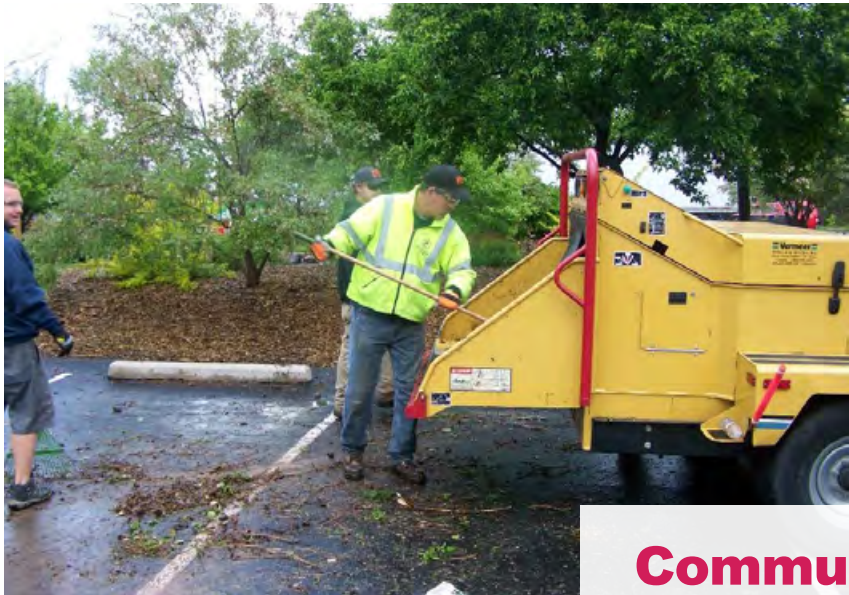

KCRMD Settles Lawsuit with Plains Metropolitan District

On Friday, April 21, Board members of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District (KCRMD) and the Plains Metropolitan District (PMD) signed a settlement for the lawsuit between the two entities that has been ongoing for 13 years. In full settlement of all claims in the lawsuit related to recreational facilities and to accomplish PMD's obligation to build and pay for recreational facilities required by the judgment, PMD will pay KCRMD \$3.5 million. All such funds shall be used by KCRMD solely for the design and construction of one or more new, refurbished or renovated swimming pools; one or more new, refurbished or renovated tennis courts; or one or more new, refurbished or renovated ball fields. Master Association Update

In my last column, I mentioned that your Master Association Board would be discussing a possible change to their definition of single family. I received a few inquiries about this topic so I thought you might like to know that the Board decided not to change the current definition: "One or more persons related by blood, marriage or adoption, living and cooking together as a single housekeeping unit, exclusive of household servants. A number of persons, but not exceeding 6, living and cooking together as a single housekeeping unit, though not related by blood, marriage or adoption, shall be deemed to constitute a family. Family shall not include more than one registered sex offender, unless related by blood, marriage or adoption."

Trash and Recycling Totes: Residents have the option of using their own trash and recycling containers/bags or using 96-gallon totes provided at no charge by Waste Connections. The totes have wheels and are 42 inches tall, the top measures 30x34 inches, and the bottom is 24x24 inches. To order totes, send an email to kencarylco@wasteconnections.com, say that you want to sign up for totes, and provide your name, address, email address, and phone number. You can request both trash and recycling totes, just a trash tote, or just a recycling tote.

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Master Association Board

The following is a summary of items from the April 18 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board:

- Steven Langer, a business owner in the Ken-Caryl Business Center, provided comments on the Deer Creek Golf Course rezoning proposal. He urged the Master Association Board to oppose the golf course rezoning.
- Staff presented a slide show on trespasser gates at trail heads in the open space. The gates are planned at three sites this summer and will be paid for out of the open space supplies budget. The Board wants the gate near the Manor House vetted by the North Ranch Board but wants to move forward with the other gates.
- At the request of a resident, the Board discussed a possible change to the definition of family. The Board does not support making a change and wants to keep the definition as is.
- The Board approved the concept of the East Plum Thicket trail design. The next step is to present this plan to the community and get resident feedback.
- The Board discussed the approval process for outdoor speakers at private residences or businesses. Staff will discuss this issue with the Master Association's attorney.
- The Board reviewed the Policy to Adopt Policies and Rules and plans to adopt a revised policy at the May meeting.
- The Board discussed improvements to the Ranch House volleyball court. The Parks Advisory Committee will discuss further and report to the Board.
- The Board reviewed the 1st Quarter Reserves Status.
- A motion passed accepting the 2016 Audit as presented by James Moore and Associates.
- A motion passed amending the Procurement Guidelines to remove the references to the Finance Committee.
- A motion passed authorizing staff to purchase a new pool boiler for the Ranch House pool from Performance Pools. Cost \$30,664 - funding source Reserves.
- A motion passed approving the final design of Question Mark Peak Spur trail and authorizing construction.
- A motion passed authorizing a change

in the Valley entrance marquee sign, adding the KC logo, and funding in the amount of \$3,652. Source 2017 Contingency – balance available \$43,750.

