Projects Around the Ranch

More projects underway. As I write this, Urban Drainage's contractor working in conjunction with Jefferson County is scheduled to begin work on the North Tributary of Massey Draw Bank Stabilization Project at Ken Caryl Ave. This project will address the area of the corrugated metal pipe that deposits storm-water runoff from Ken Caryl Ave. into the North Massey drainage below the road south of the Equestrian Center.

The best way for crews and equipment to access this site is from the end of Canyon Cedar and then across the top of the dam. Unfortunately, this

will require trail detours and closures for the duration of the project (approximately four months). The contractor, Valles Construction, has reviewed the project with representatives of the Master Association, Urban Drainage and Jefferson County. Together, the least impactful routes have been identified as we work together to minimize the impact on trail users. See page 6 for more information.

Also scheduled to begin work is a Master Association project to realign the trail behind homes on Buckthorn near the intersection of Wood Sorrel. This project will improve the gradient of the access trail as well as move a section of trail to the north, which will provide for better exposure to sun in the winter and less ice buildup.

Resident Survey FAQs

Why Do the Pools Close Early in the Season?

Ken-Caryl Ranch has three pools: Bradford, Community Center and Ranch House. There are a few reasons we close two of them earlier in the season: staffing, low attendance and resources. We hire and train a lifeguard staff each summer that consists mostly of high school or college students who return to school in mid-August. Additionally, attendance at all pools is highest in June and the beginning of July. By late July, daily use of the pools drops significantly. Operating three pools is a big expense for the District. Once school starts in mid-August, there are not enough lifeguards to keep all three pools open, and with low attendance, the cost of operating multiple pools outweighs the benefit to the community. Instead, we focus our resources on one pool for the last couple weeks of the season. The Community Center Pool is open through Labor Day. After Labor Day, we are planning to keep the Splash Pad open on some days, weather permitting.

Trash Service Delay Week of Fourth of July

This is a reminder from the Ken-Caryl Ranch trash service provider, Waste Connections, that Fourth of July is an observed holiday. Trash and recycling for Wednesday and Thursday customers will be delayed



one day the week of Fourth of July. If your regular trash day is Monday or Tuesday, your trash and recycling service will remain on schedule.

Waste Connections offers an auto-dial service to notify customers of any delays or changes in trash pickup days. If you are interested in being notified through this service, you can sign up online at www.wcdenver.com/contact/. Complete the required information, and in the comment section at the bottom of the page explain that you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up for the Call Fire service.

What Happens After You Call to Report a Violation?

Reporting a violation or a perceived violation can be challenging. Many residents prefer to address their neighbors directly. When one has a good relationship with their neighbor this can be a simple conversation. If one doesn't have the confidence that a reasonable conversation is possible, members have the Master Association to help.

When a complaint is received, an inspection is initiated to verify the report. An inspection typically begins with a review of the rules and a curbside inspection. In most instances a complaint can be validated on the spot. For example: "My neighbor has not mowed their lawn." That's pretty simple; I can drive up and see whether or not a lawn is mowed. If the complaint cannot be verified or interpretation is needed, the Master Association's Architectural Consultant may be asked to inspect and give their input. An example where interpretation may be needed would be a situation where a resident feels their neighbor's landscaping design is unattractive and, in some way, violates the covenants. In some cases, the Architectural Committee may be tasked with providing an interpretation of the rules in a regular meeting to determine if a violation exists.

In an attempt to limit unnecessary contact, we try to do as much behind the scenes prior to contacting the homeowner. When a complaint is validated, the violation policy is activated and the first contact or letter of violation is sent. The letter states that a violation has been observed that needs the attention of the homeowner with a timeframe to cure. This opens up the dialog with the homeowner to communicate whatever plans they have in place to cure or to offer any clarity on the matter. Most concerns are resolved without any further involvement than this.

Should the matter go unattended and no communication from the homeowner has been initiated, another letter is sent explaining what may happen if the violation continues to go uncured. The violation policy then gives one more chance with a Hearing Notice. The Hearing Notice informs the resident that the matter will be reviewed by the Covenant Control Committee, who may impose fines and revoke community privileges. Should a complaint be investigated and the property is found to be compliant, no further action is taken. Every reported concern has its own set of circumstances and the path to resolution can be different from one issue to the next.

- A motion passed adopting the final trail alignment for section 7 of the East Plum Thicket/Manzanita Trail.
- A motion passed moving the discussion about curb cuts/ramps at the intersection of Valley Parkway and North Massey Trail to 2019 budget talks.
- · A motion passed appointing Lauri Osborne to the Open Space Committee.
- · A motion passed authorizing an expenditure of \$2,500 to survey the open space boundary for the Docmann Loop Trail location.
- Chris Pacetti's Manager's Report included: potential solution to the proposed cancellation of RTD bus route 85; update on the Urban Drainage Project on Massey Draw; workers' comp rating going down; new trees and slide repair in Heirloom Park; update on the fence/wall project along Valley Parkway; proposal to replace the white split-rail fence around the Ranch House with a natural-wood fence; possibility of a Mill Levy vote for the Metropolitan District.



