Bond update: At the June Study Session the Boards agreed on the Schematic Design for the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge campus improvements. The floor plans for all three facilities are posted on our website. Just click on the Bond & Improvement Projects on the bottom of our home page to access this and other bond information.

If you have comments, please submit them to us using the bondprojects@kcranch.org email address.

In order to provide all of the improvements identified for these campuses, the Boards had to reassign \$840,000 of the Bond proceeds from the signs, playgrounds and landscape improvements "bucket." The hope is that not all of this funding will be required and some may be able to be shifted back to those projects. Even with the reassignment of funds there is enough available to make the upgrades to our signs as presented recently and replace many of our playgrounds. In addition we will combine bond funds with MA operations money to continue replacing portions of the irrigation system and make modifications to our landscape. A team of volunteers working with staff and a consultant continue working on the Landscape Master Plan with hopes that it will be able to be implemented in the near future.

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◆ **Bond and Improvement Projects**

Updated Bond Project Plans

At the Joint Study Session meeting on June 2, representatives from Vanir Construction Management, Sink Combs Dethlefs Architecture & Design, and Adolfsen & Peterson Construction presented revised pricing for the bond improvement projects. The presentation identified scope reductions, more detailed drawings and specifications from which to price, a revised approach to mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems along with creative means and methods for achieving the project goals.

Following the presentations, A&P utilized a live spreadsheet to move project components from base (original) or alternate (options) scope of work to generate a working total amount. Many tough decisions were made by both the Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards to maximize improvements and minimize behind-the-walls work that would increase the life span of the facilities but not be a noticeable improvement to residents. At the conclusion of the meeting, the Joint Study Session Boards recommended the reassignment of bond funds from the Parks, Playgrounds and Landscaping projects (bucket 4) to fund the budget shortfall for the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge projects. The design team will work within the approved, reallocated amount, maintaining the bucket 4 funds for signage, playgrounds and other identified priorities.

The design team is currently working on the development of 100 percent design development drawings and specifications along with finish selections for the building interiors. The design development drawings will be reviewed by the Boards at their July 14 Study Session, along with another round of cost estimating to confirm pricing aligns with the target budgets for all campuses. Items Hauled Away for Free

Got some stuff hanging around the house that you have been meaning to get rid of? Haven't gotten around to organizing that garage sale or summoned the energy to get rid of that '80s sleeper sofa? What if there was a company that would come pick up almost anything you want to get rid of and haul it away? There is.

Gone for Good is an eco-friendly local company that will pick up most everything from trash to furniture large or small, haul them away and do everything they can to find them a new home or recycle them. Reid Husmer, owner and originator of the concept, and his crew work hard to resell items, donate items to charity, or break them down and recycle. Reduce/Resell/Recycle is the mission at Gone for Good.

The only items Gone for Good are not able to take are household hazardous chemicals. They normally charge \$150 for a quarter truck pickup, \$300 for a half truck and \$500 for a full truck (14-foot box truck, 22 cubic yards). You will also receive a tax-donation receipt and a discount on your haul away fee if there are any reusable items in the pickup. The team will do an evaluation of all items and give an estimated value of the resale. They will give you a 30 percent discount from the total of the estimated value. For example, if they think they can resell a table for \$100, then you will get \$30 off your haul-away fee.

As residents in the Ken-Caryl community, a few agents at Colorado Home Realty are sponsoring a pick-up of one to three items on July 10 and 11 from 8 a.m.-6 p.m. on both days. For most items this service will be FREE, however, there will be nominal charges for electronic items as follows: small TV or monitor \$10, medium TV or monitor \$25, large TV or monitor \$50. The guys from Gone for Good will do the lifting and hauling. The normal minimum cost to pick up one to three items is \$150, so this is a valuable service offered by these realtors!

