

Deer Creek Golf Course and Upcoming Resident Survey

On Tuesday, July 11, the Jefferson County Board of County Commissioners voted to approve the Deer Creek Golf Course Ken-Caryl Official Development Plan. This new Plan would allow for singlefamily detached, single-family attached and multi-family dwellings, as well as commercial uses, including business and professional offices, medical and dental offices, motels/hotels, restaurants, senior living facilities, and recreational building and activities. The lands included in this Plan are the Deer Creek Golf Course driving range, a piece of vacant, commercially-zoned land adjacent to the range, the current clubhouse area, parking lot, course maintenance facility, and a portion of the actual golf course (which will be slightly reconfigured). The next step in the process will be the Site Development Plan where we will see more specific plans for this development. We will share those plans when we receive them.

The Community Planning Committee, working at the direction of the Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards, is working to finalize a new community survey. The last one was completed in 2012 so after five years it is time for an update. This survey will be available both electronically and in paper format for those who request it. If we have your email address on file in our accounting system, you will receive an email with a link to the survey, but you will also have the option of getting a paper version. If we do not have your email address, we will be sending you a postcard with instructions on how to complete the survey electronically or receive a paper copy. If you don't think we have your email address, please forward it to Victoria DeSair at victoriad@kcranch.org and we will add it to our database. Look for the survey in September!

Waste Connections is the trash and recycling service provider for Ken-Caryl Ranch. Service is included as part of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association monthly dues. Waste Connections can be reached at 303-288-2100 or www. wcdenver.com.



Trash and Recycling Totes: Residents have the option of using their own trash and recycling containers/bags or using 96-gallon totes provided at no charge by Waste Connections. The totes have wheels and are 42 inches tall, the top measures 30x34 inches, and the bottom is 24x24 inches. To order totes, send an email to kencarylco@wasteconnections.com, say that you want to sign up for totes, and provide your name, address, email address, and phone number. You can request both trash and recycling totes, just a trash tote, or just a recycling tote.

Holiday Trash Delays: Waste Connections observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, unless they fall on a weekend. If your normal pickup day falls on or after a holiday, your collection schedule will run one day late that week.

Auto-Dial Service: Waste Connections offers an auto-dial service called Call Fire to notify customers of any changes in trash pickup days. You can sign up to receive a phone call online at www.wcdenver.com/contact/. Complete the required information, then in the comment section say you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up for the Call Fire service.



Architectural and **Covenant Committee** Volunteers

This week I wanted to take a moment to acknowledge the efforts and recognize the members of this community who volunteer their time to help maintain the Rules and Covenants of Ken-Caryl Ranch.

Both Committees are equipped with residents competent, either personally or professionally, to deal with challenging situations and to make difficult decisions concerning fellow residents. These are not always popular decisions, and their efforts sometimes go unappreciated. As the administrator for both of these committees, I see the work and effort they put forth to make the most informed decisions possible for the best of the community as a whole. It is inspiring to work alongside these dedicated individuals.

The Architectural Committee reviews Rules and Regulations to keep them up to date with new trends, products and materials. When a homeowner wishes to appeal a violation or architectural decision on a Home Improvement Submittal, the Architectural Committee hears the appeal and makes decisions based off of the Master Declarations of Covenants and the Home Improvement Rules and Regulations. Occasionally a rule, or the wording of a rule is called into question, and the Architectural Committee will review the concern, issue an interpretation that is final and binding for the case at hand, then determine if the rules need to be updated for clarification or to include guidelines for a new product or building material.

The Master Declaration of Covenants cannot be changed without 2/3 vote of all property owners. However, the Home Improvement Rules and Regulations often receive updates as a result of collaborations during these meetings.

The Covenant Committee reviews violations that have reached a hearing status in the violation process. When a property is out of compliance, homeowners have many opportunities to cure the violation prior to hearing. Once those opportunities have passed and the violation has not been cured, the **Covenant Control Committee reviews** the violation history to determine how to proceed. The Covenant Control Committee has the authority to issue fines and liens, and to revoke privileges to use the facilities. This is not a decision they come to lightly.

Both Committees take the time to review each case carefully; they collaborate, they investigate and ask for clarification. They know that the decisions they make will impact not just one but potentially all Ken-Caryl residents and do their best to make the very best decisions for the community overall.

Master Association Board

The following is a summary of items from the July 11 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association

- In response to a question raised at the June 20 meeting, Chris Pacetti said residents are allowed to stay at Architectural Committee meetings.

- A resident commented that she thinks the shade pavilion at the Community Center should be painted a different

- Staff asked the Boards for direction on the future goals/tasks of certain

Recognizing and **Preventing Heat Exhaustion in Dogs**

Overheating in dogs is never something to take lightly. As the temperatures in the summer months heat up, it's important to remain aware of how the heat can affect your pet. The number one summerrelated injury is heat exhaustion in dogs. This injury can lead to serious and potentially fatal conditions such as heat stroke and cardiac arrest. There are several ways to help keep your dog safe and cool during the summer. Below are signs that your pet may be overheating and how to prevent it.

Signs

A dog suffering from heatstroke will display several signs:

- Rapid panting
- Bright red tongue
- Red or pale gums
- · Thick, sticky saliva
- Depression
- Weakness Dizziness
- Vomiting possibly with blood
- Diarrhea
- Shock
- Coma

Prevention

Ways to prevent heatstroke/overheating

- Always make sure your pet has access to plenty of clean, cool water.
- Keep walks at a gentle pace.
- Take advantage of cooler hours during the early morning and late evening.
- · Pets release heat through their feet. Let them walk on the grass and avoid hot sidewalks or pavement. If you are unsure, place the back of your hand on the surface for 10 seconds. If you cannot keep it there, it is too hot for your pet.
- Make sure your pet has access to adequate shade from the sun and heat.
- Keeping long-haired or heavy-coated pets' hair cut short during hot summer months will help keep them cooler.
- Never leave your pet inside a vehicle! We are in the dog days of summer. Helping spot the signs of heat stroke can help prevent serious injury to our fourlegged companions. Remember to bring plenty of water anywhere you go with your pets!

