Now that the Bond question has been answered, what comes next? The Boards along with the Community Planning Committee are discussing next steps and beginning to identify specifics. As outlined in the Bond information, we have divided the tasks into four "buckets" 1. The Ranch House Campus; 2. The Community Center Campus; 3. The Dakota Lodge Campus; and 4. Parks, landscape, signs, playgrounds, pool furniture, etc.

Groups are being formed to dig into the details and present ideas for each of these areas. In addition, a job description/request for proposals is being developed to identify an Owners' Representative to work with the boards, volunteers and staffs to ensure efficient quality projects are completed on time and within budget.

The first project to be presented to the community is the facelift to Heirloom Park. Preliminary/concept plans were presented on June 24 and comments were received from members in attendance. The next set of plans will be presented at 7 p.m. at the Ranch House on July 23. Following that meeting, final plans will be completed and construction documents drawn up for the solicitation of bids. We hope to be able to start construction this fall.

I know I remind you about this opportunity almost every time I write but with the passage of the Bond question this is a pretty exciting and important time at Ken-Caryl Ranch. A great way to stay informed is by signing up to receive our email newsletter, the Ken-Caryl Ranch e-News. When you do you will receive regular updates from us about a variety of topics. Open Space ID Bracelets

Many trails on Ken-Caryl Ranch are private, and only residents and their accompanied guests are allowed to use these trails. To be easily identified as a resident, you can wear an Open Space ID Bracelet. To obtain your own blue ID bracelet, go to the Ranch House Recreation Office or the Community Center. You will need to complete a registration form and provide proof of residency. There is no cost.

Important Reminders From Waste Connections

- **Auto Dial Service:** Waste Connections, the trash and recycling services provider for Ken-Caryl Ranch offers an auto dial service to notify customers of any changes in trash pickup days. If you are interested in being notified through this service, you can sign up online by visiting www.wcdenver.com. Once you are at www.wcdenver.com, please click on contact tab. Complete the required information, click on Residential Trash Service, then in the comment section at the bottom of the page explain that you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up for the Call Fire service.
- **Delayed Trash Days:** Waste Connections observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, unless they fall on a weekend day. If your normal pick-up day falls on a holiday or after a holiday, your collection schedule will run one day late that week.
- **Recycling Notes:** Please remember to have your trash and recycling curbside by 7 a.m. on your collection day. Trash and recycling should be placed four feet apart from each other at the curb. Waste Connections will pick up individual bags or service totes/cans which homeowners have individually purchased. Recycling containers need to be clearly marked as recycling. Waste Connections has provided recycling stickers which can be placed on any purchased container. If you need a sticker please visit the Ranch House or Community Center. Single Stream Recycling means that glass, plastic, tin, and aluminum and paper products may all be placed in the same container.

Update On 2014 Trail Construction Projects

In December 2013, the Master Association Board approved the 2014 Annual Trails Plan, which lays out the yearly, staff/community objectives for trail construction and maintenance projects. To view the actual report, please visit the community website at www.ken-carylranh.org.

The following is a project status summary of the trail construction projects. Projects currently in the preliminary design phase include East Cougar Trail and the Cougar Connector Trail in the southwest corner of the Valley Open Space. These trails are designed for multi-use and will be built using backcountry construction techniques. The trails will also expand open space recreational opportunities south of Massey Draw including a new trail loop of easy to moderate difficulty and a new open space access/trail-head to neighborhoods in the south part of the Valley.

Staff, working with a contract biologist, will determine impacts of the proposed trail to biological elements in the area. The biological report should be available by the end of 2014. The report findings along with other potential impacts to open space resources may precipitate changes to the trail alignment. Construction start date TBD. Final design approval by the MA Board is needed before construction can begin.

