Open Space Staff Urges Visitors To Stay On New Trail

Volunteers and staff recently completed construction of a new 2.25 mile loop trail in Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space. Now that the new trail in Upper Massey Draw is open (see related article on Page 2 and map on Page 4), staff will be closing the construction access trail located along the north side of the valley bottom between Massey Draw Trail and the western reaches of the new trail. The access trail was used during the summer as a convenient "commuter" route for volunteers and staff working on the trail project. The access trail heavily impacts sensitive habitat in the area and was never intended to be a permanent trail. The Open Space staff asks that you help protect this habitat by staying on the new trail in Upper Massey Draw.

Thanksgiving Trash Service Delay





Metropolitan District Establishes Special Arrangement For Use Of Ridge Recreation Center

The Boards of Directors of both the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District (KCRMD) and the Foothills Park & Recreation District (Foothills) have reached a special arrangement for residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch (KCR) to use the Foothills Ridge Recreation Center at Footbills resident rates

The Ridge Recreation Center, which is located at 6613 South Ward St. just north of the boundary of KCR, is owned and operated by Foothills, a local park and recreation provider. Residents of KCR have always been able to use Foothills facilities as they are all open to the public. However, in the past residents of KCR have been assessed non-resident fees for Foothills facilities as it is a separate park and recreation district. Residents of KCR do not pay property taxes to help support the facilities owned and managed by

In November KCRMD and Foothills entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) to permit KCR residents to use the


drop-in amenities of the Ridge Recreation Center at the same daily rates as Foothills residents from Jan. 1, 2014, through Dec. 31, 2014. This agreement was reached on a oneyear trial period, which will be evaluated to assure that each organization is benefiting from the arrangement. Several months ago, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association (KCRMA) Board of Directors agreed to expand this column in *Life at Ken-Caryl* to include reflections from individual Board members on various topics of interest to Ranch residents. In October you heard from Board member Chris Figge who offered his sentiments on the great people who volunteer their time for Ken-Caryl Ranch. This issue I'd like to extend an invitation to join us as we continue the process of re-invigorating the buildings and infrastructure of Ken-Caryl Ranch — much of which is more than 30 years old.

As most of you know, in the fall of 2012, we conducted a comprehensive survey of all Ken-Caryl Ranch residents on future desires,

My fellow Board members and I agree that our decision-making will be vastly improved with your involvement. Some Roofing Products No Longer On Allowed List

Roof replacements continue daily on Ken-Caryl Ranch. Seems like a choir of hammers and nail guns along with dumpsters in driveways, trucks blocking cul-de-sacs and shingles being thrown to the ground. To this date, my office has processed more than 900 architectural submittals since the hail storm on Aug. 22. Some of these are for paint and decks that were damaged, but the vast majority of submittals are for roof replacements. I imagine that there will be tons more through the winter and into spring.

The submittal process is really simple, and I do my best to make it quick and painless. Please remember to check the list of approvable products when working with insurance

companies and contractors. It is especially important to know that there were two products (the Elk Prestique and the Tamko Heritage) that were once on the approved list more than a decade ago and have been removed due to manufacture of superior products. If you have an Elk Prestique or Tamko Heritage roof and you are getting a new roof, you must change to one of the 14 approvable products on the list.

Please keep in mind that rules and regulations are dynamic in nature...new issues surface, new regulations are added, inappropriate ones are deleted and others simply are amended or updated. Ken-Caryl Ranch documents are available at the Ranch House and on our website at www.ken-carylranch.org so try to make certain you, too, are upto-date. Open Space Committee Needs Help Naming New Trail

Volunteers and staff recently completed construction of a new 2.25 mile loop trail in the Foothills Open Space region of Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space (see map on Page 4). The trail is located in the upper reaches of Massey Draw and has been known during the design and construction phases of the project as Upper Massey Draw Trail.

Now that the project is completed, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee would like the community's participation in finding a permanent name for the new trail. The name should take a cue from the world of plants and animals like Ovenbird Trail or Hazelnut Trail. It could also come from geo-

graphical features like Meadow Trail or Valley Trail, or it can be based on an experience such as Grand View Trail. You may also use proper nouns as long as they refer to historical figures (like Shaffer Trail), place names (Beacon Hill Trail) or events (Fourth of July Trail). Please, do not include names of businesses or companies or names intended to be a memorial to departed loved ones.