Camping in Open Space

Rangers receive several questions a year from residents interested in camping within the open space but are not familiar with the sites, locations or how to reserve them. There are officially six areas to camp. Bradford Open Space, which has the only fire pit, needs to be reserved through Dakota Lodge. The other five sites can be reserved on a first come, first served basis at the campsite registration box located on the porch of Dakota Lodge.

Campers must first check the registration sheet to see if a site has been reserved. If the site is open, a person must list the site name, permit number, date of camping and sign their name/address. Campers will then take with them the camping permit and a camping brochure that lists campsite descriptions and Camping Rules. Once at the site, the permit will be placed on the hook of the campsite marker (plastic post approximately 2-feet high).

- Camping is limited to three days and two nights at each site
- Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- No open fires of any kind are allowed, only camp stoves (exception is Bradford Open Space).
- All trash must be packed out.
- Handle/store food appropriately because campsites are in mountain lion and bear country.

Campsite Descriptions


- 1. Bradford Open Space: Mowed area behind the restored ruins of the Bradford-Perley House, which was built in 1859. Sits within mixed grasslands and backs to a historic apple orchard. Dramatic red rock formations dominate the landscape. Reserved only through Ranch House.
- 2. Gothic Overlook: Clearings A or B near the east end of Gothic Overlook Trail. The site is dominated by Gambel oak and mountain mahogany shrubs with great views of the valley and all the way into Denver
- 3. Manor House: Clearings A or B south of the picnic shelter or site C in front of the old corral in the meadow south of Little John's Chimney Trail. Near the top of Manor House Trail, this site is tucked between oaks and ponderosa pine on the edge of a meadow that fills with wildflowers in spring. Campers can view Mt. Evans to the northwest on clear days.
- 4. North Hogback: East side of North Hogback Trail, 50 feet north of the picnic shelter. This campsite lies between the Dakota and Lyons Hogbacks in a valley with mixed grasses and occasional narrow-leaf yucca clusters.
- 5. Silver Cliff: Clearing 50 feet south of Bradford Trail. One of the park's more secluded offerings. With a covering of oak and mature ponderosa pine, campers have a southeasterly facing view of the foothills and Pike National Forest beyond.
- 6. Tin Cup: Clearing north of Summit View Trail, marked by a sign. The park's highest campsite may take its name from a community on Colorado's Western Slope. At over 7,800 feet above sea level, Tin Cup affords spectacular views of the open space system.



Isaac Mueller Named Semi-Finalist for International Ballet Competition

Ken-Caryl resident Isaac Mueller, son of Gunther and Sue Anne Mueller, has been named a semi-finalist for the 2018 USA International Ballet Competition in Jackson, Mississippi.

Isaac and his partner, Avery Underwood, were chosen by the USA IBC International Jury to move forward to the second round of the competition.

Out of 92 total competitors from 17 nations, Isaac was chosen as a semifinalist along with 43 other dancers. He is competing in the junior male division along with eight other dancers.

Semi-finalists will perform contemporary choreography in the second round of the 2018 USA IBC. After the second round's three sessions, the USA IBC International Jury will decide on finalists to compete in the third round of competition, from which medalists and award winners will be determined.

The USA IBC is a quadrennial Olympicstyle ballet competition in which top dancers vie for gold, silver and bronze medals; cash awards; company contract; and scholarships. The event is designated as the official international ballet competition in the United States by a Joint Resolution of Congress.

Residents Ride **Elephant Rock for Local Charity**



Urban Drainage Project

Urban Drainage and Flood Control
District recently started work on the
North Tributary to Massey Draw Bank
Stabilization Project. The project will fix a
severely eroded embankment on the west
side of Ken Caryl Ave. Workers will access
the project at the end of Canyon Cedar and
then drive to the project area.

Purpose and Need: In order to preserve the integrity of the roadway embankment, Jefferson County requested the assistance of Urban Drainage. Urban Drainage hired a Consulting Engineer to design and a Contractor to construct improvements that will stop the erosion.


Improvements Include:

- Stacked boulder walls to stabilize the drainageway bank and protect the roadway embankment
- Minor channel regrading
- Three boulder drop structures
- Rip-rap channel protection

Project Impact: All efforts will be employed to minimize disturbance to existing vegetation. Upon project completion, all areas disturbed by construction activities will be reseeded. Urban Drainage will maintain this project for Jefferson County and monitor revegetated areas to assure a good vegetative cover. Existing trees and brush that shield this area from nearby residences will remain undisturbed.

Bond Projects Overview

We are pleased to announce that the Bond Projects are officially complete. While the majority of the work was finished more than a year ago, there have been some minor projects and warranty work that were still in progress. It's all done now! The capital improvement projects at the Community Center, Ranch House, Dakota Lodge, and parks totaled \$8.65 million. Below is a breakdown of all the funding, how the money was spent, and what improvements were made. We have also included graphics that show the financial breakout by site, category and funding source.