Two projects that were scheduled for construction at the beginning of the season, Columbine and Lyons Trails, have now been put on hold while the design team evaluates options to restore functionality to the existing tread and reviews the cost of tread restoration to closing the old trail if rerout-

ed. Columbine Trail is in the South Hogback Open Space and branches off Cathy Johnson Trail providing a connection to South Valley Park.

Lyons Trail is in the North Hogback Open Space and is a popular trail for equestrians. Both projects were originally designed as reroutes to replace severely eroded sections of existing tracks. Many design challenges had to be overcome on these projects in order to mitigate impacts to erodible soils and plant and wildlife habitat. These trails are also designed for multi-use and will be built using backcountry construction techniques. Construction should begin later in the season.

The Bradford Rocks Trail, just north of the Bradford Pool and Tennis Courts, and the Rose Clover Trail, which connects the Carriage Hill neighborhood to Manor House Trail, were existing social trails that have been reworked to improve maintenance sustainability and user safety. The bulk of the work on these projects is complete with labor provided, in large part, by volunteers. These trails are also multi-use, backcountry type trails.

Construction on the Lower Question Mark Peak Loop Trail (LQMPL) began on June 14. This project will create a loop along the south side of the High Meadow Trail and north of the ridge that contains Question Mark Peak. New tread construction started at the east end of High Meadow Trail and will continue in a clockwise direction. As soon as details of the final design for Columbine and Lyons Trail are worked out, volunteer and staff construction crews will move off this project and focus on completing these higher priority projects. Before demobilizing, crews should be able to complete the very eastern section LQMPL, which provides spectacular views of the entirety of Ken-Caryl Ranch!

Sheriff's Office Clarifies The Use And Possession Of Fireworks

With the Fourth of July rapidly approaching, the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office would like to clarify Colorado law as it applies to the use and possession of fireworks in unincorporated areas of Jefferson County, which includes all of Ken-Caryl east and west of C-470.

A good rule of thumb: any device that explodes or leaves the ground is most likely illegal in Colorado. Illegal fireworks include but are not limited to firecrackers, cherry bombs, bottle rockets, M-80s and Roman candles. It is illegal to sell, use or possess non-permissible fireworks in unincorporated Jefferson County. Additionally, all fireworks are prohibited in Jefferson County Open Space Parks, Denver Mountain Parks and Forest Service lands.

Colorado law defines permissible fireworks as any device that does not explode or leave the ground. Examples of permissible fireworks are cylindrical or cone fountains, sparklers, toy smoke devices, snakes and glow worms. Keep in mind that while permissible fireworks may seem harmless,

they continue to account for many fireworks-related injuries each year.

To report illegal fireworks, residents may call the Jefferson County fireworks hotline at 303-271-8200.

Jefferson County deputies will strictly enforce illegal fireworks violations in the unincorporated areas of the county this coming holiday. Any person who violates the laws pertaining to the sale, possession and use of fireworks commits a class three misdemeanor and may face a fine of up to \$750. Board Meeting Summaries

MA Board Meeting

The following is a summary of items from the June 17 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board:

- The Board conducted a hearing on an open space rules violation.
- A resident addressed the Board expressing concerns about noise generated by events at the Manor House. Staff was asked to look into options for measuring noise levels and report back to the Board.
- The Committee Appointment and Operating Procedure was reviewed. Staff will make minor edits as directed and bring back for approval in July.
- Board discussed the investment in the community plan including the processes to implement the successful Bond Issue Ballot question. Representatives from the Community Planning Committee updated on their activities.
- Preliminary discussion regarding the 2015

budget was held. This will be a topic of discussion at every meeting for the next few months.

- Staff reported on the schedule to develop final plans and construction documents for the Heirloom Park redesign.
- Staff reported on the results of the first month of increased proactive covenant enforcement.
- 2014 project and goals status reports were reviewed.
- The Board reviewed the draft First Amendment to the Reorganization Plan and will submit to legal counsel for review.
- The Board ruled on a request from the homeowners at 36 Mountain Laurel.
- Staff reported on the challenges of creating a resident directory under the new state laws, and the Board directed staff not to produce a directory this year.
- **Manager's Report:** A written report was included in the Board package.