- A motion passed adopting the amended Open Space and Parks Rules as recommended by the Open Space Committee. This removes camping from the allowable uses at the Dakota Lodge.
- A motion passed appointing Victoria DeSair as an Assistant Secretary of the Association.
- Staff gave an update on the security patrols at Bradford Park and Brannon-Gearhart Park.

Metropolitan District Board

On April 25, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

- The Board announced the lawsuit settlement with the Plains Metropolitan District.
- Multiple attendees spoke during audience participation requesting the Board consider a proposal to move additional prairie dogs to the south hogback location used to relocate the Manor House colony. The Board agreed to hear the proposal as an agenda item at the June meeting and take more feedback on the matter.
- Staff updated the Board on the retaining wall at the Community Garden.

- Staff said the playground at Dakota Lodge opened April 21, which was 10 days ahead of schedule.
- Staff said the new equipment for the splash pad at the Community Center has been ordered and should be installed at the beginning of the pool season.
- Staff reported that the Master Association Board approved the purchase of a new boiler for the Ranch House Pool. The new boiler has been ordered and will be installed before the start of the season.
- The Board discussed improvements to the Ranch House volleyball court. Improvements to the court will be implemented this spring.
- Staff updated the Board that the County has scheduled hearings on the Deer Creek Golf Course rezoning. The Board stated that they are prepared to rescind their objection as soon as the Plains Settlement is finalized, noting that residents are still welcome to object or provide feedback to the County individually.
- The Board reviewed a design for a new sign at the entrance to the Community Center.
- A motion passed adjusting the closing time of the KC Nature Camp at Dakota Lodge to 6 p.m. with program participants heading inside at 5:30 p.m.
- A motion passed adopting the amended Open Space and Parks Rules as approved by the Master Association Board.
- A motion passed adopting the Ken-Caryl Ranch Public Open Space Guidelines for use of e-bikes as "other power-driving mobility devices" on properties owned or leased by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District.

Open Space Weed Management

Spring is here and along with warmer temperatures and longer days, weeds are starting to appear in lawns, parks and open space areas. As part of an integrated management approach, herbicide applications and mowing are used to combat weed infestations in the open space. This year's herbicide applications will be conducted from approximately April to July depending on weather and growing conditions. Mowing operations are usually performed in late summer to prevent seed production.

Bare-ground areas like picnic pads, hard surface trails and kiosk pads are treated first with a pre-emergent herbicide. Applications can be conducted before weeds emerge, and these herbicides prevent weeds from germinating in the area throughout the growing season.

The next weeds managed are the biennial weed species like musk thistle and knapweed. Knapweed and musk thistle are list B noxious weed species, which mandates that landowners make attempts to control and stop the spread of these weed species. The first year and early spring growth forms for these weeds is a rosette of basal leaves lying close to the ground. At this stage they are most vulnerable to chemical application because of their increased uptake of water and nutrients. Even though knapweed and musk thistle can be effectively treated all the way up to the budding stages, we have found that spring and fall spraying in the rosette stage is most effective.

As spring turns into summer, the Ranger staff turns their attention to deeply rooted perennial weeds like Canada thistle. Spraying Canada thistle and other deeply rooted perennials is more effective when the plants have bolted and grown to approximately 10 inches in height. At this point, they are still transporting nutrients to the root system, which will allow for more herbicide uptake. Mowing is also an effective way to make the perennials use more energy as they attempt to recover from the mowing. Mowed perennials are also more susceptible to fall herbicide applications.

The weeds being managed this season are very aggressive invaders that have the potential to take over native plant communities. Priority was given to areas where infestations pose the worst threat to native plant communities and where they are bordering home lots. A contract herbicide applicator and the in-house open space crew will be performing the herbicide applications. Newborn Wildlife Usually Better Off Left Alone

With spring and early summer comes a rebirth of Colorado's wildlife. From robins and jays to elk and deer, newborn wildlife can be found throughout the state at this time of the year. Colorado Parks and Wildlife asks Colorado residents and visitors to please refrain from touching or approaching the newborns so that they have a chance to thrive in their natural habitat.

