The creation and job description of each committee is approved by Board resolution, with the exception of the Architectural Committee, which is a standing committee established through the Declarations and Covenants. Some committees are limited in number of members; others are open to many volunteer members. Each committee has a Board member representative who attends the meetings and reports committee news to the Board and a staff member liaison who ensures that meeting minutes are produced and available for Board review.

On Sept. 25, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District Board of Directors approved a motion with a 4-1 vote authorizing staff to move forward with plans to remodel the child care nursery building at the Community Cen-

We encourage everyone to fill out their survey within 10 days of receipt, but all surveys must be received by Oct. 29. This means the paper surveys should be mailed by Oct. 26. Residents can either fill out the paper version of the survey or complete it online. The survey will help the Boards and staff to plan ahead to keep Ken-Caryl Ranch attractive and a great place to live. After the survey results are collected, not only will the Boards and staff have immediate feedback they can use in decision-making, but the strongest proposals will be identified for further research and development. The resulting plans that are favored and prove to be feasible for the community will ultimately become part of the Ken-Caryl Community Master Plan, which will be updated on an annual basis.

Manager's Column_

The 2013 draft budget for the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District will be available for review later this week on the Ken-Caryl Ranch website at www.ken-carylranch.org under the Administration Tab then Budgets and Reports. The Metropolitan District Board and staff have been working for the past two months to develop a draft budget for 2013. The 2013 draft budget for the Metropolitan District is presented as a "status quo" budget for 2012 with no planned additional services for 2013 and no increase in property taxes.

For budget year 2013, the overall valuation of both commercial and residential properties located in the Metropolitan District dropped more than 9 percent from the previous year. This decrease in property values created an immediate shortfall in the 2013 budg-

et, which had to be addressed by the Board of Directors.

The goal of the Board during the entire 2013 budget process has been to try to not reduce services to residents in spite of the projected budget shortfall. The draft 2013 budget was able to accomplish this through reduced planned expenditures in addition to a redirection of funding from the special funds. The Public Hearing on the draft 2013 Metropolitan District budget is scheduled for Tuesday, Oct. 23 at 6 p.m. in conjunction with the October Board of Directors meeting. The Metropolitan District 2013 budget is scheduled to be adopted by the Board of Directors at a meeting on Dec. 11.

In other news, the Metropolitan District Board of Directors in September approved a contract to remodel the interior of the child care nursery building at the Community Center. The interior renovation project, which is scheduled for completion by Dec. 1, is planned to accommodate space to service additional preschool participants as well as create more multi-purpose space at the facility. The cost for the project is being funded in its entirety by the Youth Services Fund, which generates its revenues exclusively through participant user fees.

Watch Out For Wildlife This Fall

Fall is the time when wildlife start preparing for winter and is breeding season for deer and elk. Increased activity in the fall can lead to conflicts with wildlife. By adhering to a few guidelines, Ken-Caryl Ranch residents can avoid potentially dangerous situations.



 As bears prepare for hibernation they will need to consume up to 20,000 calories a day. Residents should remove all attractants like bird feeders and remember to store trash indoors until the morning of pick up.

- As deer enter the breeding season, male deer will be searching for mates and can be very aggressive. Never approach male deer and give them plenty of room to escape if encountered.
- As the days grow shorter, collisions with deer on the roadways increase. Please slow down and be aware of major deer crossing areas like the intersection of Valley Parkway and Club Drive and the blind corners on Ken Caryl Ave. as you enter the Valley.
- Holiday lights that are strung on trees and shrubs can get caught in deer antlers and may hinder movement or feeding. If possible restrict holiday lights to your home.

The MD Board accepted a formal bid from a local contractor and began the remodeling process in early October. The project is expected to be completed Dec. 1. The new preschool classroom will be open on Wednesday, Jan. 9. The addition of this classroom will allow the preschool programs to serve an additional 15 children per day and up to 30 additional families with part-time schedules. They will also be able to offer before and after-care hours for all of their preschool families. The preschool will now have hours from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. five days a week.

During the remodel, nursery services will be available in the lobby of the Community Center. Staff expects to begin serving onsite child care patrons from the new garden level facility in early December.

"Our preschool programs have been growing by leaps and bounds over the last few years, and I am so excited to be able to make the phone calls to wait-listed families and get planning under way for the new classroom," said Youth Services Specialist Sarah Gagne.


"We as a Youth Programs staff owe a huge thank you to all of the previous and current MD & MA Board members for all of the time they have spent over the last 18 months reviewing staff proposals for this project, and also to the Ken-Caryl Ranch community for providing their feedback and continually supporting our programs. We look forward to serving our District in a way that we haven't been able to in the past."

The estimated cost of the remodeling project will be approximately \$34,000 and will be funded in its entirety by the KCRMD's Youth Services Fund. Furnishings for the newly remodeled building will also be paid for out of the Youth Services Fund.

The additional preschool program will be able to accommodate a large portion of the families currently on the waiting list. Staff will be in touch with everyone individually in the coming weeks regarding registration, deposits and other detailed program information. On Sept. 25, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

- The Board approved a request from Cub Scout Pack 4 from Shaffer Elementary School to adopt the Community Park for 2013 through the District's Adopt-a-Park program.
- The Board received an update on the Ranch House Peak-Use Task Force. The Task Force is scheduled to present a report at the Oct. 23 Board meeting.
- Representatives from Ken-Caryl Little League and South Jeffco Sports were in attendance at the meeting to discuss with the Board possible improvements to the

Community Park baseball fields.