- **Committees:** Board member committee liaisons reported on the activities that their committees have been engaged in for the past month.
- **Motion:** A motion authorizing the use of power tools by volunteers over 18 years old following completion of safety training and execution of Release, Waiver, Agreement Not to Sue, and Indemnification and Hold Harmless Agreement was approved.
- **Motion:** A motion authorizing staff to contract with Dove Creek to perform the 2014 Tin Cup — Beacon Hill Forestry Project was approved. Cost \$23,961. Budget \$25,000.
- **Motion:** A motion adopting the Community Planning Committee job description was approved.

MD Board Meeting

On June 24, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a regular meeting of the

Board of Directors and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

- The Board conducted a public hearing on the proposed redevelopment of Heirloom Park. A number of residents attended and provided input on the planned designs and process. A second public meeting will be held on July 23 at 7 p.m. at the Ranch House to present revised plans for the park and playground based on the input received and soliciting additional resident input on the proposed changes.
- The Board received a report from the District's auditor on the draft 2013 District audit. Following discussion, the Board accepted the 2013 audit and approved a 2013 Supplemental Budget.
- The Board approved the revised job description for the Community Planning Committee.
- The Board received its monthly update on

Reminder About Special Arrangement For Use Of Ridge Rec Center



In November 2013, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District (KCRMD) and Foothills entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement to permit Ken-Caryl residents to use the drop-in amenities of the Ridge Recreation Center at the same daily rates as Foothills residents from Jan. 2 through Dec. 31, 2014. This agreement was reached on a one-year trial period, which will be evaluated to assure that each organization is benefiting from the arrangement. The fee differential will be absorbed by the KCRMD and the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association.

The Ridge Recreation Center, which is located at 6613 South Ward St. just north of the boundary of KCR, is owned and operated by

Foothills, a local park and recreation provider. Residents of KCR have always been able to use Foothills facilities as they are all open to the public. However, in the past residents of KCR have been assessed non-resident fees for Foothills facilities as it is a separate park and recreation district. Residents of KCR do not pay property taxes to help support the facilities owned and managed by Foothills.

The Ridge Recreation Center offers users an indoor lap and separate leisure activity pool, a therapy pool, a gymnasium and track, a cardio weight room, racquetball courts and a rock-climbing wall. As part of the agreement, KCR residents will receive a special ID card issued by Foothills, which will identify the user as a resident of KCR. ID cards cost \$5 per card charged to the user and are issued by Foothills at the Ridge Recreation Center.

The current agreement is exclusive to the Ridge Recreation Center only. The agreement does not include the special discounted fee toward use of the Edge Ice Arena, the Peak Community and Wellness Center or any other Foothills amenities. The special rate is only for the drop-in use of these amenities and does not apply to classes or youth programs.

The KCRMD Board of Directors began working on this agreement with the Foothills Board early in 2013 following results of the 2012 KCR resident survey, which showed a strong interest in the ability to use an indoor, year-round swimming pool. Help Support The Veterans Monument

