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## Public Meeting For C-470 Express Toll Lanes

The C-470 Corridor Coalition will hold a public town hall meeting on Monday, Sept. 15 from 6-8 p.m. at the Ranch House to discuss proposed reconstruction of C-470 to add tolled express lanes and make other improvements.

This freeway experiences unacceptable levels of congestion during peak commuter hours, and the congestion will worsen in the future with continued regional growth. A key goal of the project is to offer travel time reliability.

The C-470 Coalition was formed in 2011 to provide a forum for local governments, business organizations and citizens to consider funding options and ultimately reach consensus on a plan to pay for C-470 improvements. Public funding is not available in sufficient amounts to pay for the additional highway capacity to meet travel demand. Several funding options were presented to the public for consideration, and tolled express lanes received the most support. In February 2013, the C-470 Coalition obtained consensus on Express Lanes as the preferred C-470 funding alternative.

The Coalition is currently preparing a Revised Environmental Assessment. The Express Lanes alternative being analyzed has different access designs and locations,

no longer includes a barrier separation and includes auxiliary lanes in select locations. C-470 will be reconstructed to add managed toll lanes (one or two lanes in each direction, varying by location), plus associated improvements. Motorists will have the choice of using the existing two lanes in each direction or paying to use the managed lanes. Transponders and photo-

billing will be used, as they are today on the E-470 toll highway. The project will begin in 2016 and is expected to last for two years.

### Bear Activity

Due to reports of bear activity in the Ken-Caryl Valley, the Ranger staff started posting bear signs that advise residents on how to avoid bear conflicts. Like last year, the postings will be in conjunction with the garbage collection routes in the Valley. In order to avoid conflicts with bears (and other wildlife for that matter) remove all attractants from your property. ## KCRMD Board Authorizes Bond Sale

At its Aug. 26 Board meeting, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District (KCRMD) Board of Directors authorized the sale of \$7.9 million in municipal bonds for this coming fall. The Board of Directors approved a bond resolution that authorizes the KCRMD's underwriter, George K. Baum & Company, to finalize the necessary paperwork and proceed with the sale of tax-exempt general obligation bonds. Timing on the sale is likely to take place the last week of September.

This action by the Board of Directors culminates a multi-year process to provide funding for capital improvements to the Ken-Caryl Ranch community. On May 6, voters of the KCRMD authorized the KCRMD to issue up to \$7.9 million in municipal bonds with a 10-year payback to be used for improvements to facilities and landscaping in the Ken-Caryl Ranch community. The sale of the bonds paves the way for funding to begin construction of the bond projects approved by voters on May 6. Construction is planned to begin in the fall of 2015 on the initial phases of the improvements.

As the bonds are being issued by the KCRMD, a political subdivision of the State of Colorado, all earnings to investors on the bonds qualify for exemption from both federal and state income taxes. As part of the bond sale process to take place later this month, the KCRMD will be offering bonds to residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch in advance of the public sale. Bonds can be purchased by Ken-Caryl Ranch residents in increments of \$5,000 with interest earnings exempt from

both federal and State of Colorado income tax. Interest rates for the bonds will be determined by market conditions at the time of the bond closing in September.

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## Manager's Column

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Board of Directors made history at its Board meeting on Aug. 26 when it took official action to authorize the sale of \$7.9 million in municipal bonds to fund improvements to the facilities and landscaping of Ken-Caryl Ranch. The action by the District Board marks the first time in the history of Ken-Caryl Ranch dating back nearly 40 years the residents have approved significant financial resources to upgrade the facilities and landscaping of the community.

