Frequently Asked Questions From Resident Survey

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Resident Survey was completed in the fall of 2012. Residents submitted a significant amount of comments/ questions, and we will be answering some of the frequently asked questions in the paper and on the website over the next couple months. In this issue, we will begin by informing people what their dues and taxes cover. What do my Master Association dues pay for?

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association began operation in 1976. Our purpose is to maintain the high standards established by the community's developers through covenant protection and architectural standards. We are also responsible for the *Life at Ken-Caryl* newspaper and the Equestrian Center. Our trash/recycling program and ownership and management of more than 4,000 acres of native Open Space place Ken-Caryl Ranch at the forefront as an environmentally-conscious community. The Master Association is governed by a five-member Board of Directors. Residents are invited to attend the monthly study sessions and business meetings.

It may be hard to believe, but warmer weather and the summer is just around the corner. For the past two months, the Metropolitan District staff has been working on the 2013 edition of District Dimensions, the annual publication that lists all of the essential information on recreational offerings of the District for the summer and fall of 2013. This year's edition once again includes course schedules and pertinent information on swimming, tennis, youth programming, environmental education and all of the other programs offered by the District.

The 2013 District Dimensions will be distributed to all homes on Ken-Caryl Ranch in the March 13 issue of Life at Ken-Caryl as well as be available on the Ken-Caryl Ranch website at www.ken-carylranch

.org. Be sure to check out this year's edition of District Dimensions as it contains something for everyone!

Spring is usually a time of the year the District works on special projects that it may not have time to do during the busy summer months. This year, the District's Parks Department is in the process of wrapping up a baseball field improvement project at the Community Park. This year's project involved replacement of the backstop and dugout fencing on both baseball fields at the park as well as constructing covers over the dugouts.

In addition, the District has installed new ball field mix on the west field and will paint and refurbish the existing picnic pavilion and restroom enclosure at the park. Part of the restroom enclosure work includes installation of a portable restroom to accommodate the requirements of the Americans With Disabilities Act. The improvements to the baseball fields were made possible through leveraging funding available in the District's 2013 budget with contributions from Ken-Caryl Little League and South Jeffco Sports

Finally, a capital project that is just beginning is the irrigation replacement project on the final phase of the Valley Parkway. The District Board of Directors selected a contractor at its Feb. 26 meeting and authorized staff to move forward on the project. This will be the fourth annual irrigation replacement project, all of which have been co-funded by the Master Association with assistance from the Ken-Caryl Ranch Water and Sanitation District. Each project has replaced irrigation systems that are more than 30 years old. The new irrigation systems include computerized master controllers, which are monitored from the Parks Maintenance Shop to reduce water waste and improve irrigation efficiency. Completion of this year's project is scheduled for the end of June.

- Delayed Trash Days: Waste Connections observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, unless they fall on a weekend day. If your normal pick-up day falls on a holiday or within the same week as a holiday, your collection schedule will run one day late.
- Recycling Notes: Please remember to have your trash and recycling curbside by 7 a.m. on your collection day. Trash and recycling should be placed four feet apart from each other at the curb. Waste Connections will pick up individual bags or service toters/cans which homeowners have individually purchased. Recycling containers need to be clearly marked as recycling. Waste Connections has provided recycling stickers which can be placed on any purchased container. If you need a sticker please visit the Ranch House or Community Center. Single Stream Recycling means that glass, plastic, tin, and aluminum and paper products may all be placed in the same container.

Architectural Review Process

I'd like to take this time to educate any homeowner out there who is not familiar with the architectural review process. Perhaps you are new residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch, and, if so, I welcome you! I do realize that life gets complicated, especially when dealing with all that is involved around the closing of a home.

There surely is an abundance of paperwork, not the least of which is the Master Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions that we, here on Ken-Caryl Ranch, are bound to honor when we "sign on the dotted line" to own our properties and homes. Article III, Section 3.07 of the above named document requires prior approval of the Architectural Committee before any exterior improvement or alteration may be done to a residential lot or residence. This winter many homes are getting "new hats" with the installation of new roofs.