Master Association Board

The following is a summary of items from the June 9 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board:

- The Board reviewed a letter from the Master Association's auditor, James Moore & Associates.
- The Board received an update on the status of the insurance claim for hail damage at the Equestrian Center.
- The Board received a follow-up report on a previous mediation request from the Open Space Committee.
- The Board discussed funding from the Master Association's operating and reserve funds to partner on bond projects.
- The Board reviewed the Conduct of Meetings Policy.
- Manager's Report: A written report was included in the Board package.
- Committees: Board member committee liaisons reported on the activities that their committees have been engaged in for the past month.
- A motion was approved authorizing staff to contract with Tony Boone Trails for contract trail building. \$25,000 is budgeted for this in 2015.
- A motion was approved for the prairie dog release site on the east slope of the north hogback.
- A motion authorizing the Lower Cougar Trail alignment was approved.
- A motion was approved authorizing the bond project schematic design as presented and amended at the June 2 Study Session as memorialized on the spreadsheet dated June 5, 2015 and approving a reassignment of funds from bucket 4 for those purposes.
- A motion was approved adopting the Capitalization Policy as recommended by the Finance Committee.

MA/MD Joint Study Session

On June 2, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards held a Joint Study Session at the Ranch House and discussed the following items:

Representatives from Vanir Construction Management, Sink Combs Dethlefs Architecture & Design, and Adolfsen & Peterson Construction presented revised plans and updated pricing for the bond improvement projects. The pricing presented exceeded the target budgets for each campus. Following discussion the Boards recommended the reassignment of bond funds from the Parks, Playgrounds and Landscaping projects to fund the budget shortfall for the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge projects.

The design team is currently working on the design development drawings and specifications along with finish selections for the building interiors. The design development drawings will be reviewed by the Boards, along with another round of cost estimating to confirm pricing aligns with the target budgets for all campuses.

Update on Trail Maintenance in the Open Space

June 6 was National Trails Day, which should be a good reminder for us to recognize the importance of all trails and the effort it takes to create and maintain them.

We all know the local trails here at Ken-Caryl have been taking a beating over the last month with these persistent heavy rainfalls. This amount of rain will always frustrate any trail user and manager. As a result of the recent weather, we have had to take on a more reactive role in trail maintenance, including these three trail rehabilitation projects that have been completed or are near completion.

The Ken-Caryl Trail Crew restored one heavily damaged section of the Bradford Trail just north of Dutch Creek under the power lines. On Saturday, May 30, 12 volunteers from the Boy Scouts of America/Order of the Arrow helped

restore a 150-foot section of Lyons Trail that was greatly damaged by recent rains. These volunteers reclaimed the lost soil, brought it back to the trail, installed new erosion control features and cleaned out existing features.

On Sunday, June 7, 17 residents from Ken-Caryl, most of whom were from the local Trail Club, volunteered and helped restore numerous sections of trail near the northwest end of the North Hogback Open Space. The work from both of these groups is most definitely appreciated, and the maintenance and time they contribute should not go unnoticed. Thanks again for helping!

We have also been installing additional erosion control features throughout the trail system, and in certain locations we are in the middle of some level of rehabilitation. When you notice this you might wonder what is going on. I just wanted to say that trail work tends not to be visually appealing during this transition, but please be patient. Trail work is hard, it takes time, and there are always seven different ways to do things.

Sometimes we just have to do a quick fix, let it sit, and wait to interpret how the rain and water flow reacts, and then follow up with a more permanent solution afterward. Ultimately the trails will benefit from this work and also from the dedication of our trail partners and volunteers. Without their contribution the Ken-Caryl Trail Crew would be struggling to keep up with all the work that comes along with all this rain.

Thanks again to all the dedicated volunteers! Our trails appreciate it.

Resident Wins Colorado Authors' League Award

Congratulations to Ken-Caryl Ranch resident Jerry Mitchell for winning the 2015 Colorado Authors' League Award for mainstream fiction for his novel, *The Height of Secrecy*. He received the following comment about his book from the judges: "An engaging mystery with strong characters and a wonderfully authentic setting in the southwest. Keep your eye on this nascent series."

Jerry had a long career with the National Park Service. He was chief of the agency's Biological Resource Management Division and retired after 36 years of service, having worked in Yosemite, Grand Canyon, and Zion National Parks, along with Washington, D.C., and Fort Collins. *The Height of Secrecy* is his second book and can be ordered from your favorite independent bookstore, Amazon or Barnes and Noble.