"In almost every instance when somebody finds a baby chick, fawn or calf, the best course of action is to leave the newborn animal alone," said Rick Spowart, district wildlife manager in the Estes Park area. "Most newborn wildlife are typically left alone for long periods of time by their mothers on purpose."

By design, deer fawns and elk calves are born with natural camouflage and a lack of scent. In the first few days of their lives, the newborns are not mobile enough to travel with their mothers. As a defensive tactic to keep nearby predators away from the newborns' location, the mothers will often leave the young animals alone for long periods of time. During this crucial period, the mothers will visit the newborns at least twice a day to feed them. After a few days, the fawns and calves are usually strong enough to join their mothers and the herd, where there's more protection.

Spowart asks people who find a newborn deer, elk or antelope to leave the animal alone for at least 12 hours before calling – unless they are absolutely sure the parent animal is dead (hit by a car, for example).

Oftentimes, people will find young birds that appear to have fallen from their nests. Sometimes the birds have actually fallen and other times they're in the process of learning to fly. If the birds can safely be put back in the nest or on a high branch, it's okay to do so.

One of the best things residents and visitors can do to protect Colorado's newborn wildlife is to keep their pets under control. Countless numbers of baby rabbits, squirrels, birds and other wildlife fall prey to domestic dogs and cats every year. Owners of dogs that chase or injure big game animals – including newborns – can be held liable by law for their dog's actions.

Keeping your pets restrained or indoors as much as possible will protect newborn wildlife, as will respecting the many seasonal wildlife closures that are in place during this time of the year on various municipal, county, state and federal properties to protect young animals.

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How to Safely Haze Nuisance Mammals Out of Yards

- If approached by a coyote or fox, do not run or turn your back on it. Be as big and loud as possible.
- Wave arms and yell in an authoritative voice.
- Turn on sprinklers or spray with a garden hose.
- Throw rocks, sticks, tennis balls or anything else you can find.
- Bang pots and pan together.
- Sling a rock using a slingshot.

- Turn on flood lights.
 - Shake or throw a shaker can, which is a soda can filled with pennies or pebbles and sealed with duct tape.
 - Make noise with an air horn, whistle or other noise makers.
 - Spray pepper spray or citronella spray such as Sprayshield product.
 - Use a paintball gun to scare them off. The intent is to scare, not injure them.
- If animals are staying in yard overnight in specific area:
- Remove any attractants, pet bowls, birdfeeders, fallen fruit, remove/clean dirty grills and trash.
 - Trim bushes/trees, mow tall grass,

- remove or thin brush piles to eliminate cover for animals.
 - Place bright light by the area at night.
 - Throw dog scat or rags/tennis balls soaked in ammonia by the area.
 - Placing a loud radio (or other sound-producing device) by the area.
- The main goal is to make mammals that are a nuisance to humans uncomfortable and to instill the fear of humans and leave the area. Fireworks are prohibited in Jefferson County and cannot be used as a deterrent. Do not harass or injure the animals as this will make the situation worse. 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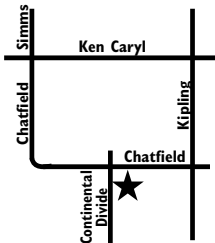

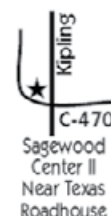

Youth Programs and Parks Department Team Up for Tree Planting

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Youth Programs and the Parks Department joined forces on April 24 to teach students about the importance of trees.

More than 40 students from the Ken-Caryl Ranch Preschool and the KC Nature Outdoor Discovery Program helped plant an English Oak at the Community Center. The Parks Department did the heavy lifting and dug the hole for the new tree, and the kids shoveled dirt into the hole and covered it with mulch. The tree planting was the culmination of a week-long tree education effort and celebration of Arbor Day in the Youth Programs.

Parks Director Allen Rogers taught the kids about the value of trees and discussed several reasons we need trees. He said the Ken-Caryl Ranch Parks Department plants an average of 60 new trees a year and explained that sometimes old trees must be cut down when they die or become a hazard.

Ken-Caryl Ranch is one of 3,400 communities nationwide that is designated a Tree City USA community. These communities achieved Tree City USA status by meeting four core standards of sound urban forestry management: maintaining a tree board or department, having a community tree ordinance, spending at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry, and celebrating Arbor Day.

