Proposed 'Opportunity Trail' Between Hogback & C-470

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District have received a proposal from Jefferson County Open Space that includes the following:

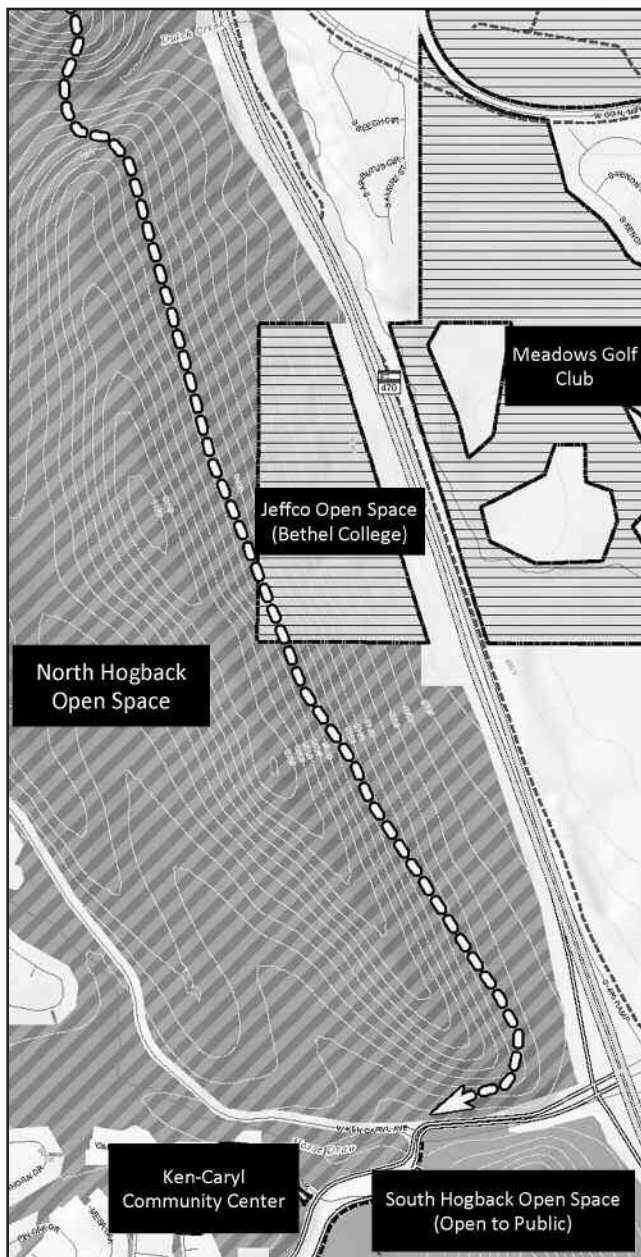
- The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association would grant Jeffco Open Space a public, multi-use trail easement on the east side of the hogback from the Dutch Creek drainage to Ken Caryl Ave., as conceptually depicted on the map to the right. Jeffco Open Space is interested in building a public, natural surface trail, which is referred to as the Opportunity Trail, from Bowles Ave. to Ken Caryl Ave. on the east side of the Hogback.
- Jeffco Open Space would renew leases to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District for Tract A and Bethel College properties.
- Jeffco Open Space would deed the Community Center property to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District.

Regarding the need for a trail easement, the land for part of the proposed trail between the Hogback and C-470 is owned by the Master Association. In order for Jeffco Open Space to build the part of the trail on the Master Association's privately-owned section from the Dutch Creek drainage to Ken Caryl Ave., the Master Association must grant them permission through a trail easement.

The Opportunity Trail would connect Jeffco Open Space parks located north of Ken-Caryl Ranch to those parks south of the area. Both the Master Association and Jeffco

Open Space would mutually agree upon the trail location. To clearly differentiate between the public trail and the Ken-Caryl Ranch private trails, there would be fencing, gates and signage, as well as enforcement patrols.

Christmas Tree Sale

The annual Christmas Tree Sale will be held at the Dakota Lodge on Saturday, Dec. 6 from 8-10 a.m. A limited number of trees cut from forest management areas will be available to the public, on a first come, first served basis. Rangers are requesting donations in exchange for the trees, and the donations will be used to offset expenses in the open space program.

