Bond and Improvement Projects

Bond Improvement Projects Schedule

The design team and contractor for the bond improvement projects are diligently working on the next milestone in the project process of construction documents or CDs. This package will be submitted to authorities having jurisdiction for plan review and building permits in late August. On a parallel track to this review, Adolfson & Peterson Construction will be confirming pricing and developing a Guaranteed Maximum Price for the scope of work identified in the drawings and specifications.

The construction for the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge is still targeted to begin in the fall – once summer camps are complete and children are back in school. As mentioned in previous articles, all three facilities will be under construction at the same time. The targeted completion date for construction is spring of 2016.

There will likely be some landscape items (trees, shrubs, etc.) that lag the overall schedule. This is due to established planting seasons for the area. With guidance from KCR staff, the design team will provide phasing plans and project graphics to advise residents of areas of construction as well as alternative routes. This information will be posted at each facility and communicated to residents via the Life at Ken-Caryl newspaper.

The construction schedule is a very



detailed document that identifies each task and the anticipated durations required to complete the work. An initial schedule and phasing plan was reviewed with KCR staff. Based upon staff input, Adolfson & Peterson is in the process of revising the initial construction schedule and phasing plan. The next version of the schedule will focus on what areas can be combined into phases. This will provide the contractor with a greater work area, which can lead to efficiencies with construction activities.

Phased construction in an occupied facility is necessary to maintain operations. There will be some inconveniences to the residents and staff as routine functions may be temporarily displaced. It will be temporary, and we would ask for your understanding and patience during the construction process.

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Architectural Committee has recently added another product to the Roofing Guidelines to be approvable in neighborhoods that originally had wood shake shingled roofs.

This brings us to a total of 15 premium composition roofing products that are compliant choices. This new addition is named CeDur Synthetic Roofing Shakes, which is designed and manufactured to withstand the harsh fire, hail, sun and wind conditions that can be present in Colorado.

The product has an aesthetically pleasing look which resembles wood shake shingles. It has the dimension and color variation and also ages to a nice wood color.

CeDur has a Class A fire rating and a Class 4 Impact (hail resistant) rating, which carry a potential reduction in homeowner's insurance. It also has a 50-year warranty and improves the insulation value of your roof. In addition, this product is manufactured in Colorado.

The Architectural Committee reviewed several installations throughout metropolitan Denver area prior to approval, which is the standard procedure for evaluating roofing products. A few samples and addresses where the product has been installed are available in my office should you wish to learn more as you consider roof replacement. Ken-Caryl Ranch is Getting Firewise!

Ken-Caryl Ranch residents are starting to become Firewise as they begin to learn how to address the wildfire hazards around their homes and the entire community. Ken-Caryl Ranch has adopted a Forest Stewardship Plan that will continue to manage the wildfire hazards and forest health needs of the mountain Open Space areas. The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association has a Community Wildfire Mitigation Plan prepared for the entire community that helps identify measures that recognize wildfire threats, enhance safety for residents and improve community awareness.

Attendees at the Ken-Caryl Ranch Spring Fling in May were able to interact with Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Rangers, West Metro Fire Rescue firefighters, and Colorado State Forest Service staff and ask questions specific to their homes and neighborhoods. Residents learned about wildfires in Colorado and around Ken-Caryl Ranch, how to reduce this threat to their homes through vegetation and architectural management, and opportunities to become more involved with the community's efforts to address this issue that can affect all portions of the area.

Ken-Caryl Ranch homeowners that border Open Space areas can work with the KCR Park Rangers to reduce natural fuels through mowing up to 4 feet in width along their property lines. These adjacent homeowners who want to determine what they can do to address wildfire hazards on their own properties can contact the Colorado State Forest Service for an assessment and report. The CSFS Golden District office can be reached at 303-279-9757. CSFS can also provide additional free information concerning wildfire mitigation issues and actions.

