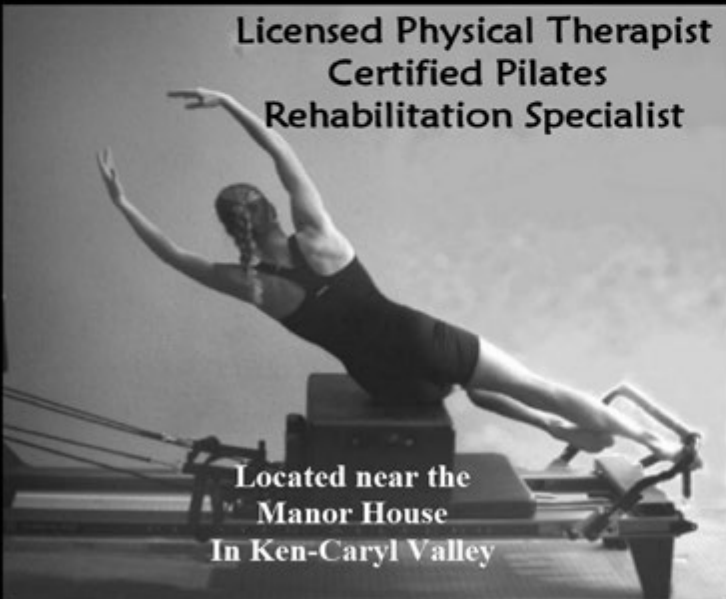

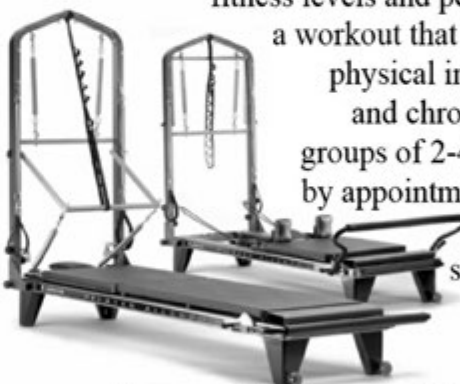

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Family Dog U: Training & Pet Services

Ken-Caryl resident Sandra Elvenholl started her dog training and services business, Family Dog U, 15 years ago. She trains puppies and adult dogs through individualized training programs at a client's home or through group classes at her own home or in the neighborhood.

"Most of my clients come to me for help with common behavioral problems such as potty training, jumping up or pulling on leash. I also deal with aggression and fear cases," said Sandra. "The bulk of my business is concentrated on individualized training programs held in clients' homes (private lessons). I come to them, learn about their dog and their family's needs. Then I design a training program that will work best for all involved."

Sandra also offers group classes such as Basic Obedience, Puppy Kindergarten and Agility for Fun, as well as puppy socials,

adolescent dog socials, seminars and workshops. Group classes and socials take place in her backyard or around Ken-Caryl.

"Because my training is focused on 'the family dog,' holding classes around the neighborhood benefits those who enjoy taking their dogs along on a walk but are having issues while out walking." "I've partnered with rescue organizations, animal shelters and even doggy day cares to create behavior programs and/or evaluation procedures to better help the dogs they service. My family and I have fostered and adopted along the way, and I'm a huge advocate of rescuing/adopting dogs," said Sandra.

"There is no one way to train every dog," Sandra said. "Having a one-size-fits-all mentality can frustrate both dogs and their owners, leading to long-term failure. Many of my clients come to me after having tried other training programs. I listen to my client's individual concerns and then put together a program that will be effective and easy to fit into their busy schedules."

Mile High Equestrian Teams Earn Top Honors

Congratulations to the High School Mile High Equestrian Team who earned the Championship Award and first place and to the Middle School Mile High Equestrian Team who received Reserve Champion and a close second place at the local Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA) Zone final competition in February at Fox Hill Farms in Littleton.

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Why Do We Need to Conserve Water?

Over the next few years, Ken-Caryl Ranch will implement landscape water conservation efforts to align with the Landscape Master Vision that was adopted in 2015. As part of this process, you may start to notice turf reduction in some common areas where sprinklers are turned off. So that you can better understand why these changes are being made, here are a few key points about water consumption on Ken-Caryl Ranch:

- The purpose of this Landscape Master Vision is to facilitate a more consistent and attractive landscape throughout Ken-Caryl Ranch; increase environmental stewardship on community-owned and privately-owned lands; and reduce water usage.
- Ken-Caryl Ranch budgets for approximately \$350,000 per year on water.
- During the summer, Ken-Caryl Ranch spends approximately \$3,000 per day on water.
- Finding ways to conserve water helps the sustainability of this precious resource.