The sale of the bonds is planned to take place the last week of September with bond rates to be determined by market conditions at the time of the sale. Interest rates for municipal bond financing continue to be at historic lows, allowing the Ken-Caryl Ranch community to borrow money over the next 10 years at a very low cost. The capital improvements authorized by voters on the May 6 election are expected to be completed within the next three years. The Community Planning Committee and the Boards of both the District and Master Association are in the planning process studying project prioritization and timing. One of the first tasks the Boards have identified as necessary to move forward with scheduling the many improvements approved by the voters is the hiring of an Owner's Representative. The Owner's Representative will be responsible for planning and scheduling all aspects of the projects including assisting the Boards with the hiring of consultants and contractors to make the projects happen. The Boards and staff are currently in the process of selecting the firm to handle these duties with a goal of having this person hired by early September.

In other news, all outdoor pools are closed for the season with staff now beginning to concentrate on fall projects and recreation programming. The draft 2015 District budget is in the process of being developed and will be available for review by the community on Oct. 15. The 2015 District budget is scheduled for adoption by the Board of Directors at its meeting on Dec. 9.

Finally, 2014 will be the first year of the Brading Tennis scholarship created by the District. The scholarship will be used to further the tennis training for one male and one female tennis player between the ages of 10 and 14. Please contact me at darrellw@kcranch.org for details.

• **Auto Dial Service:** Waste Connections, the trash and recycling services provider for Ken-Caryl Ranch offers an auto dial service to notify customers of any changes in trash pickup days. Complete the required information, click on Residential Trash Service, then in the comment section at the bottom

of the page explain that you are a Ken-Caryl resident seeking to sign up for the Call Fire service.

• **Delayed Trash Days:** Waste Connections observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, unless they fall on a weekend day. If your normal pick-up day falls on a holiday or after a holiday, your collection schedule will run one day late that week.

• **Recycling Notes:** Please remember to have your trash and recycling curbside by 7 a.m. on your collection day. Trash and recycling should be placed four feet apart from each other at the curb. Waste Connections will pick up individual bags or service totes/cans which homeowners have individually purchased. Recycling containers need to be clearly marked as recycling. Waste Connections has provided recycling stickers which can be placed on any purchased container. If you need a sticker please visit the Ranch House or Community Center. Single Stream Recycling means that glass, plastic, tin, and aluminum and paper products may all be placed in the same container.

## Covenant Clips

### Top 10 Neighbor Complaints

**10. Noise/Lights:** Enjoyment of property is compromised by loud noise or music; outdoor lights shine into windows. Your neighbors often don't want to approach you about this, but it's almost guaranteed that someone is unhappy or upset if you are generating these kinds of intrusions.

**9. Encroaching Trees/Shrubs:** Overhanging limbs or lush shrubs cross the property line and create a nuisance or hazard. Trees and shrubs were small and occupied a defined space when first planted, but exponential growth spills them onto neighboring properties. Before taking matters into your own hands, discuss it with your neighbor to ensure the best health and shape of the vegetation and to avoid emotional ramification.

**8. Snow Shoveling/Leaf Raking:** Snow is thrown into the street; shoveling and raking is ignored. Jefferson County may issue citations for snow pushed onto county streets. Neglecting to shovel sidewalks creates pedestrian hazards, particularly the buildup that thaws and refreezes as ice. Failing to rake leaves blows your responsibility right into the next yard, doubling the size of the chore for your neighbor.

**7. Overgrown Vegetation Blocking Sidewalks:** Concern for safety develops when kids walking to school or families with bikes and strollers need to move into the street. Periodically walk down your own sidewalk and assess whether you need to detour or duck, then trim and shape trees and shrubs.

**6. Property Upkeep:** Owners expect neighbors to protect their investment with paint, roofs and garage doors in good condition and cracked or spalling concrete replaced. Check out the contractor references on our website, and please be considerate and exercise common sense with placement of dumpsters.

**5. Landscape Maintenance:** Residents react strongly to distressed or neglected lawns and dead or unhealthy trees and shrubs. Pride of ownership says it all. If you're gone — make arrangements, if it's sick — take care of it, if it's dead — remove it.

**4. Unsightly Articles:** Folks are disgusted to look out their window or have guests comment about scattered, ragged or random items around a neighboring property. Teach the kids to be responsible with their toys, and assess your property regularly with a critical eye.

