The air was filled with a mix of excitement and nostalgia around the Manor House on Saturday, Aug. 9 for KCR100. More than 500 people attended the

once-in-a-lifetime celebration to recognize and honor 100 years of Ken-Caryl Ranch.

Guests were patriotically welcomed by 700 small American flags lining Manor House Road, thanks to the generosity of DD Harder Properties of Metro Brokers. The guest book was signed by visitors from as far away as Japan, Texas, Kentucky, California, Indiana and Nebraska as well as hundreds of Ken-Caryl Ranch residents.

Descendants of some of the previous owners of Ken-Caryl Ranch attended as well, including 17 members of the John C. Shaffer family, many of whom traveled from Texas. Shaffer purchased 2,660 acres of land southwest of Denver on Oct. 17, 1914. This purchase and subsequent land purchases combined



Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society Chairman Jeff Allison, dressed in a red and white striped coat reminiscent of the *Music Man*, welcomed the crowd and told the history of Ken-Caryl Ranch. Boy Scout Troop 47, under Scoutmaster Robert Peterson, presented the colors while the UltraSoniX Barbershop Quartet sang the National Anthem. Jefferson County Commissioner Faye Griffin was on hand to read a proclamation from the county to recognize and celebrate the 100th anniversary.

Architectural Accents

Exterior Storage by Architectural Administrator Julie Kearful

As families stay longer in their homes, more and more "stuff" accumulates — perhaps generating a need for additional storage space. Here on Ken-Caryl Ranch, exterior sheds and cabinets are allowed according to Section 3.01 of our KCR Home Improvement Rules, Guidelines and Information. The size, site location and materials are of particular concern and often distinguish the difference

between a "shed" and a "storage cabinet." Accessory buildings are to be painted to match the existing home and have a like roof as well — this gives the property a more aesthetically pleasing look.

Boards To Review Draft Prairie Dog Policy In September

The Prairie Dog Task Force (PDTF) will present its draft Prairie Dog Conservation Policy to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association (KCRMA) Board and Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District Board at their Joint Study Session meeting on Sept. 2 at 7:30 p.m. at the Community Center. The community is encouraged to attend.

The primary purpose of the PDTF is to develop a conservation policy for Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space and Parks staff use that recognizes the ecological significance of the black-tailed prairie dog within the prairie ecosystem, while addressing the concerns of private landowners and residents, considering other wildlife species and preserving the conservation values for which open space was established.

Five residents were appointed by the KCRMA Board to serve on the PDTF, and the group began meeting in May. The residents represent a variety of viewpoints on the subject of prairie dogs. A specialized consultant hired by KCRMA worked with staff to facili-

tate the development of a recommended policy and provide background and history on de facto prairie dog management on open space and park lands.

The draft policy was presented to the Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Committee in July which, after making minor revisions, endorsed the document. Final approval by the Boards is required. If approved, staff will likely develop a management plan, using the new policy, for the Manor House prairie dog colony and seek approval for a budget to implement in 2015.

'Rabbit Fever'

Due to positive tests in rabbits for tularemia this year in southern Jefferson County, Jefferson County Public Health continues to recommend the public take precautions while enjoying outdoor recreation.

Tularemia is a disease of animals and humans caused by the bacterium Francisella tularensis. It is also called "rabbit fever" and rabbits, hares, beavers and rodents are especially susceptible. Humans can also be infected

with the bacteria, which is treatable with ap-Found In South Jeffco

Jefferson County Public Health advises

citizens to follow basic safety precautions to avoid exposure to animal-borne diseases, including:

- struct children to leave wildlife alone.
- · Keep pets on a leash and do not allow
- Use protective clothing and insect repel-
- Conduct frequent checks for ticks.

Symptoms usually appear three to five days after exposure and can include high fever, swollen lymph nodes and a sore or lesion at the site where the bacteria entered the body. In addition, if bacteria are ingested, such as swallowing contaminated water, a person may have a sore throat, abdominal pain, vomiting or diarrhea. If you develop symp toms, contact your physician or healthcare provider. If you find a dead rabbit on your property, please contact Animal Control at 303-271-5070.

Action Center Hosting A Volunteer Fair

- The Board discussed the investment in the community plan including the status of hiring an Owner's Representative.

- Residents addressed the Board regarding noise levels at the Manor House. Staff was directed to proceed with a noise study.

- Motion: A motion appointing Claudia Kutz and Deb Perkins-Smith to the Community Planning Committee was approved.
- Motion: A motion appointing three new members to the Open Space Committee was approved.

