A Tale of Two Amendments

Most Coloradans are familiar with TABOR in some form or another. TABOR is the "Taxpayer Bill of Rights," which was passed by a vote of the people in 1992. TABOR imposes some of the strictest revenue and spending limits in the nation by prohibiting any tax increase without a vote of the people, limiting how much revenue the state can keep and spend, and requiring any revenue collected in excess of set limits to be refunded to the taxpayers.

While these restrictions may sound great for the average taxpayer, they made it difficult for many local governments to function well. As a result, many municipalities and special districts, including the Ken-

Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District, "de-bruced" by a vote of the people. "De-brucing" lifts some of these restrictions, in turn allowing the District to retain revenue from year-to-year in the form of reserves.

Turning the clock back another decade, in 1982 Colorado voters passed the Gallagher Amendment. Gallagher is another tax amendment intended to protect residential and commercial tax rates from an imbalance by maintaining a consistent ratio between the revenue from each. The effect of Gallagher is of particular significance for the District because our tax revenue is approximately 80 percent residential. As property values rise, Gallagher reduces the assessment rate to keep residential rates in line with slower growing commercial rates. This, in turn, reduces the amount of tax revenue the District receives, which is a significant funding source for services to the community.

I bring these two amendments up because you will likely hear more about them in the coming months as more and more communities feel the impacts of lower tax revenue and the limitations on raising taxes without a vote. At the District, the Board and staff are working diligently to evaluate our service levels and ensure we are operating as efficiently as possible without disrupting services. We are also paying close attention to projections for the next rate adjustment and what that will mean for our tax revenue in the future. Each month at the Metro District Board Meetings, we are discussing our current mill levy and next steps. Stay tuned for more information or join us at a meeting to learn more.

Resident Survey FAQs

Who Pays for Fence Repairs/ Replacement?

The subject of fences is a complicated issue because some sections of perimeter and greenbelt fence are the financial responsibility of the Master Association or Metropolitan District, while individual owners are responsible for other sections. The Metropolitan District pays for fence repairs on identified perimeter and greenbelt fences out of its annual operating budget, and replacement of these fences is budgeted for in the Master Association Reserve Fund.

The fences were installed by the builders/developers at different stages of the development of Ken-Caryl Ranch. Depending upon the conditions at the time and location of the neighborhood, different standards were applied and fence responsibility assigned. The Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards have discussed fences periodically since the early 1990s with no obvious or easy solution. Survey results regarding fences are on page 11.

Buying and selling a home can be such an exciting process, but there is a lot to do. We rely on realtors, title companies and other support systems to help get through the task.

Part of the process includes a review of the property and membership status to ensure the homeowners are in good standing with the Master Association as well as any

subassociations. When a title company requests the status for a property from the Master Association, we review the dues payment status and assess future months' dues to be paid at closing; we look at the property history for any outstanding covenant violations and may conduct a visual curbside inspection of the property for any non-compliant exterior improvements may need to be addressed prior to the transfer of ownership.

Additionally, if the property is adjacent to Open Space, the Rangers will conduct a review as well. They look for any open encroachment violations or notifications that would need to be communicated to the new owner. Finally, the title company is notified of instances where a property is managed privately by a subassociation, who will submit their own status as well.

After closing, the title company will mail a check for the dues payment, transfer fee, the required Senate Bill 100 Disclosure Statement, warranty deed and a buyer information sheet. This process can take up to a few weeks, though once received is administered as quickly as possible. The prior owner's dues payment account will be closed and a new account created for the new owner. The Master Association then sends an update to the Recreation Department, Open Space Department and the new owner is added to the e-News (upon request). The new resident receives a Welcome Letter e-mail telling them about Ken-Caryl, their account number and how to access it, payment options, and helpful links to important homeowner resources.

Master Declaration, Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, Rules and Regulations, Master Association Board and Annual Meeting Minutes, Neighborhood Subassociations, Master Association Audit, Master Association Budget, Master Association Monthly Financials and Master Association Insurance Certificate: these documents are commonly requested at the sale of a property and are available on our website at www.kencarylranch.org under the Administration tab, then Realtor Package.

We want to do our best to ensure a smooth transition when a property changes hands and that new residents to Ken-Caryl Ranch receive a proper welcome to the neighborhood. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me at jennyb@kcranch.org or 303-979-1876, ext. 113.