Following is a summary of the book: High on a treacherous canyon wall, a man from the pueblo clings to a ledge. Furiously working to rescue him, Ranger Jack Chastain is nearly killed. Now he wants answers and the man refuses to talk. After learning the secret revolves around a death 16 years before, ghosts from his own past threaten his new life in New Mexico, forcing a choice between a man who can save a collapsing coalition or a Native American with something to hide. 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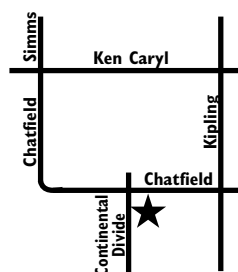

You will see water-wise gardens, hummingbird gardens, rock gardens, and beautiful landscaping filled with annuals, perennials, and vegetables. There are many different ways to enjoy some green in your landscape and maybe even grow some fresh, nutritious food in the process! Of course the deer think it is fresh and nutritious also!

The gardeners are pleased to open up their gardens for others to enjoy, but also to encourage others to try growing something green and to share some tips they have learned, often the hard way!

They also believe in the reason for this fundraiser, which is to raise funds to build portable, wheeled garden beds for rehab/nursing facilities. The first of such beds was placed in May at Care Meridian on Bowles Ave. in honor of Nina Forgo who lived there after her severe stroke and found great joy and healing during her time spent working with plants. The residents there are already enjoying caring for the plants as well as tasting the strawberries and fresh parsley and garnishing their plates with edible pansies and nasturtium.

This year's event will raise funds to place other gardens at area nursing facilities so that this healing method can be spread to others. The goal is to place two more beds in 2016.

The idea of horticulture therapy has

been proven as an important healing method for people who are limited in their mobility. It has been used for seniors and children, as well as people suffering from physical disabilities including brain and spinal cord injuries. While it provides enjoyment, it also provides a positive psychological effect and assists with improving fine motor skills. It is used for its healing value at places like Craig Hospital and Children's Hospital.

The event is being hosted by the Ken Caryl Ranch Foundation and sponsored by Jared's Nursery who will be on hand at the Community Garden to demonstrate how to create a beautiful container garden.

Tickets may be purchased in advance at the Ranch House and Community Center or at the Community Garden (located next to the Community Center) the day of the event, July 11, from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. (tickets will be sold until noon). 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Intergovernmental Agreement

Reminder About Agreement for Use of Ridge Recreation Center

Residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch (KCR) can use the Foothills Ridge Recreation Center at Foothills resident rates for 2015.

The Ridge Recreation Center, which is located at 6613 South Ward St. just north of the boundary of KCR, is owned and operated by Foothills, a local park and recreation provider. Residents of KCR have always been able to use Foothills facilities as they are all open to the public. However, prior to 2014, residents of KCR were assessed non-resident fees for Foothills facilities as it is a separate park and recreation district. For calendar year 2014, KCRMD and Foothills entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) to permit KCR residents to use the drop-in amenities of the Ridge Recreation Center at the same daily rates as Foothills residents. Residents of KCR do not pay property taxes to help support the facilities owned and managed by Foothills. The year 2014 was used as a trial period to gauge the use and popularity of the facility with residents of KCR with the KCRMD subsidizing the non-resident fee differential.

The Ridge Recreation Center offers users an indoor lap and separate leisure activity pool, a therapy pool, a gymnasium and track, a cardio weight room, racquetball courts and a rock climbing wall. As part of the agreement, KCR residents must pay \$5 for a special ID card issued by Foothills that will identify the user as a resident of KCR. ID cards that were issued to KCR residents in 2014 are still valid for 2015.

The current agreement is exclusive to the Ridge Recreation Center only. The agreement does not include a discount for use of the Edge Ice Arena, the Peak Community and Wellness Center, or any other Foothills amenities. The special rate is only for the drop-in use of these amenities and does not apply to classes or youth programs.

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Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor:

I am grateful for the Firearms and Projectiles reminder in the recent Life at Ken Caryl. As summer begins it's good to remind and encourage everyone to be safe. Just recently in fact, I saw some children with BB guns in the area and it raised concern.

As a representative of the ASK Campaign here in Colorado I would like to add that one in three homes with children have guns, and many are kept unlocked and loaded. Add to that, that three in four children ages 5 to 14 know where firearms are kept in the home and 80 percent of unintentional firearm deaths of kids under 15 occur in the home.

What better time of year to remind everyone to ASK? ASK stands for Asking Saves Kids and is a campaign to encourage conversation about keeping firearms stored properly and away from children.