Mainly Douglas Firs and some Ponderosa Pines will be cut two weeks before the sale, so they will be very fresh and fragrant for the sale. These trees are not bushy and manicured like those found on Christmas tree lots around town, but the fresh pine scent still invokes the holiday spirit.

For the annual tree sale, Rangers will harvest small diameter trees in the open space to improve wildlife habitat and overall forest health. The removal of the small trees reduces overcrowding and eliminates ladder fuels that can carry fire into a forest canopy. Trees that don't find a home are chipped and made into mulch. The Ranger staff hopes to see you on sale day!

Manager's Column

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association (MA) and Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District (MD) staffs and Boards work closely together to provide service to the members of the community. We are sometimes asked, "So who does what?"

First a little history: the MA was formed by the developer in 1974 to manage the affairs of the Association for the benefit of residents and businesses located on Ken-Caryl Ranch. In 1988 the concept of the MD was presented to the community, a vote was held and the MD was formed. Following the election, the two organizations created and adopted the Reorganization Agreement that spelled out the duties of each organization.

The MA is responsible for managing the Open Space that is owned by the MA, MD and leased from Jefferson County, the weekly curbside trash and recycling program, architectural and covenant protection services, operation of the Equestrian Center, production of Life at Ken-Caryl, administration of the website and funding of a reserve program to provide for repair and replacement of major assets.

The MD is responsible for maintenance of the irrigated green spaces, maintenance of buildings and facilities including the Ranch House, which is owned by the MA, and the Community Center, which is leased from Jefferson County. In addition, the MD administers the recreation programs including the youth services.

Obviously there are many details to this relationship, and we are fortunate to have two staffs that work very cooperatively on a day-to-day basis. This relationship ensures that we do not duplicate efforts and that decisions are made to benefit the members of the community.

Important Reminders From Waste Connections

- Auto Dial Service:** Waste Connections, the trash and recycling services provider for Ken-Caryl Ranch offers an auto dial service to notify customers of any changes in trash pickup days. If you are interested in being notified through this service, you can sign up online by visiting www.wcdenver.com. Once you are at www.wcdenver.com, please click on contact tab. Complete the required information, click on Residential Trash Service, then in the comment section at the bottom of the page explain that you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up for the Call Fire service.
- Delayed Trash Days:** Waste Connections observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, unless they fall on a weekend day. If your normal pickup day falls on a holiday or after a holiday, your collection schedule will run one day late that week.
- Recycling Notes:** Please remember to have your trash and recycling curbside by 7 a.m. on your collection day. Trash and recycling should be placed four feet apart from each other at the curb. Waste Connections will pick up individual bags or service totes/cans which homeowners have individually purchased. Recycling containers need to be clearly marked as recycling. Waste Connections has provided recycling stickers which can be placed on any purchased container. If you need a sticker please visit the Ranch House or Community Center. Single Stream Recycling means that glass, plastic, tin, and aluminum and paper products may all be placed in the same container.

Watch Out For Wildlife In Fall

Fall is the time when wildlife start preparing for winter and is breeding season for deer and elk. Increased activity in the fall can lead to conflicts with wildlife. By adhering to a few guidelines, Ken-Caryl residents can avoid potentially dangerous situations.



- BEARS** are preparing for hibernation, and they will need to consume up to 20,000 calories a day. Residents should remove all attractants like birdfeeders and remember to store trash indoors until the morning of pickup.
- DEER** are entering the breeding season and male deer will be searching for mates and can be very aggressive. Never approach male deer and give them plenty of room to escape if encountered.
- VEHICLE COLLISIONS** with deer increase in the fall as the days get shorter. Please slow down and be aware of major deer crossing areas like the intersection of Valley Parkway and Club Drive and the blind corners on Ken-Caryl Ave. as you enter or leave the Valley.
- NETS** — Soccer, volleyball or badminton nets are a hazard to deer and elk due to entanglement and can cause serious in-

jury. Please take them down on a daily basis when not in use.

- HOLIDAY LIGHTS** that are strung on trees and shrubs can get caught in deer antlers and may hinder movement or feeding. If possible, restrict holiday lights at your home.

Be Respectful On The Trails!