**3. Vehicle Parking:** Available parking on the street is limited due to residents with many vehicles or neighbors who disregard the parking rules. Make room in the garage for one more vehicle, and understand that no matter how beautiful your vehicle is, your neighbors don't want it continuously taking up their curb space.

**2. Barking Dogs:** You've heard about it from us numerous times. Be a responsible owner. Be a good neighbor.

### Architectural Rules Changes

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Architectural Committee has approved some minor rules changes to some Ken-Caryl Ranch Rules & Regulations. In the parking rules, the following change has been made: "A resident of Ken-Caryl Ranch may park a boat, camper or RV in his driveway for two non-consecutive days during a seven-day period. These two days are intended for the loading and unloading of the vehicle." Before, the rule just said "two days during a seven-day period" so the addition of the words "non-consecutive" was added for clarification.

In the Garage Sale/Miscellaneous Signage Policy, the following statement was added to the policy to specify the timeframe for how long garage sale and miscellaneous signs can be posted: "Signs cannot be posted sooner than the evening before the sale and must be removed no later than the evening of the last day of the sale."

## Ranger Field Notes

### Bears Active On Ken-Caryl Ranch

Bears have been frequenting Ken-Caryl Ranch lately, and residents have seen them feeding on garbage. Over the next couple months, sightings will increase as black bears are fattening up for the winter.

According to Colorado Parks and Wildlife, during this period, they may be actively feeding for up to 20 hours per day and may ingest 20,000 calories daily. They may be active anytime, day or night, most often during morning and evening hours. Bears are looking for an easy meal, and if they can consume all their calories at a person's birdfeeder or garbage can, they will easily do so. All attractants can eventually lead to human/bear conflicts and the Rangers are trying to minimize this issue through education.

**Remember To Remove All Attractants:**

- Birdfeeders (including hummingbird feeders) should be removed entirely until winter (snow on ground) when bears are not active.
- Place secured garbage cans outside for pickup in the morning only.
- Burn food off barbecue grills and clean after each use.
- Clean garbage cans with ammonia to discourage bears and other wildlife.
- Don't leave food, trash, coolers, air fresheners or anything that smells in your vehicle.
- Lock bear-accessible doors and windows

in the house, garage and car at night.

- Remove any ripened fruit that has fallen to the ground on your property. Bears that get too comfortable around people can destroy property or even become a threat to human safety. Habituated bears must often be destroyed as relocation does not work. Please don't let bears die needlessly. Do your part to bear-proof your home and property, and help keep bears alive and wild. Remember, a fed bear is a dead bear!

# Board Meeting Summaries

## MD Board Meeting

On Aug. 26, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District held a Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors and discussed the following items and took the following actions:

- The Board took action to approve a resolution authorizing the sale of \$7.9 million in general obligation bonds to fund improvements for the community. The resolution authorizes the sale of bonds by George K. Baum & Company, the District's underwriter. The bonds, which will likely be issued during the last week of September, were approved by voters in the election on May 6 and will finance upgrades to the Ranch House, Community Center, Dakota Lodge, playgrounds, landscaping and irrigation system improvements. While the sale of bonds to institutional buyers will likely take place near the end of September, residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch will be able to purchase bonds in \$5,000 increments in advance of the offering to the general public.
- The Board reviewed correspondence from a resident concerned about traffic on Club Drive adjacent to the Community Center. Staff has contacted the Jefferson County Traffic Department for any recommendations on assistance with this concern.
- The Board also reviewed correspondence from a resident concerned about declines in the local deer population.
- The Board discussed a staff report on the annual Fourth of July pool party and con-

cert at the Ranch House Pool. The Board directed staff to plan on providing improved monitoring of non-resident participation at this event in 2015.