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MA/MD Joint Study Session

On Aug. 12, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards held a Joint Study Session at the Ranch House and discussed the following items:

- The Boards discussed the idea of adding conflict resolution language to the Reorganization Agreement and determined that it was not necessary.
- The 2015 Budgets were discussed with copies of the "yellow" and "green" sheets distributed. These sheets describe possible changes to each organization's budget for
- · A concept to "exchange" access to the east side of the North Hogback for a Jefferson County Open Space trail in exchange for a Commissioner's Deed to the Community Center was discussed. Staff was directed to review with the Open Space Committee.
- The Bond projects were discussed with the Boards.
- Options for replacing the roof on the Ranch House were presented by staff. The Boards decided that it was best to maintain the red color so the new roof will be red. This is the result of hail damage and an insurance claim.
- The MA Board was briefed on the status of the Plains Metro District/KCRMD law-



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
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Ranch House Pool Improvements

Several improvements were made to the Ranch House Pool in the spring in order to get it ready for the 2014 summer swim season and to reduce the number of pool closures due to mechanical issues or water conditions. We're happy to announce that the improvements led to ZERO mechanical closures at the Ranch House Pool for the 2014 summer season. The majority of improvements were made to the mechanical systems, including replumbing the heater, adding a new chlorine system and updating to an automatic fill system. The improvements totaled \$17,000 and were paid for by the Master Association.

were free to tour the Manor House and the Kent Shaffer House (located next door) and participate in a variety of activities on the grounds. One particular highlight was the mule-drawn wagon ride that was sponsored by Susan Schell of RE/MAX Professionals. The wagon carried riders along a portion of the Manor House Trail, which is believed to be part of the Bradford Road, an 1860s toll road to the western mines.

The atmosphere outside was filled with a vibe of enthusiasm. There were yard games for kids, sack races and vintage cars, including a 1914 Model T Ford. Ranger Ernie Stone had some fun environmental education activities, and it was one of her last activities on Ken-Caryl Ranch before her Aug. 15 retire-

Located in the tent adjacent to the Manor House, clubs and organizations were invited to show and discuss what they offer to the Ken-Caryl Ranch community. The Jefferson County Public Library had information for residents, including the opportunity for residents to listen to digitized oral histories told by descendants of past owners of Ken-Caryl Ranch. The Jefferson County Historical Commission, Senior Club, Community Garden

Club, Art Guild and the Ken-Caryl Ranch Foundation also presented displays.

Guests were treated to free ice cream, compliments of an anonymous donor. There were 400 ice cream bars donated, and the Historical Society bought 100 more due to demand! Our residents must love ice cream! The Manor House generously provided snacks, drinks and hot dogs. Residents Mike and Diana Dargen supplied a birthday cake and samples of their Bundt cakes for a business they plan to open in the area.

As guests strolled inside and outside the Manor House, they were delighted by the sounds of the Mile High Banio Band, with pianist Molly Kaufmann, and the UltraSoniX Barbershop Quartet. Members of the Historical Society added to the ambience with their period costumes.

Throughout the inside of the Manor House were posters and videos produced by the Historical Society highlighting the history of the area. Historical Society emeritus member Dolores Ebner was on hand to sign and sell her books, The Bradford Years and John C. Shaffer. The proceeds will be used to maintain items of archaeological and historical significance on Ken-Caryl Ranch. A special treat was a fashion show of vintage clothing of the early 1900s by the Ladies of Days Gone By.

The night before the main event, special guests were invited to a reception at the Ranch House. It was sponsored by the Johns Manville Corporation, and the company's CEO and President Mary Rhinehart, addressed the attendees. Jefferson County Commissioners Don Rosier and Casey Tighe presented a 100-year anniversary proclamation to Valerie Walling, Master Association Board President, and Bob Generoli, Metro District Board President. Two descendants of James Adams Perley, who owned a portion of the land on the north end of what would become Ken-Caryl Ranch from 1895 to 1926, attended the reception. Judy Janicak, who presented a book depicting the history of the Perley family on Ken-Caryl Ranch, is the great granddaughter of Perley, and Linda Shea, who presented a pioneer woman's sun bonnet, is a great great granddaughter of Perley. Members of the aforementioned Shaffer and McDannald families also attended the reception.