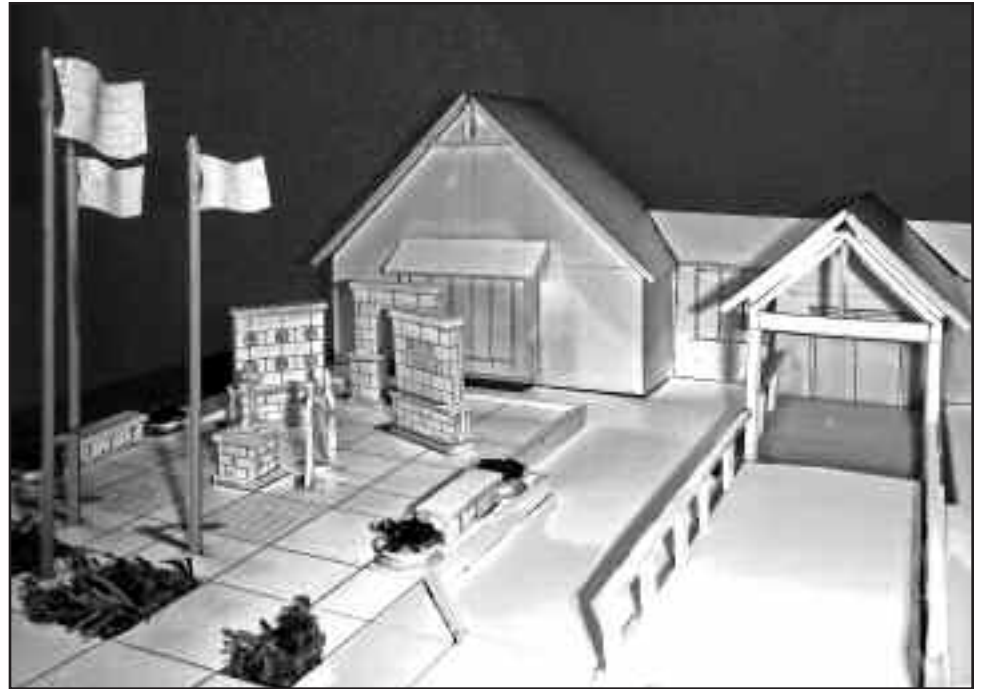

Prospecting, Mining And Quarrying

While the unique geology of the Dakota Hogback does not contain veins of precious minerals, industrial minerals abound. Limestone and clay were plentiful and readily accessible in the near vertical beds of rock. Gravel could be found in the creek beds. Extensive coal beds underlay the plains. The Hogback also was a minor source of uranium. In the 1950s, two small mines near Highway 285 in Turkey Creek Canyon extracted uranium.

Limestone was quarried to feed the lime kilns that produced quicklime for mortar and bricks. One such kiln can still be found along the North Hogback Trail. It is impossible to date this kiln, but lime kilns were present in Jefferson County as early as 1860. It is possible that this kiln was used to make lime to build the Bradford-Perley House, outbuildings, silos and other improvements necessary for the operation of a ranch.

In the 1960s, a gravel pit was located along Massey Draw on the present-day Deer Creek Golf Course property. After the Black Angus herd was removed from the Valley in 1980, Cooley Gravel filed for rezoning a parcel of agricultural land in the far southwest corner of Ken-Caryl Ranch. The company purchased the land in June 1978 with the intent of opening a rock quarry in Deer Creek Canyon. Residents put up stiff resistance to the plan, as they had bought homes in Ken-Caryl to get away from such heavy industry and feared the traffic coming from the quarry and through the Valley. Although the County Com-

missioners denied the rezoning permit for several years, the quarry eventually opened. The gravel pits are now closed.

Coal and clay mining were more prevalent outside of Ken-Caryl Ranch. Coal Mine Ave. west of Kipling Parkway crosses an abandoned coal mine. Coal and clay were abundant in the Golden area. If you look east from C-470 near Morrison, you can see the remains of a major clay and limestone quarry on Alameda Ave.

Just to the west of Ken-Caryl Valley, mica and feldspar were found, hence the name of South Mica Mine Gulch Road off of Murphy Gulch Road. Nearby were two prospecting holes, one 75 feet deep, at the top of Docmann Gulch, which were backfilled by the State of Colorado's Department of Natural Resources, Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety. As to just what the prospectors hoped to find remains a mystery.

Keep your eyes open when hiking along the Hogback. Here and there you may find a pit and rubble, the remains of small quarries mined for building materials over a century ago.