- The Board received its monthly update on fundraising efforts for the Veterans Monument.
- The District Manager presented an update to the Board on the 2014 aquatic program and activities. Both the Bradford and Ranch House Pools have closed for the season. The Community Center Pool remained open through Labor Day on Monday, Sept. 1.
- The Board took action to approve the replacement of roofs at both the Parks Maintenance Shop and the Ranch House from insurance proceeds resulting from an August 2013 hailstorm.
- The Board reviewed the Community Center Campus Master Plan, which was adopted by the Board of Directors in June of 2013. Following discussion, the Board made the decision the plan stands as originally adopted and will be used in planning for use of the bond proceeds.
- Staff reported that the process is moving forward on selection of an Owner's Representative to assist the District in managing the bond projects. It is likely this position will be hired and approved by the Board in September.
- The Board took action to approve a contract with the Atkinson Design Group to develop a Landscape Master Vision Statement of Goals to guide the community in future enhancements and modifications to landscaping throughout Ken-Caryl Ranch. The Board Vice-President also updated the rest of the Board on the proposed plan for proceeding with the redevelopment of Heirloom Park. It appears likely the work of the Atkinson Design Group will be incorporated into future plans for the redesign of Heirloom Park.

- The District Manager reminded the Board that the September Joint Study Session with the Master Association scheduled for Tuesday, Sept. 2 will be held at the Community Center and will include a bus tour of the Valley.
- The Board took action to approve an engagement letter with Schilling & Company to provide 2014 audit services for the District.
- The Board discussed different liaison positions for each member of the Board of Directors to distribute the workload more equitably while providing Board member presence and representation where needed.

## MA/MD Joint Study Session

On Sept. 2, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association and Metropolitan District Boards held a Joint Study Session at the Ranch House and discussed the following items:

- The Prairie Dog Task Force presented their report and policy recommendation. There was also a proposal made by a community activist to relocate 90 dogs from a site that is scheduled for development in exchange for some funding and volunteer service to relocate dogs from the Manor House site. Following a great deal of discussion, the draft policy will be discussed further in the September MA/MD business meetings.
- The 2015 budget town meeting included a demonstration of support for a funding request to hire a contractor to construct new open space trails. Staff distributed updated MD "green" and MA "yellow" sheets. These sheets describe possible changes to each organization's budget for 2015.
- The Chairman of the Community Planning Committee updated the Boards on progress by the group. This included: a draft Vision statement, draft Community Mission statement, draft Guiding Principles, a draft

Table of Contents and an update on the status of new initiatives.

- Staff reported on the status of the hiring of an Owner's Representative and sale of the bonds.

