

Massey Draw Stream Stabilization Project

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association has contracted with AGE, Inc. to complete planned drainageway improvements in Massey Draw near the Community Center. The improvements will address public safety concerns, downstream bank stability and water quality issues. The stream stabilization project will start in late October and take approximately nine months to complete. The cost of \$385,000 is funded entirely by Master Association dues.

In 2009, Muller Engineering completed a drainageway hazard assessment of Massey Draw and Dutch Creek. The assessment identified problems within all of the major drainageways and their tributaries in the Valley and North Ranch areas, ranking the severity of the problems and providing conceptual designs and cost estimates for correcting the most severe problems. Muller also looked at flooding hazards and water quality issues. The assessment identified four high-priority sites in the Massey Draw drainage area and one high-priority site in the Dutch Creek drainage area. One of the Massey Draw drainageway projects was completed in 2012 at the Equestrian Center, and the Community Center stream stabilization project is next.


This new project next to the Community Center has many components. To stabilize the stream channel, AGE will move the channel further north from the current location and install grouted boulder drop structures to prevent erosion at the new location. The contractor will then fill in eroded channels and grade slopes.

Also as part of the project, AGE will create an earthen bench along Ken Caryl Ave. for a future trail to connect Brannon Gearhart Park to Club Drive along the south side of Ken Carvl Ave. This trail connection is a recommendation of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Trails Master Plan. A new sidewalk will be added along the north side of Club Drive from the existing intersection with the concrete trail

to South Valley Road.

During construction, the concrete trail along the south and west side of the project will be detoured around the work site. There may be construction traffic and occasional lane closures around the site as well. Timely updates on the project will be in the Ken-Caryl Ranch e-News. Manager's Column_

On Sept. 22, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District completed its \$7.9 million bond sale to fund improvements to the facilities and infrastructure of the community. The sale of the bonds was very successful with the Metropolitan District issuing the bonds at a net interest rate of 2.37 percent, making the borrowing rate very low. Residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch purchased \$765,000 of the bonds, nearly 10 percent of the amount available.

The balance of the bonds was purchased by a mix of Colorado and national banks, institutional money managers as well as retail bond purchasers. The Metropolitan District bonds received an A-rating from Standard & Poor's, making them an excellent credit risk.

The bonds will be repaid over a 10-year period through a property tax mill levy, which will be assessed to homeowners beginning in January of 2015.

In other bond related news, the Metropolitan District Board of Directors at its September Board meeting approved the contract with Vanir Construction Management to serve as the Owner's Representative for the bond improvements for the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge. Vanir will be managing the upgrades to these facilities approved by voters in the May 2014 election.

The Boards of both the Metropolitan District and Master Association and staff have begun work with Vanir on the planned improvements to the community. One of the first activities that will be taking place is the hiring of an architect and general contractor for the projects. Requests for Proposal for these positions are in the process of being developed with a goal of bringing these individuals on board this fall. Read bond project updates on Page 3 of this issue and in upcoming issues of *Life at Ken-Caryl* and on the Ken-Caryl Ranch website.

In addition to the quickly escalating bond project activity, the Metropolitan District is in the process of preparing its 2015 budget. A draft 2015 budget will be available for review by the community by Oct. 15. A public hearing on the draft 2015 budget is scheduled for the Oct. 28 Board meeting. The 2015 budget will be adopted by the Metropolitan District Board of Directors on Tuesday, Dec. 9.

Covenant Clips ____ And The "Winner" Is...

(Neighbor Complaints No. 2 through No. 10 were highlighted in the issue dated Sept. 10, 2014. If you missed it, the back issues of Life at Ken-Caryl are archived on our website under "Community & News/Newspaper.")

1. Too Much/Too Little Covenant Enforcement: While this frequently involves neighbor-to-neighbor issues, this category reaches beyond to include covenant activity through my office. Human nature can foster frustrations. Neighbors don't do things right (my way), or neighbors expect me to do things their way (not right for me). I often hear "I have talked to all my neighbors, and they don't have a problem with my (fill in the blank)." They often do, but they are reluctant to tell the person next door.

