KCRMD Board Considers Options For Bond Financing

Following the successful May 6 KCRMD bond election, the KCRMD Board of Directors has begun discussing its options for financing improvements for the community. On May 6, voters of the KCRMD authorized the Board of Directors to issue up to \$7.9 million in municipal debt over a 10-year period to fund upgrades to the Ranch House, Community Center, Dakota Lodge, the Bradford pool, signage and landscaping.

At its May 27 monthly meeting, the Board discussed different options for financing these improvements through the issuance of municipal bonds. Should the Board de-

cide to go this financing route, it is likely bonds would be available for purchase by residents in increments of \$5,000. Residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch would receive priority in the purchasing of the bonds before the sale would be open to the general public. At this time it appears likely the earnings on the bonds would be exempt from both federal and state income taxes. By purchasing these bonds, residents would have the opportunity to invest in the future of their community.

Volunteers are needed to work in Project Groups to develop input in the planning stages for improvements to the various facilities, playgrounds, landscaping and more. The Project Groups will work with the Community Planning Committee, which will obtain community input, refine the findings, prioritize and report to the Boards. All recommendations will be publicly communicated. The Metro District will review the bond project recommendations and community feedback and direct the work of the architect(s). The Community Planning Committee, a joint committee of the Master Association and Metro District, may soon be expanded and has potential openings. **Applications are** due Monday, June 23. The day was a huge success with a great volunteer and staff effort to install all of the equipment. The official opening of the playground will take place once the new poured-in-place rubberized playground surface is completed by one of our contractors. In addition, Jefferson County Open Space contributed grant money of \$42,000 toward the new playground equipment. The new playground is scheduled to open on Monday, June 23. Home, Home On The Ran...ch

I enjoy frequent conversations with homeowners who express love for their homes and for this community. I remember how thrilled we were 30 years ago this month to move into our first house on Ken-Caryl Ranch. For years I spent many hours each week commuting to a job across town, but would look forward to returning each evening to this special place I called home.

In the course of my duties, I interact with quite a few "new" owners as they move to their second or even third home on Ken-Caryl Ranch. Others are purchasing their first home here, and I am pleased at their level of commitment to covenant protection. We frequently receive architectural submittals from purchasers who have yet to close on the property.

However, the resident survey conducted in 2012 revealed 20 percent of the respon-

dents were not satisfied with the level of covenant enforcement and the general appearances of homes. As a result, increased attention is being focused in those areas toward achieving and maintaining a quality appearance in our neighborhoods. If a notice of noncompliance is received, I would ask owners to go outside and take a close, objective look at the issue in question. Many of the violations being cited can be cured at little cost, and often without a huge time commitment.

In conjunction with addressing covenant violations, our residents need to devote adequate effort and resources to preserve and enhance the appearance of our maturing neighborhoods. Such pride of ownership will ensure Ken-Caryl Ranch remains a unique haven of true Colorado living!



Living With Bears On Ken-Caryl Ranch

Bear sightings at Ken-Caryl Ranch are common, both in the open space and in the neighborhoods. Encountering bears should be expected any time of the year, but they are definitely more conspicuous in the spring, latesummer and fall. Being large animals, they eat



a lot. They eat just about anything, which is why the potential for a bear to visit your property is pretty good if you are inadvertently attracting them with food sources.

In order to avoid conflicts with bears (and other wildlife for that matter) remove the things that attract them to your property. In the case of bears, this is mostly food items, e.g. dog food on the porch, trash left out on the curb overnight, birdfeeders, etc.

The following information, provided by the Colorado Parks and Wildlife, provides good information on how to keep bears off your property and what to do if you come in contact with a bear. Remember: Every situation is different with respect to the bear, the

- terrain, the people and their activity. **Enjoy the woods!** Hiking at dawn or dusk may increase your chances of meeting a bear. Use extra caution in places where hearing or visibility is limited: in brushy areas, near streams, where trails round a bend or on windy days. Avoid berry patches in fall. Reduce your chances of surprising a bear by making noise — talk or sing.
- Kids and dogs. Make sure children are close to you or at least within your sight at all times. Leave your dog at home or have it on a leash.
- Stay calm. If you see a bear and it hasn't seen you, calmly leave the area. As you move away, talk aloud to let the bear discover your presence.
- Stop. Back away slowly while facing the bear. Avoid direct eye contact as bears may perceive this as a threat. Give the bear plenty of room to escape. Wild bears rarely attack people unless they feel threatened or provoked.
- **Escape.** If on a trail, step off the trail on the downhill side and slowly leave the area. Don't run or make any sudden movements. Running is likely to prompt the bear to give chase, and you can't outrun a bear. Do not attempt climbing trees to escape black bears. This may stimulate the bear to follow and pull you out by the foot. Stand your ground.
- **Speak softly.** This may reassure the bear that no harm is meant to it. Try not to show
- Be cautious with cubs. In contrast to grizzly bears, female black bears do not

