



# Don't Turn Around

This summer we have received feedback

from residents about a problem that challenges a small percentage of property owners. A small adjustment of many other residents' activity could significantly impact the experience of these residents in a positive way. I'm talking about driveway turnarounds.

It happens all the time. A driver stops by the mailbox, drops a kiddo off at school, makes a wrong turn, and needs to make a U-turn. The most convenient place to make that turn is often a neighbor's driveway. We may not think much of it since it only takes a second, and we're on our way with what seems like a small inconvenience to the resident. However, the outcome could end up costly for the owner of the driveway. Property owners in some areas are experiencing damage to their driveways. In some cases, expensive paver or concrete work is compromised by heavy vehicles, regular patterns of activity, and tire damage. Recently a homeowner was forced to foot the bill of over \$2,000 to repair a paver driveway damaged by studded tires from someone turning around on their property. The driveway was less than a year old at the time the damage was done. In another circumstance a resident received a letter to replace or repair their driveway for extensive damage. They did so right away, and within two years the replacement is already seeing significant wear and tear.

Turning around in a driveway is not an activity on which the Master Association can reasonably take action, nor can we reach every driver with this message. Most importantly we realize the behavior is not maliciously motivated, but the unintended consequences offer a significant challenge to the residents left with the damage. The residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch take pride in their properties and work hard to keep them well maintained, sometimes at considerable expense. A residential driveway is private property and should not be considered accessible without the owner's permission. Awareness is key, and it is our intent by sharing this message to make drivers aware that this is an issue with the hope that some may take it to heart and choose differently in the future. Your neighbors near the mailbox, school drop off, and trailheads will thank you.

# Board Meeting Summaries

# Master Association

On July 16, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association held a regular meeting and discussed the following items:

• A work group comprised of resident volunteers from the Covenant Control and Architectural Committees, as well as staff, have reviewed the current Home Improvement Rules document and submitted a draft of their suggested full revision to the Master Association Board for consideration. The document, referred to as the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Rules, Regulations, and Procedures, is available on the Ken-Caryl website. Resident Jennifer Manta requested the addition of two locations for signs to be allowed. She requested a location near the offramp at the entrance

to the Valley as well as the fork at the intersection of Ken Caryl Ave. and S. Valley Road. Resident Kayla Kirkpatrick expressed concern about the Holiday Lighting rule, specifically about net lighting. The Board will vote on the rules document in August.

- Staff presented a proposal to convert the Equestrian Center Office to natural gas. The Board would like to wait on the proposal.
- · Staff provided an update on a proposed Valley Parkway crossing project. The project was budgeted for \$8,000, but due to the need for engineering design and additional requirements, it is projected to cost substantially more. The Board would like to discuss options when the entire Board is present.
- Resident Ethan Pankow addressed concerns with a crosswalk at S. Valley Road and Ken Caryl Ave. Cars are ignoring the crosswalk and not yielding to pedestrians or cyclists.
- A motion passed authorizing staff to enter into a contract extension with Waste Connections for trash/recycling services.
- A motion passed adopting the Amended Meeting Guidelines with one change to the third to last bullet.
- A motion passed adopting the Policy for Anonymous Communications at Board Meetings.
- A motion passed authorizing staff to enter into an extended contract with James Moore and Associates for auditing
- A motion passed adopting updated Open Space & Parks curfew hours language.
- A motion passed appointing a new member to the Covenant Committee.

# **Joint Study Session**

On July 16, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards held a Joint Study Session and discussed the following items:

