Public Comment: Open Space Management Plan Draft

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Comprehensive Management Plan was originally drafted in 1997. In 2016, a Task Force was formed to update the Management Plan. The purpose of the Open Space Comprehensive Management Plan is to establish a framework for setting broad land management and recreational priorities and to provide guidelines to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space staff on managing the natural and recreational resources within the Open Space boundaries. Implementation of the Management Plan will assist the staff in its efforts to preserve and enhance these areas for present and future generations.

A draft of the revised Management Plan is now available for public comment at www.ken-carylranch.org under the Open Space tab, then Plans & Studies. Comments regarding the plan can be submitted to Victoria DeSair at victoriad@kcranch.org no later than Sept. 25.

All trash and recycling service the week of Labor Day will be delayed one day. Waste Connections offers an autodial service to notify customers of any delays or changes in trash pickup days. If you are interested in being notified through this service, you can sign up online at www.wcdenver.com/contact/. Complete the required information, and in the comment section at the bottom of the page explain that you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up for the Call Fire service.

Trash and Recycling Information

Waste Connections is the trash and recycling service provider for Ken-Caryl Ranch. Service is included as part of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association monthly dues. Waste Connections can be reached at 303-288-2100 or www.wcdenver.com.



Trash and Recycling Totes: Residents have the option of using their own trash and recycling containers/bags or using 96-gallon totes provided at no charge by Waste Connections. The totes have wheels and are 42 inches tall, the top measures 30x34 inches, and the bottom is 24x24 inches. To order totes, send an email to kencarylco@wasteconnections.com, say that you want to sign up for totes, and provide your name, address, email address, and phone number. You can request both trash and recycling totes, just a trash tote, or just a recycling tote.

Holiday Trash Delays: Waste Connections observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, unless they fall on a weekend. If your normal pickup day falls on or after a holiday, your collection schedule will run one day late that week.

Auto-Dial Service: Waste Connections offers an auto-dial service called Call Fire to notify customers of any changes in trash pickup days. You can sign up to receive a phone call online at www.wcdenver.com/contact/. Complete the required information, then in the comment section say you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up for the Call Fire service.

Watch Your Email or Mail for the 2017 Resident Survey

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards and the Community Planning Committee want your input! The 2017 Resident Survey is coming in September! Following are a few questions you may have about the survey.

How and When Will I Receive the Survey?

In September, the online survey link will be emailed to all households with an email address in the Master Association's accounting database. Those households without an email address will receive a postcard in the mail with survey instructions. You should receive the survey by the second week of September. If you don't receive it, send an email to cpc@kcranch.org or call 303-979-1876.

How Many Surveys Can My Household Complete?

There is one survey per household within the boundaries of Ken-Caryl Ranch. Each household will receive a unique passcode. We encourage you to discuss the survey with other members of your household so your responses reflect your combined opinions and desired future plans for Ken-Caryl Ranch.

Is the Survey Only Available Online?

While the preferred method for taking the survey is online, paper copies will be available at the Ranch House for those who prefer not to or can't take the online version.

Should I Take the Survey on My Computer or Mobile Device?

The online version of the survey may be completed on a computer or a mobile device, but a computer provides the best experience.

How Long Will the Survey Take?

The survey will likely take 15-20 minutes. Depending on the length of the respondent's write-in comments, it could take substantially longer.

Who Created the Survey?

The Community Planning Committee spearheaded the survey project along with staff from the Master Association and Metropolitan District. Several months' worth of meetings culminated in the very comprehensive survey. An independent survey consultant, RRC & Associates, was hired to consult on questions and develop the online survey tool.

Is the Survey Anonymous?

Yes, the survey is anonymous. An independent survey consultant, RRC & Associates, manages the survey distribution and data compilation.

Why Are We Doing a Survey?

It's been five years since the last formal resident survey, and staff and volunteers would like to collect updated data about our community demographics, preferred activities, and satisfaction level with our facilities, services and amenities. The 2012 resident survey was a valuable planning tool for the Boards, staff and Community Planning Committee. The survey results helped the Boards to make decisions regarding facility renovations, programming changes, a partnership with Foothills for indoor pool usage, new community entrance signs, and new playgrounds. The Community Planning Committee also created a long-range Community Plan based on the survey results.