Please send in your nominations by Dec. 4. Dog Licensing by Sheriff Ted Mink

Residents in unincorporated Jefferson County have been required to license their dogs since 1994. In 2007, Lakewood, Golden, Wheat Ridge, Westminster and Arvada joined the county's licensing program and residents in

those cities have been required to license their dogs ever since.

The original purpose of the county licensing program was to expedite returning pets to owners, to encourage the spaying and neutering of dogs by offering a reduced license fee, to establish a fund to pay for medical treatment of injured stray animals, and to provide a source of revenue to move the animal control operation toward self-suf-

In 2007, although the primary purpose remained the same (returning pets to owners), the focus changed to raising money to build a much needed new animal shelter to replace the old and non-functional Table Mountain Animal Center. Consequently, residents now have the new Foothills Animal Shelter that offers excellent services for county pets and county residents.

Now that the shelter has been built, the focus is changing once again and animal license fees will be used to support operations at the Foothills Animal Shelter. Due to this change, the board of directors decided that Foothills staff should administer the licensing program instead of the sheriff's office. This change took place in July of 2013.

The license fee has always been a source of revenue to support providing services (animal control and sheltering) to the citizens of the county and is necessary for con-





Chatfield Ave. Project Update

The Chatfield Ave. improvement project is moving along, and it is anticipated to be completed in mid-December, with the exception of landscaping. Landscaping will be completed in spring 2014. Contractors will be working seven days a week until completion of the project.

The Ken-Caryl Business Center access west of Shaffer Parkway will be temporarily closed as full roadway reconstruction is completed in this area on Chatfield Ave. Business Center traffic will be detoured to Shaffer Parkway.

The speed limit is 25 mph through the construction zone, so for your safety and the safety of the workers, please drive slowly and cautiously through the construction zone. Jefferson County Sheriff deputies are conducting speed enforcement in the Chatfield Ave. construction areas.

Caryl Ranch Master Association.

The Ridge Recreation Center offers users an indoor lap and separate leisure activity pool, a therapy pool, a gymnasium and track, a cardio weight room, racquetball courts and a rock-climbing wall. As part of the agreement, KCR residents will receive a special ID card issued by Foothills, which will identify the user as a resident of KCR. While ID cards issued by Foothills normally cost \$5 per card charged to the user, ID cards issued during the month of December are free to the user. We encourage you to go to the Ridge in the month of December to get your free ID card.

The current agreement is exclusive to the Ridge Recreation Center only. The agreement does not include the special discounted fee toward use of the Edge Ice Arena, the Peak Community and Wellness Center or any other Foothills amenities. The special rate is only for the drop-in use of these amenities and does not apply to classes or youth programs.

The KCRMD Board of Directors began working on this agreement with the Foothills Board earlier this year following results of the 2012 KCR resident survey, which showed a strong interest in the ability to use an indoor, year-round swimming pool.



Holidays At The Bradford House

Maj. Robert Boyles Bradford moved to what is now Ken-Caryl Valley in 1859. The original part of the stone house found in the North Ranch was completed between 1859 and 1860. The Bradfords most likely celebrated their first winter holidays in their new

home the winter of 1860. I wonder if Maj. Bradford hunted Massey Draw for a wild turkey to grace their Thanksgiving table. Thanksgiving was not a national holiday until Oct. 3, 1863, but many pioneer families celebrated with a feast and church services.

The celebration of Christmas with decorations and gifts started in the United States between the 1820s and 1830s. According to legend, the idea of a decorated Christmas tree was introduced by German soldiers who had been hired to fight for the British during the American Revolution.

The tree did not become part of the American holiday tradition until about 1830. Not all pioneer families had a Christmas tree, but holiday decorating was still part of getting ready for the holidays. They would decorate with pine boughs, wreaths and handmade ornaments that they hung in the windows. They made ornaments out of salt dough, and a yarn decoration called ojo de Dios (O-ho day Dee-ohs).