Recent wildfires in Colorado, especially the Waldo Canyon fire in Colorado Springs, have highlighted the threats to even urbanized communities. Educational efforts and action plans that lead to immediate improvements can occur through adoption of the Firewise Communities program. Long-term efforts to become a Firewise Adapted Community will help address the many needs associated with living in the wildland-urban interface.

Meet Your Park Ranger Staff

Residents are sometimes surprised to hear that there is a Ranger staff for Ken-Caryl Ranch, and then there are also residents who simply aren't aware of what the Ranger staff does. This article was written to give residents a better understanding of the various duties performed by the Ranger staff.

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Park Ranger staff consists of four full-time rangers: Gary Norton, Matt Öven, Peter Marozas and Cory Mensen. The open space department is overseen by the Open Space Manager, Sean Warren. In addition, several seasonal technicians and two park ranger (patrol) seasonals are hired for a short time during the summer season to assist full-time staff. The Rangers work different shifts comprised generally of four 10-hour shifts covering seven days a week, and with four rangers and one manager it can be challenging responding to all the open space issues in a timely manner.

In addition, there is a misconception that the Rangers work on all the same job duties. All of the Rangers contribute to the following shared job duties:

- Answers questions about behavior/ biology of wildlife and conflicts with wildlife
- Euthanizes injured or sick deer with a rifle and removes dead carcasses
- Provides contractor information for removal of wildlife in private homes
- Patrols over 30 miles of parks, greenbelts and trails including open space areas
- Write articles for the Life at Ken-Caryl newspaper
- Coordinates community Christmas Tree Harvest and Sale
- Helps with open space maintenance

There are also specific primary duties each Ranger and the Open Space Manager complete, which are listed below.



Sean Warren - Open Space Manager

- Oversees management and execution of environmental objectives and requirements
- Provides leadership and guidance to environmental and planning programs
- Develops and administers program for management of open space lands
- Serves as liaison with community advisory groups
- Interfaces with Colorado Division of Wildlife, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, West Metro Fire Protection District, **Urban Drainage and Flood Control** District
- Provides guidance, assistance and support to Ken-Caryl Ranch residents for applicable environmental laws, regulations and directives regarding open space
- Designs memorandums of understanding, programmatic agreements and other compliance agreements

Develops intergovernmental agreements . regarding maintenance, research, education and other activities on open space lands

- · Plans, directs and oversees work of four full-time Rangers
- · Assists in preparation of open space budget
- · Prepares written reports and oral presentations to staff, community boards, advisory committees and grant councils
- Serves as KCRMA representative to Open Space Committee
- Writes RFPs and prepares bid packages for construction projects, feasibility studies and general open space services
- Oversees work of private contractors and associated budgets
- · Works with various organizations on natural resource conservation issues



Gary Norton - Natural Resource Management & Patrol

- Develops the noxious weed work plan
- · Hires, trains and supervises seasonal
- Develops work plan for restoration projects in grasslands, forests and riparian areas
- Conducts habitat and rare plan inventories to assess open space ecological health
- Implements Forestry Stewardship Plan and Fuels Management Plan
- Prunes and/or removes hazardous or dead trees in the open space
- Conducts hazardous fuel assessments for residents upon request
- Serves as liaison to West Metro Fire, Jefferson County Open Space and the Colorado State Forest Service
- **Chairs Safety Committee**
- Collects data in the field and adds information to ArcGIS program for maps



Matt Öven – Lead Patrol, Boundary **Management & Wildlife Education**

- Promotes, trains and supervises the Volunteer Patroller Program
- Monitors property boundaries for encroachments and rules violations
- Drafts and updates Encroachment License Agreements with homeowners
- Verifies property boundaries for landscape submittals and homes for sale · Handles and oversees contracts for