As one of the first steps in the implementation of the Landscape Master Plan, there are proposed areas throughout the Valley and North Ranch where Ken-Caryl Ranch can reduce water usage through turf reduction. You can review the plans for each specific area online at www.ken-carylranh.org under the Administration tab, then Bond & Improvement Projects. On each map, there's a highlighted yellow area that shows where sprinklers will be turned off. Dryland grasses rather than irrigated turf will then be allowed to flourish in those areas, and the Parks Department will control weeds as needed.

There will be an open house for residents to ask questions and discuss the plans on Tuesday, April 5 from 5-6 p.m. at the Ranch House. We encourage everyone to attend. You can also email your comments to bondprojects@kcranch.org.

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Consumer Alert: Government Agency Scam Calls

Government agencies will not contact you via telephone or email to settle an outstanding issue, including any payment or fee! The IRS scam calls have never gone away. Now, however, the calls are supposedly coming from the U.S. Treasury Department or your Sheriff's Office. These calls are from scammers, mostly calling from outside the United States, who route the call through a U.S. area code to add legitimacy and fool consumers. They are meant to frighten and scare consumers into acting compulsively by providing a credit card or buying a reloadable money card to make an arrest warrant go away or avoid a court appearance.

In one day, the District Attorney's Fraud Hotline was informed of nine different area codes that scammers used for these calls. The number will be active for about five to eight hours and then disconnected or taken down. Remember that scammers cannot get money from a voice messaging machine. They need to talk to and frighten a 'real' person into providing a credit card or reloadable money card. Don't talk to them and don't call their number back!

Tips to Remember:

- Government agencies will not call you about an outstanding arrest warrant or court appearance.
- Government agencies will not attempt to settle any fee, payment, or penalty over the telephone, via wire money

transfer, credit card, or a reloadable money card.

- These scammers are mostly calling from outside the United States, countries like Jamaica, India, Singapore and Pakistan, and routing their calls through a U.S. area code to fool citizens.
- These scammers can 'spoof' your caller ID, even putting in your own name and telephone number, to get you to answer their call.

Important Points:

- Do not answer calls from an area code that you do not recognize. Allow voice messaging to answer the call.
- Do not return a call to any number left by one of these scam calls. Don't believe you can wear scammers out or teach them a lesson.
- The ONLY message a scammer understands is, "I'm not paying attention to you!" Don't answer the call, don't return their call and don't push a number to be taken off their call list. These responses all state, "I paid attention to your call."
- If you answer their call, even if you just pick up the receiver and quickly put it back down, you demonstrate that you paid attention to their call and you may receive another four to six calls.

You may call the District Attorney's Fraud Hotline to report these calls at 303-271-6980. Please remember, however, the scammer's return number may already likely be disconnected, and the DA does not have jurisdiction in foreign countries.