- Staff provided an update on the Ranch House Pool Replacement Project. The pool will close on Aug. 4, and preparation for construction will start Aug. 5. There are some pool items that are currently unfunded that will be discussed in the 2020 budget process.. These include shade structures, additional seating, climbing wall, and play features.
- The Board discussed the progress of the Financial & Organizational Operations Work Group. The group is comprised of two members of each Board as well as staff members.
- Resident Jim Fodor talked about the importance of aesthetics of the pool.
- Resident Rilla Reinsma asked about the depth of the piers for the new pool, and staff informed her it was 37 feet. She also talked about the Westerly Apartments and the importance of notifying the residents about the rare plants area. Chris Pacetti said staff will reach out to the management of the apartments.
- Resident Jerry Sullivan spoke on behalf of Ken-Caryl Little League. KCLL is hosting the Colorado State Championships for the majors division. He requested a welcome message on the community marguees. Staff will discuss options.
- Historical Society Chair Jim Antes reported about maintenance and repairs due to deterioration of the Bradford-Perley House at a cost of around \$50,000. The Historical Society will ask the Master Association Board for annual maintenance funding. The group is also exploring grants. Jim also discussed a rare archaeological find of a mano in the open space. Staff and volunteers visited the site where the mano was found and discovered further archaeological finds. Jim also told the Boards the Shaffer Barn at the Equestrian Center was placed on the National Register of Historic Places.
- Chris Pacetti reported about foundation issues at Dakota Lodge.







# Recognizing and Preventing Heat Exhaustion in Dogs

Overheating in dogs is never something to take lightly. As the temperatures in the summer months heat up, it's important to remain aware of how the heat can affect your pet. The number one summerrelated injury is heat exhaustion in dogs. This injury can lead to serious and potentially fatal conditions such as heat stroke and cardiac arrest. There are several ways to help keep your dog safe and cool during the summer. Below are signs that your pet may be overheating and how to prevent it.

#### Signs

A dog suffering from heatstroke will display several signs:

- · Rapid panting
- Bright red tongue
- · Red or pale gums
- Thick, sticky saliva
- DepressionWeakness
- Dizziness
- Vomiting possibly with blood
- Diarrhea
- Shock
- Coma

# Prevention

Several ways to prevent heatstroke/ overheating in your pet:

- Always make sure your pet always has access to plenty of clean, cool water.
- Keep walks at a gentle pace.
- Take advantage of cooler hours during the early morning and late evening.
- Pets release heat through their feet, let them walk on the grass and avoid hot sidewalks or pavement. If you are unsure, place the back of your hand on the surface for 10 seconds. If you cannot keep it there, it is too hot for your pet.
- Make sure your pet has access to adequate shade from the sun and heat.
- Keeping long-haired or heavy-coated pets hair cut short during hot summer months will help keep them cooler.
- Never leave your pet inside a vehicle!
   We are in the dog days of summer.
   Helping spot the signs of heat stroke can help prevent serious injury to our four-legged companions. Remember to bring plenty of water anywhere you go with your pets!

# Home Improvement and Community Rules Document Draft

A work group comprised of resident volunteers from the Covenant Control and Architectural Committees, as well as staff, have reviewed the current Home Improvement Rules document and submitted a draft of their suggested full revision to the Master Association Board for consideration. The document, referred to as the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Rules, Regulations, and Procedures, is available at www.kencarylranch.org under the Administration tab, then Governing Documents. Residents are encouraged to review the draft document and provide feedback to Jenny Bernal at jennyb@kcranch.org. Once feedback is compiled and necessary edits are made, a final draft will be submitted to the board for adoption at their August business meeting.

Residents Peggy Coen, Matt O'Brien, Bob Siegel, and Matt Thomson offered their valuable time and expertise as professionals and residents for several weekly meetings committed to a detailed review of the original document. Opportunities for continuity, clarification, and updates to out-of-date rules and policies were identified and addressed. The extent of the work involved a complete line-by-line revision of the document therefore an entirely new document was created.

Some of the differences from the original document include:

- Updated and consistent formatting throughout the document.
- Clarification of some rules such as Parking and Temporary Sign Posting.
- Rules added to reflect trends in projects such as large-scale demolition and reconstruction projects.
- Rules added to address new trends in products and installations like swim spas, composting equipment, and fire pits.
- Updated and refined submittal requirements for Home Improvement Rules.
- Policies and best practices for procedures and enforcement.

 Improved formatting to make the document easier to read and allow for keyword searches and embedded links online.