Rangers have received several calls lately from concerned residents regarding bikers not yielding correctly or announcing their intentions when approaching a trail user.

REMEMBER:

- Slow down and call your pass by loud voice or with a bell!
- Anticipate other trail users when entering blind turns and heavily vegetated areas!
- Free your ears of earbuds!

Jeffco Open Space would likely build this trail in three to five years.

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee has had the opportunity to review the proposed trail easement plan. The committee had several questions regarding the proposed trail, and Jeffco Open Space answered them in a Q&A document that is available for review at www.ken-carylranh.org, under the Open Space tab, then Trails & Map.

The lease renewal for the Tract A and Bethel College properties would be a lease term

of 50 years with a standard provision to terminate with a one-year notice. The Community Center is currently leased by the Metropolitan District from Jefferson County. With this proposal, the Community Center would be deeded to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District.

Hard Costs, Soft Costs ... What?

The majority of the \$7.9 million in bond funds that Ken-Caryl Ranch residents approved last May via ballot issue 5A will be used for the actual construction of tennis courts, playgrounds, gathering spaces, expanded pool decks, multipurpose rooms, parking areas, maintenance facilities and many other valuable improvements throughout the Ranch.

The direct construction-related labor and

materials costs for these projects are referred to as "hard costs." A second category of project costs will go to paying for Owner's Representative oversight, architects, sub consultants, surveys, materials testing fees, legal fees, moving and storage, and other expenses not considered direct construction costs. These are referred to as "soft costs." The accompanying graphic illustrates how much of

the \$7.9 million is estimated to be spent on both hard and soft costs.

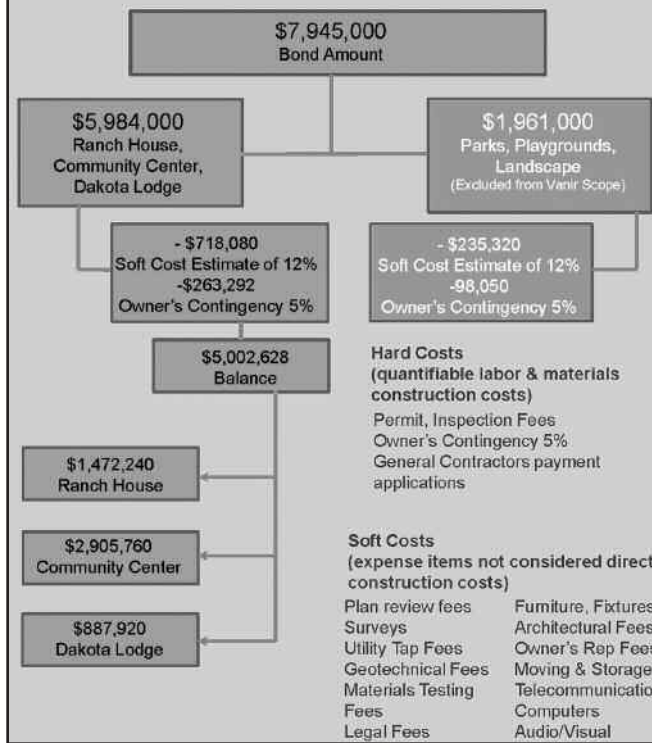
Vanir Construction Management has been hired by the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District to oversee the work at the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge. The work on parks, playgrounds, landscaping and signs will be managed by the KCRMD staff. Approximately \$5,984,000 has been allocated to the three projects for which Vanir is responsible. Of this amount, approximately 12 percent or \$718,080 will be used for soft costs and another 5 percent or \$263,292 will be reserved as an owner's contingency to cover unexpected direct construction issues. Deducting these two items from the \$5,984,000 yields a balance of \$5,002,628. This is the initial hard cost amount for direct construction at the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge.

A similar breakdown has been done for the \$1,961,000 allocated for parks, playgrounds and landscaping. The cost estimating for this part of the bond work is still in progress, but assuming similar percentages for soft costs

and owner's contingency, the hard cost balance available for parks, playgrounds and landscaping is \$1,627,630.

Bottom line: we estimate that it will take about 12 percent in soft costs in order to successfully plan, design and build successful projects throughout the Ken-Caryl Ranch community. We thought you should know. Please contact us at bondprojects@kcranch.org if you have any questions or comments.