Board Meeting Summary

Joint Study Session

On June 5, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District held a Joint Study Session and discussed the following items:

- A resident presented to the Boards about the proposed Line 85 elimination from the RTD bus routes. He encouraged the Boards to advocate to RTD to keep the line. Board members in attendance supported this request. Staff will confirm support from the Board members that were unable to attend the meeting and send a letter asking RTD to maintain this
- The Boards discussed the Ranch
 House swimming pool project and
 cooperative agreement. To ensure there
 is sufficient time for public input, a more
 thorough design and bid process, and to
 accumulate more funding, the Boards and
 staff agreed to push the pool build out a
 year and start in fall 2019 instead of 2018.
- The Boards plan to review greenbelt W drainage conditions and some other pools at their July 10 Study Session.
- The Boards discussed the possibility of a Metro District Mill Levy and Gallagher Amendment Update for the November 2018 Metro District ballot.
- The Boards discussed a letter from the Ken-Caryl Ranch Foundation. They would like to strengthen ties with the Foundation.

• The Master Association Board agreed to

fund a second community trash day to

be scheduled in the fall.
The Boards discussed the opportunity to gather license plate numbers from cars parked in the Brannon Gearhart and Bradford parking lots, identify owners, and contact non-members to see why they were in the lot. It was decided not to pursue this option at this time.



- If approached by a coyote or fox, do not run or turn your back on it. Be as big and loud as possible.
- Wave arms and yell in an authoritative voice.
- Turn on sprinklers or spray with a garden hose.
- Throw rocks, sticks, tennis balls or anything else you can find.
- Bang pots and pans together.
- Sling a rock using a slingshot.
- · Turn on flood lights.
- Shake or throw a shaker can, which is a soda can filled with pennies or pebbles and sealed with duct tape.
- Make noise with an air horn, whistle or other noise maker.
- Spray pepper spray or citronella spray such as Sprayshield product.
- Use a paintball gun to scare them off. The intent is to scare, not injure them.
 If animals are staying in yard overnight in specific area:
- Remove any attractants, pet bowls, birdfeeders, fallen fruit, remove/clean dirty grills and trash.
- Trim bushes/trees, mow tall grass, remove any brush piles so as to eliminate cover for animals.
- Place bright light by the area at night.
- Throw dog scat or rags/tennis balls soaked in ammonia by the area.
- Placing a loud radio (or other soundproducing device) by the area.

The main goal is to make mammals that are a nuisance to humans uncomfortable and to instill the fear of humans and leave the area. Fireworks are prohibited in Jefferson County and cannot be used



as a deterrent. Do not harass or injure the animals as this will make the situation worse. If you have any questions, feel free to email matto@kcranch.org or call the Rangers at 303-979-1876, ext. 170.

Ranch House Pool Replacement Update

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards and staff are working with Ohlson Lavoie Architects on a design for the new pool at the Ranch House. To ensure there is sufficient time for public input, a more thorough design and bid process, and to accumulate more funding, the Boards and staff are going to push the pool build out a year and start in fall 2019 instead of 2018. This would mean the current Ranch House Pool would remain for the 2019 summer swim season.

The pool may cost more money than initially thought, especially if the majority of the

community's needs and desires are incorporated. Delaying the pool construction by a year will allow more money to be saved. Even after evaluating possible increases in construction costs, the Boards and staff still feel it is in the community's best interest to wait a year.

The architect is currently improving the design based on feedback from the community open house in March. A revised design will be presented at another open house later this summer. Watch the paper and e-News for details!



Items Hauled Away for Free

The Recycling Event has come and gone. The Community Garage Sale is past. Still got some stuff hanging around the house that you have been meaning to get rid of? Didn't get around to organizing that garage sale or summon the energy to get rid of that '80s sleeper sofa? What if there was a company that would come pick up almost anything you want to get rid of and haul it away? There is!

Local Real Estate Agents from Colorado Home Realty are sponsoring a pickup with Gone for Good of one to three items on June 29 and 30, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on both days. For most items this service will be FREE; however, there will be charges for electronic items as follows: 31-inch or smaller TV or large monitor \$25, 32-42-inch TV or monitor \$50, 43-inch or larger TV or monitor \$75, console or rear projection TV \$100. Printers and flat screen monitors are \$10.

Gone for Good is an eco-friendly local company that will pick up most everything from trash to furniture, large or small, haul them away, and do everything they can to find them a new home or recycle them. Reid Husmer, owner and originator of the concept, and his crew work hard to resell items, donate items to charity, or break them down and recycle. Reduce/Resell/ Recycle is the mission at Gone for Good.

Gone for Good typically charges \$150 to pick up 1-3 items, \$300 for a quartertruck pickup, \$450 for a half-truck, \$550 for three-quarters truck and \$650 for a full truck (16-foot box truck, 39 cubic yards). The only items they are not able to take are household hazardous chemicals.

The guys from Gone for Good will do the lifting and hauling. The normal minimum cost to pick up one to three items is \$150, so take advantage of this event if you can. All you have to do is call to let them know what you would like hauled away.