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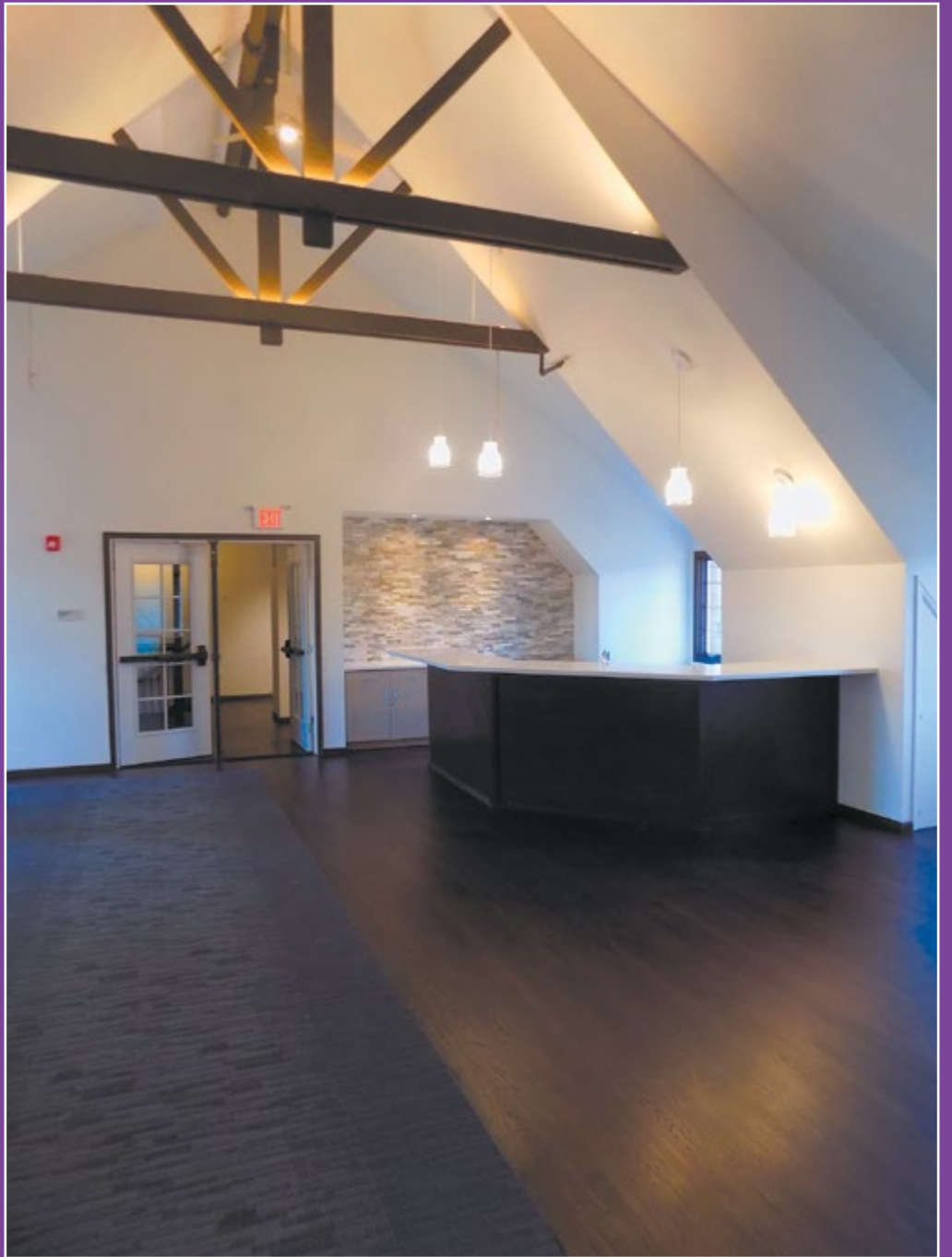

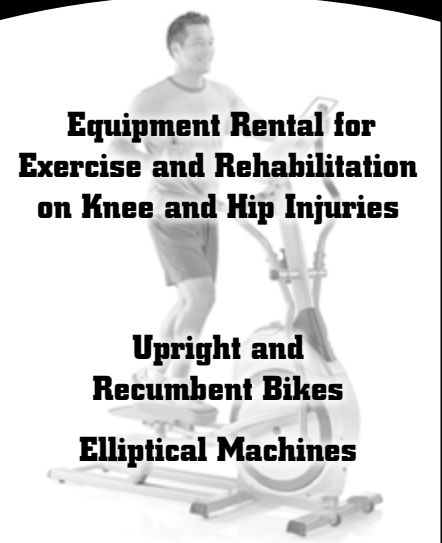

Preparing for Wildfire in Ken-Caryl

A wildfire is an unplanned, unwanted fire burning in a natural area, such as a forest, grassland or prairie. As building development expands into these areas of the Wildland Urban Interface (WUI), homes sited in these areas are susceptible to wildfires. Wildfires can damage natural resources, destroy homes and threaten the safety of the public and the firefighters who protect our homes.

Wildfires can occur at any time throughout the year along the Front Range, but the potential is always higher during periods with little or no rainfall, which make brush, grass and trees dry and burn more easily. High winds, as are seen within Ken-Caryl, can also contribute to spreading the fire.

Wildfires can occur anywhere in the country, but the Front Range of Colorado has seen significant wildfire activity in the past few years. Ken-Caryl falls within the WUI and has fuels, topography and home placement similar to other areas impacted by fire in Colorado. Wildfires can start in remote wilderness areas, in national parks or even in your backyard. Wildfires can start from natural causes, such as lightning, but most are caused by humans, either accidentally—from cigarettes, campfires or outdoor burning—or intentionally.