"It was such an honor to be part of the 100year celebration of Ken-Caryl Ranch," said Valerie Walling. "I'd like to thank the Historical Society for the countless hours they put into coordinating the event. 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





ward with a planned sale of \$7.9 million in municipal bonds for this coming fall. On May 6, voters authorized the KCRMD to issue up to \$7.9 million in municipal bonds for



Since the May 6 election, the KCRMD Board of Directors has been working closely with the Master Association Board of Directors and the Community Planning Committee to prioritize capital projects with an eye toward the optimum time to sell the bonds to provide the necessary financing for the projects.

The KCRMD Board has been working with its investment advisor, George K. Baum & Company, to keep abreast of market conditions for bond financing to take advantage of historic low interest rates. It appears likely at this time the KCRMD bond sale will take place in early October at which time the entire \$7.9 million will be available for project funding.

As part of the bond sale process, the KCRMD Board of Directors is planning on of-

fering bonds to residents of Ken-Carvl Ranch in advance of the public sale. Bonds could be purchased by Ken-Caryl Ranch residents in increments of \$5,000 with interest earnings exempt from both federal and State of Colorado income tax. Interest rates for the bonds will be determined at the time of the bond closing in October.

Residents who might be interested in purchasing some of the bonds during the advance purchase period should provide their contact information to KCRMD District Manager Darrell Windes at darrellw@kcranch.org to be placed on a list to be notified when the details of the upcoming sale are known. 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KCSC Lightning Celebrates Champion Swimmers

The Ken-Caryl Lightning swim team completed another successful season by finishing 13th place overall out of 55 teams at the State Summer Club Swim Championships at Splash in Golden the weekend of July 25-27. This came on the heels of a third place finish at the South Jeffco Swim League (SJSL) Championships on July 20 at Governor's Ranch. The Lightning had numerous outstanding swims across all age groups at both

The Lightning had nine swimmers that

were crowned League Champions in at least one event out of 70 that swam at SJSL. Swimmers who won League Championships were: 8 & under, Audrey Steeves (25-meter backstroke); 9-10 year olds Gunnar Holmes (50 backstroke), Jack Tolbert (200 free), and Andy Carlson (50 breaststroke — broke a 24year-old SJSL record by 2.5 seconds!); 11-12 year old Garrett Cruz (200 free); 13-14 year olds Micaela Clode (50 free and 100 backstroke) and Ethan Drews (400 free); and 15-18 year old Toby Mullarkey (200 free, 400 free). In addition, the 9-10 boys relay team of Holmes, Carlson, Tolbert and Evan Turney won both relays, breaking a 24-year-old SJSL record by 13 seconds in the 200 Medley Relay and their own SJSL League record from last year by six seconds in the 200 Free Relay!

A week later, five swimmers out of 21 were crowned as State Champions in at least one event at the State Championships. Lightning State Champions were: Turney in the 50 free; Holmes in the 50 backstroke; Carlson in the 50 breaststroke; and Mullarkey in the 400 free. The 9-10 boys relay teams of Holmes, Carlson, Turney and Tolbert were at it again, destroying the field and setting new state records by five seconds in the 200 Medley Relay and by almost eight seconds in the 200 Free Relay, each team dropping about six seconds from their League Championship swims a week earlier!

The coaching staff, headed Carlson and Jack Tolbert. by 10th season head coach Polly Boen, did a tremendous job coaching these swimmers to be able to do their best and represent Ken-Caryl Ranch in fine fashion. The entire team

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

Fine artist Michael Schuessler of Schuessler Art Studios will be featured at the Thursday, Sept. 11 meeting of the Ken-Caryl Art Guild at Rox Bar & Grill, 12684 W. Indore Place in Littleton. His presentation will take place at 7 p.m. following the regularly scheduled business meeting at 6 p.m.

Michael's medium is chalk pastel on raw, untreated canvas, which he binds together with acrylic bonding agent. This is accomplished in a series of transparent layers. As a result, light striking the canvas is absorbed rather than reflected. This illusion creates the effect of self-generated light, changing from morning to night, and it facilitates the true spirit of the pigments on the surface in an ever-changing palette of color.

Michael has an extensive background in the healing arts, focusing on The Kabala, psychology, studies in symbolism, and healing with sound, color, and mysticism. These studies along with his artistic training have enabled him to capture the quintessence of mood upon the canvas, which then defines the true essence of spirit. "I believe the healing arts and the canvas arts can be one and the same," Michael said.

'Creative imagination is a beautiful thing. Oftentimes certain artists over explain where, why and how the art was created. I believe that this does not always allow the viewer to spontaneously see, feel and react to the art," said Michael. "When I create, my emphasis is on spirit and the viewer. 

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