The architectural review process is really quite simple, and I am here to make it even easier if that is possible. Various forms, depending on the nature of the improvement, are available to be completed and returned to the Ranch House. Although the forms say to allow two weeks for the architectural process, almost always, if given the appropriate information, it will take less than two weeks. The Architectural Consultant and I are both here to assist in many ways. If you, or any of your friends and neighbors living on Ken-Caryl Ranch, have any questions regarding a submittal or the process, call 303-979-1876 or just stop by the Ranch House.

Please keep in mind that rules and regulations are dynamic in nature...new issues surface, new regulations are added, inappropriate ones are deleted and others simply are amended or updated. Ken-Caryl Ranch documents are available at the Ranch House and on our website at www.ken-carylranch.org so try to make certain you, too, are up-to-date. Bobcat Sightings On The Rise

The Rangers have been receiving a rash of calls reporting bobcat sightings in Heirloom and surrounding neighborhoods. Bobcats primarily go near your home because they are attracted to a food source and/or shelter opportunities that present themselves



nearby. This is normal activity due to the fact that bobcats favor foothills, canyons, mesas and plateaus, where brush and woodland areas provide suitable habitat. This is also the time that bobcats are looking for a den to breed their young, which happens in late winter and spring.

How do you identify a bobcat? Bobcats, sometimes called wildcats, are roughly twice as big as the average housecat. They have long legs, large paws and tufted ears similar to those of their larger relative, the Canada lynx, which have recently been released in Colorado. Most bobcats are brown or brownish red with a white underbelly and short, black-tipped tail. The bobcat is named for its tail, which appears to be cut or bobbed.

What do you do if you come in contact with a bobcat? I know seeing a bobcat is a truly amazing moment. The best thing to do is to enjoy them from a safe distance as to not put yourself or the bobcat in danger. However, if you feel threatened, the next step would be to haze them. Hazing, not harassing, is defined as an activity that humanely makes bobcats and other wildlife more afraid, instilling their natural fear for humans. You can do

things such as use noisemakers, bang pots and pans, yell, wave arms and run toward them to try and deter them from returning to the area. We stress that you do not harass bobcats or any wildlife. The winter months are stressful on wildlife especially as the snow accumulates and wildlife find it difficult to get around. Harassing would include feeding, trapping, domesticating or shooting.

What do you do if a bobcat is frequenting your backyard? To keep bobcats away from your home, try to eliminate all food and water sources they may have access to. Similar to feral cats, if bobcats are continuously fed, they will continue to come around your home. You should also consider blocking off shelter-like areas, like bushes, thickets, hollows, rooftops, attics and the space underneath decks, where bobcats may set up a residence.

Preventative measures you can take to avoid conflicts with bobcats are:

- Make sure there are no food attractants near your home or in the area, i.e. bird feeders, pet food, trash, etc.
- Feed your pets inside or remove uneaten pet food between feedings.
- Keep your pets in a secured enclosure.
- Close or patch openings in fences.
- Keep shrubbery, grass, weeds, etc. trimmed to deny bobcats cover.
- Work with your neighbors and local wildlife officers to achieve a consistent solution to the situation.

As our cities and infrastructure of the Front Range and throughout the state of Colorado grow, new and expanding subdivisions and developments have a major impact on wildlife and wildlife habitat. Wildlife is usually displaced by development whereas other species such as coyotes, bears, mountain lions and bobcats, are able to adapt and live in nearby open spaces, parks, drainage ways, creeks or rivers.

In most cases, people and wildlife can coexist without conflict. The most important key is to respect wildlife. Most dangerous conflicts and encounters happen because people choose not to respect and leave wildlife alone. If you are having a wildlife conflict that poses or could possibly pose immediate danger for the animal or humans in the area, please call your local Colorado Parks and Wildlife office enforcement agency at 303-297-1192.

Open Space ID Bracelets

Many trails on Ken-Caryl Ranch are private, and only residents and their accompanied guests are allowed to use these trails. To be easily identified as a resident, you can wear an Open Space ID Bracelet. To obtain your own blue ID bracelet, go to the Ranch House Recreation Office or the Community Center. You will need to complete a registration form and provide proof of residency. There is no cost.