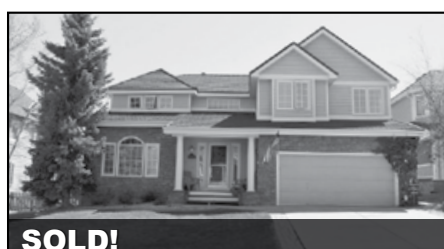

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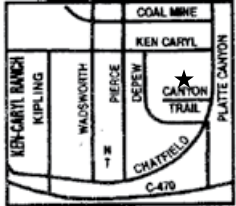


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KC Resident Opening Second Chick-fil-A Franchise

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Update on Historical Society Programs

On April 6 about 50 people enjoyed an evening with living historian Michael Schaub, who discussed trading practices in the high plains based on the 1837 inventory of a trading party along the Arkansas River.

The presentation contextualized the inventory of this specific trading party compared with other trading parties of the era. Although trading was generally conducted between men, Michael demonstrated through his research the influence that Indian wives had in determining the types and quality of the goods traded. Trade was not just furs, guns and alcohol. Depending on the needs of the tribe, household goods made up a large part of the inventory. The Indians were very savvy in assessing the quality of the manufactured goods they were offered, such as the cloth and dyes for clothing. Michael also brought a wide range of reproduction goods, from rifles to needles, and answered many questions from the attendees.

Now that spring is here, we will be opening the Bradford-Perley House for tours. Please contact Rose Lewis at 303-972-4576 if you are interested in a tour. We have started a small garden to the east side of the House with flowers that would have been typical during the Perley family's residency a century ago. The apple orchard is doing very well and the circa 1860 trees are continuing to flower and bear fruit. We anticipate that some of the young trees planted in 2010 will also fruit this year.

As you hike the Open Space trails this summer you will also see new signs describing the history of Ken-Caryl Valley, from the prehistoric era through the ranching era.

This fall we plan on hosting Matthew Mossbrucker, Director and Curator of the Morrison Natural History Museum, who will talk about dinosaurs. Look for the Save the Date announcement in a few months for this exciting program!

Dear Editor:

We have recently joined the sport of mountain biking around our beautiful community and trail system. However, there appears to be some confusion about crosswalk law. For instance, the other week we were returning from the Hogback Trail and dismounted from our bikes at the marked crosswalk at Ken Caryl and Valley Road. This marked crosswalk also has a posted yellow pedestrian sign. Several cars sped through the crosswalk without stopping to yield. We have experienced this numerous other times throughout the Valley. We have checked with the Colorado State Patrol who reviewed Colorado Revised Statutes 42-4-802(1&6) and 42-4-1412 10(b&c):

- Drivers shall yield the right-of-way, slowing down or stopping if need be to yield to pedestrians at crosswalks.
- A person riding or walking a bike along a sidewalk or pathway or across a roadway at a crosswalk shall have the

- rights and duties of a pedestrian.
- A person riding a bicycle shall dismount before entering any crosswalk where required – thereby becoming a pedestrian!
- Violation of these laws is a Class A traffic infraction.

The Colorado Driver Handbook also states "Pedestrians have the right-of-way at all intersections and crosswalks. Drivers must come to a complete stop and let the person pass safely."

Therefore, please yield and do what's right when you see us trying to cross a road. After all, it's the polite and legal thing to do.

It is now becoming clear how extensive are the negative effects of last year's policy by the MD to turn off many of the water sprinklers to irrigated verges.

Many of you will remember that last summer, once the disastrous effects of this policy were becoming obvious, a large turnout at a Board Meeting presented, at a rate of approximately 45 to 2 (according to my notes) a request that the Board restore the irrigation. It is now the time of year that the Board will be discussing this year's irrigation plans.


I urge all concerned residents to visit the places where the sprinklers were turned off, and see for yourselves how the vegetation, at least at the time of this writing, has not come back. As a result, parts of Valley Parkway - in particular from North Ranch Road to Long Spur, and various areas to the west of Valley Parkway south of Brannon Gearhart look derelict. As Valley Parkway is the main artery of the Valley, it is the first thing that visitors and residents alike get to see, and it should be a showcase of how we appreciate grass, flowers and trees. While not completely attainable, as we residents are owners of this property, it would be nice to have as a target, that the verges of Valley Parkway are maintained to as high a standard as a country club or vacation resort.

If you share my concerns, please call or write to the Board Members to request that we bring our community back to the

high landscaping standards which were on display when the development was new.