Fire Restrictions Implemented for Jefferson County

On June 5, Jefferson County Sheriff Jeff Shrader implemented temporary Stage 1 Fire Restrictions for all lands in Jefferson County. Please note the Fire Restrictions were in place as of press time. Citizens wishing to obtain current fire restriction or fire ban information, firework regulations, burn permit information, or to report a firework violation can call the Jeffco Sheriff's Fire Information Hotline at 303-271-8200. For more information about the restrictions, see the Jeffco Sheriff's website at https://www.jeffco.us/511/Fire-Restrictions-Bans

These restrictions are being enacted due to current dry conditions favorable for the possibility of a wildfire and limited availability of fire control resources. Please note the use of all fireworks is prohibited within the restricted area. Conditions will continue to be monitored and restrictions

will be adjusted in the coming weeks as necessary.

The following activities are prohibited under Stage 1 Fire Restrictions in the restricted portions of the county:

- Building, maintaining, attending, or using any fire or recreational campfire, except a recreational fire within a permanently constructed fire grate in a developed park, campground, private residence, or picnic area.
- Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area of at least six feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all combustible material.
- Open burning, including "bon fires" that require a permit from the fire authority having jurisdiction
- The use of all fireworks.





Pet Care and Evacuation in Wildfire

Just as humans prepare, it's important to have household pets ready yearround for a potential wildfire evacuation. Preparing animals for an evacuation, however, requires an extra level of planning, preparedness and practice.

Evacuation Tips

Bring pets inside at the early signs of a wildfire - if an evacuation notice is issued, they'll be close and you won't have to spend time searching for them outdoors. If possible, take pets with you when evacuating; they could encounter problems when left on their own, and you could have difficulty locating them when you return. Don't ever delay leaving home during a fire to find pets; your personal safety could depend on a quick exit!

Make sure your pets have proper identification in case you are separated from the animals. A collar and identification tag with current information will help to ensure that your pets are reunited with you should you become separated during an emergency, such as a wildfire, as often occurs. Provide a set of house keys to a trusted neighbor who is willing to assist your pets in case a wildfire strikes when you are not at home. And promise to do the same for their pets.

What to Expect for Your Pets When You've Been Evacuated


The majority of human evacuation centers cannot accept pets due to health and safety regulations. Typically, only service animals are permitted in an evacuation center. If your family will be staying at a public shelter during an evacuation, it's important to know animals may not be allowed to stay with

In some communities, evacuation shelters are located close to where pets are kept, but that's not always the case. If they're housed closely, you may have an opportunity to care for them yourself. Many of the supplies needed for a pet kit can be used. When you buy a new leash, collar or bed, add the old item to your pet's emergency kit. Instead of disposing of old towels and blankets, wash them and put some in your pet's kit.

Capture high-quality photos and descriptions of your pets electronically. Scan the recommended documents and photos and store them on a flash drive inside the kit or email the photos and other information to vourself. Consider giving an additional flash drive to a friend or relative that lives in a neighboring community; that way if you don't have time to pack your pet evacuation kit, you'll have another option to retrieve the information.



Fences and Covenants


My name is Chris Figge. I've been a member of the Community Planning Committee for several years, as well as the Master Association (MA) Board liaison to the Covenant Control Committee. As a 26-year resident of Ken-Caryl Ranch, I've seen our community grow, change, evolve and refresh itself through the most recent bond referendum. Two issues I'd like to give my input on are perimeter fences and the covenant control process. I am Ken-Caryl.


Fences. I've included the survey results from our most recent survey regarding your opinion on what, if anything, the MA should do regarding the deteriorating condition of our perimeter fences. Most of these fences are owned and maintained by residents. It is estimated to cost approximately \$750,000 to replace them if these fences were to become MA responsibility in the future. Maintenance would cost an additional \$25,000 per year for these fences.

Fences are divided into essentially three groups. First, fences owned by the MA and on MA property are maintained and replaced when necessary by the MA and Metropolitan District (MD). Second, fences where one side of the fence borders private property and the other side is community property. In some cases, maintenance and replacement is the responsibility of the MA/MD. However, in many other cases the adjacent homeowner is responsible. Third is where the fence is entirely on private property, and in this case the individual homeowner is the responsible party and must adhere to fencing guidelines as set by Architectural Standards and enforced by the Covenant Control Committee.

Results from our most recent survey fairly mirror the results of the 2012 survey. In every segment of our community, the overwhelming consensus is NOT to fund additional fence maintenance and replacement through MA dues or MD taxes. And while I have been an advocate for MA/MD responsibility of our perimeter fences, the results are clear.