- normally defend their cubs aggressively, but send them up trees. However, use extra caution if you encounter a female black bear with cubs. Move away from the cub and be on the lookout for other cubs.
- Bears have great senses. Bears use all their senses to try to identify what you are. Remember: Their eyesight is good and their sense of smell is acute. If a bear stands upright or moves closer, it may be trying to detect smells in the air. This isn't a sign of aggression. Once it identifies you, it may leave the area or try to intimidate you by charging to within a few feet before it withdraws.
- Fight back if a black bear attacks you. Black bears have been driven away when people have fought back with rocks, sticks, binoculars and even their bare hands. Black bears vary in size and weight, with males generally being larger than females. Adult males average 275 pounds, while the adult female may average 175 pounds. Depending on the season, food supply and gender, they may weigh anywhere from 125 to 450 pounds. Black bears measure about three feet high when on all four feet or about five feet tall standing upright.
- What to do if you live in bear country. If you choose to live or have a summer home in bear country, make sure you don't contribute to resident bears becoming "garbage" bears. Most conflicts between bears and people are linked to careless handling of food or garbage. Don't let your carelessness cause the unnecessary death of a bear. Learn to live responsibly with wildlife!

Black bears eat almost anything. They will eat human food, garbage, hummingbird food, and pet and livestock food when available. Once a bear has found the easily accessible, consistent food source that human settlements can offer, it may overcome its wariness of people and visit regularly, increasing the chance of a human/ bear encounter. You and your neighbors can make a difference. Your actions may prevent the unnecessary death of a bear!

- Keep garbage away. Make your property safe by keeping garbage out of reach and smell of bears. Use bear-proof trash containers. Be sure garbage cans are emptied regularly. Periodically clean garbage cans to reduce residual odor — using hot water and chlorine bleach, or by burning trash residue in cans. Store trash in a bearproof enclosure. Contact Colorado Parks and Wildlife for designs.
- Don't leave out pet food. If you have pets, do not store their food or feed them outside. Clean your BBO grill of grease and store inside. Hang bird seed, suet and hummingbird feeders on a wire between trees instead of on your deck or porch. Bring all birdfeeders in at night. Do not put fruit, melon rinds and other tasty items in mulch or compost piles.





Goodwill Donations Help Veterans Monument







Ken-Caryl Valley Water

"Whiskey is for drinkin' and water is for fightin'," so the old western saying goes, putting priorities into perspective. In our semi-arid environment, securing



the rights to water was essential. The early homesteaders and settlers located their claims along the draws and creeks, such as Robert Bradford's home right next to Dutch Creek. Other early homesteaders such as Joel Mann, John Williamson and Wiley Phillips selected their land along Deer Creek at least partly based on the availability of water. Having the creek was one thing, but the settlers also needed to construct ditches and reservoirs to capture the winter's runoff for their crops and cattle.

Hand-dug stock ponds and ditches pockmarked the landscape. At the bottom of the natural drainages coming off of the mountains, the remnants of several of these ponds are still visible. Mann Reservoir in South Valley Park dates from perhaps a century ago when Frank Mann, son of Joel Mann, built his ranch and Falcon House. Just west of Mann Reservoir you can see the remains of a ditch


and small dam

Pump houses were built in or next to the draws to shelter the pumps that drew water from the creeks to fill tanks for the ranchers and their cattle. One such pump house remains on the north fork of Massey Draw along the trail between the Dakota Lodge and Bradford Intermediate School. The Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society is presently working on restoring this building.

One lost feature is the Tinker Shaffer Reservoir, a pond that was about twice the size in surface area as the Mann Reservoir, but was likely quite shallow. Ditches from both the north and south forks of Massey Draw, and the gullies to the west brought in water. In the April 9 edition of *Life at Ken-Caryl*, there was a story about "Curious Kids" from the Bolling and Harkness families and a wooden structure on upper Massey Draw. This was a diversion structure that could channel runoff either down the natural drainage or via a ditch dug to the Tinker Shaffer Reservoir.