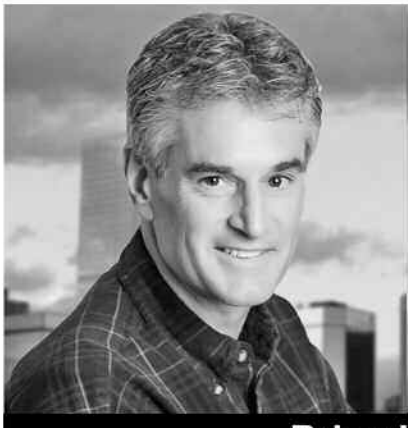

Thankful For Ken-Caryl Ranch

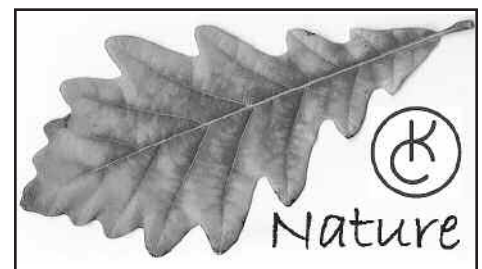


Thanksgiving will be here before you know it! In a lot of ways this time of year might remind you what you are thankful for in your life. Ken-Caryl Ranch provides us with beautiful scenery, excellent recreational opportunities, great schools, close grocery stores, and wonderful friends and families that make up our community. But have you ever wondered what early humans that inhabited this land cen-

turies before us may have been thankful for? The Colorado Archaeological Society has done many studies and digs on Ken-Caryl Ranch and have found various artifacts that give insight into how early dwellers may have lived. Woodland and Archaic Indian cultures are known to have occupied Ken-Caryl Ranch between 10,000 BC and 800 AD. Artifacts such as pottery, projectile points and hide scrapers indicate that these cultures were hunters and gatherers and did not use farming. With the knowledge of these artifacts it might be safe to guess that these people may have been thankful for the land they lived on. The land provided clay soils to make pottery, various rock types to use as weapons or tools, and also the plants and animals that nourished their bodies. Bison were probably one of the main animals that provided many benefits such as meat, clothing and shelter for these early people. 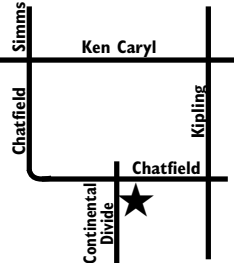

Letter

Dear Editor:

I'm responding to the letter from Pat Mesec of the Jeffco League of Women Voters chapter in the Oct. 22 issue, which alleges various misdeeds by the current Jeffco Board of Education. The particulars of that letter don't interest me that much, since they simply represent a sideshow in the battle between the teachers' union that no longer has control of the Board and the three

recently elected Board members who are not union fans. I applaud Ms. Mesec's championing of "open meetings" and "Colorado's Sunshine Law" but do find the Jeffco LWV's silence on Proposition 104 (School Board Open Meetings) more than a tad inconsistent.

The LWV claims to be "nonpartisan" but the most cursory examination of their local and national websites shows that they are obviously a partisan advocacy group of the political left aligned with the interests of the Democratic Party. I suggest that any missives of this organization should be judged with

their political biases in mind.

At the national LWV site you will find that the group actively opposes voter ID laws. But opinion polls have consistently shown that the vast majority of American voters approve such laws. For instance, a Pew poll of registered voters taken in September of 2012 found that 95 percent of Republicans, 83 percent of Independents and 61 percent of Democrats favored voter ID. A separate Pew poll taken at the same time showed 71 percent approval of voter ID by Latino voters. In an opinion piece on voter fraud in the Oct. 28, 2014, *Wall Street Journal* it was mentioned

that the LWV has joined with the leftist advocacy group Common Cause to challenge citizenship voting requirements in court. That is, the LWV is advocating that non-citizens should be allowed to vote in U.S./Colorado elections. Let me opine that both of these major LWV positions are very far left of the American public.

Finally, let me add a suggestion for *Life at Ken-Caryl*: consider declining to publish letters of a political nature unless such letters apply to Ken Caryl-specific issues.