- The Board received an update on the KC2020 Task Force. A resident survey is scheduled to go out the first week of Oc-
- The Board took action to approve a proposal to remodel the child care nursery building at the Community Center for additional preschool offerings and increased multi-purpose space.
- The Board received an update from State House of Representative Andy Kerr on the 2012 House Bill 1254 addressing funding for Metropolitan Districts from the State of Colorado Conservation Trust Fund.
- The Board reviewed a draft job description for a proposed new joint task force with the Master Association called the Ken-Caryl

Ranch Community Planning Committee.

- The Board took action to approve a new Gardener Agreement for users of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Community Garden.
- The Board received an update from the District Manager on the Requests for Proposal received by the District for the Community Center Campus Master Plan. Staff will make a recommendation to the Board at the Oct. 23 Board meeting on a consultant to be awarded this project.
- The District Manager updated the Board on the Sept. 18 meeting of the Board of Di-

rectors of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Water and Sanitation District. Staff and a Board member attended the meeting to discuss changes in the irrigation water rates for the District in 2013.

- The Board took action to approve an Engagement Letter from Schilling & Company to provide 2012 audit services for the District.
- The Board was reminded the October Joint Study Session with the Master Association will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 9 at 6 p.m. at the Ranch House.







Fall Family Flu Shot Clinic

The Colorado Flu Shot Company will be providing family flu immunization clinics. The flu vaccinations are now recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and the American Academy of Pediatrics for anyone 6 months of age and older who would like to increase their chances of a flufree fall and winter season. The CDC in 2006 has changed the age range of high-risk children to include all children 5 years and under, and their care givers. This is because younger children are most at risk for secondary infections (pneumonia, bronchitis, ear infections, etc.), and complications from the virus result in more childhood hospitalizations than any other vaccine-preventable disease. Others at higher risk include: anyone with asthma, heart disease, kidney disease, nursing or pregnant mothers and cancer patients. School-age children/students are also the most common source of spreading the virus.

The Humphrey Memorial Park and Museum is located on a very secluded and tran-





textiles, china, porcelain, furniture, Native American artifacts and countless more curiosities. Many of these fabulous pieces can be seen in the house today, which is now a

Hazel married Lucius Humphrey, a Denver newspaper man, in 1917. Lucius drove his Ford Model A from the ranch to downtown Denver for work. Back in those days, it was a two-hour trip and often was affected by

adverse weather in winter. The Model A still sits in the garage today! Lucius and Hazel had a daughter, Hazel Lou, who was only two years old when they bought the ranch from the Clarke family in 1920, naming it the Kinnikinick Ranch.

Hazel Lou Humphrey was an accomplished horsewoman and was very civic minded, participating in many clubs and organizations. She was one of the founders of the Jefferson County Historical Society and helped save what is now the Hiwan Homestead Museum from being torn down and developed. She was the last living Humphrey family member, dying on the ranch at 78 years old in 1995. It was her vision to create the ranch as a museum, leaving a trust fund and will creating what is now the Humphrey Memorial Park and Museum.

The Humphrey Memorial Park and Muse um is an example of ranching life in the late 19th and early 20th Century Colorado. In addition to the house/museum, many outbuildings indicative of Old West architecture, such as a smokehouse, teacherage, reconstructed barn/garage, cattery/garden shed, Hazel Lou's playhouse, three-seat outhouse, family garage (with Lucius' Model A), summer house, croquet court and others, are there to see. The house was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978. Remarkably, the furniture, fixtures and family treasures inside remain relatively undisturbed from when Hazel Lou, the last resident, lived on the ranch. Go to www.hmpm.org for more information.

In response to recent items in LAKC criticizing me for, supposedly, not supporting the proposed KCR Veterans Monument, I'd like to point out that all Board members, myself included, have been unanimous in our support of building the Monument. The only question is in regard to the precise location, and I believe this question requires a thorough discussion. I'd like to explain why.

I recently paid a visit to the Highlands Ranch Veterans Monument in Civic Green Park. I strongly recommend it for anyone interested in this subject.

What you will find there is an absolute jewel. The monument is tasteful and attractive. The design incorporates military elements both obvious and subtle. The placement of the dedication walls, alternating on either side of the path, mimic the advancement of an infantry unit. Look closely and you'll notice that the dedication walls are identified using military phonic alphabet. Subtle and clever.

Then take a step back to look at the "big picture," and you will notice more cleverness of the design: it is seamlessly integrated into the overall layout and function of the park. It provides a flowing transition from the library to the pavilion. There is separation from the park's turf area, thus avoiding the safety issues that arise when there are conflicting uses intermingled. The overall effect says that the designers thought long and hard about all the details, including how this monument would integrate with existing usage.

It's that attention to detail, both the macro and micro, which separates good design from great design, the satisfactory from the jewel. I believe the veterans and residents of KCR deserve a jewel.

That is why, as an MD Board member, I'm refusing to approve any location without exploring it completely. That is why I am asking questions and insisting on dialogue. I make no apologies for holding the KCR Veterans Monument effort to a high standard.

I hold it to that standard, not because I don't appreciate the sacrifice that our military men and women have made, but because I do.