Consumer Alert: Beware Of Suspicious Callers Claiming To Be With The IRS

First Judicial District Attorney Pete Weir is warning consumers to beware of a scam involving telephone calls from someone claiming to be with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The caller tells the consumer that there is a problem with their tax account and that they need to call immediately. Consumers should not make that call. A returned call could result in a financial loss that cannot be recouped.

The DA's office has received numerous calls from Jefferson and Gilpin County residents who have received telephone calls and voicemails from individuals saying they are with the IRS and that there is problem with the consumer's tax account. The calls are generally robo-calls, which sound very realistic. However, some consumers have received these calls or voicemail messages from live persons with heavy accents. The caller may use generic, American-sounding names, such as "Special Agent Mike Jones," as they set the stage for this scam.

The caller represents himself or herself as an investigator or special agent from the Crime Investigative Unit of the IRS. The call recipient is told that there is an urgent matter involving tax fraud that requires they (the consumer) call a specific number immediately.

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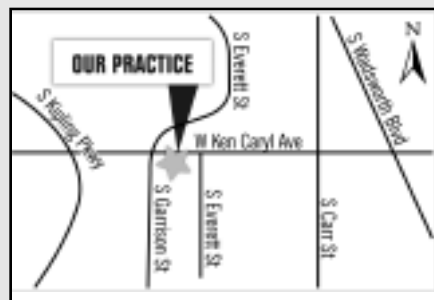
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First Music A La Mode Concert Of The Season

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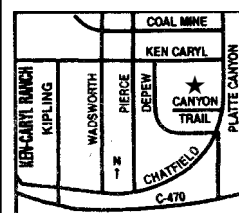

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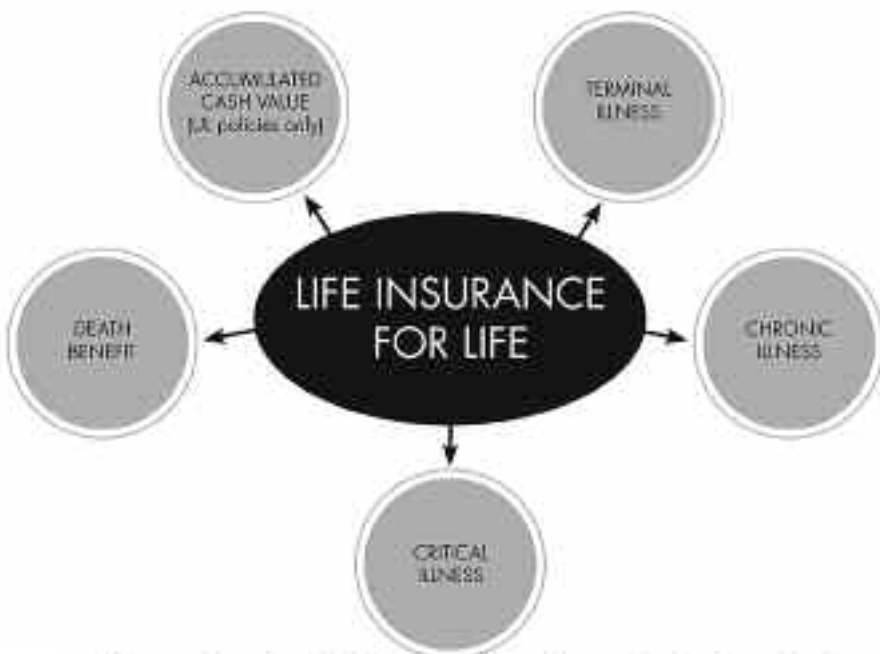