Only people can prevent conflicts with bears. Please do your part to protect your home and property, and prevent conflicts with

# **Keep Bears Out**

- Many bears that enter homes do so through an unlocked or open window or door. Close and lock all bear-accessible windows and doors when you leave the house, and at night before you go to bed.
- If you must leave downstairs windows open, install sturdy grates or bars. Screens don't keep out bears.
- Keep garage doors and windows closed and locked at night and when you're not home. Don't leave your garage door standing open when you're not outside. Install extra-sturdy doors if you have a freezer, refrigerator, pet food, bird seed, or other attractants in your garage.
- Keep car doors and windows closed and locked if you park outside. Make sure there's nothing with an odor in your vehicle, including candy, gum, air fresheners, trash, lotions and lip balms.
- Bears are great climbers remove any tree limbs that might provide access to upper level decks and windows.
- Replace exterior lever-style door handles with good quality round door knobs that bears can't pull or push open.
- Put on talk radio (not music) when you leave home; the human voice startles most bears.

# **Get Rid of Attractants**

- Bears follow their super-sensitive noses to anything that smells like food, and can follow scents from up to five miles away.
- Don't leave trash out overnight unless it's in a bear-proof enclosure or container. Obey all local regulations.
- We recommend feeding birds only when bears are hibernating. If you want to feed birds when bears are active, please review the Attracting Birds, Not Bears fact sheet on our website.

- Don't store food of any kind in an unlocked garage, flimsy shed or on or under your deck.
- Don't leave anything with an odor outside, near open windows or in your vehicle, even if you're home. That includes scented candles, air fresheners, soaps and lotions.

# Teach Bears They're Not Welcome

- If a bear comes into your yard or close to your home, do yourself and the bear a big favor, and scare it away. A confident attitude plus loud noises like a firm yell, clapping your hands, banging on pots and pans or blowing an air horn sends most bears running.
- If a bear enters your home, open doors and windows and make sure it can leave the same way it got in. Don't approach the bear or block escape routes.
- Never approach a bear. If a bear won't leave, call your local CPW office. If a bear presents an immediate threat to human safety, call 911.

# Ranch House Pool: Then and Now

After decades of bringing joy to children and families, the Ranch House Pool will close on Aug. 4 to make way for a larger, redesigned pool.

The Ranch House Pool, built in 1975, has weathered many hot summers, cold winters, and years of shifting soils with its aluminum-frame construction. Although the pool has spent the majority of its time in the ground, it made a brief above-ground appearance in the late 1970s when the entire pool was emptied, pulled out of the ground by a crane, and set on the greenbelt behind the Ranch House for repairs. The pool

frame got to see the light of day again in 1998, when the outside of the pool was excavated for repairs. In February 2001, the aluminum frame was separated into its original rectangular segments, the bottom was repaired, and the pieces were welded back together again. After four decades of use, the beloved pool will now be retired.


The original aluminum frame will be recycled to make way for a concrete design. The new, larger pool will rest on 89 piers, each set 37 feet deep in the ground. The new design includes more grass space and concrete decking, a zero-depth entry, diving board, and eight lap lanes, an increase from the existing six lap lanes. The new design, measuring in at 6,300 square feet and 237,000 gallons, will be a 48% increase in volume from the existing 3,844 square feet and 160,000 gallons.

The project is budgeted at \$3.6 million, of which \$2.25 million will come from Plains Metro District lawsuit settlement funds designated for pools. The remainder of the funding will come from Master Association Reserves and Operations.

There are still some unfunded elements of the project that the Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards hope to fund in the future. Some of these items include additional shade structures (red umbrellas on the drawing are for visualization only), additional seating, climbing wall, and play features.

The Ranch House Pool will have its last splash on Sunday, Aug. 4 so that construction can begin on Aug. 5. The early closure will take advantage of good weather for groundwork and will give a wider window for construction to finish before the anticipated opening in early summer 2020.





# Trails Status Report: June-July Summary

Editor's Note: Thanks to a suggestion by a resident, we will start including trail status reports from the Ken-Caryl Ranch Volunteer Trail Coordinators periodically in the newspaper. # General Maintenance Project (Contractor)

- All contractor-based maintenance has been completed for the season.
- No work done by contractors during this report period.