## Correction

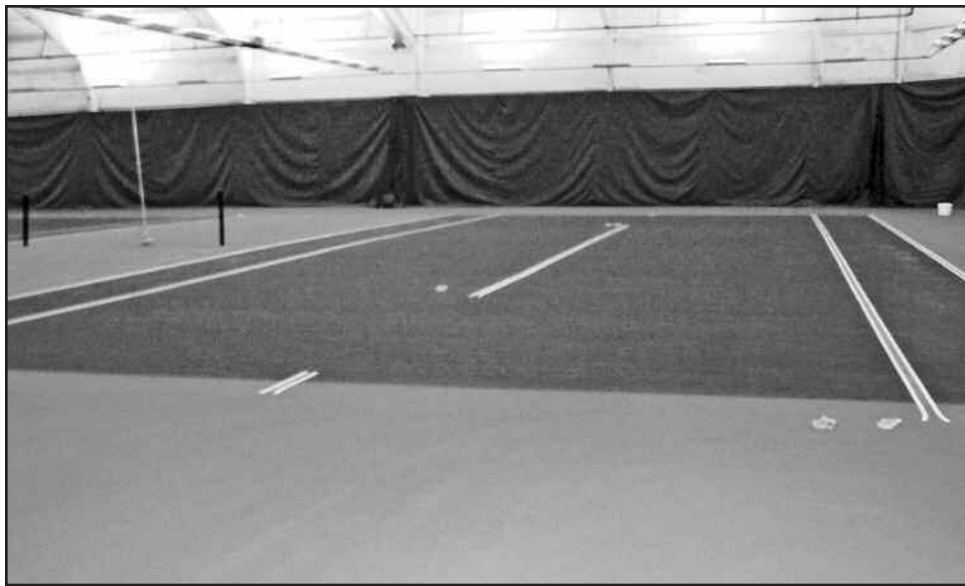

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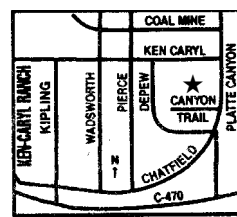

fee. Atlas Coffees has partnered with Ozo Coffee, which is a small roaster located in Boulder to provide specialty-grade, direct-trade organic coffees. Because the beans are sourced directly from the farmers (and in many cases in person by a member of Ozo's team) we are able to retain the unique flavors of the individual coffees, creating a much more nuanced cup than similar businesses."

Colin said his favorite thing about his job is that people are typically happy to see him when they come in, which was a nice change from his previous line of work. He also enjoys getting to meet new people and interact with customers.

Atlas Coffees offers a 10 percent discount for students, military and first responders. On Sept. 11 of this year (and each subsequent year), Atlas Coffees will be donating 10 percent of its sales for that day to the

Jason Dahl Memorial Scholarship fund. The Jason Dahl Scholarship is a nationwide aviation scholarship for students across the country. 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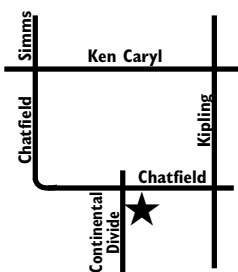

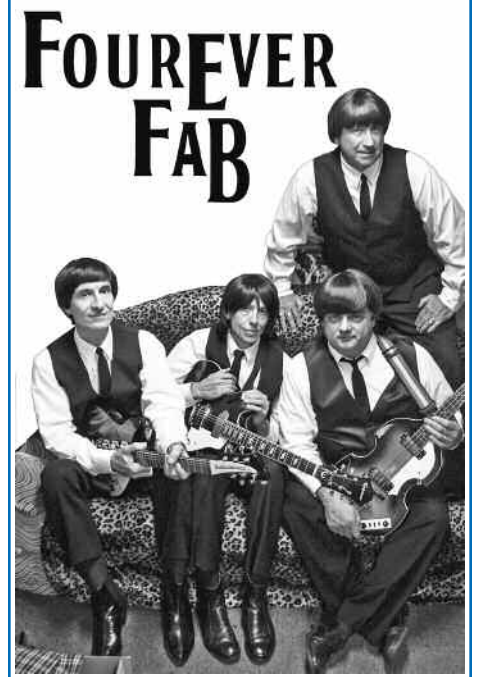

## Critter Clues

My tracks are big with claw marks you can see. My fur color ranges from light brown to reddish to black. I love to eat berries, nuts, bugs, sometimes small mammals, and unfortunately your trash. I live in the foothills and mountains of North America. Is that enough clues for you to guess what I am? I am an American Black Bear!

There are many ways animals leave us clues that tell us that they were around. It may be a track, some scat, a den or hole, bones, a scent, or even their food. We as humans have five senses we use to be able to observe the world around us, but we heavily depend on our sight to perceive our surroundings. Can you name our other four senses?

Animals also use senses to be able to sur-



vive in the wild and may have an extra keen sense that is key to being able find food or a mate, or escape from a predator. Have you ever heard the term eagle eye? This term comes from the fact that raptors have an excellent ability to see small things, like a mouse, very far away. Bears, wolves and sharks can smell extraordinarily well, which aids them in finding their next meal. Bats and dolphins use their hearing or echolocation to detect creatures in their vicinity. Echolocation involves emitting ultrasonic chirps and interpreting the echo the sound waves make after bouncing off objects, this phenomenon is essential when flying at night or swimming in murky waters.
