Landscape Design and Maintenance

Spring is the time of year when we are anxious to enjoy our outdoor living and often will consider changes to the design and maintenance of our landscape. Xeriscape is an alternative to traditional landscaping that eventually conserves water and can provide a beautiful and inviting space.

If this becomes your choice, it is important to remember that xeriscaping requires as much or more maintenance as traditional landscaping (it is not ZEROscape). Many people create their own designs with excellent results, and landscape professionals can also serve as helpful resources. Pruning, weeding, proper fertilization, pest control and irrigation system adjustments are all necessary components that will maintain the intended beauty. Also remember to always water according to plant needs and current soil conditions.

On another note, Southern Living magazine suggests that to keep garden flowers free from being gobbled up by deer, choose flowers that people find glorious and deer find disgusting! Choose perennials like Butterfly Weed, Globe Thistle, Royal Red Butterfly Bush and Purple Cornflower and plant them in well-drained areas. These should be available at local garden centers. Happy spring time!

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Revised Bond Project Plans to be Presented June 2

At the Joint Study Session on Tuesday, representatives from Vanir Construction Management, Sink Combs Dethlefs Architecture & Design, and Adolfson & Peterson Construction presented initial pricing for the bond improvement projects. Unfortunately, the pricing exceeded our budget so we will be working together to modify the plans to provide facility upgrades that work within the funding approved by voters.

Tough decisions will need to be made regarding some of the enhancements. There may be parts of the designs that need to be added to a list of “future improvements” for implementation at a later date. The Boards want to ensure residents that the bond funds will be spent wisely and on the upgrades that are most beneficial to the community.

The design team is currently reworking the plans for all three facilities based on feedback from the Boards and staff, and they will present revised plans to both Boards at the Joint Study Session on Tuesday, June 2 at 6 p.m. at the Ranch House. Residents are welcome to attend the meeting. The plans will also be posted online for comment later that week. We appreciate your patience and understanding during this process. Sub-Contractor Prequalification for Bond Projects

The Ken-Caryl Ranch community has many talented professionals. During the General Contractor selection process for the bond projects, an idea resonated with the selection committee to provide an opportunity for residents involved in the construction industry to participate in the bond improvement projects.

Adolfson & Peterson (A&P) was selected as the Construction Manager/General Contractor for all three campus locations. A&P has agreed to participate in an online job fair to solicit interest in participating in the bidding process. All subcontractor bids will be competitive, and all subcontractors will need to become qualified through A&P’s bidding process. There are many components to these projects: demolition, framing, drywall, painting, HVAC, plumbing, electrical, landscaping, etc.

A&P welcomes the opportunity for any company located on Ken-Caryl Ranch or any Ken-Caryl resident who owns or works for a company in the construction industry to join us in improving these great facilities. Interested Ken-Caryl residents and businesses that would like to be considered as a subcontractor to work with A&P on the bond improvement projects must submit a Prequalification Packet.

Subcontractor prequalification is an integral part of A&P’s risk management program and a prerequisite for working with the company. Please complete the subcontractor prequalification questionnaire to help A&P better understand your operational capabilities, safety record and liquidity. Community Input: KCR Landscape Master Plan Open House May 20

All Ken-Caryl residents are invited to an open house on Wednesday, May 20 from 4:30-6:30 p.m. in the Ranch House Adult Lounge. The purpose of the event will be to present the Ranch-wide Landscape Master Plan and obtain additional resident input. The Landscape Master Plan has been prepared by Atkinson Design Group to serve as a long-range guide for future decision-making and investment in landscaped areas on Ken-Caryl Ranch. These areas include parks, playgrounds, medians, and irrigated areas adjacent to roads and parking. The scope of this plan does not include KCR open space.

The plan was conceived in conjunction with the implementation of \$7.9 million in bond funds approved by residents in May 2014. The plan will continue to serve as a tool for decision-making long after the bond funds are exhausted. Future boards may select projects from the Landscape Master Plan knowing that when implemented they will conform with and contribute to an overall integrated landscape. Additionally, the plan will help operational decisions such as tree maintenance and removal, irrigation upgrades and turf conversions.