Sometimes the gist of conversations is that I don't effectively enforce a category that is very important to that resident (parked campers congest the street parking) — which coincidentally is the one category I shouldn't enforce according to their next-door neighbor (camping is that family's primary activity).

Our governing documents are the basis for the covenants by which we all agreed to abide when purchasing a home on Ken-Caryl Ranch. The Home Improvement Rules, Guidelines and Information spelled out in the Rules and Regulations are continuously examined and updated by the Architectural

Committee. As always mentioned at the end of this column, rules are dynamic and changes are periodically made. If owners question a particular rule, the venue for review and possible update of the rule starts with the Architectural Committee.

My office is expected to enforce the covenants and rules, and to do it in a balanced, consistent and reasonable manner. Regular reviews are evenly scheduled, so specific properties are not "targeted." Sometimes the luck of timing triggers a violation letter for a rare occurrence — just as timing can also be the cause of missing a more chronic infraction.

There has been a lot of activity related to covenants this summer. I have had some very rewarding, some very insightful and some very challenging interactions with residents. I can't say enough how much communication helps me to stay on top of issues as well as to avoid misunderstandings that can happen with assumptions or misinformation. There have been some very avoidable situations that escalated because people sometimes rely on information gleaned from a gathering in the cul-de-sac or from social media. When in doubt, please call or email me. And if I make a mistake, it's REALLY important that you contact me!



Calling Rangers With Wildlife Concerns

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers would like to thank all residents on Ken-Caryl Ranch who have called to report wildlife sightings, wildlife concerns and injuries in open space. Without your help, the Rangers would not be as effective in a timely manner. Park



Rangers do keep a call log when reports come in, referencing sightings and/or concerns about animals in the open space. The log assists the Rangers in detecting a pattern to behavior or activity of the animals.

Many times animals are found injured or dead by the resident on private property, open space or on the streets. Listed below are a few highlights to assist residents:

 KEN-CARYL RANCH PARK RANGERS will only handle deer. As time allows, a report of an injured or sick deer will be reviewed, and any dead deer will be removed depending on the time of day and availability of the Ranger on duty. The Rangers can be reached at 303-979-1876, ext. 170.

JEFFERSON COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL
will remove any dead animals and advise
on injured animals other than a deer. Due
to infectious diseases and calls in the past,
Park Rangers will advise the resident to
contact Jefferson County Animal Control
at 303-271-5070, and they may assist with
any concerns and/or advise to call the
Jefferson County Health Department at
303-232-6301 or Colorado Parks and Wildlife at 303-291-7227.

Open Space ID Bracelets

KCRMD Completes Sale Of \$7.9 Million In Tax-Exempt Bonds

On Sept. 22, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District completed the sale of \$7.9 million in tax-exempt municipal bonds. By selling the bonds at this time, the KCRMD was able to take advantage of historically low interest rates to finance upgrades to the Ranch House, Community Center, Dakota Lodge, new entrance signage, and landscape and irrigation system improvements.

Residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch, who were offered the opportunity to purchase bonds in \$5,000 increments in advance of the public offering, purchased \$765,000 (nearly 10 percent) of the total \$7.9 million in bonds. The sale of the bonds was authorized by voters in May 2014 to fund improvements to the infrastructure of the community that is approaching 40 years of age. The bonds have a maturity of 10 years with an interest rate of 2.37 percent and are exempt from both Federal and Colorado state tax to residents of Colorado. George K. Baum & Company served as underwriter for the transaction.



Board Meeting Summary

MD Board Meeting

On Sept. 23, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

The Board took action to approve an agreement with Vanir Construction Management to provide Owner's Representative Services for the May 2014 voter-approved Ken-Caryl Ranch bond projects for facility improvements. Vanir has begun working with staff and the Board on the next steps of developing Requests for Proposal for architec-

tural and general contractor services for upgrades to the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge.

