Prior to the modern development of Ken-Caryl Ranch, which started in the 1970s, the landowners had the Denver Chapter of the Colorado Archaeological Society



(CAS) do an archaeological survey of the land. Archaeology is the science that uncovers the physical objects, called artifacts, left behind by past peoples and researches their meaning.