The destruction caused by wildfires depends on the size of the fire, the landscape, the amount of fuel—such as trees and structures—in the path of the fire, and the direction and intensity of the wind.

- Wildfires can cause death or injury to people and animals.
- Structures may be damaged or destroyed.
- Transportation, gas, power, communications and other services may be disrupted.
- Flying embers can set fire to buildings more than a mile away from the wildfire itself.
- Smoke can cause health issues for people, even for those far away from the fire.
- Extensive acreage can be burned, damaging watersheds and critical natural areas.
- Flash flooding and mudslides can result from fire damage to the surrounding landscape.
- Wildfires can affect the land for many years, including causing changes to the soil that increase the risk of future floods.

Defensible Space

Your goal now, before a fire happens, is to make your home and the surrounding area more resistant to catching fire and burning. This means reducing the amount of material that can burn easily in and around your home by clearing away debris and other flammable materials, and using fire-resistant materials for landscaping and construction.

Insurance

Review your homeowners or renters insurance policy to ensure that you have adequate coverage for your property and personal belongings.

Fire Weather Warnings

The National Weather Service (NWS) issues notices when weather conditions such as strong wind, low relative humidity and high temperatures make wildfires more likely. During these dangerous periods, NWS urges everyone to use extreme caution because a simple spark in open space grass can cause a major wildfire.

The NWS issues a fire weather watch when potentially dangerous fire weather conditions are possible over the next 12 to 72 hours. NWS issues a fire weather warning or red flag warning when fire danger exists and weather patterns that support wildfires are either occurring or expected to occur within 24 hours.

Evacuation

When a wildfire threatens your area, the best action to protect yourself and your family is to evacuate early to avoid being trapped. Ken-Caryl has a limited number of roads to handle an emergency evacuation, and your normal route may not be accessible due to the wildfire. If there is smoke, drive carefully because visibility will be reduced. Keep your headlights on and watch for other vehicles and fleeing wildlife or emergency vehicles working in the area.

If the danger is imminent, the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office may issue an evacuation notice to alert residents that a fire is nearby and it is important to leave the area. Evacuation orders vary from simple notification of fire in the area to a request for immediate evacuation. If you are concerned about fire activity in the area do not wait for an evacuation notice – prepare your home, family and pets and consider evacuating to a safe location.

Talk with your family about a safe location to meet following evacuation – consider the home of friends or family in another part of the Denver Metro area. A communications plan is also very important. Identify a contact such as a friend or relative who lives out-of-state for household members to notify they are safe. Be sure every member of your family knows the phone number and has a cell phone or other way to access the number. Text messaging may be more effective in a wildfire emergency situation. Text messages can often get around network disruptions when a phone call might not be able to get through overloaded phone lines.

Wildfire Evacuation Exercise in Ken Caryl

The May 21 wildfire response and voluntary evacuation exercise will prepare the Ken-Caryl community for a major wildland fire. The safety of Ken-Caryl residents, firefighters and law enforcement during the exercise is critical. Proactive preparation for a wildfire event enhances the safety of all.

Wildland Fire Evacuation Exercise in Ken-Caryl Valley May 21

There will be a Wildland Fire Evacuation Exercise in Ken-Caryl Valley on Saturday, May 21. Emergency vehicles will swarm into Ken-Caryl Valley as citizens are evacuating from a simulated wildfire. The response by fire departments and law enforcement may look real, but it will only be a drill. The simulated wildfire response and evacuation exercise is sponsored by Jefferson County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Management and West Metro Fire Rescue.

Those living in Ken-Caryl Valley and the North Ranch will be invited to take part in the voluntary community evacuation drill. The exercise will begin at 8 a.m., and the evacuation will start at 9 a.m. Residents of the area will receive an evacuation notice via telephone. Residents who have signed up with CodeRed will also receive notification via smartphone. If you haven't signed up for emergency notifications through CodeRed, please sign up at www.your911.net. Participating residents should evacuate safely with their family members in their car and can meet at the evacuation

point (Chatfield High School) if they choose. The drill is meant to simulate a real-life emergency and test evacuation procedures.

The May 21 wildfire response and evacuation exercise will prepare the Ken-Caryl community for a major wildland fire, such as those that have struck the Waldo Canyon or Black Forest areas. Preparation, mitigation and safe evacuation is beneficial for us as residents and for our neighbors. Additional information will be provided by West Metro and the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office prior to the evacuation exercise on May 21.