Firearms and Projectiles Prohibited in Parks and Open Space

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Rules Concerning Homes Bordering Open Space

Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers routinely monitor open space lands adjacent to 850 homes to look for encroachments and landscape violations. This interface area is 17.5 miles in length. The open space is owned by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association (KCRMA). In an effort to minimize impact to open space, the KCRMA Board of Directors incorporated the Open Space & Parks Rules and Enforcement Policy regarding open space violations next to homes. The following are examples of open space violations and how they impact the resources contained in our open space.

Dumping

Includes grass clippings, branches, other yard waste, dog feces and construction debris. Harm to the open space includes yard waste containing seeds of non-native plants that can germinate and crowd out native and other desirable plants in the open space. Dump piles can provide habitat for rodents and snakes that you may not want living close to your house. The open space is not a public dumping area, but is shared by everyone to enjoy.

Driving in Open Space

Includes contractors using open space to access an owner's property, transportation of materials, ATVs or any other unauthorized vehicles in open space. Harm to the open space includes destruction of property, weed invasions, unsightly scars, erosion of bare soil and potential ignition source for wildfires.

Excessive Mowing

Includes mowing beyond the allowed four-foot wide swath where private property meets open space. Excessive mowing prevents seed development of native plants, not allowing them to reseed. Some native plants can be killed by excessive mowing, and variations in excessive mowing create an unsightly mosaic of the private property/open space boundaries.

Structures

Includes retaining walls, pathways or trails, extension of private landscaping, birdfeeders, play equipment (swing sets, trampolines, etc.), invisible dog fences or other fences, or any other structures are prohibited. The use of open space for personal benefit is unfair to other property owners.

Planting in Open Space

Includes trees, shrubs, non-native vegetation, or any other non-approved plantings. Planting non-native species can compete with native species. If a resident

is interested in planting in open space, they may submit a planting plan to KCRMA Open Space Committee for approval.

Enforcement Procedure

If a KCR Rules Violation is found adjacent to your property, you will be issued a KCR Contact Notice requiring you to stop and/or clean up the area by a deadline. Failure to meet the mitigation deadline may result in a second Contact Notice.

Any two or more violations or contact notices for the same violation within a 36-month period may result in a Notice of Hearing to appear before the KCRMA Board of Directors and penalties can be imposed.

NOTE: Residents are responsible for the actions of their contractors. When a contractor is driving on open space, dumping material, installing a fence in open space, etc., the resident will be cited and expected to mitigate the violation.

The main point regarding these violations is that any damage to open space grasses allows noxious weeds to grow. If a new weed area is established, then resources have to be redistributed from other areas to stop this new growth, straining the Ranger staff. In addition, noxious weeds can spread onto a homeowner's property.

Newborn Wildlife Usually Better Off Left Alone

Editor's Note: The following article has been re-printed from Colorado Parks and Wildlife. The Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Ranger staff receives several calls this time of year about "abandoned" baby deer and birds. The information in the article is applicable to our situation on Ken-Caryl Ranch. Most of the time when you find a fawn or fledgling on the ground, it is not orphaned, and the watchful eyes of the parents are nearby. If, however, baby wildlife have been unattended for a long period of time (12-24 hours), please contact the Rangers at 303-979-1876, ext. 170.

With spring and early summer comes a rebirth of Colorado's wildlife. From robins and jays to elk and deer, newborn wildlife can be found throughout the state at this time of the year. The Division of Wildlife (DOW) asks Colorado residents and visitors to please refrain from touching or approaching the newborns so that they have a chance to thrive in their natural habitat.

"In almost every instance when somebody finds a baby chick, fawn or calf, the best course of action is to leave the newborn animal alone," said Rick Spowart, district wildlife manager in the Estes Park area. "Most newborn wildlife are typically left alone for long periods of time by their mothers on purpose."

By design, deer fawns and elk calves are born with natural camouflage and a lack of scent. In the first few days of their lives, the newborns are not mobile enough to travel with their mothers. As a defensive tactic to keep nearby predators away from the

newborns' location, the mothers will often leave the young animals alone for long periods of time. During this crucial period, the mothers will visit the newborns at least twice a day to feed them. After a few days, the fawns and calves are usually strong enough to join their mothers and the herd, where there's more protection.