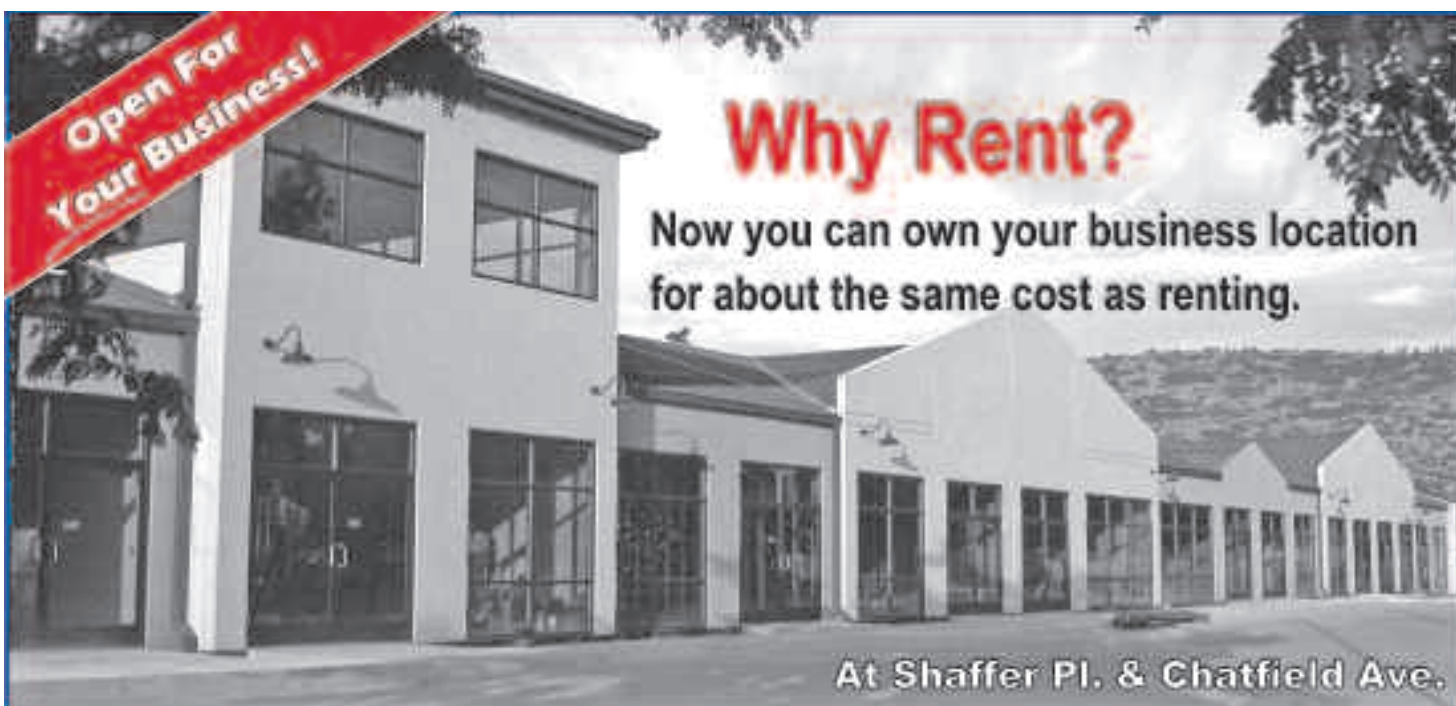

ately. The number consumers are told to call may appear to have a Washington, D.C. area code. Sophisticated scammers can use technology to alter the information that appears on caller ID (called spoofing), which can mislead consumers by making it appear that the call is originating from the IRS or the Washington, D.C. area.

Should a taxpayer place the call, they will be asked for payment. Most often the scammer will request that the taxpayer wire money or obtain a prepaid debit card and call them back. If money is wired or a card is purchased, and the information is provided to the scammer, the money is gone and often there is nothing that law enforcement can do.

The IRS will never attempt to notify taxpayers of a problem or issue regarding their tax account by telephone calls or email. Should consumers receive one of these calls, we recommend they get more information before they act. They may do one or more of the following:

- Contact the District Attorney's Office at 303-271-6931 with concerns.
- Call the IRS directly. Call 303-446-1675 or 800-829-1040 to verify that taxes are current and up-to-date or call 800-366-4484 to alert the IRS of this scam if your taxes have been paid.
- Forward any suspicious emails to phishing@irs.gov. Don't open any attachments or click on any links in those emails.
- File a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission at ftc.gov/complaint.

