Metropolitan District Budget and Fee Discussions

At the foundation of every successful public agency you will likely find sound budgeting and fiscal management. The Metropolitan District has made significant strides in developing this strong foundation thanks to the work of the Metropolitan District Board, staff, and the community. There has also been a tremendous effort to work collectively with the Master Association Board, providing a "one community" voice to the work of both Boards. This collaborative work has resulted in the identification of innovative and creative options to solving long-term financial issues, as you may have read in the last issue of Life at Ken-Caryl.

The Metropolitan District and Master Association Boards both opened the 2020 budget season with initial discussions on Oct. 22. The Metropolitan District discussed the achievement of operating and capital reserves, a milestone that has not been realized for many years. In addition, the Board discussed purchases for priority capital needs. Although the 2020 budget is positive and allows for much needed fiscal stability, the budget includes information regarding fees, including the aquatic fees, credit card processing fees, facility rentals, and program fees. Generally speaking, the



individual program fees cover the direct, and to some extent, the indirect costs of providing the program. These fees are an important component to the financial sustainability of the programs and the District, so the Board will be continuing discussions regarding fee reductions and/ or increases at the November meeting.

If you have questions or comments, mark your calendar for Tuesday, Nov. 12 at 6 p.m. at the Ranch House when the Metropolitan District Board will be opening the public hearing to discuss the 2020 Budget. The community is invited to provide feedback about the overall budget as well as the proposed fees. You can find more draft budget documents and information on the website at www.ken-carylranch.org. Parking on Ken-Caryl Ranch

This summer, the Master Association Board of Directors approved a revision of the parking rules as part of the Rules, Regulations, and, Procedures Document. New rules added include construction equipment for home improvement projects, emergency vehicle state law requirements, and vehicles blocking Emergency Access or sightlines. Rules once referred to as regulating "Commercial Vehicles" and "Inoperable Vehicles" were clarified and broadened to better reflect the spirit of the rule as they pertain to unsightly articles.

Commercial vehicles remain under review by the Architectural Committee as they gather data to further develop the rule to best fit the needs of the community in accordance with the Master Declaration. As parking issues often cross over with county regulations, and partnership with or deferment to Jefferson County Sheriff is sometimes necessary, we also included information as to which entities enforce the rules. Most parking concerns are enforced in response to a complaint. Reporting a parking or vehicle violation may require the complainant to be identifiable on the record and provide proof of the violation, i.e. timestamped photos.

3.08 Parking Rules

The following parking rules shall be in effect on all land within the boundaries of Ken-Carvl Ranch. Homeowners and residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch shall be responsible for the parking and storage of vehicles owned or operated by their tenants, visitors, and household guests. Any vehicle described in Section 4.05 of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions "... trailers, mobile homes, recreation vehicles, graders, trucks other than pickups, boats, tractors, campers, wagons, buses, sleighs, motorcycles, motor scooters, snowmobiles, snow removal equipment and garden and maintenance equipment..." shall not be permitted to be stored on any street or public right-of-way or on private property within Ken-Caryl Ranch but shall be kept at all times in the garage, screened from view, or stored at an offsite facility.

Approved Parking and Vehicles

- A resident of Ken-Caryl Ranch may park a boat, camper, hobby/recreation trailer, or RV on the street or in the driveway for two non-consecutive days during a seven-day period.
- Extension or expansion of driveways for additional parking is not permitted. Driveways must be surfaced with asphalt, concrete, or pavers and cannot extend beyond the width of the garage. See Driveways/Concrete Work Home Improvements Section 2.18 (of the Rules Regulations and Procedures).

· Construction trailers, dumpsters, and portable toilets required for a home improvement project are the duration



and must be promptly removed when no longer required.

In accordance with state law, Emergency Vehicles that are required by the resident's employer (an Emergency Service provider such as Fire Department, law enforcement, or EMS) as a condition of employment, weighs ten thousand pounds or less, has a visible emblem or marking designating it as an emergency vehicle, may be parked in the driveway or on the street in front of the resident's property.

Prohibitions and Restrictions

- Parking of any type of vehicle on landscape, rocks, and/or lawn portions of the yard, or any other pervious surface is prohibited.
- Any automobile, truck, or other vehicle which displays lettering or advertising, carries equipment for a business, or is equipped for performing services, shall be kept at all times in an enclosed garage or at an offsite facility.
- Any automobile, truck, motorcycle, or other similar vehicle that does not have a valid registration sticker or temporary tag posted in plain view, or a vehicle which has one or more flat tires, broken windows, or missing parts shall be parked in the garage until returned to an operable or complete condition.
- No parked vehicle will obstruct emergency access or interfere with the use of the streets. Contact Jefferson County Sheriff for enforcement of street parking.
- No vehicle covers are permitted. Enforcement
- Parking violations on or in front of private property will be subject to the Violation **Notification Policy and Covenant** Enforcement, Section 1.05 (of the Rules Regulations and Procedures).
- Vehicles blocking public rights of way, sightlines, or emergency access must be reported to the Jefferson County Sheriff for enforcement.