Alan Matlosz with George K. Baum & Company updated the Board on the completed sale of the District's bonds of \$7.9 million, which took place on Monday, Sept. 22. The bonds, which were rated A-, sold out in a matter of hours following the advanced purchase period in which Ken-Caryl Ranch residents purchased \$765,000 of the total bonds available. The District will pay an average interest rate of 2.37

- The Board reviewed the Second Quarter 2014 Investment Report.
- The Board received its monthly update on fundraising efforts for the Veterans Monument. The Veterans Monument Committee is reviewing an Xcel power line easement that exists under the site selected at the Ranch House. The committee will provide an update on status of the easement and power line when additional information is known.
- The District Manager presented an update to the Board on the 2014 aquatic program, reporting that all pools have closed for the season. Staff will prepare its annual report of aquatic activity for the past season for the October Board meeting.
- The Board President updated the Board on the status of discussions on the proposed opportunity trail east of the hogback north of Ken Caryl Ave. The Ken-Caryl Ranch

Sidewalk Closure Information

Portions of the sidewalk along the south side of Ken Caryl Ave. at the entrance to the Valley are scheduled to be replaced in October. The path and the adjacent lane of Ken Caryl Ave. may be closed periodically throughout construction. Timely updates on the project will be published in the Ken-Caryl Ranch *e-News*. Open Space Committee and staff have submitted a set of questions and comments to Jefferson County Open Space for clarification and additional information on the proposed trail.

- Staff reported the Community Center sidewalk improvements will likely be a late summer 2015 project. Staff will solicit bids for the work in the spring of 2015 to coordinate with drainage improvements and sidewalk work being performed by the Master Association in the same general area adjacent to the Community Center.
- The Board discussed the report and recommendations from the Prairie Dog Task Force report, which was received earlier in the month. Following spirited discussion with staff and the audience, the Board will continue its review of the report and schedule further discussion at the October Joint Study Session with the Master Association.
- The Board set the date of Oct. 8 for the annual Board/staff budget discussion. A draft 2015 budget will be available to the community on Oct. 15.





Election Day is fast approaching, and the Jefferson County League of Women Voters will be examining Colorado Ballot Issues as well as reviewing the new election rules at its early October meetings. The four statewide ballot measures include two constitutional amendments:

- · Amendment 67, which would add "unborn human being" to the definitions of "person" and "child" in the Colorado Criminal Code and Colorado wrongful death statutes:
- Amendment 68, which creates a new K-12 Education Fund to receive revenues from expanded limited gaming at horse racetracks.

There will also be two statutory changes to the laws on the ballot:

- Proposition 104, requiring school boards to negotiate collective bargaining agreements in public meetings;
- Proposition 105, requiring the labeling of genetically modified foods.

Colorado has simplified its voting access and modernized its elections while guarding the integrity of the ballot. Learn more about the new voter registration guidelines, the mail ballot provisions, what happened to the inactive voter status, as well as the impact of the two constitutional ballot measures.



dents, leaving both the parents and the child frustrated. Ken-Caryl Ranch resident David Cowan hopes to engage students and give them a better understanding of math through his tutoring company, www.Algebra2Calculus Tutor.com.

David started his business six years ago when he realized that teaching mathematics was one of the best things a person could do in life. "After graduating with a B.S. in Math and Geophysics from Colorado School of Mines, I have had careers as a geophysicist, money manager, and entrepreneur, and finally found my true calling, teaching mathema-

tics. Math is truly one of mankind's greatest accomplishments," said David.

David provides in-person and online math tutoring services for algebra, geometry, trigonometry, pre-calculus, AP calculus, and ACT/SAT/GRE/GMAT prep. The online sessions, which are lower in cost, allow for recorded sessions, easier scheduling, as well

> as the ability to do halfhour sessions.

"Obviously, you want to maximize your child's math skills, regardless of what they are. Few things in life are more important than critical thinking ability," said David. "In South Korea, the world's No. 1 math performer, 25 percent of students have private tutors. In 1990, the University of Maryland, in an attempt to raise their abysmal graduation rate, instilled a policy of mandatory tutoring for students falling behind, and raised their graduation rate from 60 to 80 percent over the next 10 years."