End of Summer Maintenance

As summer counts down its final days for 2017, this is a great time to take a look at our properties to prepare for the coming seasons and take stock of what can be done to take even more pride in our neighborhoods.

Some of the following "checklist" questions came from our Covenant Control Committee. These are not all covenant violations: some are county issues and all are a courtesy to your neighbors. Our goal is not to issue violations, assess fines or lien your home. Our goal is to have a beautiful community we can all enjoy, and that starts with each individual effort. Please take a moment to look around your property and ask yourself these questions and more, and please don't hesitate to lend a hand to that neighbor who may not be able to do some of this work themselves. If you find yourself inspired to make larger improvements, please don't hesitate to reach out for information on the architectural submittal process. More information is available at www.ken-carylranch.org under the Residents tab.

Does your curb or sidewalk need sweeping? Keeping the side walk clear of debris is not only aesthetically pleasing but also eliminates some slip or trip hazards. If you have a broken sidewalk or need weed mitigation on the street or sidewalk cracks in front of your home, you can contact Jefferson County to do that maintenance on County property. Jefferson County Road and Bridge, 303-271-5219.

Do your shrubs need to be trimmed back so the entire sidewalk is passable? A sidewalk or public right of way must be cleared for pedestrians to pass safely and in accordance with ADA compliance. I will often send a courtesy letter notifying a homeowner that a County violation has been observed or reported, but the sidewalks and streets are enforced by Jefferson County.

Do you know where to store play equipment? Our kiddos are now back to

school and not using their play equipment during the day. It's time to ensure their equipment is properly put away. Portable basketball goals and tetherball stands should be stored at least halfway up the driveway in an upright position when not in immediate use. They cannot be stored on the street, sidewalk or in any common areas. Soccer nets need to be stored out of public view. This is a covenant violation that we look for. During the summer months, I issued very few violations for play equipment because if I could see the equipment in use or even kiddos in the immediate area in the middle of the day I could safely assume the equipment was in use. Last year during the winter months we had several complaints that prompted many letters being sent and some challenging conversations with homeowners who didn't understand or thought the rule didn't apply to their neighborhoods or cul-de-sacs.


Does your grass need to be mowed? Do the weeds need to be pulled? As we all know basic yard maintenance doesn't go away. Weed mitigation and mowing go a long way in maintaining the aesthetics of your property. If you had some challenges with your lawn this year, are there preventative measures you can take now to ensure your lawn is healthy for next year?

Are your weekly trash containers **screened from view?** Trash setout time is 7 p.m. the night before trash pick-up, and it has to be brought in by 7 p.m. the day of pickup. The appropriate storage for your trash cans during the rest of the time is that they are reasonably screened from view. Most utilize their garage or other architecturally approved screening structure; some residents screen their cans with shrubs or trees. The idea is to keep them reasonably out of sight for your neighbors and their visitors. This is a covenant violation and you could receive a letter if the cans are consistently stored incorrectly.

Can the exterior of your house use a good wash? The annual paint review is coming up in January. What I noticed last year was that some homes just need a good pressure wash but looked like it needed painting. This might be a good time to look at ways you can help your paint job last longer and protect your investment.






Metropolitan District Board

On Aug. 22, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

- The Board reviewed the regular communication items, including the status report and financial reports and discussed modifying the format of some documents to provide more helpful information.
- The Board discussed modifying the KCRMD/KCRMA Cooperative Agreement regarding prairie dog relocation to allow for other colonies within KCR property to be relocated and prohibit colonies from outside of the community from being relocated to KCRMD property. The Board will be discussing the topic in more detail with the Master Association at the next Joint Study Session.
- Staff provided an update on the 2016 audit schedule. The draft audit presentation will take place at the September Metro District Board meeting. The Board also reviewed a proposed policy for capital assets. A formal resolution for the policy will be presented at the September meeting.
- Staff and the Board reviewed current open positions and the status of filling those positions.
- The Board reviewed proposed dates for special meetings. Two additional meetings were set: Tuesday, Sept. 19 at 5 p.m. and Tuesday, Oct. 10 at 5 p.m.
- The Board discussed the next steps for selecting an architect for the Ranch House Pool renovation.