The Tinker Shaffer Reservoir was located between Deerwood Drive and Blue Sage west of the Bradford Intermediate School. The reservoir was drained long ago and is now open space with a trail running through it. The map shows where the Tinker Shaffer Reservoir was in relation to the Manor House (noted as Ken-Caryl Ranch) and the Massey Draw diversion structure. This map is extracted from the 1945 USGS Indian Hills quadrangle topographic map.


So keep your eyes peeled as you walk through Ken-Caryl or any of the old ranches in the area. There are more ditches, dams, tanks and stock ponds around us waiting to be found.

Roots, Shoots And Fruits

Plants are made up of many different parts such as, roots, shoots/ stems, leaves, flowers, seeds and fruits. Which plant parts are your favorites to eat? Well, if lettuce is your favorite, you like leaves, or if asparagus is your favorite, you like stems. Some people may like multi-

ple parts of a plant where the root and the stem can be eaten, such as an onion. Most all plants are made of these basic parts, but sometimes only a certain part of a plant is edible, while other parts can be poisonous to us. For example, the tomato plant has leaves that are poisonous, but the fruit is a delicious ingredient in salsa, pizza sauce or a salad.

Native Americans and pioneers that lived in the foothills also would eat different plant parts. Because these people depended on the land for their survival, they had to know what plants and specifically what parts were edible to be able to live. It is said that the beautiful Mariposa Lily that grows here in Ken-Caryl has a sweet bulb. This would be like us eating a potato or beet. Natives would also eat young shoots of horsetail also known as scoring rush. This would be considered a springtime feast if growing season was good. The fruit from a prickly pear cactus would also be enjoyed by the people here before us.

Off-Leash Interference With A Service Dog

In order to reduce the number of occurrences, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) has established a campaign to help educate the community regarding interference with service dogs.

JCSO is taking an active role in investigating interference to service dogs, particularly with off-leash encounters involving other dogs. The law, for persons with disabilities, is crucial because of the potential impact to a disabled person whose dog is incapacitated or killed by another. This criminal matter requires investigation not only by animal control, but law enforcement as well. Service dogs are protected by the Americans with Disabilities Act and Colorado state law. The objective is to ensure that service dogs are not interfered with, harmed or killed.

Chargeable Offense

Aside from the class II petty offense for a dog at-large or off-leash, did you know that it is a crime to negligently permit a dog to intimidate, distract or interfere with a service dog? Interfering with a service dog can be a misdemeanor when the act of interference keeps the animal from continuing their work. Both physical and emotional trauma to a service dog can have a devastating consequence on both the dog and its owner.

"Service animals are especially vulnerable to injury during an attack because they've been bred and trained to be non-aggressive," said Jefferson County Animal Control Manager Carla Zinanti. Allowing a pet to injure or interfere could result in a class 3 misdemeanor charge (C.R.S. 18-13-107), along with potential jail time. Additional consequences to the violator include restitution, costs associated with retraining or replacing a service dog, veterinary bills, lost income, attorney's fees and court costs.

types of disabilities. Service dogs are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack or performing other duties. Service dogs are primarily working animals, and not pets.

Under the Americans with Disabilities Act, service animals must be harnessed, leashed or tethered, unless these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents using these devices. In that case, the individual must maintain control of the animal through voice, signal or other effective controls.

Pedestrian Safety: Understanding Crosswalks

The Ken-Caryl Ranch community is full of walkers and runners, and we think it's important to remind everyone of some safety issues regarding pedestrians. Pedestrians have the right-of-way at crosswalks and intersections whether the crosswalks are marked or not.

According to www.coloradodot.info, nationally each year about 5,000 pedestrians die and 70,000 are injured in traffic accidents. Young children and the elderly are more likely to be killed or injured in a pedestrian crash than any other group. While they won't protect pedestrians from oncoming traffic, crosswalks do serve to guide pedestrians across

Legal crosswalk locations can be either marked or unmarked. Colorado statutes at section 42-1-102 (21) C.R.S., define a crosswalk as: "... that portion of a roadway ordinarily included within the prolongation or connection of the lateral lines of sidewalks at intersections or any portion of a roadway distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other marking on the surface."