Temporary Fire Ban Implemented in Jefferson County

Editor's Note: Please note that the fire ban was in place as of press time. Citizens wishing to obtain current fire restriction or fire ban information, firework regulations, burn permit information or to report a firework violation can dial the Jeffco Sheriff's Fire Information Hotline at 303-271-8200.

On July 13, Jefferson County Sheriff Jeff Shrader enacted a Stage 2 Fire Ban for Jefferson County. This temporary Stage 2 Fire Ban supersedes all previous fire restrictions and bans. The ban applies to all lands in Jefferson County.

This ban is being enacted due to current dry conditions favorable for the possibility of a wildfire and limited availability of fire control resources. Conditions will continue to be monitored and restrictions will be adjusted in the coming weeks as necessary.

Pursuant to the Annual Operating Plan regarding the implementation of fire restrictions and fire bans, and due to the continuing high fire danger condition within Jefferson County, the following activities are prohibited pursuant to a Stage 2 fire ban:

- Building, maintaining, attending or using any fire.
- Recreational fires, including recreational campfires.
- Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area of at least six feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all combustible material.

- Open burning including "bon fires" that require a permit from the fire authority having jurisdiction.
- The USE of ALL fireworks.
- Shooting tracer rounds or explosive type targets.
- Chainsaws shall only be operated with a USDA or SAE approved spark arresting device properly installed and in proper working order, and having an extinguishing source, water, pressurized water extinguisher, or a proper chemical pressurized extinguisher large enough to handle nearby hazards and possessing at least one large-size pointed shovel with an overall length of at least 36 inches. All must be readily available for quick use.
- Welding and cutting torch appliances shall only be operated within an area that is barren or cleared of all combustible material at least 30 feet in all directions from the operating equipment.
- Use of an explosive initiation system requiring a burning fuse line.
 Exemptions approved under this temporary Stage 2 Fire Ban:
- Use of liquid- or gas-fueled appliances.
- Approved wood-pellet grills.
- Permitted fires by persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act such as professional fireworks displays.
 Contact must be made with the permitting authority to verify the status of permits issued prior to the establishment of burn

restrictions.

- Fire Department/District training fires.
- Burning of explosive wastes by manufacturers of explosives in areas zoned for industrial use, when the burning is supervised by the fire protection district.
- Open fires or open burning by any federal, state or local officer in the performance of official fire suppression functions.
- Individuals operating under any of the above exemptions shall take adequate measures to prevent uncontrolled fires. Possible measures include, but are not limited to:
- o Containers of adequate water or dry soil nearby.
- o Shovels, fire extinguishers or other extinguishing agents nearby.
- Coordination with the local fire department or district to be on scene or standby during an activity.





Rats in the Littleton Area

Some residents have contacted the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association to report rats in the community. Both 9News and Fox 31 Denver have published stories this year regarding rats in the broader Littleton area. There are many theories as to why people are seeing rats, including a decrease in predators and an increase in construction. The following information regarding rats comes from Jefferson County Public Health.

Rats can spread disease and interfere with man's economic and physical well-being. Rats are predominately burrowing rodents. They are most active at night and are seldom seen during the day except when there is a large population. Rats will eat most anything that man eats and often feed on pet and livestock food.

Signs of Rat Activity

- Droppings shiny and dark colored when
- Runways rats use the same trails from burrow to food, water and harborage.
- Burrows found along ditch banks, along walls, under rubbish, wood piles and concrete slabs. Abandoned burrows will be dusty and have cobwebs in the openings.
- Gnawing rats must gnaw to keep their front teeth worn down.
- Tracks in dust and soft earth. The tail may also leave a mark.

Homeowners and businesses can and must control the physical environment to

- fresh
- These pathways appear to be swept clean of debris.

limit rat populations by:

- Eliminating the rat's food o Use a 20- to 30-gallon garbage can
 - with a tight-fitting lid for storing garbage and rubbish.
- o Do not leave pet or livestock food where rats can have access to it. If you feed your pets outside, be sure to remove the pet food after your pets have fed. Leaving pet food outside may attract rats into your yard.
- o Compost piles may also be a source of food for rats. If you live in an area where rats may become a problem, do not put food scraps in your compost pile, or use the pit method of composting.

- o Remember! If you eliminate a rat's food source, you eliminate the rat.
- Eliminating the rat's harborage
 - o Get rid of all rubbish, junk and unwanted building materials where rats can hide and live.
 - o Store useable building materials, firewood, etc. on racks at least 18 inches above the ground.
 - o Irrigation ditches and stream beds that run through neighborhoods provide undisturbed areas in which rats may live. Dumping grass clippings and tree trimmings into these areas provides additional harborage for rats.
 - o Prevent rats from entering buildings by closing all access routes.
- Good environmental sanitation is required if rats are to be controlled or

- eliminated from an area.
- Rat poisons or trapping can be used as a tool to supplement good sanitation practices but should not be used as a substitute for sanitation.
- Warfarin or similar compounds are sold by many companies and are available to the general public. Rats must feed on these materials for about one week before they are killed. These baits must be available to rats for the entire week period. Be sure to follow all instructions on the label completely.
- Trapping may be effective if populations are small.
