

Commercial Vehicle Parking 2020

What is considered a "commercial vehicle"? A commercial vehicle can be a car, truck, van, etc., that has advertising on the body of the vehicle and/or is equipped externally for services. These types of work vehicles, in place for a construction or remodeling project are permitted for the duration of a project, however, they are prohibited from being stored in public view,

As wrapped vehicles and home-based businesses are more common, and are often essential to the livelihood of some residents, the Architectural Committee understands that off-site parking is not always practical, and a solution to the benefit of all residents is needed. The committee also appreciates that these vehicles can sometimes be considered unsightly and require some regulation to help maintain neighborhood aesthetics. After much deliberation on the topic, the committee is recommending permissions and restrictions for "commercial vehicles" within Ken-Caryl Ranch, which support the diversity of the community while maintaining a regulated, and enforceable standard. Sub-associations may impose tighter restrictions, please check with your sub-association's management for more information.

such as a resident's work vehicle.

3.08 of the Rules, Regulations, and Procedures currently states, in part:

"Any automobile, truck, or other vehicle, which displays lettering or advertising, carries equipment for a business, or is equipped for performing services, shall be kept in an enclosed garage or at an off-site facility."

On Feb. 13, the Master Association Architectural Committee will vote to adopt the

following parking rule for the community:

"Any automobile, truck, or other vehicle, which displays permanently-affixed lettering or advertisina, carries equipment for a business on the outside of the vehicle, is advertised by its manufacturer as a commercial vehicle, or is externally equipped for performing commercial services (for example, a generator, integrated ladder rack, or built-in (not aftermarket) tool box), shall be well maintained and kept at all times in an enclosed garage, in the driveway, or at an off-site facility. The determination of whether any vehicle is subject to this section shall be the Architectural Committee's reasonable discretion. Only one such vehicle permitted per property. Trailers and RVs are subject to additional parking restrictions, see Approved Parking and Vehicles earlier in this section, 3.08."



Rangers Seeking Volunteer Patrollers for 2020

Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers are seeking any residents who would like to join the Volunteer Patroller Program for the 2020 season. The program started in 2012 with three volunteers and has grown to 26 volunteers donating 270 hours to patrol the open space! The Volunteer Patrollers serve as an extension of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association's Park Ranger Staff. Volunteer Patrollers provide rules education, trail use guidelines and private open space information. Volunteer Patrollers strive to achieve and maintain a positive relationship with different user groups and present a professional image. To be accepted into the program, you must be a Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association member in good standing and submit a signed application and letter of commitment. A short phone interview and a two to three-hour training in the month of March will complete the

process. The date and time of the training will be determined based on the number of applications received.

Basic requirements include, performing at least two trail patrols per month either hiking or biking, mainly from May through September, but volunteers can also patrol outside of these months, too. All volunteers must be 25 years of age or older, attend trainings, and be willing to make routine contacts checking residency and providing basic rules education.

Patrollers will receive all related training and will be supplied with an open space patrol vest, volunteer ID, first aid kit, and a packet with brochures, patrol log, and quick reference sheet.







JeffCo Public Health Offers Free Radon **Testing Kits in** January

In recognition of National Radon Action Month in January, Jefferson County Public Health (JCPH) is encouraging residents to protect themselves and loved ones from dangerous radon gas by testing their homes, and are currently offering free radon test kits all month long. These kits are available while supplies last, one per address and on a first come-first served basis throughout the month of January, and can be picked up at their location at 645 Parfet Street in Lakewood.

Radon is a dangerous and naturallyoccurring radioactive gas that you cannot smell, taste or see. People are exposed to radon primarily from breathing radon in air that enters homes and other buildings through cracks and gaps in foundations.

Radon exposure is the leading cause of lung cancer among non-smokers and a top environmental cause of cancer nationwide. In Jefferson County, more than half of homes tested have high levels of radon. While there is always some radon in the air, high levels of exposure to radon over time can lead to a significant risk of developing lung cancer. The risk of lung cancer is even greater for smokers who are exposed to radon.

"Any home can have high levels of radon, whether it's new or old, large or small – that's why it's so important to test," said Mitch Brown, Environmental Health supervisor at JCPH. "Once you test, there are steps you can take to make your home healthier and safer, and that's really our end goal. We want to reduce the negative effects radon has on the Jeffco community."

While homeowners do not need to test for radon annually if their homes have recently tested below the maximum threshold (4 picocuries per liter), residents are encouraged to conduct testing every 2-3 years. If your home has tested above the determined threshold, more comprehensive testing may be needed to gauge the severity of the problem. There is no safe level of radon, so even if your home tests below the established threshold, you may still want to consider mitigation.