David said that one of the biggest differences between the way math is taught in the United States versus in Asian

countries is that while U.S. students will spend an hour answering 20 questions, students in Asian countries will spend that hour answering four questions from five different angles.

"I do think there is a general misconception that only 'failing kids' need tutoring," said David. "A tutor should be thought of in a similar light as a tennis or golf coach. You would be more likely to get one if your child had good tennis or golf skills. The better your child is at something, the greater necessity for a coach or tutor."

David believes the most important trait a good tutor can have is the ability to engage the student. "We learn things by hearing about them, reading about them, and/or doing them. By far, the most important factor in that equation is the doing. In a classroom setting, the teacher can really only engage one student at a time, leaving the other 25 as listeners and watchers.


Everyone is different and learns at a different pace. I can go at whatever pace fits the student best. In a classroom with 20-30 other students, the teacher wouldn't have the same advantage. They would have to go at a pace determined by the average of the class. This can be most unfortunate for some, because with math, if you get lost, you generally stay lost," said David.







'Leafing' Summer

Now that summer is officially over, we are starting to see the beautiful colors that fall brings. The Autumnal Equinox occurred on Sept. 22, meaning that there was approximately an equal amount of time during the day and night, but going into fall brings longer

nights and shorter days. These cooler nights but still warm days make the broad-leave, or deciduous, trees around us put on an amazing show!

You may have heard of the term "leaf peeper" or maybe you are even considered one! These are people who travel near or far to see the spectacular golds, reds and oranges along the hillside that the deciduous trees provide. Over the past couple of weeks the aspens in the high country have been pheno-



menal, and soon the Gambel oaks in our Foothills will be amazing all of us as well.

Have you ever wondered why these trees provide such a beautiful treat? The leaves on deciduous trees contain pigments called chlorophyll and carotenoids all summer long. Chlorophyll pigments are green and mask the carotenoids in the summer because they are busy using sunlight to make food for the tree, but in the fall the weather is too cool and the chlorophyll breaks down and disappears. This is when the carotenoids show their colors like yellow and orange.



JCPL is partnering with the Senior Resource Center, Bridges to Opportunity and Metro West Housing Solutions to create a mobile fleet of laptop computers and devices that can be transported to convenient locations through-

out the county to deliver onsite training in technology.

"More and more Jefferson County residents are coming to the library to access computers and the Internet, and to get help with basic tasks, including filling out tax forms, communicating via email, applying for jobs online, and securing essential services," said Debby Ridgell, patron education manager. "This grant will help us to address this growing demand, especially for people who can't get to the Library."

Funds will be used to:

- Purchase laptops, devices and accessories for JCPL Digital U;
- Develop curricula and handouts for nine new computer classes;
- Train 13 additional library staff and volunteers to deliver computer class instruction;
- Market the expanded service; and
- Establish classes at six library sites and seven community locations throughout the county, beginning in March 2015.

"Our goal is to help all Jeffco residents acquire the skills they need to function and thrive in today's online and digitized society," Ridgell continued. "This program will enable us to expand our outreach to seniors, residents from families with low income and/or education, and folks who are unemployed, unfamiliar with technology or otherwise lacking the technical skills to compete in today's job market."





Help Raise Awareness For Cervical Cancer At Kim Kopp Daisy Run Oct. 12



Political Signage Policy

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Political Signage Policy must be followed during the upcoming election. Neither attended nor unattended signage is allowed on property owned or maintained by the Master Association without the approval of the Master Association Board of Directors.

Political signs may not be attached to fences, utility boxes, light poles, traffic signals or trees. Since sidewalks are for pedestrians, permitted signs on private or public property should be placed on grass areas next to the sidewalk. Political signs on any owner's property are limited to one per office or ballot issue. Political signs posted in violation of these guidelines may be removed by the Master Association without further notice.