Cory Mensen – Trail Specialist

Note: The Trail Specialist is a new position, and Cory was hired in March

- Implements and supervises the trails program
- · Oversees quality control of new trail construction and heavy maintenance projects
- Coordinates all trail related volunteer activities
- Assists in the management of the open space with the focus of future trail development and maintenance
- Consults and directs ground disturbing activities
- Assists with wildland fire mitigation
- · Participates in hazardous tree analysis

Bears Sighted on Ken-Caryl Ranch

Recently, bears have been sighted in and around the Manor Ridge subdivision of Ken-Caryl Ranch. They may be active anytime, day or night, most often during morning and evening hours. Remember to remove all ATTRACTANTS:

- Birdfeeders should be removed until winter when bears are not active.
- Place secured garbage cans outside for pickup in the morning only.
- Burn food off barbeque grills and clean after each use.
- Clean garbage cans with ammonia to discourage bears and other wildlife.
- Don't leave food, trash, coolers, air fresheners or anything that smells in your vehicle.
- Lock bear-accessible doors and windows in the house, garage and car at night.
- Remove any ripened fruit that has fallen to the ground on your property.



The Jefferson County Public Library's Bookmobile began service in the Ken-Caryl Ranch area in July 2014 and now provides weekly Saturday service from noon-4 p.m. in the Safeway parking lot at Ken Caryl Ave. and Shaffer Parkway.

Patrons may use the Bookmobile for the library's most popular services: checking out and returning materials, placing and picking up holds, and accessing information about other library services. The Bookmobile collection holds over 1,200 items for patrons





Deterrents for Rascally Rabbits, Prairie Dogs and Deer

Because of our incredible moisture we have received this year, the vegetation in the area is very lush. This is great news for herbivores like rabbits, prairie dogs and deer that are in the Ken-Caryl Ranch area. In fact, you may have noticed one or more of these critters finding lunch in your yard. Sometimes people may think of this as a nuisance, and if so, here are some passive/non-lethal tips on how to deter these species from munching on your prized landscaping.

Cottontail rabbits are not rodents; instead they are in a group called lagomorphs and possess two rows of incisors on the upper jaw. Another trait of all lagomorphs is their production of two kinds of feces—solid round droppings and soft black grease-like pellets. The soft feces contain up to five times the vitamin content of hard feces; these are reingested. This double-digestion process

allows lagomorphs to utilize nutrients missed during the first passage through the digestive tract and thus ensures that maximum nutrition is derived from the food they eat. Cottontails usually forage on grasses, roots, twigs and of course garden vegetables. Rabbits use their ears for protection from predators, so when it is windy or noisy, they are usually not around. So, make sure to fence your garden and frequent your yard to help discourage these guys from eating everything in sight.

Black-tailed prairie dogs can also be seen in our area and love eating grasses, leaves, seeds and fruits. Prairie dogs like the short grass prairie, which is more favorable for seeing predators and being able to communicate with one another. So, keeping taller grass, planting unpalatable shrubs like Rabbitbrush and Snakeweed, and making underground fences can be ways to keep prairie dogs off your turf.

Deer are all over the foothills and sometimes even make it east of C-470. Deer really enjoy eating leaves, twigs and fruits from tree and shrubs, and sometimes grass. Planting "deer resistant" plants, shrubs and trees that aren't fruit producing is probably your best bet for these animals not to choose to eat dinner at your house. Many garden stores and tree nurseries will label plants that are less favored by deer.

All three of these species play a very important role in our ecosystem, so it is our duty to try passive deterrents and hazing techniques at home to be able to live in harmony with all creatures. The Ken-Caryl Home Tour and The Action Center have partnered up once again to provide help, hope and dignity to struggling residents of Jefferson County. As a former Ken-Caryl resident who grew up in the Valley and attended local schools, I am thrilled to have the opportunity to work professionally on this fundraising event and serve as The Action Center's liaison.