As a rule of thumb, follow the basic seven principles of Leave-No-Trace to have an enjoyable recreational experience in a safe and responsible manner!

- Travel and camp on durable surfaces
- Dispose of waste properly
- Leave what you find
- Minimize campfire impacts
- Respect wildlife
- Be considerate of other visitors

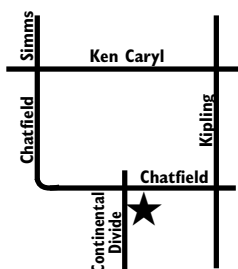

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Letters To The Editor

Dear Editor:

I was surprised (and alarmed) to receive a "town hall" phone call on April 25 from the Jefferson County Commissioners to discuss the possibility of retail marijuana sales in unincorporated Jefferson County. As an educator, I was embarrassed at my own lack of information on an issue that can have such negative and far-reaching consequences for the youth in our community. After doing some research and attending a Marijuana Task Force committee meeting on June 9, here is important information that I discovered:

Amendment 64 allows every city and county in Colorado the right to decide if marijuana commercialization is desirable for their specific municipality. Commercialization includes four types of facilities: marijuana cultivation, testing, production and retail sales.

- Thus, before Feb. 1, 2015, when the Jefferson County moratorium ends, our three Jefferson County Commissioners will adopt legislation to permit retail sales, "opt out" (ban retail sales), or extend the temporary ban currently in place. Another option, as set forth in Amendment 64, is to

have the issue put on the November ballot. The Marijuana Task Force was formed to study the issue in order to make a recommendation to the commissioners. Their meetings are open to the public.

- Several cities in Jeffco have already banned retail sales. These include Morrison, Golden, Arvada and Littleton. Several surrounding counties have also chosen to opt out, including Douglas, Arapahoe and Weld Counties.

I received a warm welcome at the Task Force meeting and found it to be very educational. Meetings are held on Mondays at 1:30 p.m., and dates are posted on the Jeffco website calendar. Member Spotlight: Stefan Begej Ken-Caryl Art Guild Member Featured At Local Arts Festivals

Traditions resident and Ken-Caryl Art Guild member Stefan Begej will be participating in several of Colorado's most prestigious juried art and sculpture shows this summer, starting with the 2014 Cherry Creek Arts Festival held July 4-6. Last year, Stefan won the Grand Prize for the Arrow Electronics Art Challenge at the fair, and this year he is returning in booth 237 to display and sell his artwork.

A month later on Aug. 9-10, Stefan will be participating in the Loveland Sculpture in the Park show that features over 2,000 pieces of sculpture created by 160 sculptors from around the world.

Stefan's background is in engineering for robotic applications. In 2011, he began exploring the technique of flash sculptures, which are three-dimensional analogs of high-speed photographic images in which the disintegration process of stressed objects is captured and preserved in a wall sculpture format. High reliance was placed on the use of exaggerated or impossible physics to dramatically enhance highly emotional events, and resulted in an artwork series called Fragmentations. Examples include the disintegration of musical instruments played with excessive exuberance, mineral effusions from fractured rocks, everyday electrical devices made to suffer from unbridled frustration, sports equipment fragmenting from superhuman vigor, and parodies of infinity and other conceptual abstractions.

Stefan's creative process begins with an everyday object and an associated emotion or concept. The unfortunate specimen is disassembled into components or particles

(sometimes delicately with a jeweler's saw or small tools, but sometimes more brutally with a power tool, hammer, chisel, knife or axe). The pieces are prototyped on a black workspace and repetitively rearranged to evaluate the visual effect of various distributions. The time to complete a piece ranges from one to five weeks depending on the size and complexity of the object and the number of difficulties encountered in attaching the fragments to the canvas-covered wood board.