"The first few days of a newborn's life are critical," Spowart said. "Many people find a calf or fawn left on their own and they

think the animal's been abandoned. That's typically not the case."

Spowart asks people who find a newborn deer, elk or antelope to leave the animal alone for at least 12 hours before calling – unless they are absolutely sure the parent animal is dead (hit by a car, for example).

Oftentimes, people will find young birds that appear to have fallen from their nests. Sometimes the birds have actually fallen and other times they're in the process of

learning to fly. If the birds can safely be put back in the nest or on a high branch, it's okay to do so.

One of the best things residents and visitors can do to protect Colorado's newborn wildlife is to keep their pets under control. Countless numbers of baby rabbits, squirrels, birds and other wildlife fall prey to domestic dogs and cats every year. Owners of dogs that chase or injure big game animals—including newborns—can be held liable by law for their dog's actions.

"By nature, dogs and cats are predators. You can't really blame them for what they do naturally," said Steve Yamashita, assistant regional manager in Grand Junction. "But you can blame their owners. It's up to pet owners to contain their animals if they care about local wildlife."

According to Yamashita, dogs that chase wildlife without actually catching an animal still do harm, either causing the animal to expend critical energy or running it away from its newborn. However, dogs aren't the only dangerous pets.

"This time of the year, we have all of our young birds hatching out, and they're easy prey for cats," he said. "In my neighborhood alone, I've witnessed the cat population decimate a covey of quail."

Keeping your pets restrained or indoors as much as possible will protect newborn wildlife, as will respecting the many seasonal wildlife closures that are in place during this time of the year on various municipal, county, state and federal properties to protect young animals.

Pioneer Spirits: The Densmore Farm

The Joel Densmore family, like the Hotchkiss and Cowen families, established a farm along Massey Draw. Densmore purchased 80 acres of land on July 1, 1868, to the east of Jacob Cowen’s farm (see Life at Ken-Caryl, April 22, 2015), at the entrance to present-day Ken-Caryl Valley. The parcel was bisected by Massey Draw and at the valley between the Lyons and Dakota hogbacks. The family left about 1875 and moved on to Arizona.

While little is known about the Densmores during their residence in the valley, a photograph recently surfaced of their farm. Although the copy is of low resolution, it does show us a typical aspect of early settlement in this part of Colorado Territory. The rough wood house, outbuildings and fences were more easily constructed than the stone Bradford House. The small house to the right of the photograph sheltered Joel, his wife Elizabeth, and six children born between 1859 and 1872. The family also had a hired hand to help who possibly slept in the barn.

The view is to the south, taken a little uphill of the Y-intersection of Ken-Caryl Ave. and South Valley Road. The farmstead appears to be located on the north side of the Draw. A faint dark line behind the buildings may be the shadow of the cut bank. Behind is the treeless Lyons Hogback. The farmstead disappeared long ago, and is now mostly beneath the pavement of the roads. Should you have the chance to walk along the North Hogback trails, take a moment just above the parking area at the trail head and look to the south and imagine a settler’s life here 140 years ago.

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

Swallows, Sparrows and Spotted Towhees

Ever wonder what type of bird was sitting on your feeder, in a tree near your home, or singing in your window? Well why not learn? Come join Mike Foster, birding enthusiast, for an adult bird hike on Friday, June 5 from 9 a.m.-noon. We will meet at Dakota Lodge. Please be sure to bring water, a snack and binoculars if you have them. Cost is \$6 for residents and \$8 for non-residents.

Mike will go over sight and sound recognition of different bird species while also leading a beautiful hike on the Hogback Trail, Kiln Trail and Lyons Trail, which is about three miles roundtrip. These trails lead through the Lyons and Morrison formations that are home to grassland and scrub oak habitat. It's perfect for seeing an array of bird species.

A fourth-generation Coloradan, Mike grew up hiking, climbing mountains and skiing. Since he was 10, birds have had a grip on his soul. Mike has enjoyed three partly overlapping careers: history professor, executive in the non-profit sector and freelance writer. He has taught at Stanford, the University of Illinois and the University of Colorado. He was the first executive director of The Denver Foundation.