Accordingly, legal crosswalks exist at all public street intersections whether marked or unmarked. However, the only way a crosswalk can exist at a mid-block location is if it

is marked. A marked crosswalk is any crosswalk that is delineated by white painted markings placed on the pavement. Crosswalks consisting of pavement materials or colored concrete are "unmarked" crosswalks unless white paint is also present.

Always follow these steps when crossing

- Before crossing, stop at the curb, edge of the road or corner before proceeding.
- Look left-right-left and over your shoulder for turning vehicles. If it's clear, begin cross-
- Continue to check for traffic while crossing. For more information on pedestrian safety, visit www.coloradodot.info.





Repair Warning Submitted by Peter Weir, District Attorney First Judicial District Attorney Pete Weir is advising homeowners to use caution as they

begin making decisions about home repair projects following spring storms. Weir recommends that consumers collect the information they need to help make decisions before entering into a home repair contract.

"Taking the time you need to do your homework so that you can make an informed decision, before you sign a repair contract, is the best way to protect yourself from becoming the victim of fraud," said Weir. "Keep in mind that if the offer looks too good to be true, it probably is."

In the wake of weather disasters, unsuspecting consumers are easy targets for lessthan reputable contractors or professional scammers. "Storm Chasers" or "Travelers" go door-to-door offering home improvement services. After paying for their services, consumers may be stuck with subpar work, partial performance or waiting for repairs that skipped town. These groups often offer lower

The District Attorney's Office offers the following tips for anyone considering a home

- Be wary of any contractors selling repairs door-to-door.
- · Learn as much as you can about the contractor before you agree to do business with them.
- · Obtain the company name, physical address, land and cell phone numbers, and company contacts.
- Ask about the contractor's experience in performing jobs of a similar scope. Determine how many similar jobs the contractor has recently performed.
- Find out whether the contractor will perform the work or will subcontract the job. Obtain information for all subcontractors.
- Obtain several WRITTEN estimates. Insist on comprehensive estimates that include the exact work to be performed, the materials to be provided, the approximate start and completion dates, permit details (such as what permits are required and who will obtain the permits), warranty details, payment details, and cancellation/rescission and refund policies.

- Obtain any insurance and bonding information on the contractor.
- Contact the contractor's insurance agent to determine if their policies are current and what protection the policies will provide vou.
- Request references. Obtain the names, addresses and telephone numbers of the references.
- Contact the references to determine if they were satisfied with the work and if they believed the price was fair.
- Ask if the general contractor or a subcontractor performed the work. Were the subcontractors paid? Determine if start and completion dates were met.
- Ask if any problems occurred along the
- · Ask if any unexpected costs were presented (determine the amount and/or percentage of unexpected costs to the total percentage of the job)
- · Ask if all appropriate permits and inspections were obtained.
- Ask if the homeowner was satisfied with the employees or subcontractors. Did they clean up during the job and when the job was complete? Ask if they would use the contractor again and if they would feel comfortable providing a reference for the
- Contact your local building department to determine what permits are required. Ask the building department if they have dealt with the contractor in the past and if they are aware of any problems.
- Check out the company with the Better Business Bureau. The BBB can be reached at http://denver.bbb.org/ or 303-758-2100.
- Contact the Colorado Secretary of State to obtain corporate information for the con-

ny has been in business and determine if the company is registered with the Secretary of State. business@sos.state.co.us or 303-894-2200, press 2.

- Require all representations to be in writing and have both parties acknowledge the specifics. This information should include any add-ons or change orders, cancellation rights if the contract is based upon an insurance claim or financing, or statements that will document the scope or quality of work.
- Insist on a written contract. The contract should be accepted by both the contractor and the homeowner. Rescission periods are typically three days but do not pertain to emergency repairs.
- Read all contracts thoroughly, including the fine print and the back of the contracts. Know what you are signing. When in doubt, obtain legal advice.
- Don't pay in cash or prepay for services. Pay as you go and provide a small deposit only. Make certain the contract spells out the payment terms. Withhold the final payment until the work is completed and all inspections have passed.
- Beware of offers that look "too good to be true" when a contractor tells you that they have materials left over from another job or they had a job cancel, and they will pass the savings on to you. Also beware when a contractor says payments will be made to you for every referral or all insurance deductibles will be waived.
- Don't be rushed into a contract. Be cautious of contractors that warn you that time is of the essence or that this is a "limited time" only discount.