Ranger Field Notes



Calling Rangers About Wildlife Injuries

When a wildlife injury call is received, Rangers may investigate or determine over the phone if the animal should be left alone to let nature take its course, advise to take it to a licensed rehabilitator, or will need to be euthanized.

The Rangers use the same policy as Colorado Parks and Wildlife. If a deer/elk is injured but can still feed and walk on its own, then we let nature take its course. However, if the deer/elk is injured to the point it cannot feed or walk on its own, listing to one side, head/ears lowered, then Rangers will respond to euthanize the animal (if on duty) or direct the caller to contact Colorado Parks and Wildlife.

- PARK RANGERS (303-979-1876, ext. 170) will only handle deer/elk. As time allows, a report of an injured or sick deer will be reviewed and any dead deer will be removed as soon as possible depending on the time of day and availability of the Ranger on duty. Many factors play into the response time including where the Ranger is on the trails and type of work (forestry, patrol, property boundary line assessments, maintenance and proximity to a truck, time of day, etc.) they are performing.
- JEFFERSON COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL (303-271-5070) will remove any dead animals on private property and offer advice on any other injured animals for example, rabbits, squirrels, raccoons, etc.

Park Rangers keep a call log when reports come in referencing sightings and/or concerns about animals in the open space. The log assists the Rangers in detecting a pattern to behavior or injured activity of a certain animal. The Rangers can report that information on follow-up calls by staff, Colorado Wildlife Officers or Ken-Caryl Ranch residents.

Due to infectious diseases and calls in the past, the Rangers will advise the resident to contact Jefferson County Animal Control, and they may assist with any concerns and/ or advise to call the Jefferson County Health Department or Colorado Parks and Wildlife, too. 

Bear Sightings on Ken-Caryl Ranch

There have been several bear sightings on Ken-Caryl Ranch in the last few weeks. Encountering bears should be expected any time of the year, but they are definitely more conspicuous in the spring, late-summer and fall. Being large animals, they eat a lot. They eat just about anything, which is why the potential for a bear to visit your property is pretty good if you are inadvertently attracting them with food sources.

In order to avoid conflicts with bears (and other wildlife for that matter) remove all attractants from your property; in the case of bears this is mostly food items, e.g. dog food on the porch, trash left out on the curb overnight, birdfeeders, fruit trees, etc.

The following information, provided by the Colorado Parks and Wildlife, provides good information on how to keep bears off your property and what to do if you come in contact with a bear. Remember: Every situation is different with respect to the bear, the terrain, the people and their activity.

• Enjoy the woods! Hiking at dawn or dusk

may increase your chances of meeting a bear. Use extra caution in places where hearing or visibility is limited: in brushy areas, near streams, where trails round a bend or on windy days. Avoid berry patches in fall. Reduce your chances of surprising a bear by making noise—talk or sing.

- Make sure children are close to you or at least within your sight at all times.
- Leave your dog at home or have it on a leash.
- Stay calm. If you see a bear and it hasn't seen you, calmly leave the area. As you move away, talk aloud to let the bear discover your presence.
- Stop. Back away slowly while facing the bear. Avoid direct eye contact as bears may perceive this as a threat. Give the bear plenty of room to escape. Wild bears rarely attack people unless they feel threatened or provoked.
- If on a trail, step off the trail on the downhill side and slowly leave the area. Don't run or make any sudden

movements. Running is likely to prompt the bear to give chase, and you can't outrun a bear. Do not attempt climbing trees to escape black bears. This may stimulate the bear to follow and pull you out by the foot. Stand your ground.

- Speak softly. This may reassure the bear that no harm is meant to it. Try not to show fear.
- Be Cautious With Cubs. In contrast to grizzly bears, female black bears do not normally defend their cubs aggressively but send them up trees. However, use extra caution if you encounter a female black bear with cubs. Move away from the cub; be on the lookout for other cubs.
- Bears Have Great Senses. Bears use all their senses to try to identify what you are. Remember: Their eyesight is good and their sense of smell is acute. If a bear stands upright or moves closer, it may be trying to detect smells in the air. This isn't a sign of aggression. Once it identifies you, it may leave the area or try to intimidate you by charging to within a few feet before it withdraws.
- Fight back if a black bear attacks you. Black bears have been driven away when people have fought back with rocks, sticks, binoculars and even their bare hands. Black bears vary in size and weight, with males generally being larger than females. Adult males average 275 pounds, while the adult female may average 175 pounds. Depending on the season, food supply and gender, they may weigh anywhere from 125 to 450 pounds. Black bears measure about three feet high when on all four feet or about five feet tall standing upright.