The ojo de Dios is a good-luck decoration that was made by Hispanic settlers in the hills around Santa Fe in present-day New Mexico. These colorful decorations are still made by the descendants of those early settlers and also by people in Mexico. The ojo de Dios, which means "eye of God" in Spanish, was traditionally made for an October festival

In 1822, a man named Clement C. Moore wrote the poem that begins "'Twas the night before Christmas." The poem helped make Christmas a much more popular holiday. By 1843, Christmas was beginning to look like the festive holiday we know today — a time for family gatherings, a traditional dinner, decorations and, of course, gifts.

If the Bradfords had a tree, they might have strung popcorn, cranberries, and nuts and hung homemade or store-bought ornaments. If they had lights on their tree, they would have been candles. The lighting of the candles was a special moment, with everyone gathered around the tree. But the candles remained lit for only a few minutes. During that time, several people stood by with buckets of water, just in case.

Perhaps Mrs. Bradford had a photograph portrait made for Mr. Bradford to hang over the fireplace. In the early 1800s, only people who were fairly wealthy could afford to have their portraits painted. Silhouettes were a popular substitute for true portraits. A silhouette is a portrait cut from dark material and mounted on a light background. Viewers could easily identify the person, and the cost was very low.

In the late 1830s, a French artist named Louis Daguerre developed a technique for taking the first true photographs, called daguerreotypes. The technology of photography developed rapidly after that, and by the 1860s, photograph portraits were widely popular.



Things My Parents Said

Researchers in Omaha, Neb. have confirmed that the advice my parents gave me when I first went out on my own was true: don't go grocery shopping on an empty stomach. The study showed that people who shop for groceries while hungry tend to choose items with more calories and also buy more junk food. A spokesman for the study recommended eating a snack right before shopping.

I was curious whether other things my parents told me were equally true, so I went to the study's website. As I had hoped, there were a number of helpful reports. Unfortunately, the links to those studies no longer work, so you will have to be satisfied with the summaries I have put together. The statements by my parents are in bold.

Turn off the lights! Do you think I own stock in the electric company? It turns out that 70 percent of parents who say this actually DO own stock in the electric company, usually through their 401(k) plans.

If everyone else were jumping off of a bridge, would you jump too? Mothers brought in children who were doing something because "everyone else was doing it."

The kids were taken to a bridge and were told that their friends had all jumped off of it. 30 percent of the children jumped off of the bridge. The ones who survived all said they would never do it again.

Make sure you put on clean underwear before you leave the house. You never know when you might be in an accident and end up in the hospital. The kids in the prior study were used for this one as well. They were all given this advice by their mothers before being brought to the bridge. 80 percent of them chose to wear clean underwear. Researchers talked to the kids who survived the fall and found that the ones wearing clean underwear were treated better at the hospital. However, no correlation was found between wearing clean underwear and surviving jumping off of a bridge.

How many times do I have to tell you? According to the study, seven times. Why? Because I said so! Researchers examined nearly 5,000 cases where a mother gave this response to a child and concluded that the mother was justified 100 percent of the time. Oddly enough, the study provided no data or reasoning to support the claim. I called my own mother to ask her why, and she said "Because I said so!"

Someday you'll thank me for this. This study was the most requested one by parents in the Omaha area. Researchers followed nearly 25,000 children for 30 years. So far, none of them has thanked their parents for that.

Beds are not made for jumping on. It was determined that it was too dangerous to test this hypothesis on humans. So the Study Center asked a Norwegian animal trainer

named Peta to bring in some subjects. Soon there were three little monkeys jumping on the bed. One fell off and broke his head. I did a Google search on "Beds made for jumping on" and couldn't find any. This seems like a great opportunity for some entrepreneur out there.

Do you think your socks are going to pick themselves up? This study tried to answer two questions. First, how many children actually THOUGHT that the socks were going to pick themselves up? The answer was 21 percent. Second, how often did the socks ACTUALLY pick themselves up? Disappointingly, that only happened 1 percent of the time.

There were some other studies, but I don't remember them and as I said before, the links are no longer working. But if you have any other questions, let me know and I'll ask my friend Ted who lives down the street. He knows a lot of stuff.