As a writer he has published four books and more than 70 articles on history, biography, mountaineering, business, natural history and birds. In his most recent book, *The Ties That Bind: Birds, Nature and Us* (2010), Mike tells how he became fascinated with birds and committed to helping them in their struggle to survive. He assesses our environmental dilemmas and suggests how you can make a difference in solving them. His essays combine openhearted encounters with nature and pointed insights into contemporary culture.

He also leads birding trips for two local Audubon chapters, for the Denver Field Ornithologists and for the Colorado Mountain Club. On his trips, and in his bird classes, Mike goes beyond identifying birds and considers their wider place in the natural world—a world to which all humans and all creatures belong.

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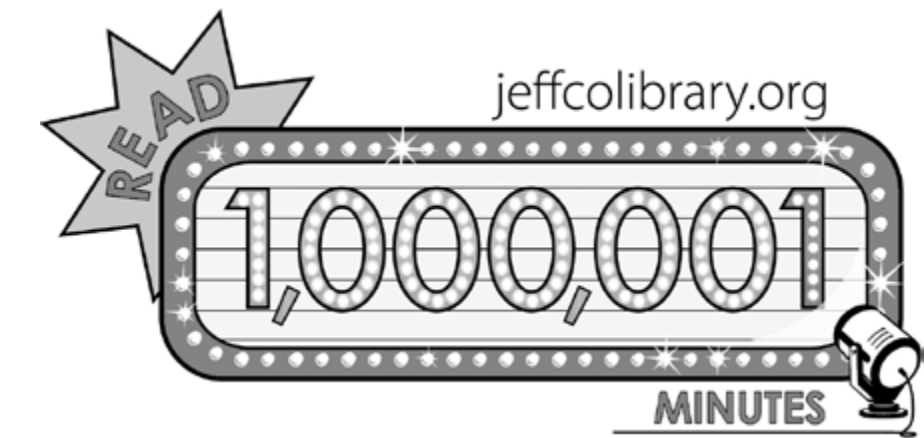
Summer Reading Starts with the Bookmobile

Garage Sale Signage Policy Reminder

The fourth annual Ken-Caryl Community-Wide Garage Sale will be Friday and Saturday, May 29-30 from 8 a.m.-2 p.m. in your own driveway or garage. Discounted garage sale signs are available for \$3 (normally \$5) at the Ranch House now through May 29. Only these architecturally approved (white 24" wide by 18" high) signs may be used. The Garage Sale Signage Policy is listed below as a reminder to residents about where signs are allowed.

The purpose of this signage policy is to maintain an aesthetically pleasing neighborhood while offering an opportunity for residents to advertise garage sales, etc. We appreciate your cooperation by adhering to the guidelines which were adopted by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Architectural Committee.

Signs may be purchased Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. at the Ranch House business office, 7676 South Continental Divide Road (holidays excluded). Only these architecturally approved (white 24" wide by 18" high) signs may be used. Signs cannot be posted sooner than the evening before the sale and must be removed no later than the evening of the last day of the sale.

Sample/Garage/Yard Sale Policy

Garage sales cannot exceed 3 sales per calendar year and shall not be held for more than 4 consecutive days per sale (per County regulation Section 8 - orig. 6-23-81).

Sign Locations

To keep your community safe and to keep high impact areas free of clutter, the following rules must be followed.

- Signs will only be allowed at intersections where a turn is required to reach the sale, and only one sign per intersection per event. Each sign must have left or right turn arrow.
- Signs will not be allowed on Ken Caryl Avenue west of C-470 except at the intersection of the Valley Parkway.

- Signs will not be allowed on South Valley Road except at the intersection of the Valley Parkway or Club Drive.
- Signs will not be allowed at the intersection of Ken Caryl Avenue and Continental Divide Road.
- No signs permitted on medians.
- No banners are allowed.

It is unacceptable to attach poster board or other material to your sign. Our goal is to have this signage appear neat and uniform.

Please Note!!! Signs in any of the above-mentioned areas and other non-complying signs will be removed without notification.