Community Center

We were able to completely renovate the fitness center, adding new equipment and make better use of all the space in the lower level of the building. A new, accessible entrance to the building and elevator made the building ADA compliant and created access to all amenities at the site for people of all abilities. We resurfaced tennis courts 3-6 (note: Courts 1 & 2 were resurfaced with another funding source), added bathrooms and a pavilion near the courts, added a playground for older kids and renovated the site landscaping. Inside, we remodeled the front desk, consolidated office spaces and created an additional community/program area.

Ranch House

The administrative side of the Ranch House was remodeled to maximize community use space. The Shaffer and

Bradford Rooms were remodeled and office space was consolidated to provide a more useful front desk and lobby area. The Recreation side of the building was renovated to provide new space for youth programs, which were previously operating out of the basement. A new pool entrance created better traffic flow in the summer, and bathrooms accessible from the outside of the building provide a much-needed amenity for all park

Dakota Lodge

With the addition of the Lodge Room at Dakota Lodge, the site is now able to accommodate the heavy demand for community use and programming. There is now a dedicated classroom for the thriving Environmental Education programs as well as the new space that is used for private events, community gatherings and programming. Renovated office space for some of the Ranger Staff allowed for the creation of a conference room that is available for community use as well. The park and playground were renovated to create an outdoor experience that matches the site, creates more learning opportunities and addressed accessibility challenges.


Parks and Signs

The McDowells believe that nature is a remedy to that struggle and can nourish the soul.

"My favorite thing in the whole world is nature, animals and being with my family," said daughter Annabelle McDowell.

There are 59 National Parks scattered all across North America, and there are even some out of the contiguous states like American Samoa and Dry Tortugas, that will take some additional effort in which to get. That is all part of the exciting adventure ahead.

Wonderful and surprising things happen when families are out in nature together. A buffalo wandered into their camp late at night in Theodore Roosevelt National Park and ate a midnight snack only yards away....and while kayaking together at

Harvey Gap not too long ago, Andrew, 9, looked at his dad and said, "This is so great."

How do they not get overwhelmed for such extensive traveling? "Planning!", said Alexis. "I like to plan everything out so that we don't miss anything." This means that Alexis reads lots of resources to gain information about where they will go and what could be interesting to see along the way. She is also a member of many online groups that also share inside info and tips for the parks and camping.

The McDowells have found that they are not alone in their goal to visit all the parks. There are many others online who share the goal, and even a family or two here in the KC area who are further along in accomplishing the goal. The McDowells love to connect with people who have this love of nature.

In an effort to forge family bonds and create wonderful memories, this family is adventuring together and enjoying amazing places that our wonderful country

Dear Editor:

The purpose of this letter is to point out how strange the priorities of the MA Board and Open Space Committee are in regard to preserving the natural environment we have, with regard to construction projects and the expense thereof. While much of the trail discussions prior to the election were on construction of three miles of new Docmann Trail, flying under the radar was the 545-foot (Segment 7) of the Manzanita Thicket Connector. This trail, proposed to be cut through a natural thicket (partially designated wetland) north of Bradford Intermediate school, is totally unnecessary, as its sole purpose is to shave 100 feet off the existing "Valley Parkway/Woodruff" road or sidewalk route to the school.

The cost of building the bridge and this segment is estimated to be \$15,000 in material costs, as well as the salary costs of Chris Pacetti, Sean Warren and other KC staff in managing the project and fulfilling the additional environmental work required by Jeffco to grant the grading permit, as this is a wetland (contact Sean Warren for details). This expense cannot be justified, using any rational economic value analysis.

It would appear that even though economic conditions and Ranch maintenance needs (fences or replacement of dead trees, for example) have changed in the last 10 years, the build-out of the 2009 Trails Master Plan "must" continue at all costs, because, to quote the mantra made plain at many Board meetings when residents have suggested a pause in building, "the process has been followed." Perhaps when we are spending \$15,000 to cut a trail through an undisturbed wetland to save 100 feet, it's time to reconsider the process.

Equestrian Center Overview

The Ken-Caryl Equestrian Center (EC) is operated and maintained by the Master Association (MA). The MA is operated by a five-member volunteer Board of Directors that is elected by the community to ensure sustainable success for the entire community.* The MA hires professional staff to manage their day-to-day operations such as operation of the Equestrian Center.

The EC current staff consists of a manager who runs the daily operation at the center, three full-time staff members who perform the daily horse chores (cleaning stalls, feeding, maintenance) and three part-time staff that operate the riding school (oversee school horses, school lessons and camps).** Currently there is also an EC Task Force comprised of eight community volunteers who work together with the community, the EC staff and the MA to develop recommendations for both short- and long-term facility improvements.

An area identified by the EC Task Force that would benefit from improvement is increased community communication and involvement. As part of this initiative, the EC is bringing back a regular feature in Life at Ken-Caryl titled Straight from the Horse's Mouth.