The Ken-Caryl Home Tour has raised more than \$10,000 in past years, which directly supports vital programs at The Action Center. Liz provided Carol with four months' worth of bus passes and arranged a meeting with a Red Rocks Community College adviser to discuss her education status. Liz also wrote a letter of recommendation for Carol, and she was approved for housing in Denver! The Action Center provided Carol with ARC vouchers so she could furnish her new living space. Carol is now in stable housing with her son, working toward advancing her education status and hopeful that she will find a career that she loves!

The proceeds from the Ken-Caryl Home Tour will help fund vital programs at The Action Center that will ultimately help our struggling neighbors, like Carol, reach self-sufficiency. 

Upper Cougar Trail Final Design Presentation to the Board in July

On July 21 at their regular monthly business meeting, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board will consider a recommendation from the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee (Committee) to approve the final design for Upper Cougar Trail. The Committee formed its recommendation after hearing a presentation from the Cougar Design Team (Team) at the Committee's monthly meeting on June 25. This action by the Committee is consistent with step B-9 of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Trails Implementation Process.

The proposed trail is located in the southwest corner of Ken-Caryl Ranch Private Open Space (see map). The new trail when combined with Lower Cougar Trail (approved by the Board on June 9) will add nearly five miles of new trail to our existing trail system, which totals nearly 38 miles of singletrack, 2-track, soft surface and hard surface trails. The two projects together will provide a new open space access/trailhead to neighborhoods in the south part of the Valley, a trail loop of moderate to easy difficulty along the rolling, grassy toe slopes of the foothills, and a new access to the Foothills Open Space including connections to Massey Draw and trails north of there.

The Team started its work in January 2015, with the goal of creating an enjoyable trail experience for hikers,

bikers and equestrians while "avoiding impacts and protecting habitat for rare or sensitive species" in accordance with the Ken-Caryl Ranch Trails Master Plan (TMP). The Team also looked closely at potential impacts to neighboring properties. This is the typical procedure for finalizing new trail projects, and like other trail projects the design alignment can change several times during the process while the Team works to find the right balance. The Team's specific goals included:

- 1. Balance recreation and conservation
- Incorporate results of biological report (a reference to the Survey of Critical Biological Resources, Cougar Trail Alignments, completed by the Colorado Natural Heritage Program in 2014. Can be viewed on community website) to come up with an alignment.
- 3. Optimize all considerations, including biology, technical design, buffers to properties and view-sheds.
- 4. Provide resident access to the southern part of KCR Open Space, serving the southern community.
- 5. Reduce/minimize biological impacts and avoid/prevent sensitive biological impacts. Primary biological concerns that the Team focused on were habitat fragmentation, riparian crossings and potential impacts to Golden Eagle and raptor habitat.



- 6. Develop a final design consistent with the Trails Master Plan.
- 7. Produce a document for how the conclusion was reached.

Ultimately the Team summarized its work in the following statement (excerpted from the document titled Cougar Design Team Summary and Presentation of Final Proposed Alignment):


"Trails do create an impact, and throughout this process, the Cougar Design Team has attempted to minimize/ reduce biological impacts to sensitive resources to the extent possible. While the team agreed on a large portion of the trail, there is not full agreement on every piece of the alignment. Part of the team believes that this trail is a good compromise from the original alignment that will provide a great user experience while taking the biological resources we are blessed with into careful consideration."

Open Space staff for the Master Association worked with the Team throughout the process and have worked on conceptual designs for trails in the project area since the early part of the last decade. While the addition of a trail in the project area would be a wonderful, new recreational opportunity for the community, staff is concerned that southern sections of the trail have the potential to disrupt the nesting activities of Golden Eagles in South Valley Park despite the fact that the entire project falls outside the Colorado Parks and Wildlife recommended half-mile nesting buffer for Golden Eagles (no human encroachment, Dec. 15 through July 15).



The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board will review the Upper Cougar Trail design at their meeting on Tuesday, July 21 at 6:30 p.m. at the Ranch House.

The Board will begin reviewing details of the project on July 21 at 6:30 p.m. at the Ranch House. Several background documents relative to the project can be viewed on the community website.