Master Association On Oct. 22, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master

Association held a regular meeting and discussed the following items:

- The Board reviewed a draft of the updated Volunteer Trail Coordinator Program Description. The Board will vote on the revised description in November. Residents Ruth Sundberg and Jim Fodor expressed concerns about the VTC program.
- The Board reviewed the status of committee membership for 2020. There will be one opening for the Covenant Committee and two for the Open Space Committee.
- Staff presented options for the 2020 Draft Budget. The Board looked at dues increases in the amount of \$2-\$4 per month and discussed multiple onetime projects. Six residents addressed the Board about the budget. The Board supports a \$3/month dues increase and will vote on the budget at the Nov. 12 meeting.
- John Archer from Assured Partners Group, an insurance broker, presented insurance renewal information to the Master Association Board, Insurance costs for the Master Association will be \$12,000 higher for 2020 due to increases in premiums and the addition of cyber security insurance and an abuse and molestation policy.
- A motion passed adopting the Brannon Gearhart Task Force Job Description.
- A motion passed authorizing staff to write off uncollected late fees from 63 accounts totaling \$140.73.
- A motion failed authorizing \$15,000 for an open space survey by JF Sato.
- A motion passed authorizing \$20,000 for a contingency for the Brannon Gearhart Park project.
- · A motion passed authorizing staff to enter into an insurance renewal with Assured Partners Group.
- The Board moved the November meeting to Nov. 12 at 6 p.m. at the Ranch House.

Metropolitan District

On Oct. 22, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a regular meeting and discussed the following items:

- The Board discussed an update to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Swim Team Memorandum of Agreement.
- Board member representatives updated the Board on the progress of the Financial Sustainability Workgroup. The group continues to meet to look at long-term financial stability for the community.
- The Board reviewed an updated version of the Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards Joint Study Session Meeting Guidelines. Both Boards will vote on the updated Meeting Guidelines at their respective meetings. A motion passed adopting the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan **District Boards Joint Study Session** Meeting Guidelines.
- The Board discussed a draft of the 2020 Budget. Discussion centered around credit card processing fees, aquatic pass fees, and general recreation program fees for 2020, and the Board will discuss them further at the Nov. 12 meeting.

Christmas Tree Sale

The Annual Christmas Tree Sale will be held at the Dakota Lodge on Saturday, Dec. 7 from 8-10 a.m. A limited number of trees cut from forest management areas will be available to the public on a first come, first served basis. Rangers are requesting donations in exchange for the trees, and the donations will be used to offset expenses in the open space program. The recently cut Douglas Firs and Ponderosa Pines remain fresh and fragrant

for the sale. Unlike the trees found in Christmas tree sale lots, these trees are more "natural" in shape, but they will still fill your home with a traditional Christmas spirit.

For the annual tree sale, the Rangers harvest small diameter trees in the open space to improve wildlife habitat and overall forest health. The removal of the small trees reduces overcrowding and eliminates ladder fuels that can carry fire into a forest canopy. Trees that don't find a home are chipped and made into mulch. Board Proposing \$3 Dues Increase

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board reviewed a draft of the 2020 Budget at its Oct. 22 meeting. The Board is proposing a \$3/month dues increase and will vote on the final budget at its meeting on Nov. 12 at 6 p.m. at the Ranch House.

Some major operating costs are increasing in 2020 by the following amounts:

Dr. Alan Goral, owner of the Ken-Caryl Dental Center, is celebrating 30 years of dental service to the community. He opened his practice in 1989 on the corner of Kipling and Bowles. In 2002 he took over the Ken-Caryl Dental Center from Dr. Paul Motzkus, who started the office in 1977. Through the decades, Dr. Goral has provided dental care for multiple generations.

After 30 years in practice, Dr. Goral is "most proud of the volunteer work that my office has done." He has volunteered with Kids in Need of Dentistry to provide low-cost dental care to children. His practice also worked with the Smile Again program, providing services to women who were victims of domestic violence. Close to My Heart Photography, a new non-profit started by Ken-Caryl residents Gail and Brad Buhler, creates memories through a camera lens. The memories they capture go beyond the usual weddings and graduation photos – Gail photographs individuals diagnosed with a terminal illness or disabling disease along with their family.