# **Volunteer Maintenance Projects** *Vegetation Maintenance*

Volunteers have performed vegetation maintenance on the following trails:

- High Meadow Loop
- South Shaffer
- Upper Massey Draw
- Lost Canyon
- Tin Cup / Summit View
- Beacon Hill
- Upper Bradford
- Middle Bradford

- Powerline
- Golden Spike
- East Plum Thicket Manzanita
- Mastodon

This work consists of cutting back vegetation within the trail corridor to keep the tread readily visible to users and so vegetation doesn't interfere with use and to keep sight lines good for safety. Vegetation maintenance work will continue as needed through the rest of July and into early August, as needed.

#### **Tread Maintenance**

- Volunteers did maintenance on the connector trail between Lark Bunting and North Hogback Trails.
- All drainage dips were cleaned and rebuilt as needed on this trail.
- Volunteers have done minor tread maintenance on the South Shaffer Trail, removing cobbles and cleaning drainage dips.
- Volunteers have done minor tread maintenance on the east end of the Golden Banner Trail, primarily removing cobbles from the tread.
- Volunteers armored a wet drainage crossing on the Powerline Trail, which will prevent rutting and erosion in a seasonally wet and muddy section of trail




# **Equestrian Center Barn Named to National Register of Historic Places**

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society recently received notification that the John C. Shaffer Barn (also known as the Main Barn or the Dutch Barn) has been named to the prestigious National Register of Historic Places. The National Register of Historic Places is the official federal list of districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects significant in American history, architecture, archaeology, engineering, and culture.

Completed in 1922, the barn was a key component in Ranch-owner John C. Shaffer's plan to breed exceptional cattle capable of winning national competitions. He was very successful in this pursuit, and Ken-Caryl Ranch earned an international reputation for its outstanding Hereford cattle, winning numerous awards. The National Register nomination specifically cited the significance of the barn's architecture as an excellent and unique example of early 20th century construction of a "transverse frame barn."

This marks the fourth National Register listing for Ken-Caryl Ranch. The first two are archaeological sites: Bradford House III (listed in 1980) and Bradford House II (listed in 2001). The third site is the Bradford-Perley House, which received the designation in 2015.





# **Dear Editor:**

This Mountain Biker had a little chuckle. In a Letter to the Editor dated June 12 a resident described himself as a "real" mountain biker. Gee, did you know there were "real" and "unreal" mountain bikers? When I bought my first mountain bike in the early 1980s and traversed open space dirt trails, I thought it was real, and when I crashed I knew that was real. Maybe he is referring to competitive mountain biking and that brings up a serious question for all residents.

re: Mountain Bike Leadership. Something has been taken away from other trail users over the last 10 years. In past decades a person could escape traffic and civilization by embracing the comfort of nature in our relatively pristine foothills open space. People miss those days. The mountain bike leadership wanted interconnecting loop trails with banked turns. This "stacked" loop trail system fragments the wildlife habitat. It encircles and squeezes the entire ecosystem. Slowly our hiking experiences were being interrupted by multiple bicycle encounters. Now e-bikes capable of speeds of up to 20 mph are permitted

by the MA Board. It feels like a "bicycle highway" up there. There is nowhere to go without encountering the traffic of some mechanized vehicle. What is next: competitive mountain biking by the "real" mountain bikers?

Wouldn't it be great if there were an equivalent amount of foothills open space where the hikers, runners, equestrians, and wildlife could call their own? Why not, every KCR household pays dues and taxes, too. Simply declare the MA foothills open space extending from the Lost Canyon Trail to the southern boundary as a "Protected Wildlife Habitat." This would permit pedestrians and equestrians on these trails. It would exclude all mechanized transportation. The Lost Canyon Trail would be a dead end for the "bicycle highway" and help dissuade future bicycle competitive racing. Everyone can participate: 1. Inform the Trail Supervisors, KCR Rangers, and neighbors that you like this idea for a peaceful, quiet place. 2. Vote for candidates recommended by the KCR Conservation Club next year to provide balance on the MA Board.