Volunteers Needed for Open Space Comprehensive Management Plan Task Force

Residents are needed to serve on the new Open Space Comprehensive Management Plan Task Force. The purpose of the Task Force is to review the existing Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Comprehensive Management Plan and the working copy of the Comprehensive Plan developed by the 2004 Task Force and recommend any necessary changes to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board and the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District Board.

Responsibilities

- Review the work of the 2004 Task Force and incorporate as appropriate.
- If warranted, draft or update management plans for special management areas, specific ecosystem or habitat management plans, or maintenance plans.
- Provide more detail to directives in the existing plan where necessary.
- Present the draft management plan to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee for approval and support.
- Develop plan for presenting the draft management plan to the community and implement. Gather input and make any changes necessary.
- Present final draft to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board and the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District Board.
- Attend Task Force meetings and other meetings relevant to completing the primary objective. This may include Open Space Committee meetings, Board of Directors meetings, open houses and other public meetings. Keep community

informed of ongoing issues through the use of various media, i.e., Life at Ken-Caryl, the Ken-Caryl Ranch website, etc.

Organization

The Task Force shall be comprised of five members of the Association to be appointed by the Presidents of both the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board and the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District Board. A Master Association and District Board member, as well as an Open Space Committee member, shall serve as liaisons to facilitate communication between all leadership groups. In addition all meetings will be held in an open session and members of the Association will be encouraged to attend and participate. Staff will help to coordinate meetings and provide assistance with writing and document preparation.

Operations

The members of the Task Force shall determine the meeting date, time and location. The Task Force will report progress to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee at their monthly meetings. When the Task Force has made its final report and the Master Association Board and the Metro District Board have accepted the report, the Task Force will be disbanded. It is expected that the Task Force final report will include a recommendation for future plan updates. An ideal end date for this project is December 2016.

Daughters of the American Revolution to Honor Spanish Flu Victims in Fairmount Cemetery

The Columbine Chapter of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (NSDAR) has engaged in a community service project in conjunction with NSDAR's 125th anniversary. NSDAR is a non-profit, non-political women's volunteer service organization dedicated to promoting historic preservation, education and patriotism.

The Columbine Chapter of NSDAR will be raising funds over the next year to provide a historical monument at Fairmount Cemetery that would memorialize the Colorado victims of the Influenza Pandemic (Spanish Flu) who died from 1918-1919.

The Influenza Pandemic was known to be present in Colorado starting with the first official diagnosis in September of 1918 and continuing until June of 1919. According to a 2009 Denver Post news article, almost 8,000 Coloradans died throughout the state in that 10-month period. Approximately 1,500 of these deaths were concentrated in the Denver area. The rate of the spread of the influenza caused many towns to impose severe restrictions, and the

hospitals were overflowing. Due to the extremely infectious and rapid spread of the pandemic, many victims had to be buried in mass graves, including the one at the Fairfield Cemetery, which to this day remains unmarked.


The Columbine Chapter is actively engaged in fundraising to provide an appropriate historical marker for the victims of the Influenza Pandemic buried in the mass grave site at Fairmount Cemetery. Fairmount Cemetery management has given approval for the project. A small rose garden is also planned for the memorial area.

The Columbine Chapter and other interested parties will provide benefit to the Denver community in recognizing the historical impact of this pandemic. The monument and rose garden will provide a memorial perspective for those who perished during this time.

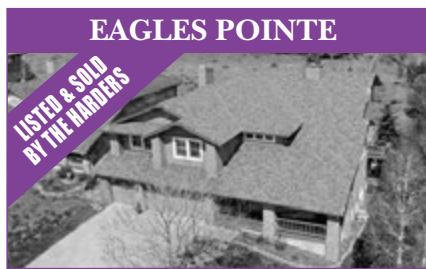
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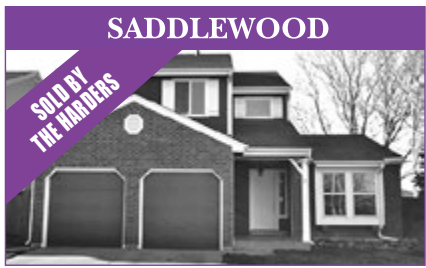
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