Gail worked as a professional photographer for 15 years before starting the nonprofit. "Once you've suffered, it's universal," said Gail. "You understand it and can bring compassion and heart to each [photography] session."

Each photo shoot is designed to provide a momentary escape from day-to-day life for

the family. Many of the family. Many of the families rarely have time to pause in daily life, and Close to My Heart gives them the opportunity to let go of the daily grind, spend time together, and even share a moment of laughter.

Close to My Heart provides all its services at no cost to the families. Initially, Gail and Brad





Jefferson County's Initiative 1A Is a 18% county property tax hike. Initiative 1A permanently eliminates part of Jeffco's Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR). At the local level, Taxpayers Bill of Rights is our way of holding Jefferson County accountable for the spending of local taxes, and TABOR as-is allows for moderate annual increases in spending. Supporters are trying scare tactics that initiative 1A is needed for community safety. Unfortunately, 1A is a BLANK check and permanently eliminates spending caps on non-property tax revenues.

The other section of Initiative 1A will also negatively impact local business owners. Local business property is assessed at 4X that of residential property. The property tax hike will be a hard hit on local businesses which will pass their increase to their customers and renters. Jefferson County can already increase spending by raising property taxes nearly 4% a year; they just need to work within their budget as we have to live within our budgets. This illustrates that Jefferson County has a spending problem if they want to increase our county property taxes by 18%, not a revenue problem.

Please join me on Nov. 5 to vote NO on Initiative 1A. Please vote NO on an 18% increase in county property taxes.



In the article below, you will find some interesting information. Granted, this article talks about a mountain biking ranger who was killed by a grizzly bear (which we do not have in KCR), but there is additional information which does apply to KCR and other areas. For example, "Mechanized mountain bikes and e-bikes, especially at higher speeds, are incompatible with hiking, hunting, and bird and wildlife watching....... Safety is also a concern."

Furthermore, the article states, "Some experts are raising questions about how fast-moving bikes startle not just bears, but elk, deer, and other species, and disrupt their lives."

"Because the popularity of biking in these areas (National Forests) has grown rapidly, there is little research on its effects on wildlife. But there is a growing body of evidence that outdoor recreations of all kinds has serious consequences for wildlife."

"Wildlife need to feel secure, and they can be stressed by the presence of people. Startling elk, deer, or any other animal causes them to flee, to use up energy and avoid areas where they are surprised but that they might need for feeding."

Over 90% of KCR open space has trails on it, which is in conflict with the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space; A Summary of the Resource and Management document which states to "provide a balance between the requirements of man and the capacity of nature."

The wildlife that is left in our area are certainly feeling disturbances daily and nightly by increased residents' use of our elaborate trail system. Hopefully, we never have a loss of life due to a bear or mountain lion collision, but it is a possibility. The elk herd, numbering in the hundreds, that previously migrated through the Valley has been gone for a decade. What else will we lose?

Wildlife was here first. Respect the animals and give them room to flourish, rather than allowing human greed for more recreational experiences to rob them of their habitat.

Dear Editor:

It's budget time again in Ken-Caryl. The Master Association is considering a number of one-time projects, which may or may not be funded based on the level of dues increase. I am not going to express an opinion on how much is an appropriate level of increase. The Board has the sole power to set dues and select projects for approval. When funding is limited, choices

always have to be made, meaning some projects proceed while others are cut or postponed.

I would like to draw residents' attention to two relatively small (in terms of cost) projects being considered, which if approved, would negatively impact the quality of our semi-rural environment. These are identified as "Valley Parkway Crossing" and "Soft Surface to Hard Surface Trail Conversion."

I have been unable to find details of either of these projects in the public domain, so these comments are based on interpretations of discussions held at the Open Space Committee. Neither have I seen nor heard any "statement of problem" which should be a prerequisite for any construction project before a "fix" is proposed. A comment that "some people have suggested..." is not a statement of a problem, it is a simple request from "some people."

However, the critical issue is that both projects replace greenery and earth in our open space with more acres of concrete. In the case of the Valley Parkway project, one plan under consideration includes building a concrete sidewalk on the east side of Valley Parkway north from Dawn Heath Drive to the Dakota path. This would mean paving over 350 linear feet of current grass verge and felling mature cottonwoods. The trail "conversion" project speaks for itself replacing a "country look and feel" path with an urban style "road."

Little by little, the original vision of Ken-Caryl as a rural enclave close to the city is being destroyed by urbanization. It is time for a moratorium on laying concrete. Do we want to look back 30 years from now and tell our kids that we were the ones who paved paradise and put up a parking lot?