What to Do if You Live in Bear Country
If you choose to live or have a summer
home in bear country, make sure you don't
contribute to resident bears becoming
'garbage' bears. Most conflicts between



bears and people are linked to careless handling of food or garbage. Don't let your carelessness cause the unnecessary death of a bear. Learn to live responsibly with wildlife!

Black bears eat almost anything. They will eat human food, garbage, hummingbird food, and pet and livestock food when available. Once a bear has found the easily accessible, consistent food source that human settlements can offer, it may overcome its wariness of people and visit regularly, increasing the chance of a human/bear encounter. You and your neighbors can make a difference. Your actions may prevent the unnecessary death of a bear!

Make your property safe by keeping garbage out of reach and smell of bears. Be sure garbage cans are emptied regularly. Periodically clean garbage cans to reduce residual odor—using hot water and chlorine bleach, or by burning trash residue in cans.

If you have pets, do not store their food or feed them outside. Clean your barbeque grill of grease and store inside. Hang birdseed, suet and hummingbird feeders on a wire between trees instead of on your deck or porch. Bring all birdfeeders in at night. Do not put fruit, melon rinds or other tasty items in mulch or compost piles.

E-Bike Registration

By Open Space Manager Sean Warren

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space and Parks Use Rules prohibit the use of motorized vehicles, including but not limited to e-bikes, motorcycles and motorized scooters. One exception to this rule is accommodations (as mandated by Americans with Disabilities Act) for individuals with mobility disabilities that need motorized vehicles, or Other Power-Driven Mobility Devices (OPDMD) to access and enjoy open space.

The Rangers occasionally observe individuals with power chairs using the trails, and now the Master Association Board has approved the use of class 1 e-bikes (pedal assist, lacking throttle) as an OPDMD on PRIVATE open space trails.


Qualified individuals will need to acquire a permit through the Master Association. Registration forms can be downloaded from the community website at www.ken-carylranch.org under Open Space, then Trails, but you must make an appointment with Ranger staff to complete the registration process, including proof of Association



membership and documentation of need from the state or a medical professional. Public open space (i.e. South Hogback Open Space) is governed by different polices and registration is not mandatory. The Master Association's new policy also requires that a staff-issued placard must be displayed on the e-bike when using PRIVATE open space trails.

To register for this program, contact the Rangers at 303-979-1876, ext. 170, and leave a message. A Ranger will call you back to schedule a time to meet you and help complete your registration for an e-bike permit.

Atticus Levy Graduates from Renowned Advanced Space Academy

In August, Ken-Caryl Ranch resident Atticus Levy, son of Joe and Cheryl Levy, attended Advanced Space Academy at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center, NASA Marshall Space Flight Center's Official Visitor Center.

The weeklong educational program promotes science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), while training students and adults with hands-on activities and missions based on teamwork, leadership and problem solving.

Atticus was part of the Advanced Space Academy program, which is designed for trainees who have an interest in space exploration. He spent the week training with a team that flew a simulated space mission to Mars. The crew participated in experiments and successfully completed an extra-vehicular activity, or spacewalk, and returned to Earth in time to graduate with honors.

"Space Camp was an amazing experience," said Atticus. "What made it unique was the missions that I had to go on. You develop an understanding of what it is like to be an astronaut. Not just the science, but the difficult procedures required to survive. The simulations are designed in a way that makes it feel like you are on an actual mission. It was an adventure I will never forget."

Space Camp operates year-round in Huntsville, Alabama, and uses astronaut training techniques to engage trainees in real-world applications of STEM subjects.


also significantly increase home values. While valid points, economics can't tell the entire story and certainly don't elucidate the true value Ken-Caryl amenities bring to the community as a whole.