Life at Ken-Caryl Board Meeting Summary

MA Board Meeting

The following is a summary of items from the Feb. 19 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board:

Reserve status reports were presented and a horse bedding vendor added to the approved vendor list.

The Board authorized staff to begin a trial phase of street sign replacements.

The Board discussed possible scenarios to address fences.

The opportunity to sell the cell tower lease at the Ranch House was discussed. The Board decided to retain the lease under its current terms.

An opportunity to reduce *Life at Ken-Carvl* distribution costs was presented. The Board determined that the delay in delivery did not justify the cost savings.

The Board reviewed three options for repairing the parking lot at Brannon Gearhart Park. Staff was directed to secure additional estimates to remove and replace damaged asphalt, overlay and re-stripe the lot to include a layout for the basketball court.

The Board reviewed their Conduct of Meetings Policy. The Board will review this document further and present an edited version for Board approval at the March Business

A draft succession plan for the Executive Director was reviewed, and the Board provided direction to staff and a second draft will be presented in March.

Manager's Report: A written report was included in the Board package. Board members inquired about some items for clarifica-

Committees: Board member committee liaisons reported on the activities that their committees have been engaged in for the past month.

Motion: A motion approving the application for the 2013 Pi Mile Run on April 28 was

Motion: A motion authorizing an expenditure of \$25,200 to purchase rough mowing equipment was approved.

Motion: A motion authorizing an expenditure of \$4,595 to purchase and install a pool access lift for the Ranch House pool was ap-

Motion: A motion authorizing staff to enter into a contract with Split Rail Fence Company to replace the rail fence along the south side of Greenbelt E at a cost of \$23,746 was approved. Reserve fund identifies \$35,000 for this purpose in 2013.

Motion: A motion authorizing an expenditure of \$4,448.22 to repair the Equestrian Center tractor from reserves was approved.

Motion: A motion authorizing expenditure of \$11,400 to replace the pool heater at the Bradford Pool was approved. The Reserve Plan identifies \$15,000 for this purpose.

Motion: A motion authorizing the Board President to enter into a Letter of Understanding with the Metropolitan District for phase three of the Valley Parkway irrigation system replacement project was approved.



be carefully examined. The question of longterm value, the actual cost of home ownership as a single person, tax consequences and the feasibility of qualifying for a loan or refinance must all be carefully assessed.

Several years ago Joan began offering free workshops called "Divorce and Your Home." The attendees shared their need for financial assistance and how very alone they felt navigating the divorce experience. To fill this void, Joan launched a nonprofit organization



called Wildflower Women's Foundation. The mission is to provide financial, legal and educational advoca-

Cat Burglar On The Prowl In South Jeffco

In early February, a burglary crime pattern emerged in south Jefferson County. In each case the victims were home. They were either asleep or unaware of the activity inside their own house.

What is a cat burglar? Cats are stealthy and quiet, approaching prey without causing alarm, pouncing



without warning. Cat burglars are thieves who slip in unnoticed, taking what they want before the victim knows what's happened. The suspect's method (true to the cat burglar definition) is to access the home through sliding glass doors left ajar or open garage doors. Once inside, suspects stealthily steal wallets, purses, jewelry and small electronic devices. The crime doesn't require the cat burglar to actually break something in order to make entry.

What You Can Do:

- Keep your garage door closed, even when you are home.
- · Lock your vehicles, even when parked in your driveway.

- Do not leave valuables in plain sight.
- Mark your valuables and sports equipment distinctively so it can be identified if recov-
- Take a photo inventory of your garage and home so that the photos can help deputies identify and return recovered items.
- Consider taking your garage door opener inside with you when you return home, rather than leaving it in the car.
- Make a list of serial numbers of your items, e.g. TVs, laptops.
- Install a Charlie bar in your sliding glass doors and/or windows.







owned by the HOA, and the dues cover maintenance and snow removal. They also cover entry gates, security camera systems and maintenance, common element insurance, common element irrigation water and maintenance, common element lawn and tree care service, and management/accounting/

Mountain Gate I: The monthly dues for Mountain Gate I are \$195 for a two bedroom and \$182 for a one bedroom. The HOA dues cover water, sewer, grounds maintenance, building maintenance, building and common area insurance, and snow removal.