In addition to providing the free test kits, JCPH staff will be available to help homeowners understand how to properly use these test kits and what to do if the test results show high levels of radon in their homes. If action is needed to reduce radon in a home, it's important to test homes for radon again to be sure the action worked and the air is safe. Resources may be available for those whose homes test positive for high levels of radon and who qualify through the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

Testing your home, and installing proper air quality controls if high levels of radon exist, is an effective way to prevent the harmful effects radon can have on you and your family. After January, radon test kits will be available for purchase at JCPH for

Jefferson County Snow Removal Protocol and Procedures

Ken-Caryl residents may not have gotten a "White Christmas," but that doesn't exempt Jefferson County from being blanketed by snow this time of year. In fact, Front Range residents can expect more prolific snowstorms to hit the area in the coming months. As residents brace themselves for the whirl of white to come, many are left wondering, who is responsible for neighborhood snow removal?

While the Ken-Caryl Metro District crews are responsible for snow removal at the Ranch House, Dakota Lodge, and the Community Center, which includes building parking lots and sidewalks, in addition to greenbelt sidewalks, the county is responsible for street snow removal.

According to information obtained from Jefferson County's website, plowing and sanding operations will take place in four phases during a storm. The order in which streets are plowed in each phase is based on the following definitions of priority:

Priority 1 - Main arterial streets that provide for high-traffic volumes.

Priority 2 - Major subdivision collectors, school zones and school bus routes.

Priority 3 - Residential or other local roads that carry moderate to low traffic volumes. **Priority 4 -** Cul-de-sacs or other dead-end roads carrying very low traffic volumes.

Sanding of most roads is limited during heavy snowfall because the sand is quickly covered and then removed as additional plowing occurs. When applying sand, special attention is given to sections of the road network posing specific safety concerns. These include, but are not limited to, areas such as: school and hospital zones, police and fire stations, bridges and overpasses, turn lanes, acceleration or deceleration lanes, approaches to intersections that are stop sign or signal controlled, curves, steep grades, heavy traffic areas, areas of ice accumulation, speed bumps, and areas with other known problems.

It is the responsibility of homeowners to clear snow from driveways, sidewalks and walkways. Postal regulations require that residents clear snow in front of mailboxes to allow for safe mail delivery.

Residents are advised that the practice of pushing or throwing snow onto or across Jefferson County streets endangers the traveling public as well as county snowplow operators. Jefferson County residents, as well as private contractors, may receive a warning and/or summons for snow pushed onto County streets and rights-of-way from sidewalks, driveways, parking lots, etc.

Streets on which vehicles have been abandoned or otherwise parked so as to restrict the safe and continuous operation of snow removal equipment may not be plowed until those vehicles are removed.

Curb Your Cans: Trash Can Placement

After receiving a few questions from residents, and some feedback from Waste Connections, we would like to share information regarding the proper placement for your trash cans on pick-up day.

To help ensure quick and easy trash collection, Waste Connections requests that residents place trash cans on the street side of the curb in the gutter. If you do not have a sidewalk, containers should be placed in the valley pan, or area between your property and the street. Cans should not be left for pick up in driveways, by garages, or block public walkways. Improperly placed cans could result in trash not being picked up or cause delays in the pick-up route. Waste Connections' staff will do all they can to ensure your trash is collected, however, improperly placed cans could result in trash not being picked up, or cause delays in the pick-up route.


Master Association Rules, Regulations, and Procedures 3.10 Trash Set Out Rules:

"Trash/Recycling items may be placed out after 7 p.m. on the evening before pick-up day. The items must be taken in prior to 7 p.m. on the day of pick-up. Refuse, garbage, and trash shall be kept at all times in a covered container and any such container shall be kept within an enclosed structure or screened from view. A resident may have a "bagster" on their property, in use for no longer than 10 days. See Parking Rules 3.08 for information regarding dumpsters. Please also see information about wildlife in reference to trash set out."



Waste Connections is considering plans to fully automate trash service in the future, which means the truck's arms will be used to dispose of trash as opposed to the driver exiting the vehicle to manually collect trash. This new protocol will lead to greater efficiencies in trash collection and ensure operator safety and security. 

It was at the Equestrian Center that Audrey met many of her friends and developed lifelong friendships. While not on her horse or walking with her dogs, Audrey and Bill traveled to many parts of the world to attend English Lace Conventions. She always kept a sketch pad in her purse to document their travels, whether abroad, or in Colorado, camping in their motorhome.

Audrey lived a long and colorful life and was buried at Fort Logan National Cemetery on Dec. 31, 2019. Additionally, you may also receive a notification when someone new tries to log on to your network. Two-factor authentication prevents hackers from getting into your account since they don't have the ability to easily access your phone or email address.

4. Update your devices regularly

While it may be an extra step, many video surveillance camera vendors expect consumers to update their devices manually to avoid hacking pitfalls that may occur due to outdated software. Prevent vulnerabilities by checking for available updates every few months and set up reminders to stay on top of software updates.