Covenants. As the liaison to the Covenant Control Committee, you can see from the attached graph that most people are in fact quite pleased with the level of covenant enforcement on KCR. We deal with myriad issues, from paint, roofing, landscaping, trees and so on. Anything that is visible from the street impacts the appearance of the entire community. It is our responsibility to you, the members of this covenant-protected community, to do our utmost to help you maintain home values. The survey results reflect a job well done by this dedicated group of volunteers who are your neighbors.



Historical Society Dedicates Pump House

On June 2, several residents gathered at the site of the historic Pump House located west of Dakota Lodge. The Historical Society dedicated the structure with an educational speech and ribboncutting ceremony.

Jim Antes, chair of the Historical Society, gave an overview of the history of the Pump House. It is believed the structure was built around 1940 to support cattle operations through irrigation. It was likely built during the time that William Allen or Joseph Minissale owned Ken-Caryl Ranch.

The Pump House sat unused for close to 40 years, and residents Steve and Lori Kraft took on the renovation project in 2013. Jeff Allison, who was the chair of the Historical Society at that time, also helped launch the project.

"Honestly, the reason I was so interested in saving the Pump House, is that I had lived so close to it for 15 years, and I always wanted to know what was inside that building," said Lori. "Actually, after joining the KCR Historical Society, this Pump House project came up, for either possible renovation or to have it removed. I just didn't want to see a historical structure lost. It's a coollooking building and a lot of people get to enjoy it walking down the path. It's great everyone now knows what is inside that building and what it was used for. Also, I enjoy the challenge of fixing thinas."

As shown in the photos, the Pump House was in shambles prior to renovation. Rangers Peter Marozas and Mike Ryan and several Historical Society volunteers helped clean out 30 bags of trash from the small building and had to wear protective masks. They replaced boards on the building with barn wood, and a new roof was donated by Tennant Roofing. Twenty tubes of caulk were used to seal the building! There is a special design on the front door that can also be found on the Equestrian Center barn and arena doors.

A video of the project was put together by Realtor Susan Schell. The video can be viewed by searching on YouTube for Ken-Caryl Pump House. Huge thanks go to Steve and Lori for seeing this project through. The many dedicated members of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society are the reason the rich history of the area is preserved. Thank you to everyone involved!





If the Open Space Committee and members of the Trails Club have their way, another portion of our pristine neighborhood will be permanently scarred, a travesty for current and future generations. Section 7 of the Plum Thicket/Manzanita trail development is slated to cut through the middle of beautiful

open space adjacent to Valley Parkway and across from the Bradford North 4-8 entrance.

The published goal of the Open Space Committee is to improve existing social trails formed by residents in the area, yet their proposal calls for development, cutting a new meandering trail and building a bridge over wetlands. Their justification falls short, given no social trail exists, an improved concrete sidewalk is just steps away, and this sidewalk already crosses the wetlands at Woodruff. A new trail in this area will startle and drive wildlife to cross Valley Parkway, causing a safety hazard for vehicles and wildlife.

The Trails/Open Space Committee is fully aware of all of these concerns. They now propose their option for "continuity" of the trail along the drainage when there's already continuity. There simply isn't a compelling reason to re-create section 7. It disturbs more open space and spends yet more money for another bridge.

My concerns as a Mountain Biker. In my opinion some previous MA Board members have put us at liability risk. Have you read or heard about the near biking death? This is sad. It could happen again. The new MA Board needs to take a pause and stop all new loop trail construction. A community vote is needed.

When I moved to KCR in the early 1980s as a young 40+ year old, I bought a mountain bike. Outside the boundaries of Ken-Caryl my friends would challenge one another similar to downhill skiing. It was fun but certainly more dangerous than skiing. I always thought this should never take place in KCR.

Trails here were for the purpose of reaching vantage points of interest and to observe the wonders of nature located in an expansive pristine and relatively undisturbed foothills environment. This could be done judiciously with hiking, biking or by horseback riding. The KCR



Open Space Comprehensive Master Plan of 1997 seemed to support this viewpoint philosophically and for us to enjoy the open space the way it was meant to be.

Our loop trail system allows aggressive biking behavior. This small community does not have deep pockets and yet non-resident use is encouraged. The Willow Springs Agreement is an example. I think most residents would be shocked if they read this agreement. When I read the biological studies, I was surprised that this expansive loop trail system was approved. Conversation with Trail Club members and leadership, Open Space Committee members, and MA Board members is needed by residents before another serious accident, a lawsuit, or substantial fine occurs. The new trail map and Docmann look to me like a MTB race

So what about the severe biking accident that occurred in late April. Perhaps you may have read about it in the small print of the MA Board notes on page 3, May 30 issue, Life at Ken-Caryl newspaper. At a meeting we heard that a non-resident biker suffered a fractured neck and a severed blood vessel and he could have died.