Mountain Gate II: The dues for Mountain Gate II are \$180 per month. They cover landscape, snow removal, exterior repairs, roofs, common area insurance and management

Mountain Gate III: Mountain Gate III dues are \$165 per month plus \$10 for a garage and \$5 for a carport. They cover landscape,

snow removal, exterior repairs, roofs, common area insurance, management fees and a pool.

North Ranch: North Ranch residents pay \$90 in January and July for a total of \$180 per year. The dues are used for flag lot drive snow removal, maintenance of flag lot drives, street identification signs and maintenance, community improvement projects, community events, management of the association, and covenant enforcement.

Settlement: The Settlement pays \$259 per month, and the dues cover all exterior maintenance, snow removal, insurance and common area maintenance.

Sunset Ridge: The dues for Sunset Ridge are \$200 per month, which covers water, sewer, grounds maintenance, building maintenance, snow removal, and building and common area insurance.

MOUNTAIN ROOI

(KCRMD) was formed in 1988 by a vote of the residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch. KCRMD provides park and recreation services for the residents of Ken-Carvl Ranch through a combination of real estate property taxes and recreation user fees.

KCRMD is a special district formed under the laws of the State of Colorado and as such operates under state statutes. Services provided to the community by KCRMD include operation and management of all recreational programming on Ken-Caryl Ranch as well as maintenance of all irrigated parks and greenbelts. KCRMD is governed by a fivemember Board of Directors who are elected to four-year terms in May of even numbered years. Residents are invited to attend public KCRMD monthly study sessions and business meetings.

Following is a brief summary and highlights from the KCRMD 2013 adopted budg-

General (Operating Fund): The Operating Fund accounts for the day-to-day annual operating activities of the KCRMD. The 2013 property tax mill levy of 15.239 mills certified by the Board will generate approximately \$2.4 million of revenue to help support maintenance and recreation activities for the coming year on Ken-Caryl Ranch. This amount is nearly \$225,000 less than the 2012 budget due to the continued overall drop in property values throughout the state during the past year. There was no property tax increase levied by KCRMD for 2013. The approximately \$3,400,000 Operating Fund budget for 2013 includes close to \$600,000 in recreation fees and other revenue generated by users during the year.

Youth Services Fund: The Youth Services Fund accounts for various activities for the youth of the community including beforeand after-school care, youth camps, the preschool program and teen programs. The

Youth Services Fund is supported entirely by user fees with no property taxes used to subsidize the program.

Tennis Fund: The Tennis Fund accounts for all tennis program activity on Ken-Caryl Ranch. The Tennis Fund, which is in its fifth year of operations as a separate fund, is also supported entirely by user fees with no property taxes used to subsidize the program.

Conservation Trust and Grant Fund: The Conservation Trust and Grant Fund accounts for money received through grants and projects associated with those grants. In 2012, this fund accounted for the initial phases of the development of the Community Center Campus Master Plan. The 2013 budgeted expenditures in this fund include completion of the Community Center Campus Master Plan, new pool furniture and shade umbrellas at the Ranch House pool, new lap lanes at the Ranch House pool and \$25,000 in improvements for the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Conservation Trust and Grant Fund also accounts for annual money received by the KCRMD from the Colorado State Lottery, which is designated for park and recreation improvements in the community.

Capital Reserve Fund: The Capital Reserve Fund accounts for money reserved for the replacement of capital assets owned and leased by KCRMD. In 2012, \$52,000 was added to this fund. The 2013 budgeted expenditures for this fund include new backstops and covered dugouts at the youth baseball fields at the Community Park, a new pool heater and swimming pool replastering at the Community Center, and purchase of a parks maintenance vehicle out of a current operating lease. The estimated fund balance in the Capital Reserve Fund at the end of 2013 is budgeted to be nearly \$370,000.

Community Garden Fund: The Community Garden Fund was created by the KCRMD in 2011 to account for money for construction and ongoing maintenance of the new Community Garden located at the Community Center. The Community Garden just entered its third season of operations and has been very successful. In 2012 this fund accounted for the daily operating and maintenance costs for the Community Garden.




